## IMPORTANCE OF VACCINATION.

THE recent introduction of Small-pox to the colony has again shown our liability to such an attack at any moment; and, although the disease has happily been again prevented from gaining a footing here, the Central Board of Health deem it of great importance to the safety of the public that every advantage should be taken of the present very favorable season for vaccination, so that the protection which vaccination is known to afford against the horrors of Small-pox may be extended as widely as possible throughout the colony.

The Central Board therefore trust that the local sanitary authorities will use all means in their power for securing the extension of vaccination in their respective districts; and as the Board believe that the ministers of the various religious bodies might very beneficially use the influence and opportunities they possess in directing attention at the present time to the proved benefits of vaccination, they desire to appeal to the latter also to use their influence in promoting a hearty compliance with the provisions of the Vaccination Act.

## INCORPORATION OF BALLARAT DISTRICT ORPHAN ASYLUM.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of June 1873.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and they shall thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Administrator of the Government in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Ballarat District Orphan Asylum, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the contributors to the said

institution to be a body politic and corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, in manner following, that is to say:—

The contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Ballarat District Orphan Asylum, situate at Ballarat, in the colony of Victoria, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Ballarat District Orphan Asylum."

And the Honorable James Goodall Francis, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby define the boundaries of the Towns hereinafter mentioned, and do distinguish such Towns by the names prefixed to the respective descriptions thereof, that is to say:—

Town of GLENMAGGIE.—County of Tanjil, parish of Glenmaggie: Commencing at the point where the east boundary of Angus Shaw's licensed block, No. 33869/19th sec., abuts on Glenmaggie Creek; bounded thence by that block and a line bearing south about twenty-two chains; thence again by that block and a line bearing east about fifty chains to a point south of the south-west angle of John Rahilly's licensed block, No. 33267/19th sec.; thence by a line and that block bearing north about seventy chains to the aforesaid creek; and thence by that creek upwards to the commencing point.—(73.L.2968.)
