

A CONTRIBUTION TOWARD A BIBLIOGRAPHY
OF THAI BOTANY⁽¹⁾

This bibliography contains a majority, if not all, of the more important works dealing specifically with the plants of Siam. It includes also many references of lesser importance which were found during the search for the major works. However, it is not to be considered a complete bibliography, for many important taxonomic monographs of groups which include Thai species are not listed here and many works with incidental references to the Thai plants are omitted. It has been prepared substantially as a supplement to "A bibliography of eastern Asiatic botany", by E.D. Merrill and E.H. Walker.⁽²⁾ If this Thai supplement is used in conjunction with the larger work, most of the references needed for the study of the plants of this country will thus have been assembled. The larger bibliography, containing around 21,000 entries, covers China proper, Japan, Manchuria, Mongolia, Tibet, Korea, and eastern Siberia, and includes the most important floras and comprehensive works on adjacent regions, such as the Philippines, Indo-China, Siam, Burma, India, and Central Asia. It includes also all or nearly all of the major reference works which will be needed by a student of the Siamese flora. An extensive subject index makes it possible to find the material on a given subject, region, or taxonomic group. All the published monographs or revisions of genera or families which have species occurring in both China and Siam may thus be located, but revisions of groups which contain Thai species but no Chinese species cannot be found by that means.

Another supplemental source of information on the literature on Thai plants is the invaluable botanical catalogue of the Bureau of Plant Industry in the library of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In this card catalogue, arranged both by authors and by subjects, are filed references to botanical books and periodical

articles from a very wide range of sources.⁽³⁾ Of course, in searching for the original descriptions of new Thai species there is no better source of information than the well-known Index Kewensis, published by the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, England. Index Londinensis, published at Oxford, England, gives the literature citations of all published illustrations of plants. As the illustrations so catalogued are usually accompanied by descriptive text, this Index is a valuable tool for locating information on plants. The Arnold Arboretum keeps a readily consulted card catalogue of references to newly described woody species and varieties, which supplements Index Kewensis.

Neither taxonomically nor floristically is the flora of Siam distinct from that of its neighbors. Hence, the literature on the adjacent regions is of exceptional importance in the study of Thai botany. At least most of the more important works on these neighboring areas are included in the following bibliography. For each of these countries except China, there is a more or less complete manual or taxonomic treatment and for Siam itself, there is an incomplete enumeration, which is very thorough so far as it has as yet appeared.⁽⁴⁾ In general, less attention has been given to the Thai flora than to that of adjacent regions and fewer botanical collections have been accumulated. Fortunately, however, from the standpoint of the ready study of botany, these specimens are largely deposited in the herbaria of one country, England, a situation quite in contrast with the wide dispersal of the botanical collections from China. For the initiation of this bibliography, I am deeply indebted to Mr. Kenneth Landon, Thai desk of Far Eastern Division, U.S. Department of State. In 1943, he initiated the compilation of an extensive reference bibliography on Siam and solicited my preparation of the part on botany. The original manuscript has recently been brought up to date and is here made available as a tool in extending our knowledge of the plants of this too little botanically known country.
