

ouisville has been chosen to win the 2004 Conference USA football championship, according to the league's head coaches. In the closest preseason coaches poll ever, the Cardinals received 106 of a possible 121 points. Memphis was second with 101 points, Southern Miss placed third with 100 and TCU ranked fourth with 99.

Louisville finished 9-4 last season and is fueled by one of the most explosive offenses in the country.

Nine starters return to an offensive unit that led C-USA in total offense (521.4 yards per game) and scoring offense (36.1 points per game) in 2003. A pair of first team All-Conference performers from last year, QB Stefan LeFors and WR J.R. Russell, are joined on the preseason all-league offense by LT Travis Leffew. Cardinals DE Marcus Jones also received preseason recognition.

Hopes are high in Memphis, as the Tigers return 19 starters from a team that won nine games for the first time since 1963 and played in a bowl game for the first time in 32 years. Reigning C-USA Offensive Player of the Year, RB DeAngelo Williams, has been selected to repeat that honor this fall. Williams had 10 consecutive 100-yard games and set a school record with 1,430 rushing yards, despite missing the final three games with a knee injury. He is joined by WR Maurice Avery and FS Wesley Smith in receiving preseason All-C-USA accolades.

Defending champion Southern Miss was picked one notch behind Memphis in third place. The Golden Eagles' always-staunch defense will be led by the preseason Defensive Player of the Year, Michael Boley. Boley led the league and finished seventh in the nation in tackles for loss with 22.5, while registering 151 total tackles.

TCU, which is coming off its first 11-win campaign since winning the national title in 1938, was one point behind the Golden Eagles in fourth place. Running back Robert Merrill, who became the second straight Horned Frog freshman to rush for 1,000 yards, is helped by the blocking of offensive linemen Anthony Alabi and Chase Johnson. Those three players, along with defensive backs Mark Walker and Marvin Godbolt, give TCU a league-high five players on the preseason team.

Houston, which is coming off its first bowl appearance since 1996, was chosen fifth, just ahead of UAB. Sophomore QB Kevin Kolb was the most productive freshman QB in the nation last season and he will lead the high-powered Cougar offense again this fall. UAB welcomes back eight starters on offense and 10 on defense as it seeks its first-ever postseason bowl game. Both schools placed a pair of performers on the preseason all-league squad, with TE Stephen Cucci and DE loe Clay representing UH and K Nick Hayes and LB Zac Woodfin listed for UAB.

USF, which posted a 7-4 record last season in its first year in C-USA, was chosen seventh, just ahead of Cincinnati. The Bulls welcome back nine offensive starters in their second year in the league, while the Bearcats placed a league-high three players on the preseason all-conference team for defense. Defensive ends Trent Cole and Andre Frazier are joined by CB Daven Holly in receiving the preseason accolades as UC prepares for its first season under new coach Mark Dantonio

Rounding out the preseason poll are Tulane, East Carolina and Army. Tulane's talented WR Roydell Williams is joined by playmaking DB Tra Boger on the all-league team, while ECU is represented by Ryan Dougherty, the league's leading punter as a freshman last year, and productive LB Chris Moore. Army opens a new era this fall with the arrival of successful former collegiate and NFL coach Bobby Ross at West Point.

Four for Eight

They're Back

onference USA celebrates its 10th anniversary in 2004-05. A significant milestone for the league, the 10th year finds the conference preparing to embark on a new era in its already remarkable history.

Marshall, Rice, SMU, Tulsa, UCF and UTEP will join East Carolina, Houston, Memphis, Southern Miss, Tulane and UAB in a 12-team conference with competition beginning in 2005-06. Current members Cincinnati, DePaul, Louisville, Marquette and USF will become members of the BIG EAST, while TCU goes to the Mountain West and Charlotte and Saint Louis will join the Atlantic 10 at the end of this season. The membership changes have given C-USA the opportunity to play a pivotal role in the changing face of conference affiliations and will reinforce the league's position in collegiate athletics for years to come.

"We are excited about adding new members and making structural improvements to Conference USA," Banowsky said. "This is an opportunity for us to tighten our geography, group similar institutions together, create a divisional model, and possibly stage a football championship game. It will be very exciting to watch this league grow and develop."

The conference headquarters moves from Chicago to the Las Colinas area in the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex in June 2004.

With a promising future ahead, there is plenty for the league to celebrate from its first nine years. After its formation in 1995, hailed as a bold move in the world on intercollegiate sports, C-USA established a strong foundation while quickly earning a reputation of successfully competing at the highest levels of intercollegiate athletics. Capitalizing on the strengths of its 15 distinguished and diverse universities, Conference USA quickly emerged as one of the nation's top conferences.

A PROUD HISTORY; A STRONG IDENTITY

The conference unveiled its name, logo and commissioner on April 24, 1995 in Chicago. Eleven of the institutions began athletic participation in 1995, while Houston joined competition in the fall of 1996. The league's headquarters were established in Chicago and after nine years, relocated to Irving, Texas. Britton Banowsky was named Commissioner in October 2002, succeeding Mike Slive, the league's first commissioner.

In May 2000, the league introduced a brand identity program, featuring a family of new marks that reflect the urban, progressive and bold nature of the C-USA brand. The new logos are part of a comprehensive marketing and promotional program designed to reinforce the conference's athletic and national emergence.

EXPANSION AND REALIGNMENT CHART THE COURSE

The league's charter members include Charlotte, Cincinnati, DePaul, Houston, Louisville, Marquette, Memphis, Saint Louis, Southern Miss, Tulane, UAB and USF. C-USA added East Carolina (September, 1996) and the United States Military Academy (March, 1997) as football members. ECU began league competition in 1997; Army in 1998 and UAB began football play in 1999. The league added TCU and ECU (1999) for all sports and they began competition in 2001. USF started C-USA football in 2003.

As another wave of major conference realignment took shape in 2003-04, Conference USA announced the addition of Marshall, Rice, SMU, UTEP, Tulsa and UCF. The six join East Carolina, Houston, Memphis, Southern Miss, Tulane and UAB in a 12-team conference for competition beginning in 2005-06.

In addition, 27 men's and women's soccer teams, 23 baseball teams and 13 softball teams have earned NCAA Tournament bids. C-USA has sent two men's soccer teams to the Final Four, one baseball team to the College World Series and four softball teams to the Women's College World Series. The league has also had three national champions in NCAA track and field competition, one national champion in diving and numerous NCAA individual and team competitors in cross country, golf, swimming, tennis and track and field. Overall, Conference USA teams and individuals have made more than 350 NCAA appearances.

SUCCESS OFF THE FIELD

Among C-USA's 5,000 student-athletes, there are champions off the playing field as well. In nine years, 78 student-athletes earned national Verizon Academic All-America honors, while 216 were named All-District. In addition, more than 9,500 student-athletes have been named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll or received the Commissioner's Academic Medal, indicative of outstanding achievement in the classroom. The conference annually awards six postgraduate scholarships, along with the Sport Academic Award, Scholar Athletes of the Year and the Institutional Academic Excellence Award.

CONFERENCE USA ON TV

ESPN, Inc. and C-USA entered into an exclusive eight-year agreement, beginning with the 2001 season. The multi-faceted agreement, which incorporates ESPN, ESPN2, ESPN Regional Television, ABC Sports, ESPN.com and ESPN Classic, is highlighted by: ESPN/ESPN2's coverage of C-USA football featuring weeknight games; televising possible future C-USA Football Championship Games on ABC; men's basketball coverage; syndication and network rights for the conference's football and basketball coverage through ERT; continued exposure for women's basketball, along with volleyball, baseball, soccer and softball, as well as marketing rights. The league also provides exposure for women's basketball, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, baseball and softball through the Conference USA Television Network.

GOVERNANCE

Along with the ACC, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and SEC, Conference USA is one of the seven conferences having significant representation in the NCAA governance structure. The Presidents of the member institutions serve as the league's Board of Directors. Dr. Joseph Steger of Cincinnati served as the chair for the first four years and was succeeded by Dr. J.H. Woodward of Charlotte. In September 2003, Dr. Shirley Raines of Memphis was named as the third chair

2004 NCAA Rules Changes

Rule 1-4-5-m — A glove is a fitted covering for a hand having separate sections for each finger and thumb, without any additional material that connects any of the fingers and/or thumb, and that completely covers each finger and thumb.

Rule 1-4-9-c — A camera, with no audio component, may be attached to cables that hang over the team area.

Rule 3-3-4 — When timeouts are not exhausted, an official shall allow a charged team timeout when requested by any player or the head coach when the ball is dead. (adds 'or the head coach')

Rule 3-5-2-e — While in the process of substitution or simulated substitution, Team A is prohibited from rushing quickly to the line of scrimmage with the obvious attempt of creating a defensive disadvantage. (Delete 'and snapping the ball')

Rule 6-1-2-a — Allow Team B the option of assessing the penalty for encroachment by Penalty and Team A during a free kick from either the previous spot or from the 10-2-2-e end of Team B's run. Exception 5

Rule 7-3-8-c-4 — Delete the possibility of pass interference against Team B when a potential Team A kicker simulates a scrimmage kick by throwing the ball high and deep.

Rule 9-1-2-0 — Exempt a defensive player who is blocked into the passer from being penalized for roughing the passer

Rule 9-1-2-q — Add to the rule: No defensive player who runs forward and leaps in an obvious attempt to block a field goal or try may land on an opponent.

Rule 11-2-1-d — The referee, if he is equipped with a microphone, shall announce the number of the player committing the foul.

Experimental Rule (Big Ten Conference Only)

Allow the use of video replay to review officials' calls in games played at Big Ten Conference stadiums in 2004.

Conference USA is prepared to embark on a new era in its already remarkable history with the addition of six prominent and tradition-rich universities, beginning in the 2005-06 academic year.

Marshall, Rice, SMU, Tulsa, UCF and UTEP will join East Carolina, Houston, Memphis, Southern Miss, Tulane and UAB in a 12-team conference that bolsters men's and women's programs rich in athletic success and academic prowess.

"We're extremely pleased with the quality institutions that will represent Conference USA in the future," Commissioner Britton Banowsky said. "Each of these institutions is nationally renowned and committed to competing at the NCAA Division I-A level. Additionally, C-USA will feature some of the country's most outstanding academic institutions, with solid reputations as teaching and research universities."

Unlike its current membership structure, all future C-USA institutions sponsor I-A football, along with several other men's and women's athletic programs, many of which compete regularly for NCAA championships.

The 12-school alignment will allow the conference to split into two, six-team divisions, which will offer benefits in a number of areas, including geography, travel costs, missed class time for student-athletes, fan travel, rivalries and a potential football championship game.

C-USA will continue to sponsor competition in 19 sports - nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis, and track and field (indoor and outdoor) and 10 for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field (indoor and outdoor) and volleyball.

In addition, the league also sponsors several academic awards, including the Commissioner's Honor Roll and the Commissioner's Academic Medal, indicative of outstanding achievement in the classroom. C-USA annually awards six postgraduate scholarships, along with the Sport Academic Award, Scholar Athletes of the Year and the Institutional Academic Excellence Award.




CONFERENCE USA ON THE MAP

Noting the Black Knights

- ➤ BOBBY ROSS begins his first season as Army's head coach. Ross compiled a 94-76-2 (.552) in 15 seasons as head coach at The Citadel (1973-77), Maryland (1982-86) and Georgia Tech (1987-91). He guided the Yellow Jackets to an 11-0-1 record and shared the national championship with Colorado in 1990. During nearly nine seasons at the helm of the San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions, Ross was 77-68 (.531), including a Super Bowl appearance in 1994 with San Diego.
- ➤ Quarterback ZAC DAHMAN concluded the 2003 season as Army's season recordholder for completions (230), attempts (436) and yards (2,234). He eclipsed the previous yardage standard of 2,174, set by Leamon Hall in 1976. Dahman had 11 touchdown passes in 2003, which tied for the third-best total in Army history.
- ➤ Senior WR AARON ALEXANDER set a new Army singleseason record for receptions with 64. He amassed 861 receiving yards in 2003, the second-highest total in Army's history. For his career, Alexander ranks on Army's career charts for receptions (90, fifth), yards (1315, third) and touchdowns (8, tied for eighth.).
- ➤ Junior RB CARLTON JONES has led the team in rushing each of his first two years. Last season, he gained 632 yards and also caught 29 passes for 211 yards, scoring a total of eight touchdowns.



Noting the Bearcats

- MARK DANTONIO begins his first season as Cincinnati's head football coach. Dantonio comes to UC after three highlysuccessful seasons as defensive coordinator at Ohio State, where he helped guide the Buckeyes to the 2002 National Championship. He has 23 years of collegiate coaching experience, including 12 years in the state of Ohio. He also served as Associate Head Coach at Michigan State during part of his six-year stint in East Lansing (1995-2000).
- Senior OB GINO GUIDUGLI begins the 2004 campaign as the school's all-time leader in pass completions (670), pass attempts (1,214), passing yardage (8,822) and passing touchdowns (53). He ranks among the top six in C-USA history in all four categories.
- Senior RB RICHARD HALL ran for 777 yards and eight touchdowns in 10 games last season, posting four 100-yard rushing days.
- Senior DE TRENT COLE tied for fourth in Conference USA with 17 tackles for loss. He had a total of 75 stops and added 5.5
- Senior CB DAVEN HOLLY tied the UC single-season school record with six interceptions. The Bearcats posted a leaguehigh 19 interceptions in 2003, the eighth-most in school
- Cincinnati's special teams unit blocked five field goals last season, returning two of the blocks for touchdowns.
- Five of the Bearcats' seven losses in 2003 were by a touchdown or less.

Noting the Pirates

- ➤ Junior RB MARVIN TOWNES ran for 1,128 yards last year, the eighth-highest total in school history. He became the third different Pirate to run for 1,000 yards in the last three seasons (Leonard Henry in 2001 and Art Brown in 2002).
- ➤ Senior LG CHARLIE DEMPSEY, who has made 24 straight starts and played in 36 consecutive games, will lead the offensive line. He graded out as the second-best lineman last season, behind three time All-Conference USA selection Brian Rimpf.
- ➤ Senior QB DESMOND ROBINSON ranked among the nation's leaders in completion percentage last season, connecting on 66.2 percent of his pass attempts (133-of-201).
- ➤ Despite missing one game due to injury, sophomore LB CHRIS MOORE finished with 148 tackles for the season. In his first 21 games in a Pirate uniform, Moore has registered 220 tackles.
- ➤ Sophomore CB ERODE JEAN earned a spot on C-USA's All-Freshman team last season after posting a team-high seven pass breakups, along with two interceptions, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. He added 50 total tackles (34 solo).
- As a true freshman last season, RYAN DOUGHERTY led Conference USA and finished ninth in the nation in punting with a 44.5 average. That average was a new ECU freshman record and he booted 15 kicks inside the 20-yard line, including three at the one-yard line.

Noting the Cougars

- The Cougars finished the 2003 season at 7-6 under firstyear head coach ART BRILES, the second-most wins in school history by a first-year mentor. Houston also made its first bowl appearance since 1996, falling to Hawai'i in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl, 54-48 in triple overtime.
- Sophomore QB KEVIN KOLB, the 2003 Conference USA Freshman of the Year, closed out his rookie campaign by passing for 3,131 yards and 25 touchdowns with just six interceptions. Nine times he threw two or more touchdown passes in a game, and three times he ran for at least two scores, finishing with seven rushing TDs.
- Junior RB ANTHONY EVANS became the 20th player in school history to run for 1,000 yards in a season, finishing the year with 1,149 yards in 2003. He closed out the regular season with four consecutive 100-yard games, establishing a new career high in each outing.
- Junior WR VINCENT MARSHALL caught a team-high 60 passes last season for 812 yards and seven touchdowns. He had two 100-yard efforts, including at the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl, where his 81-yard TD reception in the waning seconds sent the game to overtime.
- RICKY WILSON earned a spot on the C-USA All-Freshman team at cornerback and as a kick returner, becoming the first player in four years to be named to the squad at two different positions.
- Houston scored 42 or more points in seven games last
- UH produced 22 drives (19 touchdowns and 3 field goals) that took less than 2:00 off the clock.



Noting the Cardinals

- ➤ Louisville made its sixth consecutive bowl appearance last season, losing to No. 14 Miami (Ohio) in the GMAC Bowl.
- ➤ In his first season as a starter, senior QB STEFAN LEFORS earned first team All-C-USA honors, becoming the third straight U of L signal-caller to accomplish that feat. He finished the season 219-of-357 for 3,145 yards and 17 touchdowns, while rushing for 405 yards and three scores. The 405 rushing yards are the most ever by a Cardinal QB.
- ➤ Senior WR J.R. RUSSELL closed out 2003 with 1,213 receiving yards, marking the fifth time in six years that U of L has produced a 1,000-yard receiver.
- ➤ Louisville broke the 46-year old school record for team rushing yards, gaining 2,966 yards on the ground last season. Three Cardinals ran for more than 500 yards, led by senior LIONEL GATES with 817. Junior RB ERIC SHELTON, who missed nearly four full games with a knee injury, ran for 790 yards and 10 TDs, while sophomore MICHAEL BUSH added 503 yards and six scores.
- ➤ After surrendering 46 sacks in 2002, U of L's offensive line allowed only 13 last season. Second team All-Conference USA selections TRAVIS LEFFEW and JASON SPITZ are among three returning starters on the unit.
- Senior LB ROBERT McCUNE posted 143 tackles last season, registering eight games with 10 or more stops.
- Senior DE MARCUS JONES earned second team All-C-USA honors after producing a team-high 10 sacks and 17 tackles for loss.

Noting the Tigers

- ➤ The Tigers won their first bowl game in 32 years last season, defeating Sun Belt Conference champion North Texas in the New Orleans Bowl, 27-17.
- ➤ Junior RB DeANGELO WILLIAMS set a Conference USA single-season record with 10 consecutive 100-yard games en route to being named Offensive Player of the Year. Despite missing the final three games of the season with a torn MCL in his left knee, Williams still set a Memphis school record with 1,430 rushing yards. He led the nation in all-purpose yardage at 192.1 yards per game. In addition to his rushing totals, he had 384 receiving yards and 299 kick return yards for 2,113 total. Williams also scored a league-high 13 touchdowns.
- ➤ In 30 career starts, QB DANNY WIMPRINE has set 25 Memphis records and he will enter his senior season as the school's all-time leader in pass completions (583) and attempts (1,071), passing yards (7,323) and TD passes (59). In 2003, he set new school single-season marks in completions (246), attempts (440) and passing yardage (3.174).
- ➤ The 393 points scored by the Tigers in 2003 was the highest total in school history. The 1949 team had previously held the mark with 385.
- ➤ Memphis averaged 181.5 yards per game on the ground, its highest rushing average since the 1991 season. With an average of 444.5 yards of total offense, the Tigers shattered the school record of 412.4, set in 1969.
- ➤ Memphis averaged a league-high 40,621 fans last season at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium, its best-ever home attendance average.

Noting the Golden Eagles

- ➤ The Golden Eagles were the first C-USA team to post a perfect league mark since the 1999 USM squad, which finished with an 8-0 record. The nine overall wins by the Golden Eagles tied for the most ever under head coach JEFF BOWER, who earned his third Conference USA Coach of the Year honor.
- ➤ Head coach JEFF BOWER begins his 14th season as head coach at Southern Miss this fall. Only six I-A coaches have been at their school longer: Penn State's Joe Paterno (38), Bobby Bowden, Florida State (29), Fisher DeBerry, Air Force (20), Frank Beamer, Virginia Tech (17), Bill Snyder, Kansas State (15) and Barry Alvarez, Wisconsin (14). He is the only head coach remaining from C-USA's inaugural season in 1996.
- ➤ Senior LB MICHAEL BOLEY led the league and finished seventh in the nation in tackles for loss with 22.5, while registering 151 total tackles (13th in the country). It was his second-straight year with more than 100 tackles.
- ➤ Junior DB JOHN EUBANKS had three scores last season one each on a kickoff return, a fumble return and an interception return. He finished the season ranked fourth in the nation in kickoff return average (29.35).
- ➤ Senior WR MARVIN YOUNG averaged 16.7 yards per reception last season (42 for 703) and caught a team-high seven TD passes. He ranks in the top five on USM's receiving list for catches (93), yards (1,432) and TDs (14). Young was 10th in the nation in punt return avg (13.6) last season.
- ➤ Despite not becoming the feature back until the final seven games of the season after a switch from fullback, ANTHONY HARRIS ran for a team-high 671 yards and seven touchdowns. He posted four 100-yard rushing games in six regular season starts.



Noting the Horned Frogs

- TCU was nationally-ranked in both polls, marking the first time since the 1950's that the Horned Frogs finished back-to-back seasons nationally-ranked. At 11-2, the Frogs posted their first 11-win season since the 1938 National Champion TCU squad went undefeated.
- ➤ Running back ROBERT MERRILL became the second straight TCU freshman to run for 1,000 yards, finishing with 1,107 yards, the most ever by a first-year Horned Frog. Merrill becomes just the ninth player in TCU history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season.
- ➤ Junior WR REGGIE HARRELL became the first TCU receiver to ever have 1,000 receiving yards, setting a single-season school record with 1,012.
- ➤ Junior RB LONTA HOBBS led the team in touchdowns for the second straight season with nine and he has 22 TDs in his first 19 collegiate games.
- ➤ Sophomore WR/KR/PR CORY RODGERS was fourth in C-USA in all-purpose yardage last season (114.6 yards per game). He had 37 catches for 590 yards and caught five TD's, while rushing for three more. Rodgers averaged 22.1 yards on 23 kickoff returns and 11.0 yards on 32 punt returns.
- ➤ Junior LB MARTIN PATTERSON posted a team-high 103 tackles, including 17 tackles for loss (second on the squad).
- Senior WS MARVIN GODBOLT earned third team All-C-USA honors, despite missing eight games with a knee injury. He picked off four passes in four games prior to the injury and had 23 tackles in those games.
- TCU played six games that were decided by exactly three points in 2003, going 5-1 in those games.

Noting the Green Wave

- > Senior WR ROYDELL WILLIAMS finished last season with 1,006 receiving yards, becoming the eighth player in Tulane history to post 1,000 yards in a season. He has also moved into fifth place on the school's all-time receiving list with 2,381 yards and ranks seventh in receptions with 63.
- ➤ Junior JOVON JACKSON is the front-runner to replace recordsetting Mewelde Moore at running back. Jackson took over when Moore was injured last November and rushed for 377 yards on 82 carries. In his first collegiate start, he rushed for 183 yards and two touchdowns against UAB.
- ➤ Over the last three games of the season, junior WR CHRIS BUSH caught six passes and five of them were for touchdowns. On the year, he had 33 receptions for 581 yards and eight scores.
- ➤ Junior LB ANTHONY CANNON has registered more than 100 tackles in each of his first two seasons at Tulane. After tying for the nation's lead among freshmen in tackles with 114 in 2002, he posted 102 stops in 2003.
- ➤ Sophomore DE BILLY HARRISON earned a spot on C-USA's All-Freshman team after registering 64 tackles (tops on the defensive line) and a team-leading 7.5 tackles for loss as a true freshman in 2003.
- ➤ Junior CB SEAN LUCAS registered a team-high five interceptions and was third on the squad in tackles with 102.
- ➤ Freshman CHRIS BECKMAN ranked second in Conference USA in punting average at 43.5 yards per punt.



Noting the Blazers

- Over the final three games last season, sophomore RB COREY WHITE averaged 108.3 yards rushing, with 100-yard games against Tulane and Houston.
- The Blazers are looking forward to a healthy return of junior QB DARRELL HACKNEY, who missed the final five games of last season with a broken thumb. Prior to the injury, he had completed 51 percent of his passes for 1,659 yards and nine touchdowns.
- Senior WR RODDY WHITE extended his streak of consecutive games with at least one catch to 23 with a 54-yard TD reception in the season finale and finished the season with a 21.6 yard per catch, grabbing 39 receptions for 844 yards.
- As a true freshman, WR NICK COON averaged an amazing 36.2 yards per catch. Three of his 10 receptions were for touchdowns, including the game-winner at Baylor in his first collegiate game.
- With 269 tackles in his first two seasons, senior LB ZAC WOODFIN is already closing in on the UAB school record of 289. Back-to-back years he has set a new school singleseason record, finishing last year with 149 stops.
- Senior K NICK HAYES successfully connected on 17-of-20 field goal attempts last year and holds the UAB career record with 44 career field goals.
- Since beginning C-USA fooball competition in 1999, UAB has posted a 20-15 record in league play. Only Louisville and Southern Miss have won more C-USA games over that span.

Noting the Bulls

- ➤ Head coach JIM LEAVITT has posted a record of 51-26 (.662) in seven seasons as head coach at USF. He led the Bulls to Top 25 I-AA national rankings in 1998 and 1999 and owns a 24-9 mark in three seasons at the I-A level.
- ➤ USF finished the 2003 season at 7-4, the sixth straight year that the Bulls have won at least seven games.
- ➤ Sophomore LB STEPHEN NICHOLAS earned Freshman All-America honors last season after finishing second among the nation's freshmen in sacks with 5.5. He had 45 total tackles, including 11 for losses.
- Senior OT DERRICK SAROSI, who has started 33 consecutive games, is a returning All-Conference USA selection on the offensive line.
- ➤ Senior DE LEE ROY SELMON, JR. returned last year after two medical redshirt seasons and showed no rust. He finished with 58 tackles, including 3.5 sacks and he had a gameending interception in the second overtime against Cincinnati to seal the win.
- ➤ USF ranked second in Conference USA in total defense last season, allowing an average of 315.6 yards per game. The Bulls allowed the fewest passing yards (1,949) of any league school
- ➤ USF became the first team in NCAA history to win three overtime games in a season in 2003, needing extra time to defeat Louisville, Cincinnati and East Carolina. The Bulls were the 12th team to play three overtime games in one season.

Bowl Games Provide Revenue...

- This year 28 bowl games will distribute more than \$187 million to NCAA schools. More than \$820 million has been paid out in just the past five years and the bowls will conservatively payout more than \$2.1 billion over the next ten years.
- Almost all Bowl games are non-profit organizations. The more revenue the bowl brings in through ticket sales, sponsors, etc. the more money can be paid to NCAA schools.
- While it is true that some teams in conferences that don't send multiple teams to bowls don't receive as much revenue, that is a key reason additional bowls have been added recently -to provide more opportunities for those conference members and increase their revenue. Indeed some bowls have been setup with the help of conferences to provide all the other benefits of a bowl.

Bowl Games Are Tradition...

- Bowl games have been a part of college football for 90 years. They have provided some of the greatest moments in college football history and add to the pageantry, color and excitement of the game. Bowl games are as much a part of the tradition of college football as any other aspect of the game.
- While there has been an increase in the number of bowl games, half of the bowls have been around for at least 15 years and 12 of these have been in existence for 25 or more vears.
- The addition of bowl games has provided opportunities for more schools to participate in the bowl experience. That means more student athletes, coaches, cheerleaders, band members, halftime performers, administrators, alumni, college football fans and communities can be a part of this unforgettable experience. College football bowl games offer these people memories that can last a lifetime. This season about 5,600 student-athletes, 11,000 band members, 1,100 cheerleaders, 50,000 - 100,000 performers and millions of fans and community members were a part of this experience.
- · Bowl games bring a measure of importance to the regular season not seen in other sports.

No other intercollegiate sport plays as few regular season games as football and every game means something, conference championships mean something.

86 (out of 117) different Division IA schools have participated in at least one bowl game in the past six seasons. A total of 56 schools, or 48 percent, will be a part of the post-season bowl experience this season and 28 teams will finish their season as a bowl champion. This compares to approximately 20 percent that are selected in NCAA Championships in other sports (I-AA Football – 13 percent; Baseball – 22 percent; Men's & Women's Basketball – 20 percent; etc.)

Bowl Games Are Popular...

- Total attendance increased this past year as a record of more than 1.45 million fans attended 28 bowl
 - games. The average capacity-filled of the bowl stadiums was 89%. Fifteen bowls were at least 90% filled. Thirteen bowls were at least 99% filled.




