



- Asclepias syriaca common milkweed, favorite food source of Monarch caterpillars, native
- Foeniculum vulgare 'Bronze' (Fennel) food source for Black Swallowtail caterpillars & excellent herb for the kitchen, not a bulb forming type, but used for the ferny tops
- Mentha suaveolens 'Variegata' (Variegated Pineapple Mint) food source for the Gray Hairstreak caterpillar. Fuzzy, white edged leaves with a fruity aroma.
- Mentha x villosa (Mojito Mint) food source for the Gray Hairstreak caterpillar; native to Cuba
- Petroselinum crispum var. neapolitanum 'Giant of Italy' (Flat Leaf Parsley) food source for Black Swallowtail caterpillars and an excellent herb for the kitchen
- Trifolium repens 'Dragon's Blood' perennial; mint green clover with silver edges and red spots. General nectar source and host plant for Sulphurs, Dogfaces, and Eastern Tailed Blue Butterflies
- Trifolium rubens 'Red Feather' perennial; large, purple-red flower heads, general nectar source and host plant for Sulphurs, Dogfaces, and Eastern Tailed Blue Butterflies





Native to wetlands of eastern Asia, Acorus is a marginal aquatic perennial that features a grass-like, linear leaf blades that fan outward. Tufts will slowly spread over time by rhizomes to form a dense groundcover. Plants thrive in wet soils and dry spells may cause leaf tips to brown. Tiny, yellowgreen flowers bloom from spring to early summer. When pinched or bruised, its leaves emit a fresh citrus scent. Ogon is a dwarf variety with variegated leaf blades striped in yellow and green.



Blue Fortune is a pollinator magnet! Lavender blue flower spikes cover the plant from mid-summer to early fall. Bred and selected by Gert Fortgens of the Arboretum Trompenberg, in Rotterdam. Blue Fortune is a hybrid of species native to the US and Korea, A. foeniculum x A. rugosa.

Purple Haze is a shrubby looking perennial with shiny green, licoricescented foliage, that produces long spikes of smoky violet-blue flowers from early summer until September. Flowers are a darker blue than A. 'Blue Fortune' due to the black calyxes. The leaf petioles and stems will pick up a purple color with cooler fall temperatures. The stems hold up well into the winter giving several more months of interest. Agastache are very susceptible to root rot during winter and require sharp drainage for over wintering success.

Ajuga forms a dense mat of foliage, up to 6" tall, that always seems to look neat and fresh. In many cases, the leaves are colored with shades of purple, white, silver, cream, or pink. Individual plants grow as a rosette, but they intertwine to form a solid carpet that withstands light foot traffic. Flower spikes adorn plants from late spring to early summer. Ajuga is a great groundcover for part to full shade.

'Burgundy Glow' - features tricolored foliage (white, pink and green) and blue flowers on 6" spikes in late spring

'Pink Lightning' - soft, mint-green leaves with a distinct creamy white edge; bubblegum pink flower spikes rise bloom in early May. A sport of A. 'Purple Torch' discovered and introduced by Sunny Border Nursery.

Allow foliage to go yellow after flowering to store energy in the bulbs for the following year's growth.

The plants in the Inca series were bred specifically for garden use. Hardy to zone 5, they have successfully overwintered in the ground at the nursery (until we had a zone 4 winter). These plants are more compact than those bred for the floral industry, but the stems are still plenty long enough for cutting. Inca Joli™ sports vibrant orange-red and gold flowers with dark flecking. Outrageously floriferous! These were still in flower in the nursery and in Ken and Linda's yard even after the first few frosts.

Fantastic perennials for shaded areas, they provide dramatic color in the fall garden. Blooming in September, the delicate, upward-facing flowers come in shades of white and pink and are held on long stems well above the dark green palmate foliage. Always eye catching, Japanese Anemones add a unique form and texture to the garden. The taller varieties may require staking when in flower, but those two feet or less generally don't. They will perform equally well in sun if provided consistent moisture.

'Honorine Jobert' - discovered in 1858 in Verdun, France, this remains an outstanding selection. A vigorous, compact cultivar featuring large, snow white flowers with yellow center stamens; 36-48" tall. 2016 Perennial Plant of the Year™


'Lucky Charm' - leaves start off deep purple and change to dark green with a lighter violet back. Flowers are deep rich pink with very dark purple stems; 36" tall

## Asclepias & Monarchs

Commonly known as Butterfly Weed or Milkweed, Asclepias are the sole food source for Monarch caterpillars. Known for the incredible mass migration that brings millions of them to California and Mexico each winter, North American monarchs are the only butterflies that make such a massive journey—up to 3,000 miles. Only monarchs born in late summer or early fall make the migration, and they make only one round trip. By the time next year's winter migration begins, several summer generations will have lived and died and it will be the great grandchildren of last year's migrators that make the trip. Yet somehow these new generations know the way, and follow the same routes their ancestors took—sometimes even returning to the same tree. Scientists are concerned about the eastern population of monarchs, which summer east of the Rocky Mountains. This group is occurring in ever smaller numbers, and its survival is threatened by reduced acreage of milkweeds and nectar sources in their summer home. To do our part to help the Monarchs, we are offering 4 species of Milkweed for 2017. These varieties will be offered in 4" pots and 1 gallons with a Butterfly label. Valued for their dependable nature and colorful flowers, Coreopsis are low maintenance, drought tolerant, and long blooming. Native to US prairies, the flowers attract butterflies and their seeds are enjoyed by Goldfinch and other birds. There is an incredible amount of variety among Coreopsis, including broadleaf vs threadleaf, tall vs short, and flower colors including pinks, reds, yellows, oranges, whites, and bi-colors. We are frequently asked how large a particular hosta will get. The size and growth rate of a hosta greatly depends on sunlight, soil type, moisture, and fertility. The best benchmark to use on how large a hosta will grow is to observe other hostas in the area and note their size categories.
