

Melaleuca suberosa (Cork-bark Honey Myrtle)

Western Australia

Small shrub. The small leaves are linear in shape to about 6-7 mm long. Flowers occur in clusters along the older stems, often forming extended "spikes" of flowers. They are deep mauve to purple and are seen in late winter and spring. The flowers are followed by globular seed capsules.
