

Dudleya attenuata ssp. *attenuata* (ssp. *orcuttii*) Orcutt's Liveforever

PERENNIAL HERB. Succulent
3-50 rosettes, 1"-6" wide. Inflorescences to 1' high
Evergreen, glaucous leaves, linear, thick, bases purple red.
Flowers on branched inflorescence, petals white, often rose-flushed or
red-lined. May - June.

Native Habitat: Barely crosses border into California on coastal bluffs; more
common in Baja California. Elevation: 0' - 200'

Full sun
Rocky, clay soils ?
Low water; coastal environment argues for some
summer water tolerance.

Only known occurrence at Border Field State Park.
Subspecies *orcuttii* has been collapsed into *attenuata*
