At 1615 hours a call came in from a Catalina for an escort to 430 N 1210 E where a B-17 was ditching. Seven (7) persons were taken aboard the Catalina. The Catalina was escorted to Rimini, Italy. The Controller released the escort at 1715 hours.

1. Reference is made to letter, Headquarters, AAF/WFO, file and subject same as above, dated 18 October 1944, with 1st Indorsement, Headquarters XV Air Force, file 200.6, dated 23 October 1944, and letter, Headquarters NAPOUSA, file AG 200.6/040 P-O, subject same as above, dated 16 October 1944.

2. Report required by paragraph 3b, subject letter, NAPOUSA, submitted as follows:

a. Unit eligible for both campaigns - 99th Fighter Squadron.

- (1) An advanced echelon of seventy-eight (78) enlisted men and one (1) officer, 99th Fighter Squadron, landed near Battaglia, Italy, 11 September 1943; 23 September 1943, ten (10) aircraft of the 99th Fighter Squadron arrived in Paestum, Italy, and flew fourteen (14) sorties.
- (2) The remainder of the 99th Fighter Squadron joined the advanced echelon at Foggia Airfield Number Three, Italy, 17 October 1943. The date of the first mission flown by the squadron at this field was 22 October 1943.
- (3) 22 January 1944, the 99th Fighter Squadron flew four (4) missions from Capodichino Airfield, Italy for participation in the Rome-Arno Campaign. All of these were patrol missions in the assault area south of Rome.
