Flowering from June to October (in the Northern Hemisphere), they have masses of small pink, white or crimson flowers, sometimes with a honey fragrance. They are best grown in full sun with some shelter. La familia incluye 9 géneros y unas 130 especies. En general son árboles o arbustos oriundos de las regiones templadas a tropicales de Sudamérica, Malasia, Nueva Zelanda y de la isla Reunión. Descripción Son árboles o arbustos, usualmente terrestres, raramente plantas epifitas; los tallos con corteza frecuentemente exfoliante. Estipulas ausentes. Hojas alternas, simples, con las láminas a veces glandulares o resinosa, margen frecuentemente aserrado o con glándulas caducas. Inflorescencias terminales o axilares, en racimos, panículas o menos frecuentemente flores solitarias. Flores actinomorfas, bisexuales; sépalos 5, frecuentemente fusionados en las bases para formar un tubo corto; pétalos 5, libres, lineares, espatulados u obovados, erectos o extendidos; androceo de 5 estambres, estambres alternipetalos, anteras dehiscentes longitudinalmente; disco epigino rodeando la base del estilo. Frutos en forma de cápsulas. Semillas numerosas, pequeñas; con endosperma.
