Emergent Plants (Plants with leaves extending above the water surface)

<i>Alisma</i> sp.	Water Plantain; Mud Plantain
<i>Bolboschoenus fluviatilis</i>	River Bulrush
<i>Dulichium arundinaceum</i>	Three-way sedge
<i>Eleocharis erythropoda</i>	Bald spikerush
<i>Eleocharis palustris</i>	Small's Spikerush
<i>Phragmites australis</i>	Common reed grass, Cane
<i>Sagittaria latifolia</i>	Broad-leaved Arrowhead
<i>Sagittaria rigida</i>	Stiff Wapato, Sessile-fruited
<i>Schoenoplectus tabernaemontani</i>	Soft-stem bulrush
<i>Typha latifolia</i>	Broad-leaved cattail
