Trees	 <p><b>Acacia melanoxydon - Blackwood</b> – very fast growing and long lived tree reaching 20 m - long olive green leaves - pale yellow flowers in Wi &amp; Sp - cabinet timber - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>Casuarina cunninghamiana - River Oak</b> - fast growing tree to 20 m - dark green needle like foliage - tolerates poorly drained &amp; saline soils - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>Eucalyptus argophloia - Chinchilla White Gum</b> - stately white trunked tree to 25 m - smooth weeping branches - wh. flowers in Su - excellent timber - grows well in deep heavy poorly drained soils - ideal for avenues – frost, drought resistant..</p>	 <p><b>Eucalyptus scoparia - Wallangarra White Gum</b> - fast growing ornamental tree to 15 m - smooth straight white trunk - willow like olive green foliage – frost, drought resistant.</p>		
Shrubs/sml trees (> 2m)	 <p><b>Banksia occidentalis - Red Swamp Banksia</b> - one of the easiest banksias to grow, it forms a dense shrub to 3 m - narrow dark green serrated leaves - bears ruby red cylindrical flower spikes during Au - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>Callistemon Purple Splendour</b> - hardy shrub to 2 m - stiff dark green leaves - large showy purple bottlebrushes in Sp - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>Callistemon sp. Bolivia Pink</b> - rare shrub from near Bolivia Hill growing to 3m tall - oval green leaves - bright pink brushes in summer - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>G. Poorinda Constance</b> - vigorous and hardy shrub to 2 m - dark green oval leaves - orange red spider flowers much of the year - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>G. Winpara Gold</b> - fast growing shrub to 2 m - attractive grey green foliage - decorative pink &amp; yellow flower clusters in Wi &amp; Sp - frost tolerant.</p>	 <p><b>Melaleuca Seafoam</b> - compact shrub to 3 m - narrow linear leaves - a spectacular massed display of pure white brushes occurs in late Sp - hardy in poorly drained soils - moderately frost resistant.</p>
Shrubs (1-2m)	 <p><b>G. John Evans</b> - hardy shrub to 1 m - narrow dark green leaves turning reddish in Wi - masses of red spider flowers in Wi &amp; Sp - frost resistant - tolerant of heavy clay.</p>	 <p><b>G. Pink Pearl</b> (syn. G. Canberra Gem) - dense shrub to 2 m - prickly foliage - reddish pink flower clusters most of the year - frost hardy.</p>	 <p><b>G. Poorinda Tranquility</b> - shrub to 1 m - small soft linear grey green leaves - pale pink and cream flower clusters in Wi and Sp - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>G. rosmarinifolia Lutea</b> - hardy shrub to 2.5 m - green prickly needle like foliage - greenish yellow flowers in Wi and Sp - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>G. Semperflorens</b> - the first recorded grevillea hybrid, growing to 2 m tall - soft fine foliage on arching branches - yellow &amp; pink flowers most of the year - frost tolerant.</p>	 <p><b>G. Splendour</b> - hardy shrub to 3 m - dark green pointed leaves - large ruby red flower clusters most of the year - frost resistant - useful for hedges - part shade.</p>
Shrubs (< 1m)	 <p><b>Callistemon citrinus White Anzac</b> - attractive dense shrub to 1.5 m - oval green leaves - white bottlebrushes in Sp &amp; Au - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>Correa Country Belle</b> – (syn. C. New Year) – upright shrub to 1.5 m tall – dark green felted oval leaves – this shrub is showy with green tipped red bells during the Au months – tolerant of frost.</p>	 <p><b>Correa Jester</b> - shrub to 1 m high - soft green aromatic foliage - large red &amp; yellow bells in Au &amp; Wi - frost tolerant.</p>	 <p><b>Eremophila maculata aurea</b> - spreading shrub to 1.5 m high by 2 m wide - narrow dark green leaves - clear yellow tubular flowers over a long period - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>G. Scarlet Sprite</b> - dense shrub to 2 m - green prickly needle like foliage - prolific scarlet flowers in Wi and Sp - frost resistant.</p>	
	 <p><b>Homoranthus prolixus</b> - rare shrub from near Copeton Dam growing to 0.3 m high x 1.5 m wide - tiny blue green linear leaves give the plant a layered appearance - small golden yellow honey rich flowers in Sp - frost &amp; drought tolerant.</p>	 <p><b>Melaleuca lateritia - Robin Redbreast Bush</b> - Erect and open shrub to 1.5m - soft linear green leaves - large outstanding orange brushes inside the shrub in late Sp and Su - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>Philothea myoporoides subsp. acuta</b> - hardy shrub to 1.5 m tall - small green aromatic leaves - pink buds followed by starry wh. flowers in Sp - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>Spyridium scortechinii</b> - a dense shrub to 1 m for rockery or container culture - small pointed leaves - round woolly flower heads surrounded by golden brown bracts in Wi &amp; Sp, ideal for picking &amp; drying - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>Westringia Jervis Gem</b> - a compact dwarf form of Wynyabbie Gem, this westringia grows to 1 m high - foliage similar to W. fruticosa - lilac flowers most of the year - salt tolerant.</p>	
Ground covers	 <p><b>Callistemon Firebrand</b> - low spreading shrub growing 1 m tall x 2.5 m wide - green oval but pointed leaves - large red bottlebrushes late Sp - Su - frost hardy.</p>	 <p><b>Goodenia ovata prostrate</b> - vigorous groundcover with a diameter of 1.5 m - fresh green ovate leaves with toothed margins - yellow flowers most of the year - tolerates frost &amp; some shade.</p>	 <p><b>G. aquifolium Lake Wartook</b> - very hardy dense spreading shrub to 0.5 m - green holly like leaves - dark red toothbrush flowers in Wi, Sp &amp; Su - tolerates clay soils &amp; is frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>G. Carol Ann (G. juniperina x G. Forest Rambler)</b> - decumbent hardy plant 2 m in width - dense non prickly foliage with an occasional upward growing branch - dark red spider flowers over a long period - frost &amp; drought tolerant.</p>	 <p><b>G. Winter Delight (G. lanigera x lavandulacea)</b> - hardy groundcover reaching 30 cm tall x 1.5 m across - soft grey linear leaves - showy red &amp; cream flowers in Wi &amp; Sp - frost resistant.</p>	 <p><b>Leptospermum Pacific Beauty</b> - vigorous groundcover growing to 30 cm high - fine lacy foliage - masses of pink buds opening to wh. flowers in Sp - frost resistant.</p>
