This information document has been submitted by the Secretariat on behalf of the United Nations Environment Programme-World Conservation Monitoring Centre (UNEP-WCMC) in relation to agenda item 27.*

This information document provides information on plant nomenclature, specifically in relation to:

1. A response by UNEP-WCMC to CoP17 Decision 17.315, directed to the Secretariat, requesting feedback on the *CITES Cactaceae Checklist (3rd edition)* adopted at CoP17 from UNEP-WCMC.
2. An output of names of the *Dalbergia* species currently held in Species + and a full list of source references in response to a request by the Nomenclature Specialist.
3. An overview of data management approaches used for CITES-related data within Species+ (such as treatment of synonyms, hybrids etc.). This addresses recent requests by Parties on management of data for plants within Species+, as well as an action outlined in PC23 Com. 3 (Rev. by Sec.).

1. Cactaceae standard reference

Specifically relating to the new Cactaceae standard reference (Hunt (2016) CITES Cactaceae checklist, third edition), CoP17 adopted Decision 17.315 on *Nomenclature*, as follows:

Directed to the Secretariat

17.315 The Secretariat shall liaise with the United Nations Environment Programme World Conservation Monitoring Centre (UNEP-WCMC) to obtain feedback on the utility of the CITES Cactaceae Checklist (3rd edition) and any queries that arise as they update Species+.

Following CoP17, UNEP-WCMC updated Species + and the CITES Checklist in line with the newly adopted *CITES Cactaceae Checklist (3rd Edition)*. Through this process, a number of challenges were encountered when incorporating the new standard reference into Species+, and these are summarised below. Based on these challenges, a number of recommendations are also provided which aim to support the production of new CITES checklists or nomenclature updates at CoP18 as well as their efficient inclusion within the Checklist and Species+.

Incorporation of the CITES Cactaceae checklist (3rd edition) in Species+¹

Several queries arose regarding the interpretation of the terminology used in the checklist in the context of CITES. Consequently, in the process of updating Species +, a number of decisions were made, in consultation with the nomenclature expert for plants and the checklist author (see Table 1).

Further complications arose due to the inconsistent use of the symbols and formatting described in the checklist key throughout the document, and the use of abbreviated taxon names (e.g. using initials), which limited ability to search the document. Following consultation with the author, there remain a number of unresolved issues including contradictory relationships between names, and taxonomy used in the checklist that did not fully reconcile with the previously adopted taxonomy (2nd edition of the Cactaceae checklist). The total number of species that are affected by these unresolved issues is detailed in Annex A.

There were also challenges encountered with the general format of the checklist, which was only available as a PDF document that could not be digitally transcribed into an Excel-compatible format. This meant that all

relevant accepted species names, synonyms and their distribution records had to be compiled manually into an Excel spreadsheet prior to entry into the database.

Recommendations for new CITES checklists and any nomenclature updates

The use of non-CITES terminology, such as “alternative names”, should be avoided where possible, and CITES checklists should refer only to accepted names, synonyms, or names that have become invalid since the previous standard reference was published. If different approaches are used, the checklist should clearly detail how these additional name categories should be interpreted in the context of CITES.

Accepted names and synonyms should be easily distinguishable and the accepted name(s) for a synonym should be clearly and consistently identified; for example, as presented in Glaw (2015) Taxonomic checklist of Chamaeleonidae.

Abbreviations of taxonomic names should be avoided to minimise errors and to allow searching of the checklist. If the use of a key is required, CITES checklists should include a clear and simple legend explaining the use of any terms or symbols used, and the key should be applied consistently throughout the checklist.

New or updated CITES checklists should clearly map to the previous agreed taxonomy of the taxa they refer to, and all changes between the old and new taxonomy should be included (including spelling corrections). Details of the types of changes required to update the taxonomy is encouraged; for example, as in [CoP17 Doc. 81.1 Annex 8 \(Rev. 1\)](#).

The provision of information on distribution in CITES checklists can be beneficial. If provided, it should be presented in a clear and consistent manner, such as the use of ISO-2 codes (as used in Hunt (2016) CITES Cactaceae checklist, third edition).

It is recommended that checklists and any nomenclature updates that are proposed for adoption are provided in an extractable tabular format or spreadsheet that can be easily integrated into the CITES Checklist and Species+.

2. *Dalbergia* synonyms and distributions within Species+

UNEP-WCMC was requested by the Nomenclature Specialist to prepare an information document for PC24 on the names of *Dalbergia* currently held in Species + and a full list of source references (as outlined in PC24 Doc. 27). The full list of species names, their taxonomic authorities, synonyms, as well as the species global distributions are provided in [Table 1 in Annex B](#).

Distribution data included in Species+ is largely in accordance with that outlined in CoP17 Prop. 55, the proposal adopted when the genus was listed in Appendix II of CITES at CoP17 in 2016. This reflected the data within the International Legume Database (White, 2005) which is no longer being maintained. In some instances, distribution data within Species+ has been updated based on additional research of the relevant literature subsequent to the listing. In such cases, a justification for the inclusion of a country as a range States is provided. Countries that appeared to be incorrectly identified as range States in document CoP17 Prop. 55 were deleted, and these are outlined in Table 1. There is a greater degree of uncertainty relating to introduced species as the literature is less comprehensive. All synonyms listed are directly taken from the original *Dalbergia* listing proposals CoP17 Prop. 55, as well as CoP16 Prop. 60, 61, and 63.

Range States are encouraged to provide feedback on Table 1 in Annex B to improve the data holdings within Species+.

3. Data management relating to plant nomenclature within the CITES Checklist and Species +

Based on discussions at PC23 on Nomenclature, UNEP-WCMC agreed to prepare an information document on the process by which synonyms of accepted plant names are included in the Checklist of CITES Species and Species+ (see Recommendation 10 in PC23 Com. 3 (Rev. by Sec.)). In addition, other data management approaches for CITES-related information are outlined below.

1. Management of synonyms in Species+

Synonyms are systematically updated in Species+ following the adoption of new CITES standard references and amendments to the appendices at each CoP. Not all synonyms listed in Species+ are covered by the standard references. Additional synonyms feature in trade or have been identified through reviews of the scientific literature. Synonyms are therefore updated and maintained between CoPs, based on the taxonomic names reported in trade, based on literature consulted when undertaking particular species assessments, or based on specific requests or advice received from CITES Authorities and external experts. The processes followed are detailed below. It should be noted that the same taxonomic name may be added to the database *with different authors* as synonyms of the same or different accepted taxa, and so 'synonym' refers throughout to the combination of taxonomic name and author.

A. Systematic updates post-CoP

As part of the systematic nomenclature updates made to Species+ following the adoption of new CITES standard references at CoPs, synonyms are also included within Species+ where they are specified within the standard reference. This includes the addition of new synonyms (not already listed in Species+), and the reallocation of synonyms to the correct accepted names, to reflect any revised taxonomies. When new species are listed, the CoP proposal documents are used to provide details on the potential synonyms of the newly listed species until a standard reference is adopted. Where the potential synonyms of the newly listed species are already in Species+ as an accepted name, they are retained as an accepted name and are *not* added again as a synonym.

B. Updating synonyms based on CITES trade data

Synonyms are added to Species+ in the period between CITES CoPs based on the names that appear in the trade records recorded within CITES Annual Reports as submitted by Parties. Synonyms in trade are prioritised for addition to Species+ as they have direct implications for the ease and accuracy of managing and reporting trade. All synonyms reported in trade are cross-checked with relevant literature or expert databases (e.g. Kew databases) prior to entry into Species+.

C. Updating synonyms based on species assessments

Synonyms identified in the process of writing species assessments (e.g. under the Review of Significant Trade process) are added to Species+ between the CITES CoPs. This is primarily based on detailed taxon-specific research in the scientific literature. Where synonyms are already in Species+ for another accepted taxon, the standard references and other relevant literature are checked to ensure correct reconciliation.

D. Updating synonyms based on expert/authority requests

Requests for synonyms to be added to Species+ may also be received from experts or CITES Authorities. In these instances, and where not already in Species+, the scientific literature is checked and the synonym added/reassigned as appropriate.

2. Management of hybrids in Species +

New hybrids (including those presented as hybrid names or using the parental cross formula) are not added to Species +. The only exception to this has been for sturgeons where parental cross hybrids have been used in the monitoring/management of the caviar trade. Where taxa already included in Species+ as accepted names are later reclassified as hybrids, these are treated as synonyms of the first common taxon of the parent taxa in Species+. This ensures that information associated with that name reconciles to the correct accepted name. Where CITES Parties submit trade information associated with a hybrid, this trade data is entered into the CITES Trade Database as the “Genus hybrid” (e.g. *Cattleya* hybrid) or if it is an inter-genera hybrid it is entered as “Family hybrid” (e.g. trade in a hybridised orchid species within two separate genera is entered as “Orchidaceae hybrid”).

3. Treatment of newly described species belonging to taxa included in the CITES Appendices under higher taxonomic level listings

The treatment of newly described species belonging to taxa covered by higher taxonomic level listings varies depending on whether a standard reference exists.

If a standard reference exists, the new species are not added as a new accepted name without the standard reference being updated. In this case, the newly described species is added as a synonym of the parent taxon. For example, *Phragmipedium anguloi* was discovered after the publication of the *Phragmipedium* standard reference, and therefore this species is included in Species + as a synonym of *Phragmipedium*. This approach ensures that only species covered by the standard reference are included as part of the official CITES Checklist, but also facilitates the captures of these names if Parties are reporting trade in these new names. If Parties would prefer a different approach (e.g. adding these new species for higher level listings, but without the Standard reference – or using a different species name category), advice would be welcome.

Where a standard reference does not exist, the scientific literature and other expert resources (e.g. Kew World Checklist of Selected Plant Families), and in consultation with the Nomenclature Specialist for plants, as appropriate, are consulted for verification of the newly described species, and to ensure that it does not comprise of taxa already in Species+ (e.g. that it has not been split out from another species, or comprised of species being lumped together). Once verified, the newly described species is then added to Species+ as an accepted name along with any taxonomic changes to the species already in Species +.
