## District 219 teachers get 20.3% payhike after arbitration

Niles Township District 219 teachers will receive a 20.3 percent salary increase over a three-year period as a result of a decision made by binding arbitration.


The decision, announced at Monday's school board meeting, followed almost a year of negotiations culminating in a teacher's strike Oct. 1 through 9. The teachers' union and the Board of Education agreed to enter binding arbitration on Oct. 10. According to Kathy Berkel, public relations head for the district, the arbitrator, Herman

The Chicago Bar Association and the Chicago Council of Lawyers have found more than half of the 102 candidates for judicial positions in next week's judicial elections are "not qualified". The candidates are running for judgeships in the Cook County Circuit Court and the Illinois Appellate Court.

What seems incredible is after the Greyford scandals the politicians are still selecting their cronies to serve as judges in our local courts.

While proponents of the "merit system" to choose judges contend leaving the choice of selecting candidates in the hands of the governor preferable to the present system, resisters to such an idea do not like the political implications. However, with the Bar Associations looking over the governor's shoulder, it would seem their collective judgments are preferable to the present system.

On the south side wheeler and dealer Ed Vrodolyak's law firm employee is running unopposed for one judgeship. Here in our area wheeler and dealer Nick Blase has one of his cronies running for a judgeship. Blase's candidate is considered unqualified by the Chicago Bar Association and "not rated for lack of in-

## 16 teachers to be let go in District 63

Tuesday night District 63's school board approved the reduction of 16 school teachers from the school staff for the coming year. Thirteen of the teachers are first year teachers and three are second year teachers.

While the reduction is due to the decreasing enrollment in the district, it was implied most of the teachers may be rehired before the fall school term opens. Last year Associate Superintendent Donald Stetina noted every one of the teachers given notice was re-hired.

Five of the teachers given notice Tuesday are part of a team teaching group at Gemini Junior High school. Business manager Jim Bowen said reductions are based on one teacher for each 25 students in the district. He said there has been a reduction of 125 students at the junior high school level in recent years which necessitated the reduction in the five team teachers. A physical education teacher was also given notice at the junior high school level.

These changes will go into effect April 1, 1986.

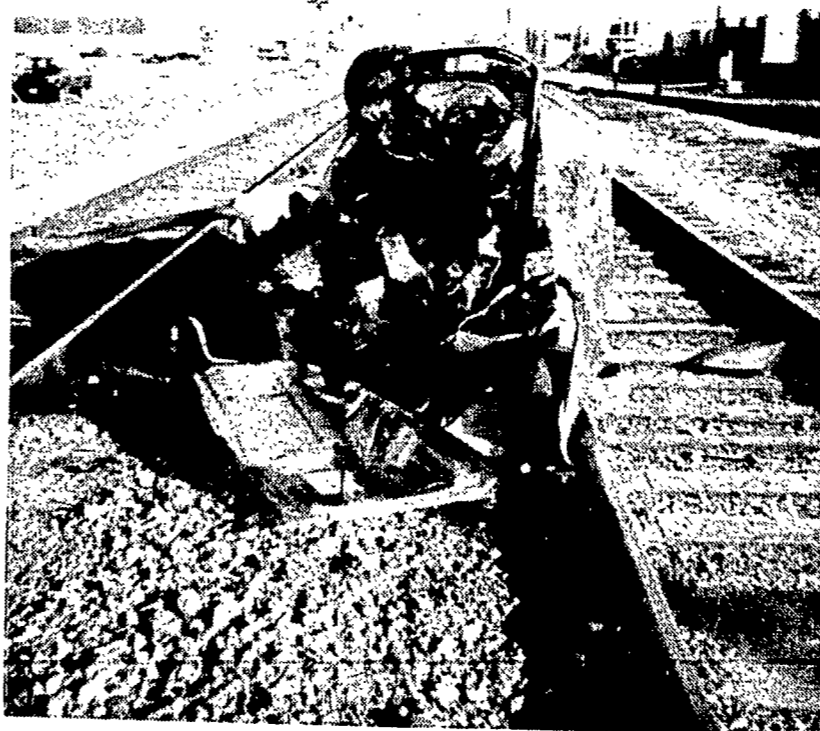

## DUSCO signs agreement to sell operations

Domestic Utilities Services Company (DUSCO), which has supplied water to residents in unincorporated areas of Maine Township for almost 30 years announced it has signed an agreement to sell its operations to a Missouri-based public utility company.

The Glenview-based family-owned firm serves approximately 32,000 customers in Maine and Northfield townships. The reason for the sale is unknown. However, in the late 1970's, the late Victor Yacktmann, founder of the utility company and developer of Talisman Village in Glenview, offered to sell the firm to Niles. The village rejected the offer.

DUSCO was involved in a long battle with a coalition of condominium and townhouse residents in unincorporated Des Plaines over a water rate increase. Increased operation costs and the need to revamp equipment were among reasons cited by the firm for the rate hike in 1982.

The Illinois Commerce Commission granted a partial water rate increase resulting in a second request for an increase the following year. At the time, Donald Yacktmann stated the firm had not been profitable for several years.

In approving the rate increase in 1984, the ICC ordered DUSCO

## Developer seeks zoning change for PUD

# Maine residents protest apartment complex

Construction of an 84-unit apartment complex in unincorporated Des Plaines drew protests from area residents at a hearing held Friday by the Cook County Zoning Board of Appeals.

Developer Clyde J. Carlig requested a zoning change from residential to residential planned unit development (PUD) for a 4.9 acre site west of the Tri-State Tollway, east of East River Road, north of Golf Rd. and south of the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad tracks. He proposed building 84 units in five, three story buildings.

Existing trees and foliage on the property would be retained, along with construction of a crushed stone "nature walk" for tenants. Carlig estimated rentals for the 14 one-bedroom and 70 two-bedroom units between \$525 and \$575 a month. "We hope to attract empty nesters and young professionals with small families," he said.

The apartment complex would have a court yard and a playground for small children. The parking plan showed spaces for 168 cars and one large access driveway to the parking area off East River Road.

Carlig said he has an option to purchase the property subject to zoning approval by the county board. The property is held in trust. Beneficiaries are the children of Tom Origer, who was a chief developer in the unincorporated area in the 1970's.

Traffic engineer Richard Beebe said he made a traffic study during peak hours which showed that approximately 4800 cars traveled on East River Road. The complex would generate a maximum of 650 cars per day. There should be adequate capacity to handle traffic on that road," Beebe said.

He also noted there would be "10" or "15" train movements from the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad located near the subject property.

The survey findings met with disagreement by neighborhood residents. "I checked with railroad officials and it's more like 24 to 26 trains per day," said Dora Kabat, 484 River Road. "During rush hours, there is a big traffic problem with car back-ups on East River Road. An increase in cars (from the complex) would aggravate the problem."

Other residents pointed out the tollway has an exit ramp with cars spilling out on East River Road. "The complex has one access driveway. In the event of a fire, how can fire engines get past backed-up cars during rush hour to get to the property. Also the railroad barrier could be down resulting in both lanes being blocked. ## Man found dead in Maine Township Culvert

A man who was found dead in a culvert in unincorporated Des Plaines on March 1 may be linked to the attempted burglary of a medical office building located near where the body was found.

Dennis Walsh, public information officer for the Cook County Sheriff's police, said Richard Reed, 28, of Chicago died of exposure and that his body showed no signs of violence. "A woman spotted the body as she was walking by about 2:30 p.m., Saturday," he said.

Walsh said police recovered the body in a culvert across the street from the Landings Condominium complex on Potter Rd. near Dempster. "The body was in a frozen condition and was partially in and partially out of the creek, fully clothed. He was identified from fingerprints."

A network check of area police stations revealed that Reed may have been connected with an attempted burglary at 6 a.m. on Feb. 23 of a medical building at 2510 Dempster St. "Des Plaines police went to the building to investigate and found office machinery had been moved but

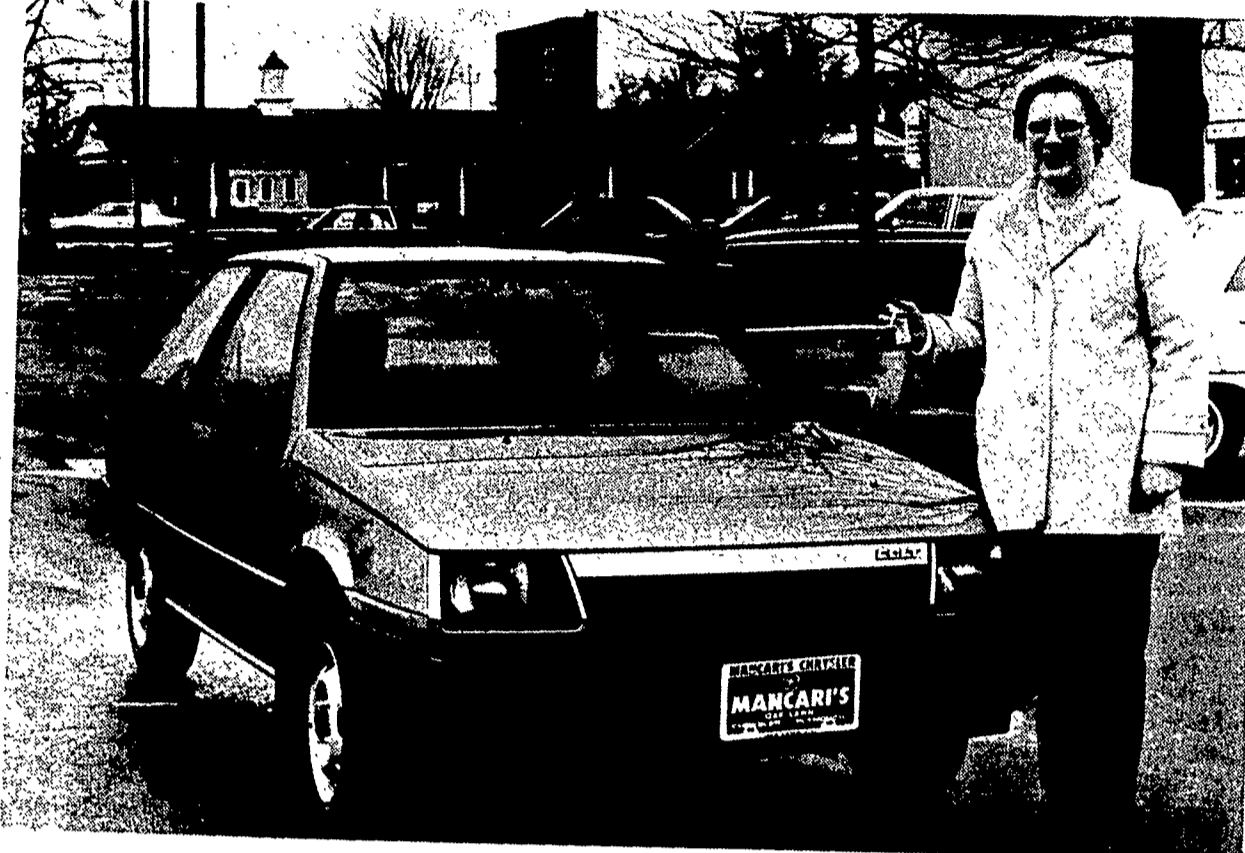

Fruit in a beef stew? Not as far out as you may think, and with rice, most affordable. Many cultures, Oriental, African and European, have used fruits with meats—as tenderizers and as flavor ingredients. Try Maui Mingle, a stew with South Seas island accents served with American grown rice.

- MAUI MINGLE**
- 1-1/2 pounds lean beef chuck, cut in 1-inch cubes
  - 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
  - 1 large onion, sliced
  - 1 tablespoon seasoned salt
  - 1 teaspoon powdered mustard
  - 2 teaspoons ground ginger
  - 1 cup dry red wine
  - 2 cups beef broth
  - 1 can (20 ounces) pineapple chunks, cut in half (drain; reserve juice)
  - 18 pitted dried prunes
  - 2 cups sliced celery
  - 1 or 2 green peppers, cut in 3/4-inch pieces
  - 1 tablespoon soy sauce
  - 2 tablespoons cornstarch
  - 3 cups hot cooked rice

Brown meat in oil on all sides. Add onion, seasonings, wine, broth, and pineapple juice. Cover and simmer about 1 hour, or until meat is tender. Add pineapple and prunes. Cook 10 minutes longer. Stir in celery, green peppers, soy sauce, and cornstarch dissolved in 3/4 cup water. Cook, stirring occasionally, about 6 to 7 minutes. Serve over beds of fluffy rice. Makes 6 servings.

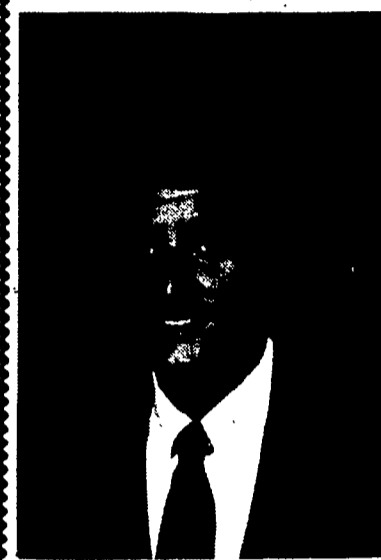

### Oakton cager makes All-Skyway team

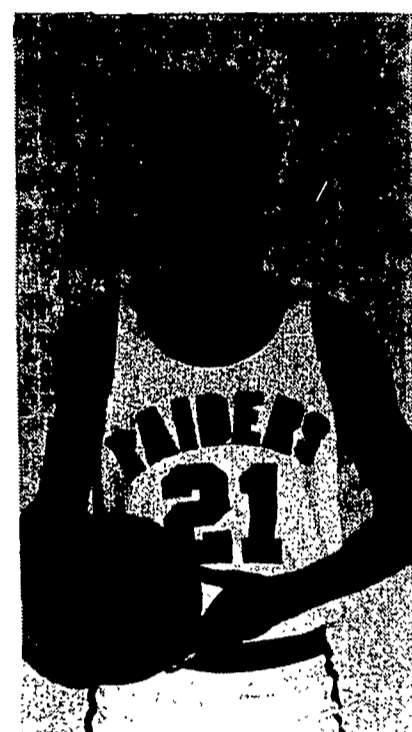

## SAT/ACT preparation classes begin March 19

Preparation classes begin March 19 in Niles. Lasting three weeks, and running 2 and one half hours each night, these classes aid the student in performing better on college entrance tests.

Can a student prepare for the SAT and the ACT, the two important college entrance exams? Although there is no guarantee of superior scores, there is little doubt that a review of the material on the tests, and an acquaintance with the test formats can only benefit.

A recent article in a February issue USA Today says that state superintendents feel that "SAT and ACT Prep courses" have contributed to the rise in scores.

The three week session beginning March 19 will prepare students for the April ACT. In May, there will be a four week session to prepare students for the June SAT and ACT tests.

Test Review Associates has been running review sessions for seven years. The preparation courses include a review of the verbal and math that is on both exams. The verbal section covers vocabulary, stressing prefix, suffix and roots, analogies, reading comprehension, sentence completion questions and grammar. Included for the ACT is coverage of the Natural Science and Social Science sections of the ACT. In the math portion, algebra, geometry, equivalents, word problems and binomials are reviewed. Included in the fee are review materials and sample exams for the students to practice the skills they learn.

Dr. Lynn Dieter and Dr. Jane Simmons, both currently employed at Maine Township High School East, in Park Ridge, are Test Review Associates. Because they are currently teaching and working with students they are well versed in the requirements for colleges and talk with the students in the review course about college choices and what exams must be taken at what time.

In general, the SAT is required by private universities, and the ACT is required by the state schools in the Midwest. Although some private universities may accept the ACT score, the two exams are not totally interchangeable. It is generally acknowledged that the SAT is the more difficult test. Test Review Associates covers preparation for both tests, and Dr. Lynn Dieter commented, "In the verbal sections, the basic principles tested are the same; however, the presentation of the question and the vocabulary are harder on the SAT. In addition, the SAT will be in the format of questions in analogies, reading comprehension, antonyms, and grammar. The ACT has primarily only English usage." Dr. Simmons indicated that the math problems on the SAT are more difficult.

Test Review Associates began when Dr. Dieter's English III Accelerated classes ago asked her to help them prepare for the tests. The next spring Test Review Associates began teaching one night a week. They now do sessions three times a year: for the Fall test, the March-April tests, and the June tests.

Much publicity has been given lately to whether preparatory programs do help. Dr. Dieter and Dr. Simmons believe they do, and see improvement in students they teach. In addition, review courses for exams have been around for years, beginning with preparation for the law boards and the medical school exams. On the East Coast, these programs for the SAT and ACT have existed for many years, and only within the last five or six have they been available in our area. Test Review Associates were one of the first groups in the area and judging from a recent article, the most reasonable.

newly developed learning strategies and the availability of support services make it possible for a person with a learning disability to earn a college degree and to be successful in a chosen career.

Learning disabilities should not be confused with mental retardation, cautions Mary Mahoney, an LOP career counselor and coordinator of the March 20th Open House. A learning disability in layman's language is simply an information processing problem which can take many forms. Most common are problems with reading, spelling or math skills and difficulty in organizing and expressing ideas.

Supervisors and human resource officers should also be aware, notes Mahoney, that an employee's ability to handle some tasks competently and failure at others could be caused by a learning disability. It is unfortunate, Mahoney adds, when these employees are passed over for promotion or do not get the jobs they seek when they could be taught to compensate for their problems.

At Barat's March 20th Open House a panel of adult and traditionally aged college students and graduates who have specific learning disabilities will discuss their college experiences. Learning strategies and support services will be explained and each person attending the meeting will receive a packet of resource material with up-to-date information about learning disabilities, college programs, organizations, diagnostic services and financial aid.

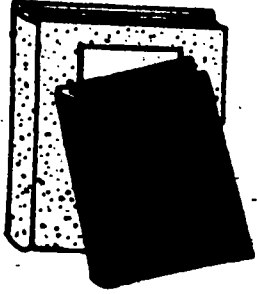

## Judge Scariano campaigns in a different kind of race

Judge Anthony Scariano, former award-winning Illinois state legislator and chairman of the Illinois Racing Board, is finding his campaign for election to the Cook County Appellate Court a horse of a different color.

Appointed to the Illinois Supreme Court in October to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Appellate Justice Maurice J. Perlin, Scariano is seeking a full 10-year term in the crowded March 18 primary. He faces five opponents.

"The judge's race is not issue-oriented," he says. "As a legislator, I discussed issues—taxes, mental health, schools—but ethics forbid a judge to take a stance. Still, people are interested in what the courts are doing, especially in the areas of heinous crimes, such as rape."

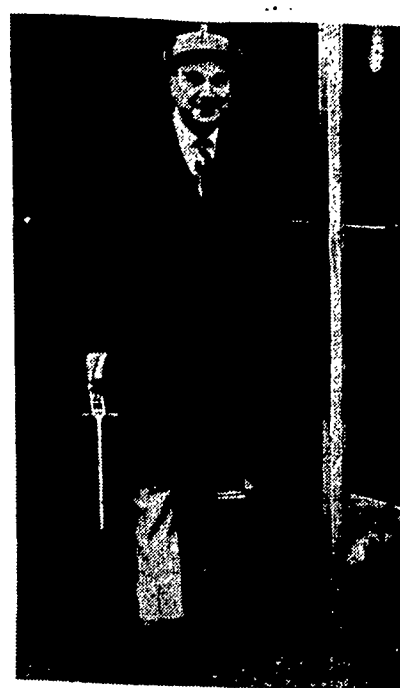
Although the judgeship race doesn't create the public attention that Scariano's fights for open meetings commanded in the 1980's, it does offer him the frequent opportunity to address ward, township, community, civic and neighborhood groups.

Long a south suburban resident of Park Forest, Scariano also has established a residence in Olympia Centre in Chicago's Streeterville neighborhood. The new condominium allows him the luxury of walking to work at the Daley Center as well as being close to his friends and contacts he's established through the years. Judge Scariano and his wife Leah will maintain their Park Forest home, where they've lived almost 38 years, he says, because the family "has deep roots there."

The judge's priority for the present, however, is the March 18 primary. The veteran Democrat calls the judgeship a "great way to cap my legal career."

Judge Scariano was awarded the "Best Legislator" distinction six of his eight terms (1957-73) in the Illinois General Assembly by the Independent Voters of Illinois. In the 1984 At-Large (Orange Ballot) Election, he placed third highest among 236 candidates for state representative. He also has received awards from both the Illinois Trial Lawyers Association and the Chicago Bar Association for his distinguished legislative service.

As a public servant, Judge Scariano gained the reputation of



an independent thinker who often was at odds with Mayor Richard Daley. He was a member of what the press called the "Kosher Nostra," an informal group of legislators known for fighting the good causes, such as civil rights, education, good government and mental health issues.

He was named chairman of the Illinois Racing Board by Governor Dan Walker in 1973. He spent the last 10 years in private practice with his law firm, Scariano, Kula and Ellch, previous to his appointment to the appellate court last fall.

"It's no secret he enjoys being in the public eye once again, even though the judge's race is not as combative as some past campaigns."

"The Operation Greyhound comes up a lot in the groups I address," he says. "My assessment is that 99 percent of judges are persons of integrity. Some weak characters—a very small percentage—will always succumb to temptation."

"All you can do is state your record as an office holder and as a private citizen. That's what I'm doing as a judicial candidate."

Senator Walter W. Dudycz, (R-Chicago), has been named to the Illinois Citizens Council on Women, a citizens advocacy panel designated to study the status of women and help assure them equal protection under Illinois laws, regulations and guidelines.

His appointment was announced by Senate Republican Leader James "Pate" Philip, Wood Dale. The council held an organizational meeting at 11 a.m. March 5 in the Stratton Office Building, Springfield.

"I look forward to working with this council," Senator Dudycz said. ## Managing arthritis through all kinds of weather

Arthritis flares up in cold weather. True or false?

Folk wisdom to the contrary, winter does not increase the pain of arthritis, according to Dr. Scott Kale, rheumatologist and co-director of Bethesda Hospital's Arthritis and Back Pain Center, 2451 W. Howard in Chicago.

Changes in barometric pressure, not in temperature, intensify pain and discomfort, Kale explained. He added, "there are two exceptions: Raynaud's Phenomenon, a painful blood vessel spasm condition of the hands and feet and sometimes of the nose and ears, definitely becomes worse in cold weather; and getting around in winter often is more difficult for someone with arthritis because clothes are bulkier and heavier, and sidewalks may be slippery, increasing the possibility of falls which may lead to serious injury—a by-product, not a feature, of arthritis.

During the Spring, wide and frequent shifts in barometric pressure increase aches and pains. Kale pointed out that the higher the barometric pressure, the greater the force of gravity a person experiences. The more gravity, the greater the pressure and the worse the pain.

A simple experiment illustrates this. Stand with both hands pressed as hard as possible against the frame of an open door, one hand against each side. Keep up the pressure for about a minute. When the pressure is released, hands and arms feel light, almost buoyant.

Not all arthritis causes pain. However, Kale stressed that being properly diagnosed for the origin of aches and pains is quite important. Often people will assume they have arthritis because they hurt, when in fact

the underlying cause of the pain may be quite different than arthritis, and easily remedied.

For those with arthritis, Kale suggested an arthritis management program such as the one at Bethesda's Arthritis and Back Pain Center. The program consists of structuring a personalized therapy with which the patient and family can live. A major goal of the therapy is to improve overall body conditioning. This often involves exercise and using physical devices such as canes or splints. Patients may be assigned to physical therapy. They may be asked to make some lifestyle changes, to switch the types of shoes they wear or to lose weight. When necessary, the physician prescribes medications.

The arthritis patient has a team of health care professionals working closely in all aspects of treatment. Radiologists, orthopedic surgeons, neurologist, podiatrists, nurse practitioners, physical, occupational and speech therapists, social workers, dieticians, laboratory personnel, pharmacists, visiting nurses and other diagnose, formulate and deliver therapy as no individual doctor can.

The warmth and concern of the managing physician, however, should not be underestimated. Kale's relationship with his patients is an example.

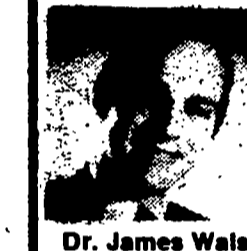

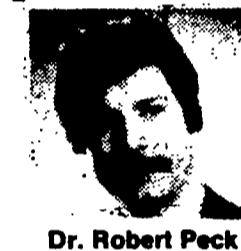

## Judge Dore establishes high quality record

Cook County Circuit Court Judge Cornelius Francis Dore, having established a high quality record in three years as a judge, is seeking election. The Honorable Judge Dore, who twice was appointed by the Supreme Court of Illinois to fill vacancies on the Cook County Circuit Court, is now running to fill the vacancy of former Cook County Circuit Court Judge Richard F. 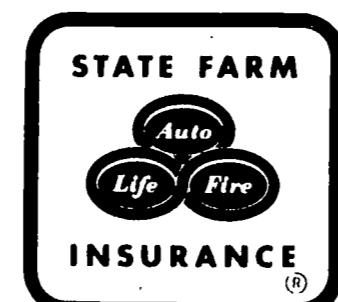

## Conlon may be rising star in Democratic Party

Kevin Conlon, candidate for Cook County Board of Commissioners in the suburbs in the March 18 Democratic primary, may be a rising star of the Cook County Democratic Party. ## Pullen sponsors key school reform proposal

House Minority Whip Penny Pullen (R-Park Ridge) has introduced a legislative proposal that changes the harmful impact of the new school consolidation law.

Introducing House Amendment 16 to Senate Bill 242 on Feb. 10, Rep. Pullen said this proposal would waive the law's requirement of forcing every elementary school district to send their eighth grade graduates to a single high school district. She has also introduced a fresh bill making the same proposal, H.B. 2892.

This amendment, she added, would help Penneyer Grade School District 79, which currently sends its junior high school graduates to Maine Township High School District 207 and Ridgewood Community High School District 234. But the new law mandates that Penneyer end that relationship and choose either Maine or Ridgewood.

"The new state consolidation law poses a harmful and severe burden on Penneyer, which enjoyed a harmonious relationship with both Maine Township and Ridgewood. Both high school districts offer outstanding education to Penneyer eighth grade graduates. I see no reason why an arbitrary state law should destroy this rapport," Rep. Pullen said.

The House passed several legislative proposals, including Rep. Pullen's S.B. 242 amendment, but deslotted with the Senate when Senate Democrats sought to impose Adlai Stevenson's consolidation proposal on the reform legislation. The state lawmaker said she expected the House to resume deliberations on the reform legislation.

Rep. Pullen also supported another S.B. 242 amendment, which would have postponed the June 30 deadline set for school consolidation plans. This measure would have allowed elementary and high school districts to complete their consolidation plans by Sept. 30.

It wasn't too long ago Blase had his law partner up for a judgeship. He was elected/ appointed and when he came up for re-election, he was deemed "unqualified" because he did not have the "proper" judicial temperament. But despite the unfavorable recommendation he retained his judgeship.

The courts in Cook County have always been bad. Thirty years ago Chicago reporters used to tell me how corrupt the courts were. Today, even the president of the Illinois Bar Association was one of the lawyers who gave money to convicted Greylord Judge Holzer. It would be scandalous anywhere else in the country. But here in Cook County the wheelers and dealers scuff at the implications of such actions.

Since most of us vote blindly for judges, we're listing the choices of the two bar associations. Hopefully, you will take this list or those in the Chicago newspapers into the polls with you when you vote next Tuesday.

Berman, submitted his decision on March 7, resolving the salary question and other issues that came up during negotiations.

Teachers will receive 5.6 percent increase this year, 6.25 percent the second year and 5.4 percent the third year. The board had offered a 19 percent increase over three years which would bring the average teacher's salary to \$48,700 per year by the third year. The teachers were seeking a 22 percent increase over two years which would bring salaries to \$51,000 in the second year.

The support staff (custodians, secretarial, maintenance personnel) had already received a 7 percent salary increase and will receive a 6 percent increase next year and 5.5 percent the third year. The support staff was seeking an 8.3 percent increase and the board had offered 5.9 percent.

Berman turned down a union demand for make-up days caused by the teacher's strike, according to Berkel.

The union claimed victory on the Fair Share issue in which non-union staff will pay a proportionate share of union dues designated for collective bargaining. The amount will be fixed by the union.

On the question of management rights, Berman said that rights of the school board in educational matters is adequately covered by Illinois law and it was unnecessary to put into the contract.

Martin Tiersky, school board president, said he was satisfied "on the whole" with the decision. "We won a victory on the salary schedule which was close to what we offered at the last negotiating session in October. "I'm glad it's over," he said.

John Herbst, president of the Niles Township Federation of Teachers and a teacher at Niles North, also claimed victory on the major issues. "I think we were pretty close on salary and it is a substantial raise. That is not as important as other issues that were resolved," he said.

One of the more important issues, he said, was job security...which was settled before binding arbitration took place. He explained the board wanted to change its policy of not dismissing tenured staff when there is a surplus of teachers. "During the teachers' strike, the board announced there would be no reduction in force (RIF) in the 1986-87 school year," he said.

He noted the school board agreed to the union's suggestion in which teachers will contribute part of their salaries toward the salaries of surplus teachers to keep them on staff. "The union thought this issue (job security) was very important," he said.

### Maine Township meeting on revenue sharing

Maine Township will hold a special meeting Wednesday, March 19, to conduct an in-depth review of the status of the endangered federal revenue sharing program.

### Homestead Exemption

Niles Township Assessor, Robert P. Hamrahan wishes to inform Niles Township residents that: Senior Citizens are now eligible for a Homestead Exemption during the year in which they turn 65. They no longer have to wait another year as was the situation with the Homestead Act prior to 1984. The Homestead Exemption has been increased from \$1,500, which it was prior to January 1, 1984, and is now \$2,000. However, this benefit will not be reflected on a Tax Bill until the second installment is due in the Summer of 1987. Therefore, the 1986 Homestead savings will not be received until the 1986 Tax Bills are paid in full with the second installment in the year 1987.

The Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption provides tax relief by reducing the equalized assessed valuation of an eligible residence by \$2,000 which can result in a tax savings of as much as \$200. This savings is in the form of a deduction on the Second Installment of the Real Estate Tax Bill.
