## Father R.G. Thelen to be honored at his 40th anniversary

WATERVLIET — Father R.G. Thelen, pastor emeritus of St. Joseph Parish, Watervliet, will celebrate the 40th anniversary of his ordination June 10th with a Mass of Thanksgiving and a parish open house and reception in his honor.

Due to Father's health, the 10:30 Mass may be said as Father Thelen is seated in a place of honor.

The open house and reception will be held in the parish hall, now named "Thelen Hall", from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. All are asked to come and honor the former pastor.

Father Thelen was ordained a priest on June 3, 1939 in St. Mary

Cathedral by Bishop Joseph H. Albers of Lansing. It is symbolic that his 40th anniversary fell on the Feast of Pentecost, which commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles.

His First Mass was at Holy Trinity Church in Fowler, Michigan on June 8th. The first seven years of his priesthood were spent in St. Paul's Church in Owosso. Then, on November 1, 1946 Father Thelen was assigned to Watervliet as pastor of St. Joseph's Church.

During Father Thelen's pastorate, the present St. Joseph Church, Rectory, Convent, and School were built. He led the

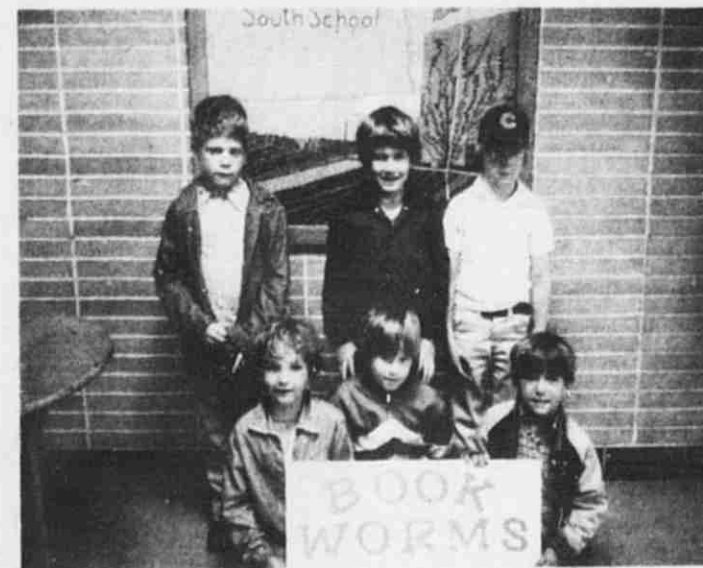

An Ordinance Compiling and Codifying The Ordinance of the City of Coloma The City of Coloma ordains that pursuant to C.L.S. Section 117 (1b), the ordinances of the City of Coloma be and the same are hereby compiled and codified and shall hereafter be known and cited as the Coloma City Compiled Ordinances.

It is the declared intention of this ordinance that only those ordinances expressly repealed by the repealing ordinance adopted contemporaneously herewith shall stand repealed, and that all other existing ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations of the City of Coloma, which are not inconsistent with this compilation, in force at the time of the adoption of this ordinance, shall continue in full force and effect although omitted from this compilation; but all ordinances or parts of ordinances of the City of Coloma in conflict with any ordinance included in this code, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

No provision of any ordinance shall be invalid by reason of deficiency in any ordinance heading.

It is the legislative intent of the Commission in adopting this compilation, that all revisions and sections of this ordinance be heretofore construed to protect and preserve peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Coloma and should no provision or section of this ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid, such holding shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining provisions or sections, it being the intent that this ordinance shall stand, notwithstanding the invalidity of any provision or section thereof. The provisions of this section shall apply to the amendment of any section of any ordinance whether or not the wording of the section is set forth in the amendatory ordinance.

Copies of the Coloma City Compiled Ordinance are available for inspection at the office of the City Clerk.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect twenty (20) days after its adoption and publication, it also being the intent that all revisions, amendments, and additions to existing ordinances, as compiled herein shall likewise be in full force and effect twenty (20) days after their adoption contemporaneously herewith and publication.

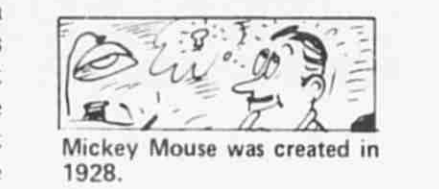

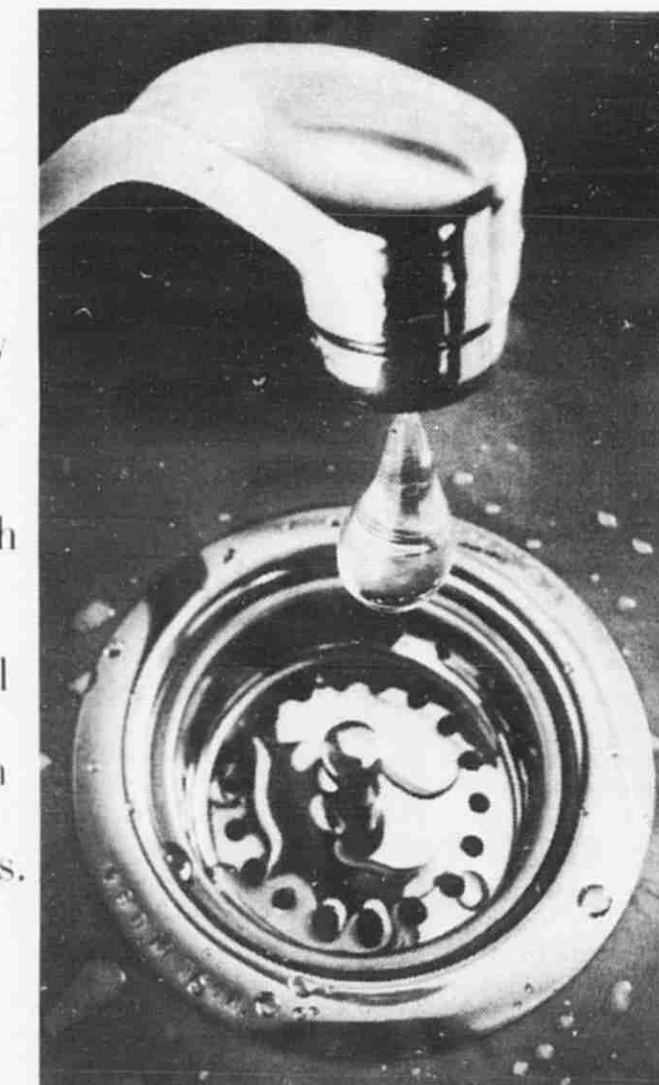
