## **Sacred Connections**

#### Are we REDI?

One of the things that makes Temple Beth Sholom's Sanctuary so special is that it is fashioned after Abraham's tent in the desert, which is said to have been open on all four sides to greet guests. At TBS we are committed to honoring this value of our patriarch, Abraham, the value known as hachnassat orchim, the welcoming of guests. We pride ourselves on being inviting, inclusive and hamishe ("warm and friendly" in Yiddish). We reflect a beautiful and diverse congregation of people, including those who were born Jewish and grew up in Reform, Conservative, Orthodox or secular homes, those who have chosen Judaism, and those who are Jewish adjacent. We include those who live with physical, mental or intellectual disabilities, Jews of Color, LGBTQ+ Jews and interfaith families; those from a multiplicity of countries and at least six out of seven continents (please let me know if there is anyone from Antartica!). We include the tiniest of newborns and the most senior adults; single individuals, blended families and multi-generational families, all with a wide range of socioeconomic backgrounds and political affiliations.

How blessed we are to be comprised of this vast array of people! Our goal is to make sure that each and every one of us feels at home and a sense of belonging at TBS. To that end, we are assembling a REDI (Racial, Equity, Diversity and Inclusivity) Working Group. This group, made up of people from a wide variety of backgrounds and lived experiences and led by Lou Dogan and Amy Turkel, will explore both subtle and overt ways we might better express our inclusivity. They will evaluate how People of Color are treated at our gates, whether or not the language we use is properly inclusive and how we might increase our sensitivity to all peoples' needs. The Union for Reform Judaism is spearheading this initiative called Audacious Hospitality and has designed an assessment tool which will be used by our REDI Group. Additionally, our staff has already begun REDI training and we will continue this important conversation.

The latest Pew study affirms that the U.S. Jewish population is becoming more racially and ethnically diverse. Fifteen percent of all Jews who are 18 - 29

years old identify as Jews of Color. Seventy one percent of non-Orthodox Jewish marriages are interfaith and Jews with disabilities account for 20% of our community. Additionally, 10% of U.S. Jews identify as Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and /or queer and up to 20% for those who are 18 - 29 years old. As these statistics show, it is essential that we continue to create a Jewish space where all feel a sense of belonging. More important than being strategically smart for TBS, it celebrates our Jewish values.

This month as we roll back the Torah to our opening stories, we read about Abraham sitting by the entrance of his open tent, recovering from his circumcision. Even in his physically compromised state, when he saw three strangers pass by, he leapt up to greet them, not even realizing they were messengers from God. May we be inspired by Abraham's audacious hospitality, even when it was difficult, and continue to model it here in our open tent of TBS.

On the first Shabbat of October this year, we read the first portion of the Torah, B'reishit. This is the first word of our most sacred text and is commonly translated to "in the beginning." I know we are hopeful that this fall might be a new beginning for all of us relative to the Covid-19 pandemic, though with variants and mutations, it is often difficult to see when a new beginning might occur and stick.

This past summer certainly felt like a new beginning with the reopening of overnight summer camps! After spending summer 2020 in our bedrooms and on screens, summer 2021 offered the chance for campers to physically walk through those gates once again and resume some sense of normalcy for the first time in too long. Yes, some things were different – masks were worn, meals were eaten outside in large tents rather than in airconditioned dining halls, movement around camp might have been more restricted within "pods" – but camp happened, and it was just what we needed.

Social opportunities for our kids have been limited since the start of the pandemic. We have done the best we could with Zoom and FaceTime opportunities, outdoor get-togethers with distancing, and whatever extra-curricular activities were running with the proper precautions. This still was not quite enough. With the opening of camps this summer, kids were able, at least for a short time, to resume some sense of normal interactions with their peers. They got to hang out in cabins or dorms with their friends. They got to participate in their favorite camp activities, including song sessions and color wars. They got to live in a camp bubble where they were always aware that Covid-19 was still a thing, but it was largely "out there." Testing protocols were worked into the schedules, and while it was a slight inconvenience, it was worth it so that the rest of camp could run.

One of the beautiful things about Jewish overnight camp is the way that our kids (and staff members) can truly live the values we teach. Kol Yisrael arevim zah lazeh – All Jews are responsible for one another. Pikuach Nefesh – the mitzvah of saving a human life. Al tifrosh min hatzibur – Do not separate yourself from the community. These are Jewish teachings that our kids could truly put

into practice this summer. They felt a collective sense of responsibility, and so followed pre-camp precautions that ensured their own safety and that of the whole camp community. They understood that following protocols before and during camp kept everyone healthy - and potentially saved lives. And they did not stay home out of their own sense of fear and uncertainty - rather, they joined back into their communities so they could benefit from the camp experience and contribute to it, as well. It is already time to think about summer 2022! We have some great Jewish camping options within our Union for Reform Judaism family. Camp Coleman in Cleveland, Georgia is our long-time regional camp that offers a wide range of activities and opportunities for growth and fun. We have three 6 Points Specialty Camps on the East Coast - Creative Arts in Pennsylvania, Sci-Tech in Massachusetts, and Sports in North Carolina - that allow our kids to engage in areas they love within a Jewish environment. All these options are amazing experiences, run by staff that put health and safety at the forefront. We hope you consider a URJ camp for your child(ren) this upcoming summer! To learn more, please reach out to me (if you don't know already, I LOVE to talk about camp!) or to our CLASP Fellow, Seth Cohen. Summer 2021 may have been a new start and a return to some sense of normalcy (as we return to the start of the Torah each year). Let summer 2022 be the start of a lifelong love of Jewish camping for your child(ren)!

This past year has been one of loss, stress, and unease. Together we have navigated a global pandemic, social and political division, and the tragedy of Surfside, amongst other concerns. At the same time, it has been a year of hope, of nurturing relationships, and of coming together to support one another and seek positive change and growth. We have learned that it is harder to withstand adversity in isolation, that we are stronger when we come together. As such, the theme for our Social Justice Network this year is solidarity.

The foundation of solidarity is unity - the commitment to form relationships across lines of difference to work together towards a common mission. Solidarity can be felt in many ways. We feel it when we work alongside different community partners to uplift those who are struggling. We also feel solidarity in understanding the interconnectedness of racism and antisemitism and fighting the scourge of both. We stand in solidarity when we listen to each other and understand each other's different views. And we stand in solidarity as we march against injustice, advocate and lobby for change, and educate ourselves and those near us. Nothing rings truer than the Jewish teaching in Psalms 91:15 "When he calls out to me, I will answer him. I will be with him in trouble." That's solidarity!

Look out for programming this year in which we stand in solidarity. We have so many avenues in which you can get involved in working toward meaningful change in our community. We work in committees with People Acting in Community Together (PACT), a multi-faith organization where people work to solve social problems in our local community. We have been excited to work closely alongside members of other Reform Jewish congregations throughout the state as part of the newly formed Religious Action Center of Florida (RAC-FL). Our gun violence prevention task force partners with local schools and physician's

offices to advocate for safety for our children and families.

Throughout the past few years, we have worked alongside several organizations around Miami and the state of Florida to advance our mission of creating a just and equitable society. In 2019 we partnered with the American Friends Service Committee and the Florida Immigration Coalition to close the Homestead Detention Center for migrant children. In 2018 we worked with the Florida Rights Restoration Coalition to pass Amendment 4, restoring the right to vote for thousands of returning citizens. These are a few examples of how we work together in partnerships and coalitions to uplift us all. Our partnerships are ongoing, and we recognize the necessity of working in solidarity with marginalized communities in order to bring about justice. We hope you will join us as we continue this sacred work!



## Barbara and Allan Pekor "I feel that what I can do with my life beyond this earth is to give to future generations."

Some love stories take longer than others to play out... but if they are truly bashert (destined to be), time knows no boundaries. For Barbara and Allan Pekor, a five-decade winding road led them to their 2013 marriage at Temple Beth Sholom by Rabbi Davis and Cantor Segal. Through their combined families, between them they now have five children and nine grandchildren and even a great grandchild. Their love and commitment to one another and to Reform Judaism is why their legacy gift is planned through their wills. They both believe that a gift through a bequest best expresses their continued support for the future of the Temple, beyond their years.

Allan's philosophy is "the reason we are here today, is because every generation made an investment in the future generation. Without that, who knows what would happen?" Barbara adds, "You may give to other organizations, but they don't make you feel good like the Temple does when you are a legacy donor." Barbara shares that she had never given much thought to giving through a will before; however, she does recall her uncle having done so for a synagogue up north. "It doesn't have to be a large amount, but the thought that part of you is going to help future generations who possibly could not afford temple membership is important."

Looking back, Barbara's upbringing was Conservative and she was actively involved in temple life. Allan's family, though a bit less religious, did keep a kosher home and belonged to a Conservative synagogue led by iconic Rabbi Joachim Prinz, who was an inspiration to him. They each were previously married and met as friends and neighbors 50 years ago in Manalapan, New Jersey, where the couples raised their families. At the time, there was only a semi-Orthodox synagogue in the area, so they joined together with 12 other families to found Temple Shaari Emeth. They

worked tirelessly to hold services and religious school classes wherever they could, as they conducted fundraisers to eventually build a permanent home for the temple. It grew into a successful Reform congregation of 600 families that they still visit whenever they are in New Jersey. Allan served twice as President of the congregation and spent five years as temple youth group leader, and Barbara was membership chair, as well as a much beloved third grade religious school teacher for 45 years.

In 1989, when Allan and his family moved to Miami Beach, as a housewarming gift, their friends Sue and Leonard Miller z"l, gave them a one year membership to Temple Beth Sholom. Allan felt he found a temple home. "The clergy is terrific! I've continued to serve on the Board over many years and am most interested in social action and Judaism's commitment to the values our religion espouses."

When the right circumstances led them to reunite and marry, Barbara also felt a deep connection to Temple Beth Sholom and said, "I felt like I was home again." Barbara actively volunteers at Mount Sinai Hospital and is a member of the TBS team that feeds the homeless at Chapman Partnership. Together they share a long-term commitment to supporting legacy through their estate planning. "It is personally rewarding for both of us to know that beyond our own years, we will be supporting the continuity of Jewish life at Temple Beth Sholom."



If I am not for myself, who will be for me? When I am only for myself, what am I? If not now, when? - Rabbi Hillel

The high holidays are a time for deep reflection and connection to ourselves and our community.
