

Melaleuca diosmatifolia (Rosy Honey Myrtle)

Attractive, hardy shrub with a prolonged summer flowering period commencing in November. It thrives along watercourses or river flats. Its flowers are pale to deep mauve that sprout on short lateral branches in cylindrical spikes that grow up to 3cm long and up to 2cm in diameter. Its fruit are barrel shaped and about 4mm wide. Leaves are almost without stalks, terete and linear shaped up to 12mm long and 0.5mm wide with a small point at the apex. They are arranged alternately to each other on the branch.
