ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, I WOULD LIKE TO

thank all of you for joining us in supporting and cheering on the Huskies in the 2019 season. Without the continued support of the directors, coaches, support staff, alumni, sponsors, volunteers, and our fans, we could not continue to provide the local community with the high level of entertainment that we see from the Edmonton Huskies each week. Special thanks to the Edmonton Eskimos for their generous support through the 50.50 at Eskimo's home games.

The success of the Huskies' program is exemplified by the vast achievements of our alumni. While some enjoyed the privilege of playing in the CFL, many have become leaders in the community. The alumni are the backbone of the Huskies' organization; some have returned as directors or coaches, others loyal supporters, but all have ensured of the continued success of the program. The culture of our team is one of family, respect and commitment. These are not just strong values to follow on a football field but values these young men will use as they grow and become active members of our society. The discipline of training, learning teamwork, following the leadership of coaches and captains, and learning to lose, provide invaluable lifelong skills for athletes. As the legendary John Wooden stated, "Sports do not build character, they reveal it."

The 2018 season brought us success on and off the field. In September, the Huskies' Hall of Fame (HOF) class was announced at the 2018 Gala Dinner. The Dinner celebrated the accomplishments of our 1962-63 National Championship Head Coach (and former player 1956-58), Dr. Dennis Kadatz, who sadly passed away earlier this year, together with the Huskies' legendary trainer, Monty "the Merc" Ford (1954-1972), Mike Eurchuk (Builder 1967-69; 1997-current), Tom Richards (Player 1982-1983), Simeon Rottier (Player 2002-2005) and Larry Tibble (Player 1967-1969; Coach

1979-80; and Builder 1982-86, 2017-current). The Dinner was very successful with the ticket proceeds funding scholarship opportunities for Huskies' players and a portion of the proceeds being directed to the Gender Based Violence Prevention Program (GBVPP).

The next Gala Dinner will be held in the Spring of 2020, when we will celebrate the next HOF class, with the proceeds again funding scholarship opportunities for Huskies' players. We hope our alumni, sponsors and fans will continue to support this event.

On the field, the Huskies have become stronger and stronger over the past few years and 2018 saw the Huskies again finish in second place in the PFC with a 6-2 record. The PFC semi-final had the Huskies host the Regina Thunder at Commonwealth Stadium and the Huskies avenged last season's playoff loss with a thrilling 39-36 overtime win. The following weekend the Huskies travelled to Saskatoon to meet the Hilltops in the PFC final. The injury riddled Huskies put up a good fight but fell to the eventual CJFL champions 28-9. We are pleased that Head Coach Iain MacLean is returning with most of his coaching staff intact as their exceptional leadership continues to bring stability and pride to our football program. Iain and his experienced coaching staff have done a great job recruiting in the off-season and we are certain that this year's team will play a tough, disciplined brand of football. The return of key veterans coupled with exciting new prospects will only bode well for an exciting 2019 season. Best of luck to the Edmonton Huskies and all other members of the Prairie Football Conference. We look forward to seeing our great alumni and our loyal fans at games to cheer on a team with lots of promise.

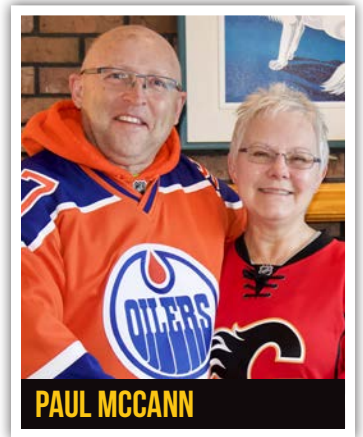

STILL GOING STRONG

OSHANE SAMUELS



FOR MOST JUNIOR FOOTBALL PLAYERS, THE LAST GAME WEARING A CJFL jersey is also their final football game. Oshane Samuels is not your usual player, however. He's optimistic that, as a result of having worn an Edmonton Huskies uniform last year, his junior football experience will be the stepping stone that is going to allow him to realize his goal to play professionally.

About four years ago, Oshane relocated to Alberta with his family, moving from Brampton, Ontario. His playing days at St. Edmund Campion High School had generated some interest from various Canadian universities, but the move to Edmonton and other conflicting factors left Oshane wondering if football was in his future. Three years 'down the hill' was just what the doctor ordered. His first season with the Huskies was a 'football shock' as the level of expectation was extremely high. Early into year two, armoured with perseverance and patience, his playing time was quickly on the rise. And things just seemed to get better as Oshane made the PFC All-Star team and etched his name in the records book, in 2018, his graduating year. Coach Iain MacLean and Coach Rick Walters were instrumental in helping Oshane to look to the future. A couple of CFL teams (the Eskimos and the Lions) and the Indianapolis Colts (through a relative) had already placed Oshane on their radars by the time he graduated. Oshane is thankful for the great support and opportunities that were made available to him during his time with the Huskies.

The 2019 football season opened with Oshane attending his first professional tryout with the Edmonton Eskimos. It was a tremendous learning experience, as well as a great motivator. "The players, coaches, and management treated me wonderfully, especially their top guys on the field - Trevor Harris and Almondo Sewell. They were really welcoming towards me. I felt very included and they happily shared a wealth of information with me. They were more than willing to show me the ropes."

As this Game Day Program goes to print, Oshane has had a whirl-wind summer. His original long-range plan was to share accommodations with former Huskies teammate Vince Schiffner in Winnipeg, while both of them suited up for the University of Manitoba Bisons this fall. However, an opportunity to sign his first professional contract with the B.C. Lions has sent Oshane flying to the west coast where he will face a new challenge of becoming a starter while playing at the highest level of football. The next time Oshane meets Trevor Harris, it may not be on as friendly terms.

After graduating high school and moving to Edmonton, I needed something to light the fire that was inside of me. The Huskies brought football out of me. My experience as a Huskie lit a spark and gave it a chance to catch fire. It's been burning strong ever since.

THE EDMONTON HUSKIES CAME INTO BEING IN 1954, AND under the leadership of Head Coach Murray Smith, developed a philosophy with two primary objectives. The first was that players would develop their football abilities. The second was that each member of the Huskies Family would leave a better community member than when they arrived. These philosophical tenants are as true today as they were then. Huskies alumni continue to be strong leaders in their communities and current players evidence this through their involvement with programs such as Gender Based Violence Prevention, support for minor football through the Kinsmen summer camps, and many of their own individual initiatives.

The Edmonton Huskies Alumni Society set three primary pillars as the foundation for their programs;

- To provide opportunities for fellowship for all Alumni as evidenced by their support of the Gala held the last two years to raise funds for player scholarships and recognize the past with the Hall of Fame induction ceremonies. The next Gala is coming in March 2020.
- To provide support for the current edition of the Huskies in the form of this Game Day Magazine and the provision of five \$500 player scholarships, awarded annually in the name of an honoured alumni or minor football contributor in the Greater Edmonton area.
- To take on community service projects. The first was Huskies for Humanity where alumni spent the day at a Habitat for Humanity build site. Our latest venture was Huskies Have Heart, the Big Bike Ride for the Heart & Stroke Foundation.

Once presented with this opportunity our Alumni team formed and set a goal to raise \$5,000. We are very pleased to report that our final total will be \$8,693 for Heart and Stroke. And, while this was very much a team effort, we would be remiss if we did not mention the support of Labatt Breweries Alberta for the matching grant made in recognition of funds raised by two of their employees.

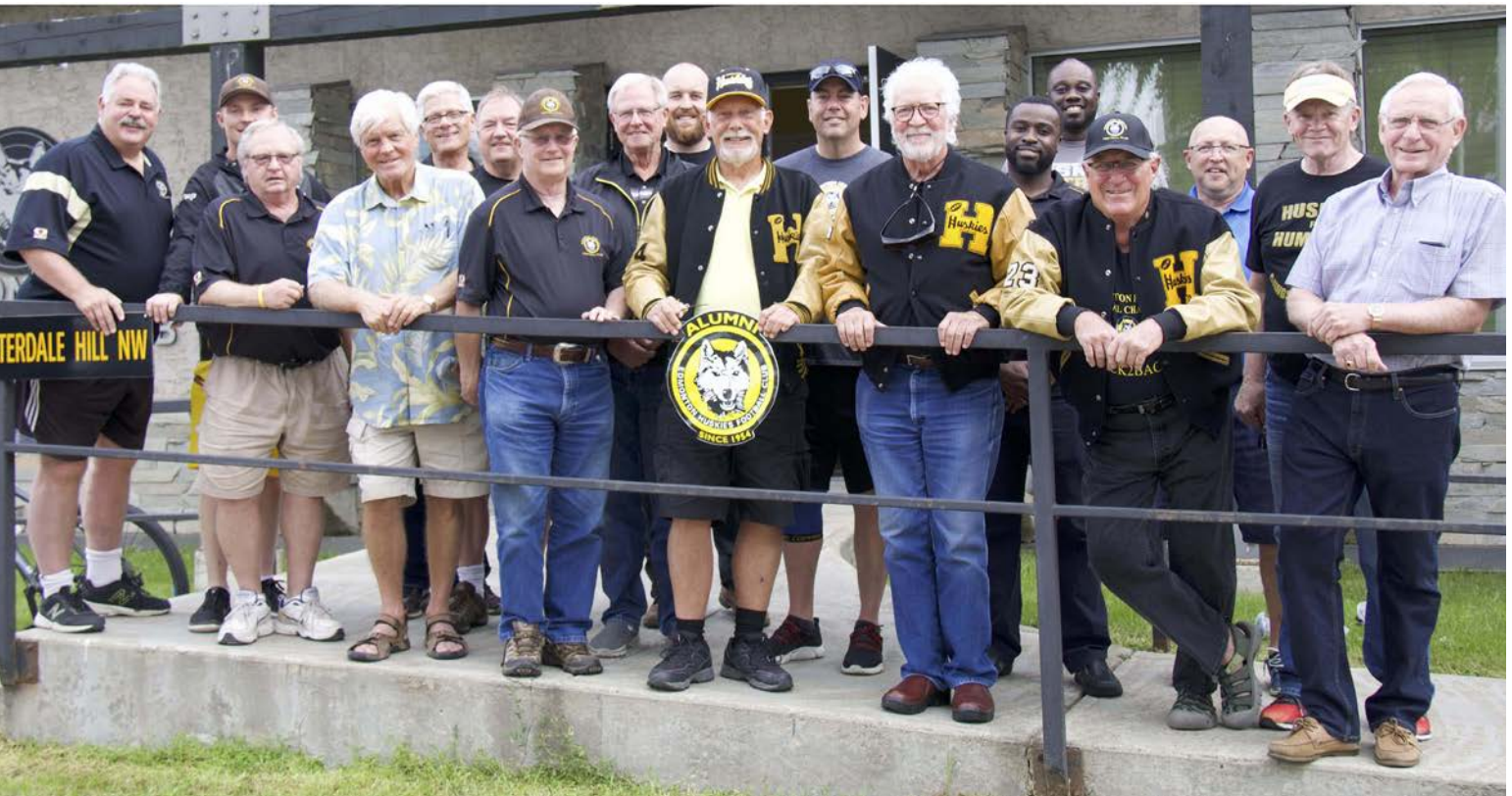

A BIG MAN, A BIGGER HEART

DAN BUTCHER

TO SAY THAT A COMMON FIRST IMPRESSION OF DAN BUTCHER

is that he appears bigger than life is an understatement. Butch's physical size and strength only pales in comparison to the size of his heart and the circles of friendship he has created. He is one of those guys who has earned the respect and trust of anyone who has ever had the privilege of being a teammate, working alongside him, or competing against him as an opponent. Yet, Dan continues to be a simple, humble, and shy farm boy whose roots are in rural Alberta where he was raised as the only brother in a household with six children.

Right up until his first day of training camp with the Edmonton Huskies, Dan had never played organized sports of any sort. He was 17 years old and had only recently graduated from high school. Being a big, chubby farm boy who hadn't ever done any sort of formal training or running for fitness, Dan didn't give himself much of a chance to make the team. It wasn't until many years later, when Butch was married and became a father that he began to realize his many accomplishments went well beyond the norm of what most people could hope to achieve.

The people that impacted Dan the most in the Huskies organization were his coaches. Butch was introduced to the Edmonton Huskies when his cousin brought him down to watch a practice. It was Head Coach John Belmont who noticed Dan, walked right up to him, and invited him to try out for the team. It was JB who put a roof over Dan's head when he learned that Dan was living in his vehicle and cleaning himself up at gas stations. Through JB's efforts, Dan was exposed to the concept of brotherhood for the first time.

1982 - Dan's first season with the Edmonton Eskimos

Five years into playing for the Huskies, Brent Pope and Dan rented a house together on the east side of Edmonton. It was owned by teammate Kan Lang. Russ, Ken's brother, lived there for a while, as well. For those 'brothers' whom had the privilege of playing with Dan and Brent, the heart and core of the '77 to '81 Edmonton Huskies began to grow with this particular relationship. The connectedness and unique personalities of these two young men became the glue that bonded the entire team. It was through their leadership that the team gelled. They set the bar and a high standard of performance was expected from all. The great success that the Huskies experienced would not have happened without them. Dan knew he was there for a reason. The Edmonton Huskies became his home and Butch was integral in helping to make the organization feel like home for everyone else.

Dan's first job while with the Huskies was at the Brick, unloading box cars and moving furniture. During his first couple of off-seasons, Dan would head back to his family home and spent some time in the oil patch. When he decided to remain in Edmonton, Butch became an iron worker. Dan went on to apprentice as a millwright in the oil field machine shops around the Edmonton area. Currently, Dan has been with Labatt Breweries for over 20 years.

Dan has always seen the world in the glass being half full kind of way. During his rookie season with the Huskies, Dan's dad was diagnosed with cancer and Butch left the team, going back home to help put up the hay. In the two weeks he was gone, Dan recognized how much he missed being around the guys. Having been born into a family of sisters, he had never really experienced brotherhood. The Huskies became his band of brothers for the next five years. Dan's last game wearing a Huskies jersey was in Regina, in 1981, his graduating year. After the game, he returned to the field and sat on the bench to reflect. Butch remembers thinking that this was the last football game he would ever play. Coach Don Barry walked over and sat beside him as Dan shared this emotional moment. Don looked at Dan and said to him, "Butch, you aren't done yet."

In 1982, Dan was invited to attend his second training camp with Hugh Campbell and the Edmonton Eskimos, where he became part of a team that included Warren Moon and the placement of a Grey Cup ring (the Esks' 5th consecutive) on his finger. Dan spent four seasons in the Canadian Football League, two of them on the Eskimos roster. His first start for the Green and Gold was the result of an ill-advised decision that fabled offensive lineman Hector Pothier made to take his first ride on Leo Blanchard's 'crotch rocket' motorcycle. Dan finished his professional career after a stint with Montreal. A highlight memory of Dan's time in the CFL happened in 2001, when he was invited to be a part of the celebration of immortalizing Warren Moon with the unveiling of his name on the Wall of Fame. Butch was a part of the sports legacy of the Edmonton Eskimos during the apex of their glory days. Dan's realization of the extent of his remarkable achievements in football came to full fruition as he stood on Commonwealth field that afternoon and looked up into the stands, knowing that his wife and four children were in attendance. What was most important to Dan at that particular time was that his family was there to share in a significant piece of his life.

A part of Dan's commitment to giving back to the community has included doing a tremendous amount of coaching over many decades. Butch started out doing some guest-coaching with the Golden Bears and then with some high school teams. He soon became a full-time coach, which included two years with Head Coach Brent Pope and the Huskies ('90, '91) and a couple of years working with youth at the Alberta Summer Games. Butch couldn't pass up the opportunity to work with his two older sons as they made their way through minor football, coaching first with the Edmonton Chargers organization and then following his two boys to Austin O'Brien for four more years. Joshua, Dan's oldest child, carried on with his own football career by playing one season with the Huskies ('10) and then graduating as a senior with the University of Saskatchewan Huskies, after a 5-year career with them.

I WOULDN'T BE WHO I AM TODAY, I WOULDN'T BE WHERE I AM TODAY, AND I QUITE LIKELY WOULD NOT HAVE THE FAMILY I AM BLESSED WITH TODAY, IF I HAD CHANGED ANYTHING ALONG THAT PATH I TRAVELLED. WHATEVER HAPPENED IN MY LIFE, I FIRMLY BELIEVE IT HAPPENED FOR A REASON. I TRY TO DEAL WITH THINGS BY LOOKING AT THEM AS THE GLASS BEING HALF FULL.

Dan was married to Nenita in 1990. Family is very important, and they are proud of their four adult children. Josh (27) is currently a doctor in Saskatoon, Zachary (25) works in IT at the University of Alberta, Gus (23) is an accomplished jazz musician and is now working on another degree to become a teacher, and Jenna (21) recently headed back to post-secondary education to pursue a career in aesthetics. Nita continues to be an avid gardener. Dan and Nita spend quality time together, working on outdoor projects around their yard.

These days, Dan has a number of different peer groups that he loves to hang out with. He cherishes the sense of brotherhood that each one brings to his life. Working with his hands continues to be a source of enjoyment for Dan. On any given day, you might find him casting a fishing rod, swinging a golf club, working on building projects for Nita, or restoring old furniture. A couple of months ago, Dan was a key driver in the success of the Edmonton Huskies Alumni Society's Big Bike Ride for the Heart & Stroke Foundation. Not only was Dan one of the big fundraisers, he also recruited some co-workers to participate in the event. It seems inevitable that, no matter where Dan works or plays, his big heart continues to have a lasting impact on those he serves through his core belief in creating brotherhood.

It's been almost a century since Dan's grandfather journeyed along the North Saskatchewan River, on a barge. He went in search of a different life and found himself settling along the north riverbank, across from Duvernay, Alberta. He founded Brosseau and established a base for his future family. In 1977, as a 17-year-old, Dan likewise took charge of his own destiny and travelled a similar journey with little more than the clothes on his back and a tank full of gas. Butch was motivated by an off-chance invitation to play football. His free-spirit, a strong belief in himself, and a very big heart is what has forged Dan's future, by establishing a presence, as well as a family home for his wife and kids in Edmonton.
