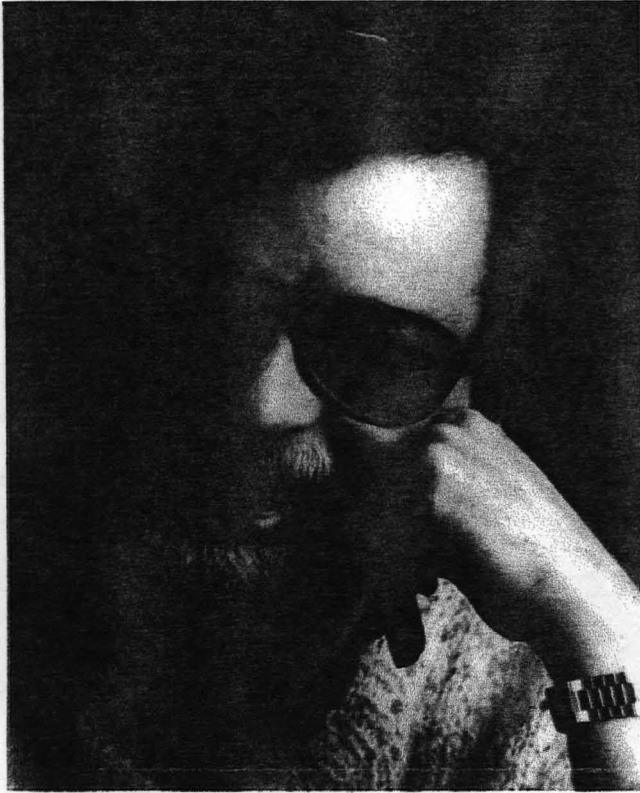

Danny Siegel is a well-known author, lecturer, and poet. He is the world's expert on the subject of Mitzvah Heroes (a term he coined) – ordinary people who do extraordinary acts of Tikkun Olam (world-repair). He is the author of 25 (and ½) books on such topics as Mitzvah Heroes and practical and personalized Tzedakah, and has produced an anthology of 500 Talmudic selections.

His most recent books include *1 + 1 = 3 and other Mitzvah Principles to Live By; Heroes & Miracle Workers;* and *Tell Me a Mitzvah.*

Ziv Tzedakah Fund, the nonprofit Mitzvah organization he founded in 1981, has distributed more than \$3,600,000 to worthy individuals and projects.

He is one of the three recipients of the prestigious 1993 Covenant Award for Exceptional Jewish Educators.

By the time you read this column, it will be only a few weeks before our annual 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Retreat. For those parents whose children have already experienced this exciting weekend, they know how special this event can be. For those whose children have yet to attend, the 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Retreat at Camp Harlam will provide a unique opportunity for the students and the professional staff at Anshe Emeth to experience Judaism together for an entire weekend of learning, socializing, and prayer.

As parents and educators, we share in the hope that our children will grow to appreciate the richness of our traditions and to become committed to leading a full Jewish life as adults. To make this hope a reality, we need to provide our children with as many opportunities as possible to experience Jewish learning and living in all its rich varieties.

Imagine if the **only** experience of Judaism our children had was attending religious school!! As adults, they would have such a narrow and formalized view of what being Jewish entails. The religious school experience must be supplemented by joyous family celebrations and quiet times learning with parents, by informal retreats and trips to Israel. Every Shabbat, we have the opportunity to experience Judaism together as a kehillah kedoshah (a holy community) in prayer. Come join us.

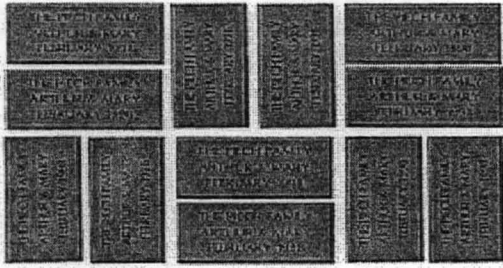

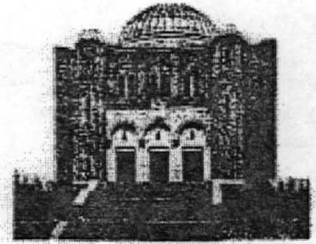
