OUR SCHOOL

Henderson Collegiate is a public charter school focused on closing the achievement gap with targeted college prep curriculum and instruction for at-risk and first-generation college students.

Henderson Collegiate was one of only 7.3% of all North Carolina public schools to earn an 'A' in 2017-2018 and earned the state's highest grade four years in a row starting in 2015.

OUR MISSION

Empower students with the character traits, academic skills, social experiences, and love of learning necessary for them to shape their own destinies, attend and graduate from the college of their choice, and become world-changing problem-solvers.

OUR PROGRAM

Extended learning time

Every year, students benefit from 25 additional days of instruction (~182 hours).

We follow a 51:49 approach. 51% of our emphasis is on character development and 49% on academics. We believe that becoming better people is even more important than becoming better students.

College preparatory curriculum


Our content and curriculum are designed to build students' critical thinking skills and to prepare them for the rigor of college courses.



GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To receive an HCHS diploma, students must successfully complete a minimum of 26 credits (1 credit = 1 year).



In addition, students must also complete:

- Senior Research Project
- 60 hours of community service
- CPR training
- 1 summer enrichment program

GRADING SCALE


In accordance with state requirements, HCHS uses the North Carolina grading scale and GPA weighted formula.

A student who earns a D or F must complete tutoring and remediation, participate in our Summer Remediation program, or repeat the course to earn a 70 average or higher.

ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

HCHS students consistently outperform both local and state schools on standardized tests. The school earned the state's highest performance grade four years in a row from 2014-2018, ranking in the top 7.3% of all North Carolina public schools and top 0.5% of North Carolina Title I schools.



ACADEMIC COURSES

Students at HCHS attend class from 7:45 am to 3:30pm with tutoring integrated during the day. Due to the length of the school day and rigor of the curriculum, students are advised not to take more than 3 AP courses per year. In addition, students take two years of College Readiness courses beginning in Junior year.

ALUMNI

100% of the HCHS alumni were accepted into a 4-year college or university, with 28% being accepted into a Tier I-III institution.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Our AP program has grown steadily since starting with only one AP offering. We currently offer **9 AP courses**, including: AP Calculus (AB & BC), AP US History, AP World History, AP Spanish Language, AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science, AP English Language, and AP English Literature.

100% of HCHS students take AP US History and AP Environmental Science in their junior year.

In the last 4 years, our students have **surpassed the national average** in AP World History, AP Spanish, AP English Literature, and AP Calculus AB.

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTING

Students will take the ACT and SAT a minimum of one time each, with most students taking each exam twice.



EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
