Ambrose Rascher was part of a four-man Hoosier contingent that earned All-America honors in 1932. Rascher finished third at 174 pounds to earn the honor. He helped the Hoosiers win the NCAA title in 1932 with a record of 6-0.



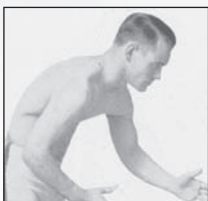
EDDIE BELSHAW
1932 - National Champion - 135 lbs.

In 1932, Indiana's Eddie Belshaw earned All-America honors at 135 pounds, winning the Big Ten title as well as the NCAA Championship. Belshaw helped lead the Hoosiers to a 6-0 record, a Big Ten co-Championship and Indiana's first NCAA title. Belshaw's 27-3 record remains one of the top single-season marks in Indiana history.

PAT DEVINE
1933 - National Champion - 135 lbs.



Pat Devine, who lettered from 1932-34, earned All-America honors in 1933 (135 pounds). In addition, he won the Big Ten and NCAA titles at that weight division. Helping to guide the Hoosiers to a 6-1 record overall and a Big Ten Championship, Devine's 27-2 mark that season is one of the top winning percentages in program history.



DALE GOINGS
1932 - Third Place - 145 lbs.
1933 - Third Place - 145 lbs.

Dale Goings was one of the Hoosiers' first two-time All-Americans with third-place performances at 145 pounds in 1932 and 1933. He helped the Hoosiers win their first NCAA title in 1932. Goings also was the Big Ten Champion at 145 during each of his All-America campaigns.

OLIVER CELLINI
1933 - Third Place - 126 lbs.
1934 - Second Place - 126 lbs.



Oliver Cellini won back-to-back All-America honors in 1933 and 1934 at 126 pounds. He finished third at the NCAAs in 1933 and second in 1934. Cellini helped the Hoosiers to Big Ten titles in 1933 and 1934 as well as an NCAA runner-up finish in 1934. Indiana went 13-1 during that two-year stretch.



ROBERT JONES
1932 - Third Place - 191 lbs.
1933 - Second Place - HWT

Robert Jones, like Dale Goings, was one of the Hoosiers' first two-time All-Americans. Jones won All-America honors in 1932 at 191 pounds by finishing third and in 1933 at heavyweight by placing second.

RICHARD VOLIVA
1933 - Second Place - 174 lbs.
1934 - National Champion - 174 lbs.



Richard Voliva earned both All-America and NCAA Championship recognition during the 1934 season when he finished with a perfect 12-0 record. In 1934, Voliva won the Big Ten Championship (175) and led IU to its third consecutive conference title and second at NCAAs (7-0). Voliva also earned All-America honors in 1933 when he finished second at 175 pounds.



OTTO KUSS
1934 - Second Place - N/A

Otto Kuss lettered four years at Indiana from 1931-34, earning All-America honors in 1934 with a second-place finish at the NCAA Championship. During his four-year career, the Hoosiers went 27-2, including four Big Ten titles and one NCAA championship.



HOWARD BUSH
1934 - Third Place - 118 lbs.

Howard Bush was an All-American at Indiana in 1934 with a third-place NCAA finish at 118 pounds. The Hoosiers went 34-1 during his three-year career, including a perfect 11-0 in his final campaign. He helped Indiana to back-to-back Big Ten Championships in 1933 and 1934.



CHARLIE MCDANIEL
1935 - National Champion - HWT
1936 - Second Place - HWT
1938 - National Champion - HWT

Charlie McDaniel was IU's first three-time wrestling All-American, earning the honor in 1935, 1936 and 1938. McDaniel won NCAA titles in 1935 and 1938, while finishing second in 1936. In 1938, he secured a Big Ten title (HWT) and wrapped up his tenure at IU with a career record of 41-5. He twice was awarded the Indiana Balfour Award, given to the student-athlete who has brought honor and distinction to IU.



WILLARD DUFFY
1935 - Second Place - 118 lbs.
1936 - Second Place - 123 lbs.
1938 - Second Place - 118 lbs.

Willard Duffy was an All-American all three years in which he lettered. In 1935, he finished second in the NCAA (118). The next year, Duffy would again place second (123), to earn his second All-America selection. He returned to 118 pounds in 1938 and placed second for his third All-America honor. Duffy won Big Ten Championships at 126 pounds in both 1936 and 1938. He helped lead the Hoosiers to three undefeated seasons and two third-place NCAA finishes. He concluded his career with a 40-3 record.

BOB HAAK
1937 - Second Place - N/A



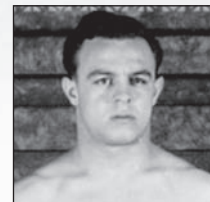
Bob Haak was the Hoosiers' lone All-American in 1937. Haak earned his All-America honor by placing second at the NCAA Championship. He helped the Hoosiers to a 5-2 record in 1937, including a fourth-place finish at the Big Ten Championship. By virtue of his All-America honor, Haak helped the Hoosiers finish eighth at the NCAA Championship.

CHRIS TRAIKOFF
1938 - Third Place - 175 lbs.
1939 - National Champion - 175 lbs.



In 1938, Chris Traicoff earned his first All-America honor placing third (175) at the NCAA Championship. Traicoff went on to win the Big Ten Championship at 175 pounds, as well as winning the National Championship in 1939 (10-0).

JOE ROMAN
1939 - National Champion - 136 lbs.
1940 - Third Place - 135 lbs.



After finishing second in the Big Ten Tournament, Joe Roman won the NCAA Championship in 1939 to earn his first All-America nod. Roman helped IU win the Big Ten title and earn a berth in the 1939 NCAA Championship. In 1940, he tallied his second All-America honor, helped the Hoosiers to a Big Ten Championship and second at NAAs. Roman completed his career by winning the 1945 Big Ten Championship (155).

BOB ANTONACCI
1940 - National Champion - 121 lbs.



Bob Antonacci joined Joe Roman in earning All-America honors in 1940. Antonacci helped lead the Hoosiers to a Big Ten title and a second-place finish at NAAs that year. In addition to winning the NCAA Championship at 121 pounds, Antonacci earned three letters as a Hoosier.



GARNET INMAN
1940 - Second Place - 175 lbs.

Garnet Inman earned All-America honors in 1940. He placed second (175) in the NCAA meet. Inman was a two-year letterwinner at IU. He helped the Hoosiers to a perfect 7-0 record in 1938, when they placed second at the Big Ten and third at the NCAA Tournament.

SIGMUND GOLONKA
1946 - Third Place - 175 lbs.



Sigmund Golonka also earned All-America honors in 1946, helping guide the Hoosiers to their sixth undefeated season in school history and a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championship. Golonka also finished third at the Big Ten Championship (175) that year.



CHAUNCEY MCDANIEL
1940 - Third Place - 176 lbs.

Chauncey McDaniel was one of four Hoosiers to earn All-America honors in 1940. He placed third in the 165-pound weight class at the NCAA Championship. That same year, McDaniel won the Big Ten Championship at 165. He helped the Hoosiers win the Big Ten Championship as well as placing second at the NCAAs in 1940.

MIKE ROLAK
1946 - Second Place - 121 lbs.



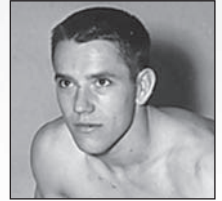

Harry Arthur helped end a six-year All-America drought for the Hoosiers, finishing second at the NCAAs to earn the honor in 1952. He also finished second at the Big Ten Championships, both at 123 pounds. The team finished fourth at Big Tens and ninth at the NCAA tourney. Arthur helped lead the Hoosiers to a 6-2-1 record overall and a 6-1-1 record in the Big Ten that year.



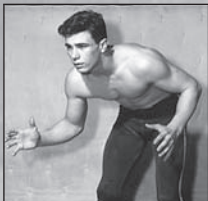
ELIAS GEORGE

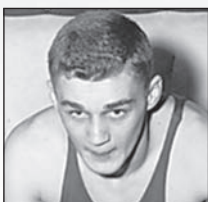
DICK ANTHONY

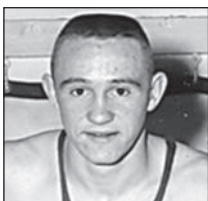
JIM ELLIS

1958 - Fourth Place - 147 lbs.

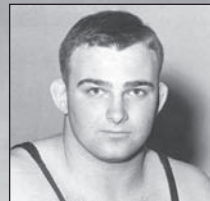

1964 - Fifth Place - HWT



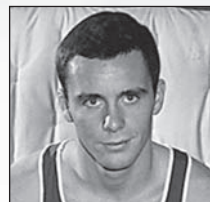

1966 - Third Place - 130 lbs.



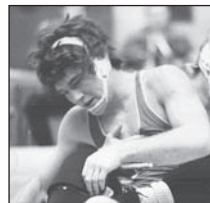

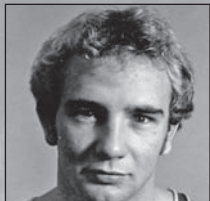

Sam Komar was the first Hoosier in eight years to win All-America honors. In 1976, he finished fourth at the NCAA Championship (134). A year later, Komar won the Big Ten title (142) and finished second at NCAAs, closing the season at 40-4-1. Komar also earned a Big Ten title in 1975 and finished his career 114-24-4.



MARK GAYLAN
1981 - Eighth Place - 126 lbs.

At 126 pounds, Mark Gaylan earned All-America honors in 1981 with a 35-8 record. Gaylan went undefeated in dual meets that year. Gaylan finished third at the Big Ten Championship and finished eighth at the NCAA Championship, ending his Hoosier career with a 74-25-1 record.

SCOTT PETCHE
1994 - Eighth Place - 150 lbs.



Scott Petche earned All-America honors for finishing third at the Big Ten Championship and eighth at the NCAA Championship in 1994. Petche ended the season 25-11 and finished his career at Indiana 56-40-2. He helped lead IU to a 12-4 record overall and a 4-3 in Big Ten action.



BRIAN DOLPH
1988 - Eighth Place - 150 lbs.
1989 - Third Place - 150 lbs.
1990 - National Champion - 150 lbs.

Brian Dolph was the first Indiana wrestler to earn All-America status in three consecutive years. He earned his first national honor in 1988, finishing second at the Big Ten Championship and eighth at NCAAs. Improving on the previous season, Dolph went undefeated in the 1989 regular season, grabbing the Big Ten title and third at the NCAA meet. His quest to be Indiana's first national champion in 50 years ended successfully in 1990 as he finished the season 46-2, and ended his career ranked first in career winning percentage 127-9 (.934).

ROGER CHANDLER
1995 - Eighth Place - 142 lbs.
1996 - Third Place - 142 lbs.
1997 - Second Place - 142 lbs.



Roger Chandler was Indiana's fourth wrestler to earn All-America honors three times. Chandler's first honor came in 1995 when he finished third at the Big Ten Championship and eighth at the NCAAs. He concluded the season with a 31-10 mark. After taking third again at the Big Ten Championship in 1996, he went on to a third-place finish at the NCAA Championship. Chandler went on to improve his record to 38-3 and was 18-0 in dual meets. His final All-America honor came in 1997 when he earned second place at the NCAA Tournament.



JEFF LYONS
1990 - Sixth Place - 142 lbs.
1992 - Fifth Place - 142 lbs.

Jeff Lyons earned All-America status in 1990. Lyons finished the season 28-9, third at Big Tens and fifth at the NCAA Championships (142). Lyons helped lead the Hoosiers to their eighth undefeated season at 14-0 overall, 6-0 Big Ten. He also earned All-America honors in 1992 finishing sixth at the Big Ten and fifth at the NCAA Championships.

MICHAEL POWELL
1996 - Seventh Place - 167 lbs.



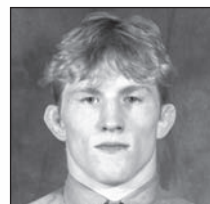

Wrestling at 126 pounds, Chris Russo finished the 1994 campaign with a 27-10 record and earned All-America honors after a third-place finish at the Big Ten Championship and an eighth-place NCAA finish. Russo helped lead the Hoosiers to a 12-4 record and a 4-3 mark in the Big Ten in 1994.

VIKTOR SVEDA

2001 - Third Place - 184 lbs.



Viktor Sveda earned All-America status finishing sixth at NCAAs (184) in 1999. He ended that year 42-6 record and 8-0 in Big Ten competition. Sveda improved his previous NCAA mark finishing third at Championship in 2001, the best by a Hoosier since 1997. Sveda finished 2001 with a 36-7 record. He finished his career as IU's all-time winningest wrestler at 149-28 and first in career pins (47).



KEVIN STANLEY

2001 - Sixth Place - 165 lbs.

Kevin Stanley finished his career with a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Championship (165) in 2001. He wrapped up the season 33-15 and his career 111-39. Stanley left IU ranking fifth all-time on the career pin list (25). He also became the first four-time NCAA Championship qualifier in the history of IU wrestling.



COYTE COOPER

2004 - Eighth Place - 149 lbs.

Wrestling at 149 pounds, Coyte Cooper finished his career by earning an eighth-place finish at the NCAA Championship, propelling him to All-America status. He finished the season with a 41-6 mark and a career record of 123-36. Cooper left IU in third place on the career pin list with 37. He also became the second four-time NCAA Championship qualifier in the history of IU wrestling.



JOE DUBUQUE

2004 - Eighth Place - 125 lbs.
2005 - National Champion - 125 lbs.
2006 - National Champion - 125 lbs.

Joe Dubuque became just the second Hoosier to win two NCAA Championships (Charlie McDaniel 1935, '38) by taking home first-team honors in both 2005 and 2006 at 125 pounds. He also became the Hoosiers' first NCAA champion since Brian Dolph won the 150-pound class in 1990. In his first year at the NCAA Championships, he brought home an eighth-place finish for his first All-American selection. In his IU career, Dubuque compiled a 114-18 overall record.



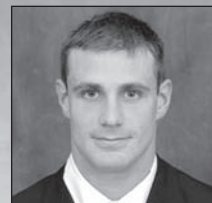
BRANDON BECKER

Brandon Becker made it to the All-American stand three times during his illustrious career at IU. In 2005, he helped lead the Hoosiers to a top-five finish at the Big Ten Championships and a top-10 finish at the NCAA Championships.

Matt Coughlin earned a seventh-place finish at the NCAA Championships in his freshman season. He defeated three nationally-ranked opponents in the process, including a 2-1 decision over No. 2 Matthew Storniolo from Oklahoma. He compiled an overall record of 31-16 with six pin falls that season.

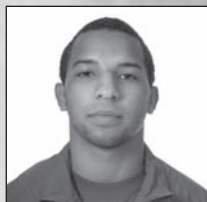
ANGEL ESCOBEDO

Angel Escobedo became the first four-time All-American in school history after finishing third at the 2010 NCAA Championships. Escobedo completed a "triple crown" of sorts that season, winning the NCAA Championship, Big Ten Championship and Midlands Championship. Escobedo, an All-American in 2007 (fourth) and 2009 (fifth) as well, left IU in second place all-time for both wins and pins with 137 and 42, respectively.

ANDRAE HERNANDEZ

2007 - Eighth Place - 133 lbs.



Andrae Hernandez took his second trip to the NCAA Championships in as many years in 2007, finishing in eighth place. After a loss in the second round, he rebounded by winning three consecutive matches in the wrestleback. He was one of five IU wrestlers to compile 30 or more wins that season, posting a 30-16 overall mark.

RICKY ALCALA

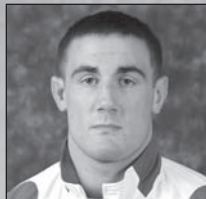
2011 - Fifth Place - 285 lbs. (HWT)



Ricky Alcala came to IU after UC-Davis discontinue it's wrestling program three seasons into his career. The California native had to work overtime at nationals, wrestling eight matches with six of those contests going into sudden victory or a tiebreaker. Alcala took care of business in the classroom as well, being named an NWCA Scholar-Athlete.

Matt Powless' 2010-11 season was one of the best statistical years in school history. En route to the All-American stand and an eighth place finish, Powless racked up 13 major decisions and 39 total wins. The 13 majors were the most in all of Division-I wrestling and his victories total ranked third nationally, were a Big Ten-best and are the seventh most all-time for a Hoosier.

Billy Thom's team won 34 straight dual matches from Feb. 13, 1933 to Feb. 6, 1937. While at IU, he won eight Big Ten championships, one national collegiate championship and finished national runner-up twice. His success at IU earned him the honor of being the head coach of the 1936 Olympic team in Berlin, Germany. While at the Olympics, two of his own products, Dick Voliva, who won a silver medal, and Charlie McDaniel made the team. Under his tutelage, the Hoosiers had 11 All-Americans and 32 Big Ten champions over the course of his 17-year tenure. His 33 Big Ten champions are more than any other coach in IU wrestling history. In 1972, Thom was inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame.

JIM HUMPHREY

1985-89
40-53-1 (.430)



In five years, Jim Humphrey racked up 42 career coaching wins, but his greatest accomplishment may have been the recruiting of Brian Dolph. The 150-pounder from North Canton, Ohio, won Big Ten titles in both 1989 and 1990, as well as an NCAA title in 1990. The national title by Dolph was the first by a Hoosier since 1940. During his five years at the top of the Hoosier program, he guided the Hoosiers to a fifth-place finish at the Big Ten Championship and a 20th-place finish at the NCAA Championship, the best since 1977. Also while at IU, he coached three different national teams, the World Championships team in 1986, the Pan-American team in 1987 and the U.S. Olympic team in 1988.



CHARLIE MCDANIEL

1945-72

Charlie McDaniels' 27-year tenure at the helm is the longest tenure in the history of the program. Seven years after winning his second of back-to-back national championships as a student-athlete, McDaniel returned to IU to be the head wrestling coach, plus responsibilities of being a scout and assistant line coach for football in 1945. His 27-year wrestling coaching tenure included 12 Big Ten champions, 13 All-Americans. In 1966, he was selected to the Helms Athletic Foundation Wrestling Hall of Fame and in 1971, he became a charter member of the Indiana Wrestling Hall of Fame. In December 1999, he was named the Herald-Times Male Athlete of the Century by over 1,300 votes.

JOE MCFARLAND

1989-91

In 1989, Joe McFarland produced one of the most impressive first-year improvements in Big Ten Conference history when he guided the Hoosiers to a perfect 14-0 dual meet record in 1990, the program's first undefeated season since 1946. IU placed eighth at the NCAA Championships and finished runner-up at the Big Ten Championships. Indiana was also the only unbeaten team in NCAA Division I that year and reached a No. 5 national ranking in the final dual meet listing by the *Amateur Wrestling News*. McFarland produced three All-Americans and three Big Ten champions, and was named the 1990 Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year. He is currently the head coach at his alma mater, Michigan.



DOUG BLUBAUGH

1973-84

Before his arrival at IU, Doug Blubaugh had stints at Army, Oklahoma, Michigan and Michigan State as an assistant coach. During his collegiate career at Oklahoma State, he was the NCAA 157-pound champion in 1957, his senior season. In the 1960 Olympics, he won seven straight matches, five by pin, en route to the gold medal. For his performance, he was named "Most Outstanding Wrestler in the World." As head coach of the Hoosiers, he mentored a pair of Big Ten champions and All-Americans. His star pupil was Sam Komar, who finished second at the 1977 NCAA Championship. The second-place finish by Komar was the highest in 25 years. The Komar-led squad finished 16th at the championship, the highest by an IU team since 1965.

DUANE GOLDMAN

1992-present

Duane Goldman has amassed 84 Big Ten All-Academic team members, three national champions, 93 NCAA qualifiers and 26 All-Americans. In both 2007 and 2008 Goldman tied the school record for most NCAA Qualifiers in one season with eight. One of those qualifiers included 125-lbs. national champion Angel Escobedo, Indiana's third national champ in that weight class in a four-year span after Joe Dubuque won back-to-back titles in 2005 and 2006 under the tutelage of Goldman. Escobedo also became the first four-time All-American in school history under the watchful eye of Coach Goldman. In September of 2005, Goldman was inducted into the University of Iowa Athletics Hall of Fame as one of the greatest grapplers in Iowa history. As a Hawkeye, Goldman collected a national championship, three national runner-ups, four Big Ten titles and 132 career victories.
