Judges Choice - October - Brassidium Golden Gamine

Brassidium (Brsdm.) Golden Gamine is an easy to grow hybrid that is a cross between Oncidium sotoanum

and *Brsdm*. Golden Urchin which is *Oncidium wentworthianum* x *Brassia arcuigera*. We purchased our plant from Alice's Orchids in 2010 and it is growing in a wire basket lined with shade cloth and coir in a medium sized potting mix of bark, perlite and charcoal. It hangs under 50% shade with plenty of air circulation. It may flower twice a year with the right conditions and the raceme can have up to 20 lightly perfumed flowers which are arranged evenly on the spike.

Reserve Champion Orchid: Cattleya schilleriana – I & N Frizzo







Saccolabiopsis armitii – W & J HarrisThis small epiphyte occurs from the Iron Range in north Queensland, south to near Bundaberg. Its preferred habitats are the drier monsoonal scrubs extending from the coast of to more than 150 km inland. Leaves of this plant are narrow and crowded on the stem. They are usually green but may become reddish under high light conditions. The very small flowers (1-3 mm) are held in pendant racemes up to 10 cm long. The mount figured is about 6 x 14 cm long. The very prominent anther is a striking red colour.

This species appears to be easily cultivated here on the coast and is best grown on a hard wood mount (see photo) and well watered during summer.

Judges Choice - October *Phalaenopsis mariae*,

(Section Ploychilos), is found from Borneo to the Philippines where it grows in dense shade at up to 600m. elevation. Our plant was purchased from Robertson's Orchid Nursery about 6 years ago and we have mounted it on a tree fern log and hang it horizontally under the bench. In hot weather or periods of low humidity all our orchids on mounts are misted frequently. We fertilize Phalaenopsis regularly with a half strength solution varying the products between Horticultural Solutions HSO12, HSO22 and AON Supreme. It is common for Phals. In this section to flower for several seasons on the same raceme and we only cut off a stem when it has withered. **Gina and Charlie**

Judges Choice - November - Grammatophyllum rumphianum
This genus comprises about 13 large growing epiphytes from Myanmar through to the South Pacific islands in Fiji and the Philippines.
The pseudobulbs of this species are thick and laterally compressed and may be surrounded by a mass of aerial basket roots. The flowering stem is long (1.20m long) and robust with 22 large (70mm wide) flowers. Because of its potential to grow very large it requires plenty of space and warm to hot conditions with copious water in the summer months. It is also a heavy feeder.

This plant was awarded an AM/AOC in 2015. Wayne & Jean

Cultural plant - Dendrobium friedricksianum

Den.friedricksianum comes from Thailand & Malaysia, I grow it in Kiwi bark under 70% shade cloth, fertilize every fortnight plus slow release granules Lots of water in the growing season, water should be reduced in autumn & very little water in winter.

I find this an easy plant to grow and a very rewarding. Bob & Joan
