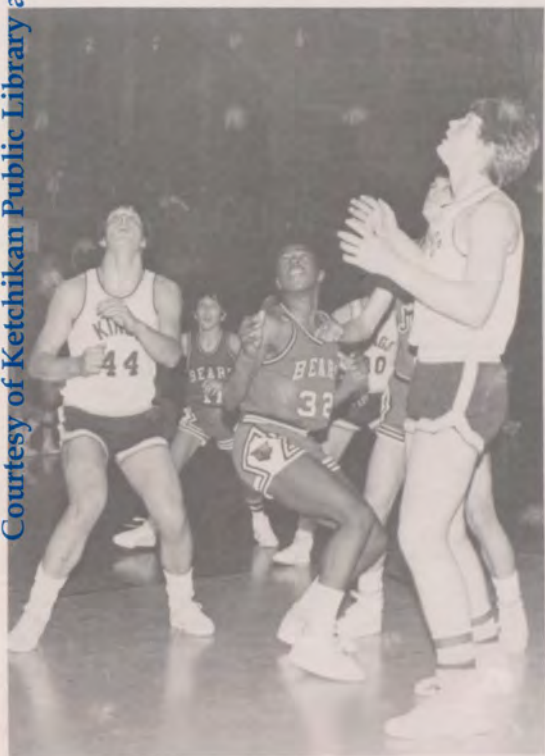
FRESHMEN HOOP SUCCESSFUL YEAR

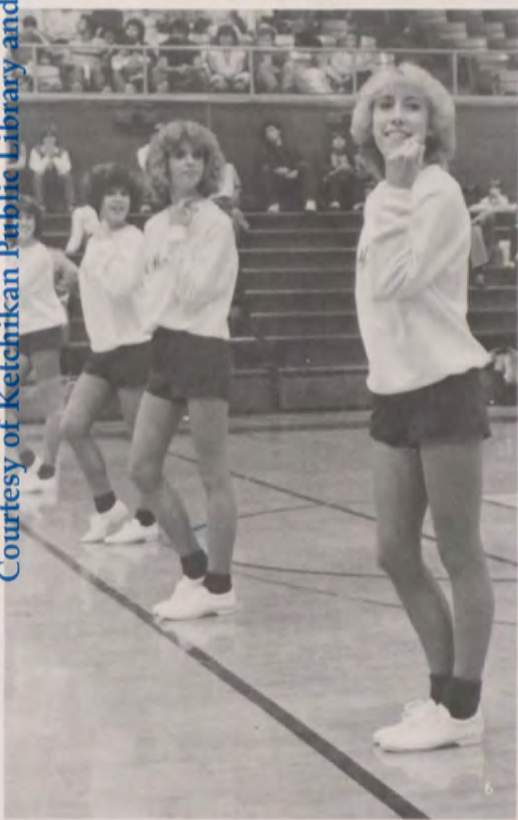
K-HIGHLIGHTS GLIMMER IN DRILL PERFORMANCES

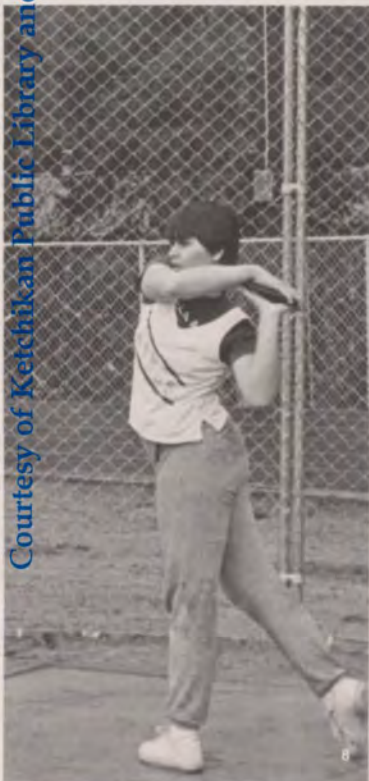

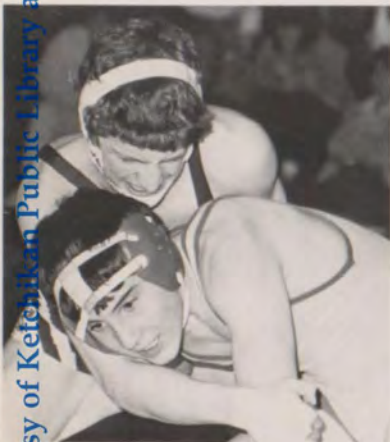

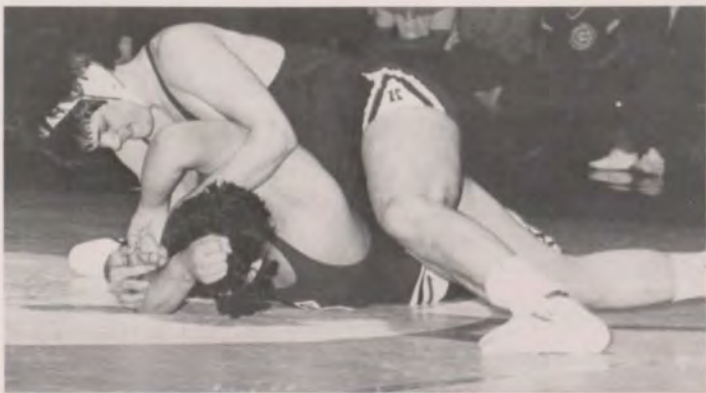

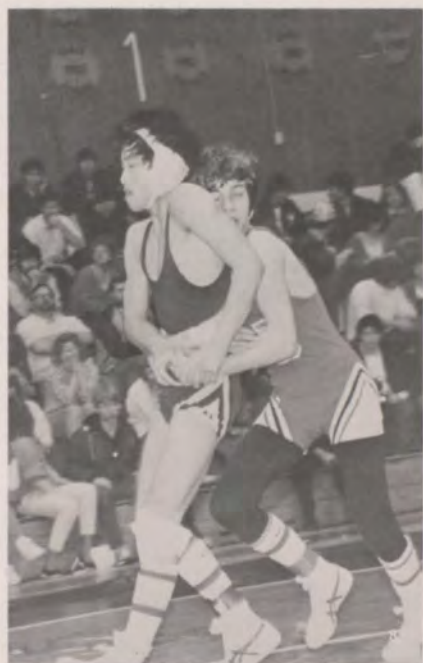

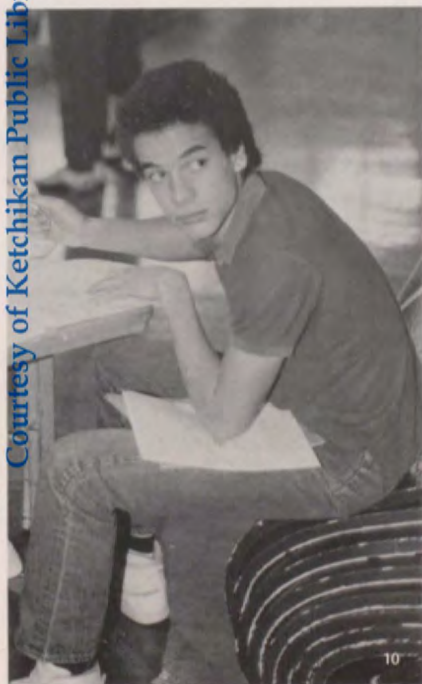
