From Our Education Chair

Aechmea biflora (? cultivar)

The picture on our <u>SCURF</u> front cover displays an exceptionally beautiful *Aechmea* from the *Streptocalyx* sub-genus (former taxon name was *Streptocalyx biflorus*). This plant was purchased from Bullis Nursery in Dade County. At maturity, it has a diameter of 60 inches (Picture 1) and a conical shaped inflorescence (Picture 2) that is 8 inches tall and 5 inches wide.



Aechmea biflora is so named because it generates two flowers per fascicle. It originates from the low lands in Ecuador and will grow epiphytically, although like many Bromeliads, larger when grown as a terrestrial. The sexually immature plant will have orange-red tipped leaves when grown "hard" (Picture 3) and its leaves will all turn red at anthesis (Picture 1).

The chart below contrasts our cover specimen with other *Aechmeas* that have similar shape but different colors of their floral bracts, calyx or corolla. Although *Aechmea nidularioides* forma yellow also has yellow floral bracts, note that it has white flowers like the red floral bract form in contradistinction to our *biflora* specimen which has an orange corolla and yellow calyx. Pictures of *Aechmea biflora* on the internet, including the <u>FCBS.org</u> picture site, all show violet tipped white-yellow corolla with a yellow calyx. These distinctions suggest that the cover plant may be a cultivar of the prototypical *Aechmea biflora*.
