## Arcyria pomiformis (Leers) Rostaf.

## **Date** 1 Sept. 2010. Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (swamp). **Habitat**: *Melaleuca ericifolia* swamp forest. **Substrate**: *Acacia melanoxylon* log.

**Description**: Several groups of stalked sporangia, 1.1–1.7 mm high x 0.5–0.9 mm diameter, pale ochraceous. **Sporotheca** subglobose, pale ochraceous, 0.5–0.9 mm diameter. **Stalk**: light yellow brown, yellow at apex, grooved, shiny, 0.5–0.7 mm long. **Hypothallus** continuous under group, yellow translucent. **Peridium** fugacious except at the base where it forms a shallow, shiny pleated calyculus that occupies <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of sporotheca. Very faint pattern on calyculus when viewed with oil immersion lens. **Capillitium** simply with sparse branching, yellow with reticulate pattern, some swellings, free ends few, club-shaped, 4 µm diameter. **Spores**: ochraceous yellow in mass, pale by transmitted light, minutely warted, with some more prominent warts 7.5–8.5 µm.

**Notes:** Among the first myxomycetes I collected; possibly only example of this species.
