



Teen violence underscores need for curfew, police say

School is out and teenagers looking to blow off some of that summertime steam may be hitting the streets in search of fun.

But the Niles Police Department wants parents and teenagers to remember that curfew is serious.

Niles' curfew starts at 1:30 p.m. Fridays and Saturdays, and at 10:30 p.m. all other days of the amount of teenage violence in Chicago recently.

Penalties for violating curfew range from a \$15 to \$100 fine to community service for repeat offenders. Parents and guardians can also be fined.

Niles Police Sgt. Tom Davis said it is important for parents to be vigilant.

"It is up to the parents and minors to know the village ordinances," he said. "Unfortunately, we have some parents that either don't care or just don't want to deal with their kids."

Science Academy headed for Our Lady of Ransom

The Science Academy of Chicago in the fall will leave the Northwest Side of the city and relocate to Niles.

The private school serving grades 1-8 signed a one-year lease at Our Lady of Ransom Parish on Greenwood Avenue, where it will occupy as many as eight classrooms

Principal Osman Arslan said his school is moving to Niles because the surrounding neighborhood and new facilities will be better than the school's former Northwest Side location near Riis Park.

"We have 64 students enrolled," he said. "We are expecting about 80. The neighborhood is better. Many people are moving

out to the suburbs. The classrooms are very clean, there's lots of sunshine and a nice backyard for students"

Arslan a Turkish im migrant, said the school has a diverse student population.

"We have African-American students, white, Asian, Bosnian, Turkish," he said. "They come from all over:"

Arslan said he was working on finding a bus service to accommodate the school's many Chicago residents who will remain enrolled. Arslan himself is looking for an apartment in Niles, as are several of his instructors.

"Our curriculum focuses on science, math and technology," he said. "Children even learn to design Web pages."

Students will also have an opportunity to learn Turkish as a foreign language.

The Science Academy of Chicago was opened in 2000 by Niagra Education Services, a nonprofit organization founded by a group of Chicago businessmen aiming to improve math and science education while fostering ethnic and cultural understanding.

The Rev. Chris Gustafson, pastor at Our Lady of Ransom, said he respects the school's mission and is happy to have it in Niles.

"They seem to be really wonderful people," he said. "We're excited about having them here."

forcement of curfew is normally left to the discretion of police officers.

"Most take it seriously," he said. "If the kids are local, we can deliver them home as long as there is a responsible adult that can sign for them. We have had to drive some minors back to Chicago or other towns but usually the parent or guardian have to make arrangements."

But Davis said taking the time to enforce curfew could have negative side effects.

"When the police have to deal with these kids, it takes them away from dealing with more serious incidents and criminals on the street," he said "Curfew laws are put in place to protect the kids, not to penalize them."

Free bus ridership increases

High gas prices are the likely cause of a surge in ridership on the Niles Free Bus, village officials reported.

Niles Village Manager George Van Geem said the free bus served more than 100,000 riders in the first four months of 2008 — a 3-percent increase from last year.

"The free bus started 35 years ago to reduce congestion," he said. "We have three routes and it is (available) about half a mile from virtually every resident in Niles." Along with the three

free bus routes Niles also has several regular Pace routes, which senior citizens may take for free.

"There are other routes in town seniors can take for free, but our free bus still saw that increase," he said. "I think that's indicative that some people are trying to economize because of gas prices."

Public transportation systems across the country have seen an increase in ridership. There were 2.6 billion trips taken on American public transportation during the first three months of 2008 - a 3-percent increase from 2007, according to the

American Public Transportation Association.

Van Geem said Niles shared the cost of the free bus with Pace. Currently, Pace pays \$840,000 and village pays \$560,000. Kelly Mickle, director

at the Niles Senior Center, said many more of her patrons have been riding the bus lately. "The free bus gets off

right outside our door." she said. "Seniors love it. The high price of gas is making a lot of them take it."

Niles resident Helen Sparkes said she takes the free bus almost every day to get around town and save on gas.

"I go to Golf Mill, the Oak Mill mall, the senior center," she said. "Thank God for it. It would kill my very soul if they stopped

running it." Van Geem said the village had no intention of discontinuing the service.

"Public transportation is answer to this problem," he said, referring to high gas prices and environmental pollution. "It's got to be a good thing to have 100,000 less cars on the road?

The Niles free bus runs continually from 8:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. weekdays, and from 11:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. weekends

New York 'skate' of mind Niles men rolling on film of skateboard trek from Millennium Park to Times Square By TONY BERTUCA

Two 20-year-old film students from Niles are traveling 850 miles to New York City — by skateboard Michael Kosciesza, 20,

and Arthur Swidzinski, 20, are now rolling across Ohio. They left June 2 from Millennium Park and have been traveling on skateboards for the past 400 miles, spending nights at motels, camp sites and the occasional couch.

Their goal is to reach Times Square in Manhattan by the end of the month.

The pair of Columbia College students are being accompanied by two friends on bicycles, James Lagen, 20, and Tony Michal, 21, who are filming their Herculean effort for a documentary to be called "Shred America." The word "shred" is a slang term meant to convey superior ability on a skateboard.

Police: Disrespect prompted stabbing

A teenager allegedly stabbed a 21-year-old man to death in Des Plaines because the victim disrespected him, police said.

Ashuri Hidou, 17, of the Bay Colony Apartments in unincorporated Des Plaines, was charged with the first-degree murder of Israel Moreno, 21, of 1370 Harding Ave., Des Plaines, shortly after 2 a.m. Saturday, said Des Plaines Police Chief James Prandini.

Police had been called to a dispute in an apartment building June 7 on the 400 block of South Laurel Avenue in Des Plaines, where Moreno was arrested and charged with three counts of battery after he and three companions reportedly attacked two adults and four teenagers between 16 and 20 years old.

"Since that time, Israel had shown up back there several times and early Saturday morning," Prandini said. "I'm not sure if there was another confrontation then, but as he walked away from the front of the building someone came out of the apart-

ment and attacked him with a knife."

A witness saw Hidou repeatedly stabbing Moreno and tried to pull Hidou off the victim, he said. During the struggle for the knife, Hidou received several injuries to his hands before running from the scene, leaving a trail of blood behind him, he added.

Moreno was pronounced dead at Advocate Lutheran General Hospital in Park Ridge.

Hidou went to Swedish Covenant Hospital. Chicago, where he was treated and released, then headed for an undisclosed location in Lincolnwood, where police found him hiding.

"After several hours of questioning, Hidou said he stabbed Israel because Israel had disrespected him and his acquaintances. He never mentioned a gang motive. It was a personal issue between him and Israel," Prandini said.

Prandini said the arrest was made so quickly because of help from the Major Case Assistance Team's investigators and forensic experts, as well as the States Attorneys office.

"They just did a great job. We had more than 30 people coming in to be interviewed about the case Saturday," Prandini said.

Hidou is being held in Cook County Jail on a \$1 million bond and is to appear in Cook County Court in Skokie June 20.



New contract encourages professional development

Teachers to get 3+ percent salary hikes

Changes in the new contract for teachers at Maine Township High School District 207 will encourage and reward those who pursue professional development, the district's superintendent, Joel Morris, said this week.

A tentative contract approved June 3 between the district and the Maine Teachers Association (MTA) and released by the district this week includes some major changes. Morris said the biggest changes include incentives for professional advancement, no-

Professional Teaching Standards Certification board, salaries and benefits.

If teachers choose to pursue National Board for Professional Teaching Standards Certification, commonly referred to as national board certification, the district will give them an annual stipend of \$1,500 as long as they maintain the certification. If more than 30 teachers elect to receive the stipend per school term, a sum of \$45,000 will be equally distributed among the teachers.

The certification is a voluntary, advanced

teaching credential that goes beyond a state license to a higher set of national standards for excellent teachers.

Other than the added incentives for teachers to pursue professional development, the contract, which is effective from 2007 to 2012 also includes changes to salaries, benefits and working conditions.

• Yearly salary increases of 3.3 percent for teachers and 3.7 for teacher assistants.

■ An eight-member insurance committee, comprised equally of representatives of the administration and the MTA, will meet quarterly

An entire truckload can hold up to 15 cubic yards, which can make a considerable dent in that over packed basement or garage.

My friends dubbed it Grape Ape because of its pretty plum color and generous proportions. I simply called it the Tank. But either way you look at it, the 2008 Toyota Sequoia is a large vehicle

In fact, it's one of those vehicles that looks large from afar and seems to grow larger the closer you get. Inside, it's downright cavernous.

Which is why the nimble handling and quick acceleration surprised me. I expected the Sequoia to be cumbersome and slow. Not so much.

Then again, the test vehicle was the limited model and came equipped with the up-level 5.7-liter V-8 engine that delivers 381 horsepower. I thought this was the perfect amount of power for a full-size SUV that weights nearly 6,000 pounds. The base engine in the SR5 model is a 4.7-liter V-8 that delivers only 276 horsepower. I can't imagine that's anywhere near enough power for daily driving, let alone towing.

The Sequoia is all new for the 2008 model year, and though the styling, chassis and interior are all-new, it's that new 5.7-liter engine that impresses me the most. And that smooth, fluid power is only part of the story. In addition to having one of the highest horsepower outputs in the full-size SUV class, it still manages to be somewhat fuel efficient - for a full-size SUV that

city/highway consumption to be 13/18 miles per gallon for the 5.7-liter engine with four-wheel drive, I averaged a solid 16.1 in the test vehicle with combined city/highway driving. The Sequoia with the 5.7-liter engine also

delivers 401 pounds to feet of torque at 3,600 rpm and has a standard towing capacity of 9,100 pounds. That bests the Chevrolet Tahoe and Ford Expedition by about 3,000 pounds, and it bests the GMC Yukon by about 2,000 pounds. To be fair, however, it should be noted that the Tahoe and Yukon do get better gas mileage than the Sequoia

Being a city person through and through, I'm just not sure what you do with a vehicle of this size and capability. It seats eight and it has a length of 205.1 inches, a height of 74.6 inches and a width of 79.9 inches. It completely filled my parking space at home, and maneuvering through the garage at work was a chore. I had to haul myself into and out of the vehicle using the handgrip, and those running boards are not just for looks. All of my passengers needed them.

The first day of the test period had me tiptocing through the streets and into my parking space slowly and gingerly. But I had gone from a midsize sedan into this full-size beast; and getting used to the sheer proportions of the Sequoia was a challenge.


Day two, however, had me pushing the barriers, testing the turning radius in my small parking lot and punching the accelerator. On day three, I was a pro, swinging the Grape Ape around like I owned it - and had owned it for vears.

Of course, I couldn't have done any of this without the optional backup camera and the

front and rear parking sonar that was standard on the limited model. It helped me learn where the edges of the vehicle were and gave me confidence while driving and parking. I even managed to parallel park the Sequoin on a crowded stretch of Logan.

Since the Sequoia is such a beast, you might not immediately think about safety features. But Toyota did. The standard STAR safety system includes vehicle stability control, traction control 'and anti-lock brakes. Additionally, standard sidecurtain airbags hit all three rows of seats. Not all the competitors can say the same.

The test vehicle was in the middle of the model pack at the limited level. Sequoia also comes as a base SR5 model starting at \$34,834 or the platinum model with a base price of \$56,285. The test vehicle had a base price of



\$49,135 but added a good dose of options and topped out at \$52,195.

While I have a hard time supporting any full-size SUV as fuel prices continue to rise, I do have to say I grew rather fond of the Grape Ape, I mean the Sequoia, during the test week. It may be oversized, like the 40-foot-tall Hanna-Barbera cartoon character, but it's also lovable in a large kind of way. Consider: Comfortable seating for eight (the third row has 35.3 inches of legroom), the ability to tow a boat and an incredible total cargo volume of 120.8 cubic-feet.

If you need such things, a lovable beast isn't a bad way to go. Just choose a color other than purple (a k a cassis pearl). Otherwise, you'll hear faint cries of "Grape Apel" every time you hit the gas pedal. I know I did. Once my friends planted the idea in my head, it stuck.



New contract encourages professional development

Teachers to get 3+ percent salary hikes

Changes in the new contract for teachers at Maine Township High School District 207 will encourage and reward those who pursue professional development, the district's superintendent, Joel Morris, said this week

A tentative contract approved June 3 between the district and the Maine Teachers Association (MTA) and released by the district this week includes some major changes. Morris said the biggest changes include incentives for professional advancement, no-

tably National Board for **Professional Teaching** Standards Certification board, salaries and benefits.

If teachers choose to pursue National Board for Professional Teaching Standards Certification, commonly referred to as national board certification, the district will give them an annual stipend of \$1,500 as long as they maintain the certification. If more than 30 teachers elect to receive the stipend per school term, a sum of \$45,000 will be equally distributed among the teachers.

The certification is a voluntary, advanced

teaching credential that goes beyond a state license to a higher set of national standards for excellent teachers. Other than the added

incentives for teachers to pursue professional development, the contract. which is effective from 2007 to 2012 also includes changes to salaries, benefits and working conditions.

Yearly salary increases of 3.3 percent for teachers and 3.7 for teacher assistants.



Dear Fixer: I received a violation notice from the Illinois Tollway in January. I paid the bill online and somehow ended up double-paying.

I called the Tollway Authority, and they told me I needed to fax a copy of my bank statement proving that I had, in fact, been doublecharged. After I did this. they said it would be eight to 10 weeks before I would be credited on my account

It's now 13 weeks later, and I still haven't received a credit. I made several attempts just to

get through to the Tollway - once being hung up on, being placed on hold for 30 minutes and being told that a "supervisor would call me within 72 hours." Still no credit

Last Friday a rep told me: "The problem is being worked on, but I cannot tell vou when vou will receive the credit."

It's only \$124, but I need it back to buy some gas!

Dear John: This sounded so ridiculously simple, we couldn't fathom what the problem might be, even taking into account all the recent billing weirdness at the Tollway. Then we heard more about what happened.

Apparently, the violation was in vour mother's name and linked to a different address, said Tollway spokeswoman

Joelle McGinnis. The person who accidentally double-paid was your girlfriend, who has a different last name and address from your mom. The refund form was filled out with your mom's name, but the Tollway could only pay back your girlfriend. Not to worry, though.

Now that everyone there knows who all of you are, the overpayment has been credited back to your girlfriend's checking account.

Bill Diehl's job description is simple.

· "It's to help people buy and sell homes," said Diehl, one of two real-estate agents behind the Repo Home Tour Chicago.

On a recent Sunday. Diehl and his partner, Matt McCarthy, were standing in the parking lot of Jewel-Osco, 1500 Lee St., Des Plaines, their multi-colored Repo Home Tour Chicago bus behind them as they waited for potential clients to arrive for a trip inspecting about eight foreclosed houses in Des Plaines and Mount Prospect.

"Certainly nobody feels good about the fact that people have lost their homes," Diehl said. "But the reality is that for most people they haven't expressed great concern about it."

The June 1 tour of two northwest suburbs drew six people who were all looking for something dif-

The prices for the rest of the homes all had some mystery involved: one seemed the product of mortgage fraud, selling previously for \$450,000 and listed at \$273,000 for the tour.

The opaque nature of pricing is just part of the process when buying a foreclosed home, Diehl said.

"To purchase a foreclosed property is like a regular real-estate closing on steroids," he says. "For the buyer it's imperative to have people involved in the transaction who have an understanding of the process."

So with the tour Diehl is trying to match buyers not afraid to purchase a foreclosed property, while also lining up attorneys and mortgage brokers who know the ropes.

And it does seem like there are a lot of complexities to the process, Lauren Picciuca, of Des Plaines, said during the tour. though she added she felt like she understood a bit more about the process. She also was hesitant

about purchasing a foreclosed property. "It kind of feels like

you're an opportunist, taking advantage of someone else's misfortune," she said.

Diehl said eliminating that stigma is part of what the tour is about, especially because the vacant homes resulting from foreclosure are like an anchor on the housing market. Diehl hopes their efforts help get the market back on track.

"Certainly that's not going to happen until we get some of these vacant properties sold and get families back into them," he said. "This is the greatest buyer's market that we've seen in 20 years."

year-old mother in Mexico, for fear that word would get back to her. "So when I call my

mother in Mexico, she asks me 'How are you? How's the house?" " Francisco said through a translator. "She's so worried about me and my family."

After years of renting, Francisco was able to establish good credit, buy a car and get a credit card. He wanted to buy a house so his six children would have someplace to play, something many landlords had discouraged.

Because of his solid

credit, purchased by working two jobs. Francisco's family members came to him and suggested they all buy a large house together, four bedrooms on the second floor and two on the first floor.

"I knew since the beginning that just by myself it was going to be really difficult (to pay for the house)," Francisco said. "I didn't want it. If it was just me I would have bought something smaller."

But in the beginning it worked out well. Francisco bought the house for about \$310,000, and his share of

the mortgage payment worked out to about \$700 a month.

"I felt happy," he said. "I saw the big house, the big yard. My family would be able to play here."

But as bills started to come in for water, electricity and other necessary items, Francisco's family decided the house was too expensive, and left.

After their departure Francisco tried to work with a friend and refinance the house. But the friend took equity from the home and left, too.

So Francisco, desperate

for help, found his way to the Interfaith Housing Center of the Northern Suburbs in June 2007, as he stopped making his mortgage payments that had jumped to \$2,200.

"I tried calling the bank and asking for help," he said. "But the bank told me that the only way to help him was the refinance again. I was already behind and my credit wasn't OK."

Jasmine Brewer, Fair Housing Coordinator with Interfaith, said her efforts have kept Francisco and his family from being foreclosed on, and that she was hopeful the situation would be resolved positively.

"I'm really thankful for Jasmine," Francisco said. "I'm really thankful with the people because they're helping me to keep my house. I can have hope now that I can probably save my house."


But he feels the stigma of foreclosure, too.

"A lot of people are telling me, 'Oh, how silly vou were, vou weren't able to pay,' " he said. "But I trusted my family, I trusted my wife's family and they just left."





Magic Slim and Shirley Johnson both came to Chicago because they knew it was the capital of the blues.

This Saturday, they'll both play at a blues show that's a little ways outside the city — the first-ever Mount Prospect Blues Festival.

Magic Slim first came to Chicago in the 1950s from his home state of Mississippi, but he quickly realized he wasn't ready to play blues guitar alongside the other musicians.

"They said I couldn't play so they wouldn't let me sit in with them," Slim recalls. "So I said, 'I'm go-



ing to get myself together and I'm gonna fix 'em.' ... I used to play a little bluegrass and country and western, you know? But I couldn't hardly play too much blues, 'cause I wasn't around nobody that played it. That's why I had to go back and get myself straightened out."

Roots revisit

Slim went back to Mississippi, learned how to play the blues in juke joints, then came back to Chicago and became a står. The tall, skinny kid got his nickname from his friend, Magic Sam, who also advised him to come up with his own style of playing guitar.

"Well, see, I know what

he thought," Slim says. "He thought that I couldn't do that. But I did it. So here I am."

Describing the sound that he came up with, Slim says, "I want it to be a little bit raw. I want it to be a little bit dirty. I don't want it to be too clean, 'cause, see, I'm a bluesman."

Slim, who just recorded a new album for Blind Pig Records, never knows for sure what he's going to play in concert.

"I don't need no set list," he says. "See, I play by ear and I play according to the public. I can do any song you name."

Gospel heritage

Shirley Johnson, a Virginia native with a new record coming out this fall on Chicago's Delmark label, grew up singing gospel.

"And then I decided I

wanted to do some blues,' she says. "Somebody said, 'You've got to go to Chicago if you want to sing the blues.' And that's what I did. I came to Chicago in 1983 — to learn how to sing the blues. Because I thought I knew how, but I didn't."

She says she learned by trial and error, becoming a regular at Chicago blues clubs. Johnson sings the blues, but she often sings it like soul music.

"There are some blues that are raw blues. You just holler it out." she says. "But I like that blues where you put a little sugar in it and sing it with a feeling. I like to feel what I'm singing about."

Johnson says her family preferred gospel music over blues, but she thinks of the musical genres as "first cousins."

The Mount Prospect Blues Festival, organized by the village and the Blues Bar, will begin at 2 p.m. in front of Village Hall with BTS Express, followed by Ms. Peaches at 3:30 p.m., Shirley Johnson at 4 p.m., Nellie "Tiger" Travis at 4:30 p.m., Cadillac Dave and the Chicago Redhots at 5:30 p.m., and Magic Slim and the Teardrops at 7:30 p.m. Meanwhile, the village will also hold a Fine Arts Festival from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. along Emerson Street and Busse Avenue.

form, while comics remained relatively insular and ignored by adults. But something rather amazing happened in 1986 to change all that. Comics --- as the cliché came to be repeated in hundreds of reports that followed ----

"grew up." The publication that year of two graphic novels, or book-length comics, altered the course of comic book history forever: Frank Miller's Return of the Dark Knight and Art Spiegelman's Pulitzer Prize-winning Maus.

These two graphic novels were by no means the first of their kind. The long-form comic book had been around sporadically since the early 1950s, but none had the impact that these two masterworks exerted on both geek and popular culture. And the two graphic novels could not have been more different.

Tarnished Knight

Return of the Dark Knight was a re-imagining of the Batman superhero which, until that point, had never quite overcome the silliness' and campy commercialization that the TV show had inflicted upon the originally noirish Batman image. Miller's version of Batman was a return to form and then some. Aimed at a strictly adult audience, the new Batman was reconceived as a sadistic, violent and

lex Ross of Glenview is one of the major superstar artists in the superhero comic book world and he will be appearing at this year's Wizard World Chicago comic book convention on Saturday to present his latest title by Dynamite Entertainment called Project Superpowers. This new project resurrects a number of for-

vengeful vigilante with a very un-PC and sociopathic personality disorder. Also aimed at an adult

audience, Maus was a semiautobiographical look at the Holocaust, specifically Spiegelman's father's experiences before, during and after his incarceration in a Nazi concentration camp. The genius of it, beyond the riveting story itself, was the artist/author's Animal Farm-like portrayal of Jews

as mice, Germans as cats, Poles as pigs, Americans as dogs and French as (what else?) frogs.

While Dark Knight represented a radical updating of the superhero genre. Maus epitomized the fruition of a new genre of comic book, the so-called Alternative school that traced its beginnings to the Underground Comix movement of R. Crumb and his countercultural associates during the

'60s and '70s. Although there have been plenty of adult-fare superhero comics and graphic novels to follow in the wake of Dark Knight — not to mention \cdot the repackaging of older serialized Marvel and DC superhero stories archived into book-length pseudo graphic novels - the subsequent proliferation of Alternative comics and graphic novels accounts for the biggest area of growth

from the 1990s to the present.

Duality rules

Today's superhero and Alternative comics worlds embody a kind of schizophrenic fissure in comic book culture and, at least until recently, readers of one kind rarely strayed into the opposite camp. However, that too is beginning to change. There are superhero stories being

vritten with decidedly re alistic, humanistic and 'emo" characteristics. And there are Alternative comics with fantastic or supernatural elements that make them difficult to cat egorize as purely Alternative fare.

Meanwhile, comic book conventions like Wizard World kowtow pretty exclusively to the superhero crowd and this is also a reflection of the attitude at most comic book shops around the country. Furthermore, Wizard World and San Diego's Comic Con International are now as much about superhero movies, TV shows, computer games and action figures as they are about the comics they are derived from. The late "king" of superhero comics, Jack Kirby, famously predicted at the second San Diego con in 1970 (attended by a mere 300 fans) that the convention would one day take over the whole city of San Diego — and that Hollywood filmmakers would be attending to get ideas for their next big superhero movie. That is precisely what is happening today.

Alternative graphic novels are represented on film as well (Road to Perdition, Ghost World, American Splendor, Persepholis) and are increasingly making their presence felt at traditional book store chains where there are now entire sections devoted to graphic novels, as well as manga (Japanese graphic novels, which are another subject entirely).

Generation Next folks currently coming-of-age are almost as conversant about the latest graphic novel as Generation X-ers were about grunge music. The main difference is that graphic novels show no signs of being a temporary trend. Indeed, they may be here to stay, well into the 21st century.

Get Smart $\star \star \star$

It's hard for me to be fair and unbiased about this review because I'm still nurturing a grievance about the old "Get Smart" TV show

Around the age of seven or thereabouts, I spent something like half a year's allowance on a "Get Smart" fountain pen radio that claimed to tune in secret transmissions if you grounded the antenna to a large metal object. I spent about six hours tethered to the water meter outside of my house one day, holding that pen up like an idiot and listen-

ing, listening — and what did I get? Would you believe ... a little static? Maybe the 1910 Fruitgum Company singing "Yummy Yummy Yummy I Got Love in My Tummy"? No. I got bupkis. Zero. Nada. Very Maxwell Smart-

like behavior, actually, now that I think about it. Maybe that was the point. Or maybe it was a "Man From Uncle" fountain pen radio and my rage has been misplaced all these years

Not that it matters, really, because I can't bring myself to slam this perfectly pleasant, more-orless satisfactory revamp out of petty vindictiveness. It's too much fun and it has too many little moments of comic inspiration (well, two or three or four, anyway). And all the stuff that makes it tedious from time to time — the elaborate stunts, the chase scenes, the big ex-

plosions - are no worse than par for the course for a summer action comedy. And, best of all, it has

Steve Carell as the supremely-confident-forno-good-reason secret agent Maxwell Smart. His Max may not be quite as absurdly funny as the Don Adams original in Mel Brooks' classic 1965 TV spy spoof, but he brings a touch of good-heartedness to the role that gives the character a welcome new dimension. When Carell's Max winds up dancing with a plus-plus-plus-size partner during a ballroom scene at a bad-guy's mansion, the joke isn't on her — or on him. Max *chooses* her and proceeds to triumph with her over the svelte, smooth-stepping, Armand Assante-esque villain and a group of nasty wenches sneering on the sidelines.

That's a nice touch, because the new Max knows

what it's like to be sneered at. The old Agent 86 was oblivious to his ineptitude. impervious to insult and more or less unaware that his supercool arrogance was completely unfounded. Carell's 86 keeps up that same cool facade, but underneath we know he's thinking "I used to be enormously overweight. I failed the field agent's test eight times. And I really wish I hadn't inhaled that poison blowdart." I won't say that hint of chagrin gives Max Shakespearean depth, but it does introduces an element of sympathy that makes it a lot easier to spend two hours with him

Story-wise, there's not a lot going on here. On his first field assignment (after all the other available agents have been killed or compromised) Max and Agent 99 (Anne Hathaway) are sent to Russia to track down some stolen uranium. And they eventually uncover a CHAOS plot to nuke Los Angeles Which doesn't seem to concern anyone very much

Fortunately, there's some verv nice comic chemistry between Carell and Hathaway (who does a very nice job of channeling Barbara Feldon, but

with a much feistier attitude) and Carell and Alan Arkin, ideally cast as CONTROL's weary, belea guered Chief. And there are a better-than-average number of laughs in the slam-bang slapstick comedy orchestrated by director Peter Segal ("Anger Management," "The Longest Yard").

The most pleasant surprise, though, is the presence of a couple of elegant sight gags that give the film a touch of unexpected sophistication — most notably a bit in which Max walks on the water of a pond to punch the code of a secret entry on the back of a duck Ah yes. It's the old lift-

ing-up-the-surface-of-the water-to-reveal-a-hiddenstaircase trick. CGI was never put to better use.



THE INCREDIBLE HULK ****** 1/2

It's too bad we actually have to sit and watch this movie and work our way through all the obligatory stuff about character, plot and all that other dramatic blah blah. It would be so much more fun to play this one like a video game and just smash, smash, smash all the time. That's what's gratifying about "The Incredible Hulk" – if the idea of pitching a temper tantrum with enough muscle power to rip a skyscraper up by the roots appeals to you on a deep dark fantasy level. Taking time out between rampages to check in on the troubles of Hulk's skinny alter ego just kills that good primal-rage buzz. The cerebral and

intense Ed Norton (a real study in contrasts compared to the musclebound, entirely non-cerebral Green Goliath) plays scientist Bruce Banner, searching for a cure to the gamma radiation that transforms him into the Hulk whenever he surrenders to a fit of pique. He's on the run from a ruthless general (William Hurt) planning to use Hulk extract to create a new breed of super-soldiers. Also from a gung-ho mercenary (Tim Roth), who uses same to transform himself into the monstrous, Hulk-hating Abomination. Nonetheless, he takes time out for some exceedingly drippy romance wedged in with Banner's faithful old girlfriend (Liv Tyler). Director Louis eterrier was no doubt hired because he packed so much energy into the excellent action thriller 'The Transporter," but the emphasis here, no doubt thanks to Norton's script rewrites, is on making the story seem as real and as human as possible. Unfortunately, that means the qualities that make "The Incredible Hulk" such a successful comic book story - its fun and fan tasy and raging animus – get short shrift. (BI) Rated PG-13 for

19 years to be precise – but they got it right. The third sequel in the "Indiana Jones" franchise is fastpaced, funny and packed with oldfashioned thrills from start to finish. It's hard to imagine that even the most finicky fan won't get a major kick out of this Cold War action extravaganza, in which Indy races evil Russkies (led by Cate Blanchett as a butch Soviet army scientist) to a lost city in the Amazon – with the fate of the world at stake. The screenplay by David Koepp ("Jurassic Park," "Spider-Man," "War of the Worlds") places just the right amount of emphasis on Indy's advancing age without getting tiresome on the subject and it features a couple of satisfying surprises. The most impressive thing about this movie, though, is its character-driven charm. You'd think that after it opens with the action archeologist trapped in a nuclear blast zone, everything would be downhill from there. But Spielberg and company manage to make it almost as entertaining when he's slowly sinking in a pit of

WHEN DID YOU LAST SEE YOUR FATHER? **★★★ 1/2**

Somewhere between a young boy's assessment of his father as "infallible, invincible, immortal" and his adult reappraisal of dad as "a mean-spirited, narrow-minded. sanctimonious old sod." the real man is in there hiding behind an Oedipal hedge ~ and it's the business of "When Did You Last See Your Father?" to get at the truth of the matter. And it does, in an oblique, not-quite-revelatory, entirely one-sided manner. Just don't expect the sort of capital-C catharsis and clarification that

comes as standard equipment in most movies that put paid to long, troubled, complex relationships. "When Did You Last See Your Father?" has all the loose ends and unanswered questions and imperfect understandings of real life Colin Firth and Jim Broadbent star as resentful son and domineering father, returned to close proximity when the latter develops terminal cancer - based on the best-selling memoir by British poet and author Blake Morrison, Director Anand Tucker ("Shopgirl," "Hilary and Jackie") skillfully unearths Blake's grievances, flashing back from the death watch to numerous scenes from his childhood and adolescence. Most of them are minor (his boyhood nickname was "fathead") and his bitterness would seem petty if it weren't for his likely susnicion that his father had a longterm affair with a family friend and that her daughter may be his halfsister. Even on that score, though, Blake is reluctant to ask his father

for real answers, meaning that the story is limited to his point of view - and an emotional distance that suggests he's more like his selfabsorbed old man than he'd care to admit. (BI) (92 min.) Rated PG-13 for sexual content, thematic material and brief strong language.

YOU DON'T MESS WITH THE ZOHAN **

Adam Sandler and his crew seem to have had a good time making this strained, raunchy, politically questionable comedy about a Mossad super-commando who would much rather be styling hair. Too bad it doesn't work out that way for the audience. Sandler is strange from the outset as The Zohan, a good-natured guy who's tired of all the fighting between Arabs and Israelis and would prefer to disco dance and dream of cutting hair the Paul Mitchell way (circa 1984) than battle one more time with his Palestinian archnemesis The Phantom (John Turturro) He's a national hero. though, so the only way out is to fake his death and escape to New York City - where he finds getting work in a salon harder than battling terrorists. He's actually pretty good at the latter, having perfected the technique of catching bullets with his nostrils. No kidding. The comedy, directed by Dennis Dugan ("I Now Pronounce You Chuck and Larry." "The Bench Warmers") contains just enough wacky stuff (like Zohan dropping a pirana down his speedo to prove how tough he is) to provide a few laughs here and there, but there's not much evidence of Judd Apatow's presence as a screenwriter (along with Sandler and "Triump the Comic Insult Dog" creator Robert Smigel) and it runs out of steam long before it's over. An uncomfortably long time before it's over. (BI) Rated PG-13 for crude and sexual content throughout, language and nudity.



The author connects with her characters so completely, that it is easy for a reader to relate to them, too. "The idea is to make the characters sort of approachable," Etzioni-Halevy said. "I'm in love

with them myself. I could n't write about them otherwise"

That certainly applies to Deborah, who the author described as "the most eminent woman in the Old Testament of the Bible. She's sort of a super leader. She's like a president and a chief justice and what we would call today a chief rabbi, all wrapped in one. People adored her. That's enough of a reason to write about her. But, in addition, the Bible tells the most amazing story about her."

increase in demand well into this century as baby boomers age and retire. Not only will there be a shortage due to an reasing aging nursing work force but also due to an increase in the number of clderly population. The elderly population is predicted to increase by 20% for a total of 71 million by 2030 according the Center for Disease Control (CDC). These factors will influence growth for several years into the future. A job growth of 18 to 26 percent has been predicted by the Department of Labor for nursing. Additionally, the Department of Labor states that positions in healthcare provided 13.5 million jobs in 2004 and more will be created between now and 2014. Getting Training

Most hospitals require nurses to work at least one year on the medical surgical floor or telemetry before being able to move to the ICU. Experience on the floor. provides a background which makes transition to this high paced environment casicr. There is still a period of a few months before a floor nurse can feel comfortable in the critical care area. A mentor is usually provided to help the nurse to adjust. A critical care course may be required at most facilities to understand the complexities of patient care.

Hospitals may take new graduates who have completed their senior Role Transition Course in the ICU. ICU nurses are respected by physicians who depend on their expertise and skills. Nursing students are drawn to the area as they can experience a variety of situations that require critical thinking skills. Excellent oral and written communication is essential as well as problem solving, prioritizing, flexibility, the ability to change and organize. Ability

to be technology savvy is essential as varied equipment and computers are used in day to day care. The work can be draining as patients are critical and continually in need of intense monitoring. complex treatment and adjusting of ultiple intravenous medications.

When opening occurs most places do not have difficulty finding candidates. A berry good way to enjoy fresh fruit

"They have a chance to appreciate and experience the process, and interact with the grower directly," hé said.

Family fun

"It's a family thing," added Judy Jacobson of Apple Barn Orchard and Winery in Elkhorn, Wis., who's been growing strawberries more than 11 years. Already-picked berries make life easier for those who don't have time to pick their own, but "a lot of families like to come out who do canning and enjoy (picking) fresh strawberries"

Visitors can expect a visual smorgasbord of bright red berries nestled among the green leaves. To further delight your taste buds, schedule berry picking excursions at various times of the growing season to take advantage of different berry varieties as they become available.

A few berry favorites include Annapolis, a good early grower and Honeoye, another early season grower with a nice, red color throughout. Cabot is a smaller, firmer fruit and Jewel, a firm, later-sea-

son berry turns a nice wine red in color: L'Amour, is a late-season berry.

> Fresh or frozen

> > Berries are perfect eating both now or later. To freeze whole or crushed strawberries

for later use, first

wash, remove stems then slice into container. Mix in desired sugar to sweeten. After sugar dissolves, put berries into freezer bags, allowing at least a half-inch space at top for expansion.

Gary's Strawberry Wine

A refreshing dessert wine from Walvoord Farm.

2 quarts cleaned, frozen berries Cheesecloth Glass gallon jug or container 8 C sugar 1 large party balloon Activated yeast String Hose for siphoning

Freeze two quarts of unsweetened berries. Once frozen, the juice will sepaate from the berries

Thaw and pour juice into a glass container. Strain the remaining berries hrough cheesecloth.

Add 8 cups of sugar and 1 teaspoon of activated yeast. Fill to neck of bottle. Put balloon over neck of bottle and tie with string. The balloon will inflate to $\ddot{}$ half its size. When the balloon lies flat — about 3 to 4 weeks — the wine is ready. Siphon wine out, leaving the last half-inch of sediment waste products at the bottom of the bottle.

The result is a sweet dessert wine with a higher alcohol content than most store-bought wines. Reduce yeast for a sweeter, lower alcohol content wine.

Strawberry Salsa

A new way to use your berries from Apple Barn Orchard and Winery.

2 1/2 C fine chopped fresh strawberries 1 C chopped green or other color pepper 2 T minced fresh parsley 2 T chopped green onion 1/3 C Catalina salad dressing Cilantro leaves chopped, to taste Hot sauce Black pepper Tortílla chips

Combine berries, peppers, onion and parsley. Stir in salad dressing; add hot auce and black pepper as desired. Cover and refrigerate two hours. Sprinkle with chopped cilantro. Serve with tortilla chips. Makes three cups.

Pick your own strawberries

"And the game is different for girls. There is not as much contact. But the game is growing among girls. Overall, you don't see many serious injuries."




"No one in that stadium (at Eastern Illinois University) expected us to even be in the hunt," Lonergan said. "So for us to win it was truly something."






