Between Us . . .

IN MEMORIAM: RABBI JEFFREY WEISBLATT

It was only a few days ago that we received the very sad news about Rabbi Jeffrey Weisblatt's death. I am sure that many of the members of our Temple remember him fondly during his years here as student rabbi and assistant rabbi. Jeff had a very special spirit and love of Torah that he shared with us in so many ways.

It is never easy for me to share words of sadness with you. Too many young in our congregation have been taken from us over the years. And the death of a young and treasured colleague adds deeply to the sense of loss. For Jeff was not only a friend to so many; he was also a teacher and fellow student of Torah. Here he began to shape and mold his rabbinate and our congregation always served as the model for him as his career grew.

In recent years he had become the rabbi of Temple Ohav Sholom of Harrisburg, Pa. There, he and Jeanne and their three children, had established a home, become part of the community, and planned to live for many years. At the funeral, you could feel the sense of community, the sense of loss, and the sense of being overwhelmed by unanswerable questions. His colleagues, Reform, Conservative, and Orthodox, all spoke lovingly of a friend, a committed Jew, a man devoted to his family, and a man who lived the words of Torah in every facet of his life.

Jeff's life certainly was too short. Thirty-six is not enough time for any one. But Jeff understood how fragile and precious life is. In his temple bulletin he had just written an article giving his personal view of how to deal with adversity in the face of tragedy. Unknowingly, he was teaching his family and congregation how to face a death that would be much like his own. That certainly was like Jeff Weisblatt. He didn't want to hurt; he only wanted to help, and to help through the power of a faith that he possessed.

Our heartfelt thoughts are of Jeff's entire family. May his memory continue to be for blessing.

HIGH HOLY DAY INFORMATION

Rabbi Miller and Rabbi Dubowe will conduct services in the Sanctuary and Reitman Hall. Cantor Roskin-Coleman with the Anshe Emeth Choir will be in the Sanctuary; Bea Adler, our vocal soloist will be in Reitman Hall.

A special family service will be held on the Second Day of Rosh Hashanah. Rabbi Miller has prepared the liturgy for the service in keeping with the other beautiful services that we observe together. This service will be held in the Sanctuary.

Your seat reservations will be sent by September 18th.

Arrangements may be made for babysitting of younger children during morning services on the First and Second Day of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur and during Yom Kippur Yizkor and Ne'elah services. If you want your children to participate and you did not check the babysitting box on your seat reservation form, please call the Temple office at 545-6484 before September 18th.

Please note that all seats in the Sanctuary and Reitman Hall are reserved for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Please notify the Seating Committee at the Temple if you will not be using a ticket. Second Day Rosh Hashanah Service will be admitted by ticket on an open seating basis. Remember, please, that tickets will also be required at afternoon Yom Kippur, Yizkor, and Ne'elah services. Ushers will check tickets.

Ushers are needed for all High Holy Day services. If you can assist at one or more of the services, please call Fred Greenstein at 248-4408, Harvey Stone at 613-0830, or the Temple office at 545-6484.

There are large print editions and Braille copies of the High Holy prayerbook for those wishing to use them. Ask an usher to provide you with one. Special audio equipment for the hearing impaired is available for use in the Sanctuary. Please call the Temple office to reserve a headset. There will be an interpreter for the hearing impaired during the services in Reitman Hall.

Because of physical impairments, some members of the congregation may not be able to attend High Holy Day services. If you or a member of your family is unable to worship with us at the Temple, cassette recordings of previous High Holy Day services will be available. Please call the Temple office to make arrangements to obtain the tapes.

Please also note that there will be a reserved section at Yom Kippur Yizkor and Ne'elah services for our disabled and/or elderly members. One family member may accompany each person.

The Interim Service will be held in Keller Hall.

You recently received a letter in your High Holy Day packet with information on how to include the names of deceased loved ones in our *In Remembrance* book. It is mailed to all congregants during the High Holy period. This act of Tzedakah is a meaningful way to perpetuate the memory of loved ones. The cost for each name is \$10. Please remember that the deadline is July 15, 1995. For more information call the Temple office at 545-6484.

Religious School Registration

Parents! Religious School registration packets for next year were mailed to you in June. Registration and Personal Jewish Library cards and fees should be mailed to the Temple by July 15. After that date, there will be a late fee of \$10.00 per child. Please send back your cards with your school fees as soon as possible so we can prepare for the coming year.

Summer Tzedakah Project

Students, watch the mail for your summer tzedakah flyer and tzedakah envelope. Be sure to decorate your tzedakah envelope, fill it up over the summer and bring it with you on the first day of religious school – September 9. We need to be aware of the need to give tzedakah and do mitzvot even when we are not coming to religious school.

High School Program

Students – watch for the sign-up sheet in the fall mailing! In it will be a description of the courses you may choose for the fall semester. Remember: religious school for high school students will begin at **10:00** on Sunday mornings and we will have three 45 minute sessions!

For Parents and Children Together

We are very excited to tell you about our very special program “for parents and children together” in our religious school. Our *enriched primary program* is for students in kindergarten and first grade – and their parents – with prior religious training (preschool) and/or a high level of family observance. This program is designed for families who are looking for a broader religious school experience for their children in the primary years. The class meets on Saturday mornings from 9:30-12:15. Students and parents participate in a series of long-term programs, each based on a particular theme. The program combines art, music, dance (movement), and other media. In addition there is an emphasis on building a basic Hebrew vocabulary for use in the classroom.

To register for this full-year parent participatory program, please call the temple. *Enrollment will be limited to ten students and their parents.*

More than 150 Anshe Emeth members helped during our first Mitzvah Day on May 21. Because of their efforts, we were able to clean an overgrown Jewish cemetery, and to pot and bring small plants to be cared for by residents at the Jewish Home for the Aged, and at Roosevelt Hospital. We brought freshly baked goodies to the emergency room staff at Robert Wood Johnson Hospital and St. Peter's Hospital and we also sent cookies and brownies along with the dinners we prepared and served for the Family and the Men's shelters.

Anshe Emeth Temple Youth spent hours making tapes of favorite music, which then were delivered to the Children's Life Center at RWJ Hospital. Earlier in the week the Anshe Emeth Choir sang for the residents of the Jewish Home for the Aged. Dozens of congregants spent the day at the Temple, cleaning and planting around the building, while others sorted and packed donations of food, children's clothing, and toys.

These donations went to the Children's Life Center, to the Family Shelter, the local soup kitchen, and Jewish Family Service. Car seats and other children's furnishings went to Women Aware, which helps victims of domestic violence.

The cost of the day was partially underwritten by MidLantic Bank, and by contributions from Anshe Emeth members.

Thank you to everyone who helped make this day possible. Not everything went exactly as planned (!), but we learned a great deal, and expect our next Mitzvah Day to be even better. We hope all of you will be part of it.
