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Fellowship winners from your area have been checked.

Thirty-four young business executives, chosen from a wide range of industrial concerns throughout the United States, have been awarded Sloan Fellowships for participation in the executive development program at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, it was announced last night by Professor E. P. Brooks, Dean of the School of Industrial Management at M.I.T.

The executives, whose average age is thirty-five, come from fourteen states, Canada, and Switzerland. They will begin their one-year program at M.I.T. in June.

"The fellowship men are chosen early in their industrial careers when they have a long future service to industry ahead of them," says Professor Howard W. Johnson, director of the Sloan program.

"The fact that they carry on their work at such a center of technological development as M.I.T.," he adds, "provides a special opportunity for them to view the long-range development of business in the perspective of technological advance, as well as within the economic and human framework of management problems."

The program itself, he says, emphasizes orientation to the fundamentals underlying management action rather than a review of management policies and techniques.
