THE AVIATION CENTER GETS A NEW ASSISTANT COMMANDANT

BRIGADIER General Rudolph Ostovich, III, is the new Assistant Commandant of the U.S. Army Aviation Center, Ft. Rucker, AL. He assumed his duties on February 1, and was officially welcomed in ceremonies on February 5. His most recent assignment was as Commander of the 11th Aviation Group, VII Corps, Federal Republic of Germany.

A leadership profile

Ostovich, 43, is the youngest brigadier general in the Army. He received his ROTC commission from Ripon College in Wisconsin in June, 1963, along with a bachelor's degree in music. He later earned a master's degree in foreign affairs from George Washington University, Washington, DC.

His first Army assignment was as a rifle platoon leader in the 1st Battalion, 8th Infantry, 4th Infantry Division, at Ft. Lewis, WA.

His recent assignments include duty with the 82nd Airborne Division, Ft. Bragg, NC, from August, 1973, to January, 1977. From his arrival there until June, 1975, he was a plans officer and later operations officer for the division's Assistant Chief of Staff.

He then moved to the 3rd Battalion (Airborne), 325th Infantry as executive officer. When he left Bragg in January, 1977, he was executive officer of the Aviation Battalion, 82nd Airborne Division.

From January, 1977, to June, 1978, Ostovich was a force integration officer with the Infantry Team, Combat Division, Requirements Direc-

torate, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans at the Department of the Army in Washington, DC. After that year in Washington, he returned to Ft. Bragg for 24 months as commander of the 82nd Aviation Battalion, 82nd Airborne Division.

In June, 1980, Ostovich began his studies at the U.S. Army War College in Carlisle Barracks, PA, and was graduated in June, 1981.

Building on the best

During an interview on the day he assumed his new duties, Ostovich said he has benefitted from the hard work already done at Ft. Rucker not only in terms of the improved equipment, but also through the upgrading of the quality of the soldiers.

"Army Aviation plays a vital role in the combined arms concept," he said. "Today, we have the best people in the Army in our nation's history. They are technically competent, tactically proficient, and physically fit."

He added that his task as Assistant Commandant will be to build upon sound leadership and improve proficiency from the most junior to the highest rank.

BG Ostovich's decorations include the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star Medal with Oak Leaf Clusters, the Meritorious Service Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, Air Medals with "V" Device, the Master Army Aviator Badge, and the Master Parachutist Badge. He and his wife Heidi have four children: Dean, 18; Denise, 15; Danielle 6; and Deborah, 4.

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
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

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STEPPING SMARTLY INTO A NEW YEAR

WELOCOME to 1985! As we step smartly into our first full year as an Aviation Branch, I look forward to challenges, hard work, progress, and rewards. This year has the potential to be one of our best ever in Army Aviation. Many accomplishments are on the horizon. Expectations for some of our programs are provided below.

• **Night Vision Goggles:** The Aviator's Night Vision Imaging System (ANVIS) is a lightweight, helmet mounted, self contained, passive, image intensification night vision system used as a pilot's aid to vision during nighttime terrain flight. The word from the Night Vision and Electro-Optics Laboratory at Fort Belvoir, VA, is that ANVIS First Article Testing has been completed. We expect initial fielding of the ANVIS and associated test equipment by the end of March, 1985.

It has been a long time coming but ANVIS will give us a significant improvement in night vision capability and wearing comfort over the modified AN/PVS-5. Since it will take some time before contractors can deliver the ANVIS in significant quantities, initial distribution is being intensely managed and will be made according to the Department of the Army master priority list and to selected high interest units.

ANVIS is here!

• **Simulators:** 1985 will be another active year for simulators. We will field the AH-1 Flight Weapons Simulator (FWS) at Fort Campbell, Fort Lewis, and Illlesheim, Germany. The CH-47 simulator conversion from the C model to the D model continues. Funds have been appropriated to procure two more AH-1 FWS, three UH-60 simulators, and two AH-64 Combat Mission Simulators. We are now in concept exploration in the development of the Aviation Combined Arms Team Trainer.

As a result of a recommendation from the U.S. Army Aviation Policy Committee, USAAVNC will examine AR 95-1 simulator flight requirements with the aim of recommending a change so that requirements more closely match the capabilities of the new simulators and simulator tasks specified in air crew training manuals.

• **Ground Support Equipment (GSE):** Late this year, the Army will begin fielding several systems designed to improve aviation maintenance operations. The Self-Propelled Elevated Maintenance Stand (SPEMS) will be fielded in the 4th Quarter of FY 85 to CH-47 and CH-54 aircraft units. The Self-Propelled Crane, Aircraft Maintenance and Positioning (SCAMP) will begin fielding in the 3d Quarter of FY85 to maintenance organizations. SCAMP is

designed to lift an AH-1S and can be externally carried by a CH-47 or loaded on a C-130.

● **CH-47D CHINOOK:** To date, the Army has fielded 60 CH-47D's. A new "J" Series TOE will be published in April and will establish a new 16 ship company organization. Over the next several years, four additional medium lift companies will be added to the force structure. We continue to modernize!

● **AH-64 APACHE:** Plans for fielding AH-64 attack battalions continue. By the end of 1984 the Army had accepted 16 AH-64 aircraft. The AH-64 is currently flying in support of AHIP OT II at Fort Hunter Liggett, CA, and is doing well. Aircraft availability rates are higher than projected for this stage of the program. Initial aircraft delivery to Forts Eustis and Rucker has begun.

● **Hydra 70:** The Army's attack helicopter fleet gets a significant boost in its firepower capability in 1985 with the receipt of an improved 2.75 inch rocket. **Hydra 70**, as it is called, will provide a significant increase in range and accuracy over current munitions. New warheads on the improved rocket will provide the attack helicopter with a second weapon system capable of defeating enemy armor. Production of **multipurpose submunition (MPSM)** rockets will provide the pilot an indirect rocket firing capability with an accuracy far superior to previous versions of the 2.75 inch rocket.

Minor fire control computer modifications will have to be made prior to firing MPSM rockets. These modifications are scheduled to occur in conjunction with the receipt of the Hydra 70.

● **Self Deployment:** The Army expects to clearly demonstrate AH-64, UH-60, and CH-47 self deployment capabilities. Self deployment exercises will validate training, organizational support, equipment requirements, and doctrine toward the goal of future unit deployments.

● **UH-60 BLACK HAWK:** The 600th UH-60 BLACK HAWK was accepted in January. After successfully fielding 100 UH-60's to Korea in 1984, we now begin fielding in Panama, Hawaii, and priority units in FORSCOM. Accelerated fielding to the Reserve Components also begins in 1985. Congress has appropriated \$15 million to qualify HELLCAT on the UH-60. This non-autonomous firing capability will be completed near the end of 1985.

● **Fixed Wing:** Management and sustainment of the fixed wing fleet will continue to re-

quire a large effort during 1985. New initiatives include: reviewing requirements for a new technology utility/cargo fixed wing aircraft with increased capability over the C-12; defining and prioritizing wartime missions for aircraft assigned to TDA Flight Activities; replacing older T-28 RDTE aircraft with T-34C aircraft obtained from the Navy; and finalizing procedures for procuring aircraft through lease or charter.

● **Air Traffic Control (ATC):** In light of the establishment of **U.S. Army Information Systems Command (USAISC)** and the Aviation Branch, a review is being conducted by TRADOC and USAISC to establish a single proponent for ATC. This review is directed toward developing a course of action that will best serve future Army ATC requirements while conserving resources.

● **Aviation Safety:** During first quarter FY 85, 11 Class A accidents occurred. Compared to the first quarters of FY 83 and FY 84 (which saw three and ten Class A accidents, respectively) we started FY85 with a poor showing. We must improve our safety programs through soldier involvement, training, motivation, maturity, and direct command supervision.

● **World Helicopter Championships:** The Army has formally proposed that DOD participate in the 1985 **World Helicopter Championships (WHC)** and expects a decision shortly. Planning has begun with the expectation of a favorable DOD decision.

In late January a strawman concept plan for the WHC was developed. Under the terms of this plan, the military services and interested civilian agencies will be invited to compete for U.S. Helicopter Team positions in a helicopter fly-off during late April or early May at Fort Rucker, AL.

Changes at Fort Rucker

Following the January 17 ceremonies at which **MG Ellis D. Parker** assumed command of the U.S. Army Aviation Center from **MG Bobby J. Maddox** (as covered in last month's issue) **BG Rudolph Ostovich, III**, replaced the former as Assistant Commandant of the Aviation Center. Additional details are included on the inside front cover of this edition.

MG Maddox and his family have relocated to Oklahoma to enjoy a well deserved retirement. Good luck to each of you!



FROM BALLOONS TO APACHES



ENLISTED PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT IN THE AVIATION BRANCH

In June of 1861, President Lincoln authorized the formation of an Army Balloon Corps to be commanded by Professor Thaddeus S.C. Lowe. For almost two years Professor Lowe and his observers "flew" their fixed balloons in the observation role over the battlefields of Virginia.

The first "aviation soldier" was probably an artilleryman and his job in the balloon corps was simple; he raised and lowered the balloons on their ropes. He was probably also charged with making minor repairs, inflating, deflating, and transporting the balloons. But, in 1863, the balloon corps was abandoned because field commanders felt that the assistance from the balloons was not worth their expense; subsequently those "aviation soldiers" were more than likely "reclassified" back to their previous military assignments.

We've come a long way

From those meager beginnings, Army Aviation has come a long way. In June of 1942 Army Aviation took its first "real steps" when light observation airplanes flew from the deck of the U.S.S. Ranger in support of the invasion of North Africa. On 12 April 1983, Army Aviation as

a separate branch and a combat arm was signed into effect. The aircraft we now have (CH47D, UH-60) and are soon to have (OH-58D, AH-64) are a far cry from those we operated in our "formative years". We now have, or soon will have, the ability to perform our mission in all weather conditions day or night, and the efforts to advance our technology and our abilities are ongoing with programs such as JVX, LHX, and ACAP, etc.

The job of the aviation soldier is to support the mission in operations, maintenance, and air traffic control, etc. This is obviously no longer a "simple task". The aviation soldier must be both mentally and physically proficient and have an attitude of upward mobility. To support upward mobility, approximately ten years ago the Army implemented the Enlisted Personnel Management System (EPMS).

This system has been designed to provide the soldier with a logical "ladder of progression" from E-1 to E-9. The implementation of the Aviation Branch has had and will continue to have, a positive impact under EPMS on soldiers serving in the branch.

search for, detect, recognize and engage targets. TADS also provides high-power direct-view optics, a high-resolution video system, a laser designator and tracker, and a range finder. Data from TADS is used by the Apache fire control computer for all of the helicopter's weapons systems.

Apache's FLIR systems are just two of the many reasons why this night fighter is "a total system for battle."




SUPPORT YOUR ARMY AVIATION BRANCH MUSEUM!

The Aviation Branch has three **Enlisted Career Management Fields (CMFs)**: 93 Aviation Operations; 67 Aircraft Maintenance; and 28 Aviation Communications Electronics System Maintenance. The Aviation Branch Chief has proponency for all three. (NOTE: CMF 28 is scheduled to be integrated into the branch in FY 85). Within these CMFs there are ongoing changes. Formal and informal studies are being conducted to propose future changes and I would like to briefly touch on some of these.

CMF 93

The current redesignation of 71P to 93P will be completed on 1 March 1985. As of 1 September 1984, U.S. Army Aviation Center (USAAVNC) has responsibility for 93P and is currently conducting an informal study into the current E5 and E6 promotion stagnation problem. It is also addressing the possible redesignation of certain 1SG positions to 93P (primarily HHCs). This would lead to increased career enhancement for the 93P and help alleviate the

current disparity in aviation 1SG positions. As Army Aviation transitions into Combat Aviation Brigades under the Army of Excellence concept, it will substantially increase the number of 93P E9 positions. The results of this study will go out as a recommended change to AR 611-201.

USAAVNC is also conducting a TRADOC directed study into the promotion stagnation problems in MOS 93H and J. It is also looking at the feasibility of consolidating 93H and J into a single MOS. The results of this study should be published in March, 1985.


CMF 67

The reorganization of CMF 67 in accordance with the Vines study was completed in June, 1984. For the first time our aircraft maintenance personnel are being dedicated to a two aircraft "sub-family" through the grade of E-7 (see Figure 1). The Utility/Tactical Track progression is shown in Figure 2 as an example.

Our allied shops personnel can now progress through E-6 in their PMOS and, upon reaching E-7, become 68Ks — Allied Shops Supervisors.

The 19Ds currently serving as our Enlisted Aeroscout Observers will be replaced by 67Vs over the next 3 years. (The Enlisted Aeroscout

Observer Course is currently being conducted at USAAVNC). The current 19D personnel will be returned to the Armored Scout role.

CMF28

Upon completion of the integration of CMF 28 into the Aviation Branch, the proponency for MOS 26E and F (SEMA Electronics Repairman) will fall under the Intelligence Branch. MOS 26D will be placed into CMF 93 as a 93D (GCA Radar Repairman) and MOS 26K (ASE Repair) will be deleted from the inventory. In the future ASE repair will be performed by MOSs 35K, L, M and R and will be integrated into CMF 67.

Building and growing

There are many exciting things happening in our branch that will greatly enhance our careers and provide us with significantly increased "upward mobility"; however with all the ongoing and proposed changes, we must not forget the basics of managing our soldiers' careers. We must insure that soldiers are released for career enhancing schools when eligible, give objective

and honest efficiency reports, and insure that our records and those of our soldiers are up to date and reflect the correct information. The proper maintenance of one's records cannot be overstressed. Failure to properly maintain records can cause a soldier to "miss the boat" when it comes time for promotion.

The Aviation Branch has within its ranks the finest corps of noncommissioned officers and soldiers in the world. By the very nature of their task, they are required to be and are fit to fight both mentally and physically. As our branch continues to build and grow, I am sure it will continue to offer increased challenges, career progression and recognition for jobs well done. IIIIII

THE UH-1 THROUGH THE YEAR 2000

REMEMBER 1954, back when Dwight D. Eisenhower was President and the New York Giants won the world series? It was the year the specification was written that initiated development of the first UH-1!

Since 1954, the UH-1 series aircraft, and its derivatives, have become the most produced military aircraft since World War II, and have come to rank 5th on the list of the most produced military aircraft ever.

A distinguished career

In 1959, the HU-1A began its Army career as a Medevac helicopter. It was the first helicopter designed and built to U.S. Army specifications. As this aircraft stimulated the imagination of field users, new roles and missions were developed and, by 1967, the HU-1A had evolved through 13 models into the present UH-1H configuration.

Our youngest UH-1 was delivered to the Army in 1976, eight years ago. 85% of today's UH-1 fleet is over 13 years old and 40% is now over 17 years old.

Today the venerable UH-1 remains the workhorse of Army Aviation, and continues to provide "core" air mobility to Active, National Guard, and Reserve forces. Approximately



3,690 UH-1H, M, V, EH-1H, and EH-1X remain in the inventory, with the UH-1H comprising approximately 85% of the fleet. There are 240 UH-1Vs configured to perform Medevac missions and approximately 250 UH-1M gunships remaining in the National Guard that are being phased out as COBRAs become available.

The UH-1 flies more than 50% of the Army rotary wing flying hours annually (approximately 760,000 hours per year) and is projected to remain at this level through 1990. UH-1s are currently performing command and control; staff, troop and cargo transport; instrument training; electronic warfare; mine dispensing; and Medevac missions around the globe, in all types of environments. Some of the more "visible" recent missions include 300 flying hours per month in support of the United Nations **Multinational Force Observers (MFO)** in the Sinai and deployment to Central America in support of continuing exercises. UH-1s were deployed in a C&C role during Operation "Urgent Fury" in Grenada and played a direct role in the capture of Grenada's ruler, General Hudson Austin.

Service life extension

It is becoming increasingly clear that a greater number of UH-1s will be retained in the inventory for longer than anybody predicted even a year ago. Current force modernization plans project a fleet of more than 3,000 through 1991 with a gradual reduction to around 1,500 aircraft by the year 2000. Yearly fleet attrition in the 1990s will be predicated upon deliveries of LHX-Utility aircraft.

The usual 20-year retirement life for Army aircraft was extended for the UH-1 by a System Review that was approved in 1980. This review created the **UH-1 Service Life Extension Program (SLEP)** which defined the number of aircraft and the configuration required to make the UH-1 mission effective into the next century.

Due to lack of funding, this program evolved through the Block Improvement Program, the Sustainment Program into a "bare bones" Modernization Program. Each successive name change was a further de-scoped version of the SLEP. In a way, each proposal has become a victim of UH-1 fleet size since any program multiplied by 3,700 soon adds up to an "unaffordable" program competing for limited development and production dollars.

A minimum number of UH-1 service life extension modifications are absolutely essential to meet the **Nap-of-the-Earth (NOE)** and survivability requirements of the modern battlefield. Modifications will be accomplished via the **Product Improvement Program (PIP)**. Presently, the UH-1 has 12 approved, priority PIPs which include safety improvements; **Reliability, Availability, and Maintainability (RAM)** modifications; and avionics modernization.

Safety

The UH-1 has one of the best safety records of any rotary winged aircraft but, due to NOE, night vision operations, and a phenomenon called "mast bumping," several safety improvements are required. Twenty-seven hundred **Wire Strike Protection Systems (WSPS)** have been procured and a contract for 300 more was awarded in December. 2,280 of these kits have been installed to date, and the feasibility of extending Wire Strike coverage is currently under further study.

Accelerated development of a Hub Spring device has been initiated with first kit installation planned for 1986. This device will provide the pilot with indications that he is approaching the limits of the flight envelope and reduces the possibility of mast bumping.


Approximately 972 "thin wall" masts (with plugs) have been removed from the UH-1 fleet since May, 1984, and replaced with "thick wall" masts offering improved safety margins in mast bumping situations.

RAM

The first **Composite Main Rotor Blade (CMRB)** will be available to the field in early 1987. The CMRB has a 10,000-hour design life and eliminates metal blade bonding, corrosion, and repair problems. It also provides increased ballistic tolerance and improved operational efficiency.

Improved servo cylinders have been developed to reduce leakage and premature removals. The new servo combines the irreversible valve function into the control head, is interchangeable with the present servo, and promises to provide at least 2,500 hours of trouble free operation.

Accelerated engineering studies have been completed and a decision was recently made to



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replace the present 500-hour finite life aluminum tail rotor grip with an interchangeable steel grip offering extended life. Development and qualification of this new grip will take place over the next 10 months.

An Improved Stabilizer Bar, that has increased corrosion resistance and will allow "on-condition" replacement in lieu of the current 5-year life, will be phased into the fleet through attrition. Our first production buy is scheduled for FY85.

An **Oil Debris Discrimination System (ODDS)** provides improved oil filtration and chip detector burn-off capability and will eliminate false chip detection warnings.

A T53-L-13B remanufacture program will be initiated at **Corpus Christi Army Depot (CCAD)** in FY85. Presently, CCAD inspects and repairs engines as necessary; however, with an average engine age of 2,700 hrs, a complete overhaul is essential if they are going to be required to operate another 15-20 years.

Fleet changeout of improved servo connec-

ting links and redesigned pitch change clevis will be completed by March, 1985.

Avionics

Avionics will also be getting a much needed upgrade since they are rapidly becoming logically unsupportable. Contracts have been let with **American Electronics Laboratories (AEL)** for the engineering prototypes and modification work order (MWO) preparation for installation of AN/ARC-186 (VHF-AM/FM), AN/ARC-164 (UHF-AM), AN/APX-100 (Transponder), AN/ARC-199 (NOE Comm, High Frequency Radio), AN/ARN-89 (ADF), AN/ARN-123 (VOR), and AN/ASN-43 (Gyro Magnetic Compass). The AN/ANS-128 Doppler Navigation Set and the NOE Comm Improved FM will also be installed in designated UH-1H aircraft.

Additionally, the UH-1 Weapon Systems Management Office assisted by the Avionics Research and Development Activity (AVRA-



DA), is exploring the feasibility of Non-Development Item (NDI) application of commercial avionics for some aircraft. Preliminary indications are that commercial avionics are readily available with substantial savings and increased supportability.

Night-Fix

Improvements are being made to the Phase I Night Vision Goggle (NVG) modification. An accelerated program was initiated in April, 1984, to develop a blue-green cockpit fully compatible with the AN/PVS-5 cutaway and ANAVS-6 NVGs. The approach taken for this modification was to disable all red lighting and replace it with blue-green lighting. Red post lights and flood lights were also replaced with blue-green lights. External lighting modifications include an infrared (IR) search light and NVG compatible position lights. A contract for 1,300 kits has been awarded and kit application will begin 4th Qtr FY85. Aircraft previously modified will be

upgraded to the improved configuration by a follow-on program.

Tried and true

In summary, the UH-1 has become the Army's "Gooney Bird" and will be an integral fixture on the battlefield beyond the year 2000. This aircraft has proven itself in over 21,000,000 combat and peacetime flight hours and will continue to perform yeoman duty with a minimum investment.

Most importantly, the UH-1 is in the field providing critical air mobility and does not require a prolonged costly development cycle. In spite of its shortcomings on the modern battlefield, its virtues of versatility, maintainability, ruggedness, and simplicity will keep the "HUEY" above the best.




