Hello!

Thank you so much for your past purchase(s)! Seed processing is now complete and our 2022 – 2023 catalog of available seeds is here! 2022 was once again an interesting year. Our 4 year old daughter was expected to have heart surgery in January, but then it got delayed until early May, and then delayed again until late May. Everything went very well, and she is doing great, but she was in the hospital for 3 weeks after; so, needless to say, collecting seeds was a little more difficult this year, so the number of seeds we were able to collect this season was down a little, but we still have some new and interesting things.

PLEASE NOTE: You can still purchase some of our items on the Ebay store, but MANY are not listed there. **Only about 1/3 of our items are listed on Ebay!** In addition, because of Ebay's excessive fees, the number of seeds offered there are less, versus directly ordering from us in the catalog. So, the best value, and perhaps easiest for both of us, is to simply email us your order directly and we can send you a direct PayPal invoice.

Note that all seeds are “first come, first served,” so orders are filled on a basis of when they are received – so get your orders in soon to prevent items being sold out! **To see images of each flower, please visit the “Catalog Pictures” link below!** All seed packets are \$2. Shipping is a standard \$4.50 - \$5.00, depending on location (the cheapest a padded envelope can be sent), for up to about 25 packets. If you want more than 25 packets, it may increase shipping slightly. Please note that if the USPS changes their shipping prices for a standard bubble envelope, then shipping cost will likely increase to match that.

Guide to the Catalog

Latin Name – shows the Latin name of the plant

Common Name – shows one of the common names of the plant

- shows the approximate number of seeds per packet

Avail – shows availability:

☉ indicates normal availability;

L indicates limited number of seed is available;

VL indicates a very limited number of seed is available;

2018 indicates no new crop this year, but last year's is still available, if desired;

Dur – shows duration of plant:

P – perennial, the plant lives 3+ years (usually much more)

A – annual, the plant lives only one year, or one growing season

B – biennial, the plant comes up, persists through a winter, and then dies after blooming

Other Symbols:

☀ - grows in full sun

☁ - grows in part sun

☀ - grows in full shade

🍷 - is said to be edible, in part or in full

💧 - prefers moist soil

☠ - parts or all of the plant are poisonous

🐝 - plants is a hummingbird favorite

🦋 - plant attracts butterflies



- plant attracts bees



- plant has medicinal or herbal applications

GROWING INSTRUCTIONS

The best time to plant wildflower seeds is either in the fall, winter, or early spring. Wildflowers are different from garden annuals and vegetables - wildflowers are very tough, so they can handle the cold, in fact, some even require a “cold period” to break seed dormancy.

If you wish, you can plant the seeds in spring. And you can even plant them in the fall... around September/October, and they will either come up then, and overwinter as a tiny plant, or they will come up in March/April. If you plant in the spring, it should be early, if you wait too long in the spring, it will be too hot, and then you'll need to water the seeds/seedlings frequently so they don't die while they are getting established. But, if you plant them as soon as the soil is not frozen, they should be able to get growing and become established before scorching summer heat. If you live in an area (like the South) where it gets hot very quickly in the spring, then fall/winter may be your best time to plant. Some wildflowers even NEED a cold period, to break their dormancy so they germinate! Most wild flower nurseries recommend fall planting as the best time to plant seeds.

Depending on how you have things set up for your garden, you can either mix all the seeds yourself and spread them, or you can do what we normally advise people to do, which is to plant them as individual species, rather than scattering them all together. The individual method gives you better control over the area, and also allows you to monitor what comes up. I would advise that you scatter each individual species in an area that is 3 inches by 3 inches, or if you have more area available, then use a 10 inch by 10 inch area for each species. Take about... say 15 - 20 seeds of 1 species, and spread it in an area... and just press them down into the soil slightly.... and then, move a few inches over, and do the same with the 2nd species... and then, the same with the 3rd... and so on. Mark where each one is... at least with a stick, if nothing else, and probably mark what each one is, too. (I usually make maps of my gardens on paper, but you could also just number them or something.) I also advise not to use the whole packet at one time - these seeds are fresh, from just this past season, so germination rate should be high. So, I would use the seeds sparingly, and save the excess seed (in the fridge will keep them freshest) and then, if you don't have luck the first time you try planting, you can try again, or try them in a new area!
