

Guidance for the trade name Dracaena marginata

Dracaena marginata is a common trade name for the popular houseplant Dragon Tree. However, this name can cause confusion as it is not an accepted scientific name and has been published in scientific literature twice by different botanists. These two instances of the name (homonyms) refer to different species.

Description	Rosette of leaves on top of woody stem. Stems form already in young plants, often branched. Leaves not fleshy, no teeth on leaf margins. Leaves variable in colour, often with white, pink or red stripes along leaf margin.	Rosette plant. Large specimens form an upright, usually unbranched stem. Leaves rather fleshy succulent, small red teeth along leaf margin. Leaves grey/green in colour with red margin.
