NEW HANDBOOK AND DIRECTORY

A new Handbook for Members has been produced by the Society's headquarters, copies of which will be sent to all members in January 1994. CURRENT COMMITTEES

IRS DECISION

The Internal Revenue Service, in a decision dated August 25, 1993, has at length determined that the Society is exempt from income tax as an organization described in section 501(c)3 of the Tax Code. As a consequence, donations to the Society are deductible under Section 170 of that Code. At the end of the "advance ruling period" (June 30, 1977) officials of the Society must notify the Internal Revenue Service that its sources of revenue have not changed.

NEWS FROM MEMBERS

Anthony COWIE is editor of the Oxford Dictionary of Phrasal Verbs (ISBN 0-19-431284-4, 517 pp.). This new edition of a volume originally titled the Oxford Dictionary of Current Idiomatic English, Volume 1 (Cowie and Mackin, 1975) includes quotations collected for the updating of OED and material from the Oxford Corpus of the English Language.

Robert I. FITZHENRY announces the 3d edition of his Fitzhenry and Whiteside Dictionary of Quotations (Canadian title). In the U.S., it has been known as the Harper Book of Quotations, in Australia as the Allen & Unwin Book of Quotations and in the U.K. The Chambers Book of Quotations.

Michael JACOBY (Erlenstrasse 18, 1000 Berlin 41, Germany) has sent us a copy of his paper "Fremdeinflusse und deren Auswirkungen innerhalb nordischer Lexikographie im Rahmen der gesamteuropäischen Entwicklung."

OBITUARIES

The friends of James L. Rosier (1932-1992) at the University of Pennsylvania have published a pamphlet recording A Remembrance held on October 1, 1992, and containing a number of eulogies and reminiscences.

Clarence Lewis Barnhart on October 24, 1993 in Peekskill, New York. On behalf of the Society, Sidney Landau, current President, has sent a letter of condolence to members Robert and David Barnhart expressing its high regard for their father, of which the following is an excerpt: "The college dictionary as we know it would not exist without his pioneering work as editor of the American College Dictionary, one of the greatest of American dictionaries. His influence on school dictionaries is equally far-reaching. The Thorndike-Barnhart dictionaries established the standard by which all later school dictionaries have to be judged.... Clarence's achievement

is all the greater when one considers that he did most of it without the backing of large corporations, but on his own. He is indeed in the tradition of Noah Webster, with whom I believe he shared an immeasurable degree of determination...Clarence was always extremely generous in sharing information with other lexicographers, and did more than anyone to establish lexicography as a worthy profession in the United States."

NEXT MEETING

The Society has received tentative offers to host its next meeting (1995), by members at the University of Georgia (Athens) and at Case Western Reserve University (Cleveland). Discussions are at an early stage and offers, when firm and detailed, will be placed before the Executive Board for its decision.

EARLY DICTIONARY DATABASES CONFERENCE REPORT

Ian Lancashire writes that the Conference on early dictionary databases at the University of Toronto took place on October 8-9, 1993 and included 24 speakers from Canada, France, Switzerland and the United States. A previous conference on early dictionaries in October 1991 discussed encoding methods and its proceedings appear in Historical Dictionary Databases (ed. T.R. Wooldridge, 1992), which may be purchased for \$35 from the Centre for Computing in the Humanities at the University of Toronto.

The 1993 conference focused on the impact that future research into early dictionaries will have on scholarship, the principles inherited from traditional lexicography that should guide this new research, and the ways in which computer technology makes possible the integration of early dictionaries and texts. Early dictionaries commented on by speakers included those of Cawdrey, Cotgrave, Wilkins, Ménage, Johnson, those of the Académie française, the DOE, MED, OED and the Dictionnaire du français québecois.

Keynote speakers were Richard Bailey (Michigan) and Bernard Quemada (Trésor de la langue française, Nancy), whose paper was delivered and translated by T.R. Wooldridge.

OED3: AN APPEAL

In a letter that appeared in the November 5, 1993 issue of the Times Literary Supplement, John Simpson and Edmund Weiner, co-editors of the third edition of the OED appeal to scholars, researchers, writers, and academics to notify them of any work they may know about concerning ante-dating, new senses and sources, new words, missing words etc... They note that The Second Edition was not a thorough reworking of the OED, but primarily an integration of the materials of the original with the supplements. The Third, however, will be a complete revision, and its editors (like those of the original edition) will again depend on volunteers to be of service: "anyone working on a literary, social, or other historical text who has found a discrepancy between the material with which they are working and an entry in the OED, no matter how trivial, [please] to send their comments to us." WHERE IS LEXICOGRAPHY TAUGHT?

From time to time our office receives inquiries from hardy souls planning to make lexicography their career. They invariably ask where they could undertake an appropriate course of study in this field. I reply that to my knowledge only the University of Delaware is active in offering a program in lexicography in this country and that Dr. Hartmann's Dictionary Research Centre does so in England. Obviously an apprenticeship in a functioning dictionary office would also provide valuable practical training, but I know of none that offer such opportunities routinely. I am sure that there are other sources of education or training in this field: will you please let me know who you are?

PERIODICALS

We have received the most recent (July 1993) issue of the League for Literate Laws Dispatch, an occasional publication "working for better laws through better English." Articles by the editor (John A. Bell, 9405 Mellenbrook Road, Columbia MD 21045) scrutinize the language of federal statutes in search of awkwardness, lack of clarity, excessive length and bad grammar and suggest alternative phrasing. Lexicos 3, published by the University of Stellenbosch. The current issue contains articles in Afrikaans and in English, including one by D.C. Hauptfleisch entitled "Racist Language in Society and in Dictionaries" (57 pp.).

SUPREME COURT STORY

The A.B.A. Journal (July 1993) printed a story by David O. Stewart about the extent to which justices of the U.S. Supreme Court rely on dictionaries, which ones, and what vintage. According to the reporter, the dictionaries relied on are Webster (1828), James Buchanan (1757), Black's Law Dictionary (1979 and 1990), Webster 3 (1961), American Heritage, Webster 2 (1942), Merriam-Webster's Ninth Collegiate (1983). A conclusion drawn by the writer is that the senior justices in their opinions cite dictionaries half as often as the junior ones.


