



# *Acacia stricta*

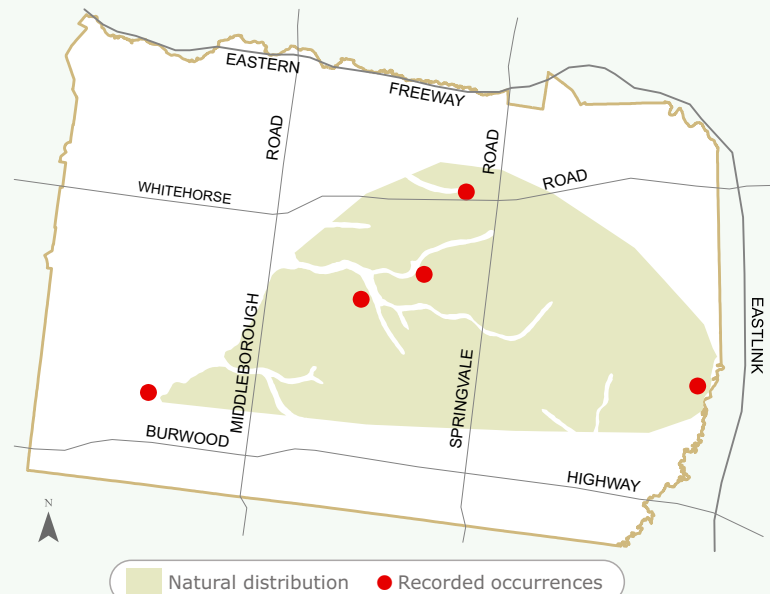
## Hop Wattle

<b>Height:</b>	2m - 5m
<b>Width:</b>	2m - 4m
<b>Habit:</b>	Fast-growing open upright shrub.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Erect narrow elliptical dull grey-green phyllodes (leaves) to 15cm long.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Pale yellow balls flowering May to October.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Reasonably well drained positions in most soils. Shade, full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	Generally adaptable in cultivation. Suitable for areas of low maintenance and as a light screen or low windbreak. Suited for planting under existing trees. Drought hardy.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.
