

Minuta de tradução de texto de requisitos fitossanitários para importação de estacas de coleus (*Solenostemon scutellarioides*) dos Estados Unidos da América

1. The consignment of coleus stems should be free from roots, plant residues and soil material.

2. The consignment of coleus stems should be accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate issued by the NPPO from USA, with the following Additional Declarations (ADs):

a) **AD1** “coleus stems (*Solenostemon scutellarioides*) are free from the insects *Aleurodicus dugesii* and *Planchonia stentae*”.

b) **AD2** “coleus stems (*Solenostemon scutellarioides*) have been treated with (specify: product, dosage or concentration, temperature and duration of exposition), to control the insects *Aleurodicus dugesii* and *Planchonia stentae*, under official supervision.

c) **AD5** – The site where the coleus stems has been produced underwent official inspection during the culture cycle and the following pests were not detected: the fungi *Nectriella pironii* and *Peronospora lamii*;

d) **AD10** – The coleus stems were produced in compliance with phytosanitary certification procedures approved by Brazilian’s NPPO for the virus Impatiens necrotic spot virus and Tomato yellow leaf curl virus by using adequate indicators or equivalent methods, being free of Impatiens necrotic spot virus and Tomato yellow leaf curl virus.

c) **AD15** – The consignment of coleus stems (*Solenostemon scutellarioides*) is free from the fungi *Nectriella pironii* and *Peronospora lamii* in compliance with the results of the official laboratory analysis (specify number of analysis);

d) Alternately, for any of the mentioned pests, the National Plant Protection Organization can declare option **AD7** - coleus stems (*Solenostemon scutellarioides*) were produced in an area known to Brazil’s NPPO as free from (specify pest(s)), in compliance with International Standards for Phytosanitary Measures (ISPM) No. 4 of the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO).

e) For compliance with Additional Declaration **AD7**, Brazil’s NPPO will have to officially acknowledge the free areas in the country of origin, by means of its publication on the Brazilian Official Daily.
