January 2019

Despite yo-yo weather in 2018 we had a season of growth. I look forward to producing and selling more plants in 2019.

2018 saw more demand for our top selling introduction *Rudbeckia x* 'American Gold Rush'. It is on its way to popularity, while 'Glitters like Gold' is just getting noticed. *Andropogon gerardii* 'Blackhawks' and 'Red October' are still hot. The two newest *Geums* 'Cherry Bomb' PPAF and 'Top Shelf Margarita' PPAF both sold well in their first year. *Sedum x* 'Pillow Talk' sales held steady. Both of the *Stachys x* 'Summer Crush' PPAF and 'Summer Romance' PP#30,243 are poised to increase in sales since *Stachys monieri* 'Hummelo' is the Perennial Plant Associations plant of the year. As I look at our future introductions many are grasses including more *Pennisetums*. This year we are introducing a small *Pennisetum alopecuroides* with golden yellow foliage called 'Yellow Ribbons' PPAF. It's size and habit are close to 'Hameln' but the thin foliage goes from a bright gold to chartreuse yellow by late summer. *Panicum virgatum* 'Prairie Dog' PPAF is our first Switch grass introduction and was selected for its clean upright gray foliage on relatively short 4-5' plants. Large inflorescence covers the top third of the plant.

Additional new perennials this year include 15 new Hostas. Many are the best new varieties from Walters Gardens. Orostachys x 'Octopus Garden' is our newest seed strain, a vigorous blend of grav-green, silvered, and plum succulent foliage in overlapping rosettes topped with pointed creamy spikes in fall. It is super attractive to pollinators too. Prunella vulgaris 'Magdalena' PPAF has both a larger habit and foliage than the species. It also has regular rebloom after the initial heavy bloom in mid-June. The fingered foliage always looks nice. These plants are very adaptable and native to 48 states. Even the dark purple seed heads are showy. I'm pleased Sedum x 'Bundle of Joy' PPAF is our fourth Proven Winners plant. It is a white sport of 'Pure Joy' and has the same great dome shaped habit, 1' tall by 15-20" wide. Sedum x 'Lime Joy' PPAF has exceptional vigor yielding 200 plants within a year. In July the lime green buds resemble Hydrangea in bud and could make a nice cut flower. By September strong stems hold 6-8" flower heads of deep pink. Sedum x 'Sunset Boulevard' PPAF is a sister seedling to 'Pillow Talk' with both darker, reddish-pink flowers and wine colored seed heads above rose and green colored foliage. The foliage adds vellow and orange fall color as the season ends putting on an extra show for October. We have two new Veronicas one is 'Blue Skywalker' a deep blue from Walters and our intro. Veronica x 'Kiss the Sky' PPAF which has extra long, sky blue flowers above gray-green clean foliage all on 24" + plants.

I look forward to showing these and many other plants this year and encourage you to visit. IPG will be on the Sunday July 28th PPA tour before the Chicago symposium. If you can't make it during PPA consider attending our 5th annual Ornamental Grasses day, Friday September 13th, 2019. This is a perfect time to see most of our ornamental grasses at their peak.



Availability

Our plants are primarily grown and overwintered outside without heat resulting in Hebron Hardy perennials! Availability begins the first week of April and continues through October. For best results order from our weekly list.

Price Quotes

Price quotes are generally returned the same day as requested. Please call if you do not receive a response within 24 hours. Price quotes are good for the calendar year they are quoted in.

Pick Ups & Orders

While we do not require minimum quantity orders, we do request your help in making peak season (April-June) orders less confusing by ordering in full case quantities. Full case quantities are as follows: 6-1 gallon per tray; 12-4 1/2" (qts.) per tray. 2 and 3 gallon pots will be sold individually. Our plugs come in 50 plug trays and 70 plug trays.

Orders can be faxed to the nursery at (815) 648-2072 or emailed to sales@intrinsicperennialgardens.com. When emailing, please include all necessary information such as pick up or delivery and ship date. When emailing additions to an order, send only additions/changes or clearly state to disregard original order. Orders are pulled only when we have a confirmed ship date.

Customers are welcome to stop and shop at the nursery by appointment. Please Note: Spring backorders are generally ready mid- to late-June but are crop dependent. Also, we can label plants with prices for a nominal label fee.

Recycling

We are happy to accept used one-gallon containers in good condition.

Weekly Email List For Customers

Our weekly broadcast publishes plants that are blooming, budding, have showy foliage and are available for delivery immediately. This plant list is available for active customers only. Just call (815) 648-2788 if you are interested in receiving Intrinsic's Blooming List weekly in season. You can also sign up download the list from our website.

Delivery & Fuel Surcharge

Delivery is free for orders over \$350.00 within 75 miles of our nursery. Orders below the minimum will be charged \$60.00 delivery (\$30.00 local if we are already headed your direction with another delivery). Outside of a 75 mile radius from our nursery, delivery fee will be determined case by case with a minimum delivery fee of \$100. \$1000 minimum order for deliveries over 100 miles. We have a 30¢ per mile fuel surcharge on all deliveries, with a \$15 minimum fuel charge.

Currently, we have two delivery trucks. We do our best to accommodate swift shipment of orders and delivery on the date requested. Generally, we ship one to three days from order date. We cannot give exact delivery times, please call the morning of delivery to get our best estimate!

Gallon plants are shipped in trays that are unpacked upon delivery. Trays are available for purchase for our current cost <u>with advance notice</u>. Trays kept by customers at the time of delivery will be charged, and this fee will be added to the order invoice.

If no one is on site to help unload plants on orders of fifteen cases or more, a \$25.00 unloading fee will be added to the order invoice. Orders over 24 cases will not be unloaded without help.

Delivery Routing

We do not follow a strict delivery schedule, orders are shipped as soon as possible, usually next day or the following day.

Terms

Billing terms for new accounts are cash (C.O.D.) only at the time of delivery. Terms for established accounts are Net 30 Days. There will be a 1.5% per month service charge on accounts past due 30 days from date of invoice. Unless we have on file a copy of your Certificate of Registration, Certificate of Resale, or a letter containing tax exempt status on a certain job, we will collect 7% tax on all orders. Tax exempt job information must be presented at time of order. Please note: The Illinois Department of Revenue does not recognize out of state registrations. Therefore, our Wisconsin customers must pay sales tax when picking up orders in Illinois.

Returned Check Policy

There is a \$25.00 returned check fee. Accounts which present NSF checks will be set to C.O.D. until account remains paid in full for a minimum of three consecutive months.

Plugs / Contract Growing

We can contract grow any size from 70 plug to 3 gallon containers, etc. Contracts require a 33% nonrefundable down payment. Plugs on many of the varieties propagated by cuttings are available. Plug availability varies based on season, and is updated online monthly.
