JULY MONTHLY MEETING REPORT

Again Covid disrupted our Monthly meeting ... this time our guest speaker Peter Ball tested positive and was unable to attend.

Vice President Les opened the meeting, welcomed members and guests and updated members on Management Committees activities.

Ian led the way for the 'Show, Tell and Ask' segment this month. He brought in some Neoregelia hybrids that he showed the group about 15 months ago. Ian hasn't named any of these plants yet. Some of the Hybrids were:

Neo. 'Brazil Red' X. Neo. 'Red Opal' ... a very small species showing some nice colour.

Neo. 'Brazil Red' X **Neo.** 'Sugar Mill' ... Ian showed us two plants that showed how siblings of the same cross can vary.

lan also showed the group Neoregelia 'Kingfisher' and Vriesea 'King David'

Maxine brought a *Catopsis sp.* from her collection that has become very soft and the centre is not looking very healthy and ask the group what their suggestions were. General consensus was that it has been effected by the cold weather and the excessive rain we have had this autumn/winter. It was suggested the it be repotted and given some fertiliser and a tonic solution, ie. Seasol. Maxine also asked about why *Tillandsia magnispica* flushes but doesn't flower. It was suggested that it was the environment here in Hervey Bay are not conducive to flowering.

Les briefed the group on the recent visit by the BSQ Tillandsia Study Group to the Fraser Coast. The study group visited a number of gardens on the Saturday. Sunday morning saw the group meet at Les & Jan's for the normal session where each member has to "Show, Tell and/or Ask' about plant in their private collections. One of the interesting aspects is the difference in flowering times between Greater Brisbane, Sunny Coast and Fraser Coast.

Sue provided a background briefing on her *Tillandsia tenuifolia var. saxicola* as did Narelle on her *Vriesea* 'Vogue'.



BOOKS IN OUR LIBRARY ...

Bromeliaceae III

by Francisco Oliviva-Esteve (2002)



This book captures the beauty of a total of 320 bromeliad species from throughout Venezuela representing 29 genera. each species is described and pictured. Spectacular habitat photographs set the scene for the plants.

The book starts with a short historical review of the first explorers of Venezuela and their discoveries of Bromeliads.

The following Bromeliad sub-families and genuses are represented:

- 1. Bromelioideae ... Aechmea, Bilbergia, Canistropsis, Canistrum, Cryptanthus, Hohenbergia, Neoregelia, Orthophytum, Portea, Queselia, Ronnbergia
- 2. Tillandsioideae ... Alcantarea, Catopsis, Guzmania, Mezobromelia, Racinaea, Tillandsia, Vriesea, Werauhia, and
- 3. Pitcairnioideae ... Brewcaria, Deuterocohnia, Dyckia, Encholirium, Fosterella, Hechtia, Lindmania, Navia, Pitcairnia, Puya.

This hard covered book is written in English ... its 274 pages contain photos 564 photos (color) and 18 line drawings (color and b/w).


