
CTWR 431- The Magic of Disney: Redefining the Family Film

Through guest speakers including writers, producers, executives, and lyricists, we will dive into the complex collaboration that drive these massively successful enterprises and answer the fundamental question of every family film: Where do we find family and, ultimately, why does it matter to audiences?

He is best known for writing the hit features Newsies, Tarzan, The Hunchback of Notre Dame, and 102 Dalmatians. He also contributed to blockbuster The Lion King and has written screenplays for every major studio.
