## **MINUTA** MINUTA Nº

ESTABLISHES THE PHYTOSANITARY REQUIREMENTS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF BETA VULGARIS SEEDS FROM ANY ORIGIN

THE SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURAL PROTECTION, OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND LIVESTOCK, in the use of the attributions conferred on it by arts. 22 and 49 of Annex I of Decree No. 11.332, of January 1, 2023, in view of the provisions of Decree No. 24,114, of April 12, 1934, in Decree No. 1,355, of December 30, 1994, in Decree No. 5,759, of April 17, 2006, in MAPA Ordinance No. 65, of March 30, 2021, in Normative Instruction No. 25, of April 7, 2020, and what is contained in Process No. 21000.083389/2022-12, resolves:

- Art. 1° The Phytosanitary Requirements for the importation of seeds (Category 4) of *Beta vulgaris* from any origin are established.
- § 1° All varieties of *Beta vulgaris* are included.
- § 2° This ordinance does not apply to Beta vulgaris subsp. vulgaris var. conditiva (beet) from MERCOSUR countries
- Art. 2° Beta vulgaris seeds must be accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate, issued by the National Plant Protection Organization - NPPO of the country of origin, with the following Additional Declaration:
- I "The consignment is free from Amaranthus blitoides, Arabis mosaic virus, Arctotheca calendula, Bromus rigidus, Carduus pycnocephalus, Cirsium arvense, Cuscuta campestris, Cuscuta epithymum, Ditylenchus dipsaci, Erwinia rhapontici, Euphorbia esula, Euphorbia helioscopia, Gibellulopsis nigrescens, Heliotropium europaeum, Hibiscus trionum, Împerata cylindrica, Lepidium draba, Lolium rigidum, Peronospora farinosa, Persicaria barbata, Persicaria nepalensis, Persicaria pensylvanica, Phalaris paradoxa, Pseudomonas syringae pv. aptata, Rhaponticum repens, Rumex hypogaeus, Stemphylium beticola, Tobacco rattle virus and Tomato black ring virus, according to the result of the official laboratory analysis No ()".
- Art. 3° According to the phytosanitary status in its territory, the country of origin may, alternatively, declare for the regulated pests above:
- I "(Name of pest/s) is an absent quarantine pest for (country of origin)."; or
- II "(Name of pest/s) is not present (country of origin)."
- Art. 4° The country of origin must previously communicate, for approval by the NPPO of Brasil, the Additional Declaration that will be used in the issuance of the Phytosanitary Certificate.
- § 1° If there is no prior communication and approval provided for in the caput of this article, the country of origin must comply with the provisions of art. 2°, being unable to use the alternative declarations provided for in art. 3°.
- § 2° The country of origin must inform the change in the phytosanitary status of the indicated pests, when there is a change in the status in its territory.
- Art. 5° The consignments are subject to inspection at the point of entry (Phytosanitary Inspection PI), as well as the collection of samples for phytosanitary analysis in official laboratories or laboratories accredited by the Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock - MAP.
- § 1. The costs of sending the samples and the phytosanitary analysis will be borne by the interested party.
- § 2. At the inspection's discretion, the interested party may remain as the depositary of the remainder of the consignment until the inspection process is completed.
- Art. 6° In the event of interception of a quarantine pest or a pest that presents quarantine potential for Brazil, the consignment will be destroyed or rejected and the NPPO in the country of origin will be notified, and the NPPO

in Brazil may suspend imports of *Beta vulgaris* seeds from this country until the review of the Pest Risk Analysis.

Art. 7° The consignment will not be internalized when it fails to comply with the requirements established in this Ordinance.

Art. 8° This Ordinance enters into force on the date of xx of xxxx, 2023.

§ 1° For seeds of *Beta vulgaris* from the countries of origin South Africa, Germany, Australia, Chile, Denmark, United States of America, France, Italy, Japan, New Zealand and The Netherlands, a period of 180 (one hundred and eighty) days is granted for the National Organizations of Phytosanitary Protection - NPPO of the countries of origin adapt their procedures to apply the requirements set forth in this Ordinance.

§ 2 During the period provided for in § 1, the requirements in force at the time of entry into force of this Ordinance are applied.
