

Poa morrisii **Velvet Tussock Grass**

Height:

to 30cm, stems 50-90cm high

Width:

30cm - 50cm

Habit:

Soft dense perennial tussock grass.

Foliage:

Soft velvety grey to bluish flat leaves.

Flowers:

Green, purple to straw-coloured open flowerheads to 25cm long on erect stems.

Flowers from October to January.

Requirements:

Moist, well drained soils. Full or partial sun.

Cultivation & uses:

An attractive ornamental grass, useful for borders, rockeries or cottage gardens. May be grown beneath established trees.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.




