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INTRODUCTION

The Kem Papers document the term of a Republican United States Senator from Missouri. The bulk of the material is constituent correspondence.

DONOR INFORMATION

The Kem Papers were donated to the University of Missouri by James Preston Kem on 29 December 1952 (Accession No. 3147).

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

James Preston Kem was born on April 2, 1890, in Macon, Missouri, the son of James P. Kem and Evelyn Lee Kem. He graduated from the Bles Military Academy in 1906, the University of Missouri in 1910, and the Harvard Law School in 1913. He was admitted to the bar and began practicing law in Kansas City in the office of Warner, Dean, McLeon & Langworthy. He practiced law in Kansas City from 1913 to 1946, and in Washington, D.C., from 1952 to 1962.

From 1917 to 1919, Kem served in the infantry of the U.S. Army. He married Mary Elizabeth Carroll in 1920, and the couple had two daughters: Carroll (Mrs. Virginius Randolph Shackelford, Jr.) and Evelyn (Mrs. John Everett Knapp).

Kem was a member of the American Bar Association, Missouri Bar Association, Lawyers' Association of Kansas City, Kansas City Bar Association, Cass County Farm Bureau, Farmers' Club, William S. Bland Post No. 20 of the American Legion, St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Ivanhoe Masonic Lodge, University Club, and Kansas City Country Club. He was vice-chairman of the board of trustees of the University of Kansas City, and a director of St. Luke's Hospital in Kansas City.

In 1946, Kem was elected to the U.S. Senate as a Republican and served until 1952. He was a member of the Agriculture and Forestry Committee, the Interstate and Foreign Commerce Committee, and the District of Columbia Committee.
