Date 30 May 2014. Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (Thismia Gully)

Habitat: Closed wet Eucalypt forest.

Substrate: Stag of dead fallen Eucalyptus obliqua


Description: Scattered and crowded sessile to very shortly stalked sporangia. **Sporangia** globose, sandy brown with fugacious iridescent peridium, 0.2–0.7 mm diameter.


Peridium iridescent peridium persists on very small sporangia, very small calyculus. Reticulum on calyculus observed with oil immersion lens. **Hypothallus** inconspicuous **Stalk** absent in most sporangia, very short, < 0.1 mm long.

Capillitium brown in mass, attached to base of calyculus, branching from nodes, decorated with rings, half rings and reticulate ridges and some warts, $4–5~\mu m$ wide with some thickenings. **Spores** sandy brown in mass, light brown by transmitted light, scattered warts, $10~\mu m$.

Notes: One collection only with brown sporangia (See *A. ferruginea* # 0003.)


