TOGETHER MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Students looking to land a cutting-edge job in software development, improve user experience and develop life-changing technology have a new option with the transfer associate degree in robotics and artificial intelligence. Curriculum will develop a student's technological knowledge and provide an opportunity to become skilled in using 3-D printing to advance business potential.

BC's 3-D printer was supported by a previous Foundation Mini-Grant.



Awarded \$276,700 in scholarships for the 2017–18 school year.

149 scholarships were awarded to BC students based on financial need, scholastic merit or a combination of both.

Presented four faculty and staff members Excellence Awards for their outstanding commitment to BC.

Charles Calvert from iBIT – Information Systems, Suzanne Lane from Diagnostic Ultrasound Technology, Sara Gardner from Autism Spectrum Navigators and Katherine Oleson from Communication Studies.

Awarded \$20,000 in 11 Mini-Grants to BC faculty, staff and administrators for program-enhancing projects that advance the mission of the College.

One grant helped fund the Advanced Optics Lab in the physics department, which will enable STEM students to learn about all areas of advanced optics, including quantum optics, entanglement, quantum computers and quantum cryptography. Hands-on, self-guided activities increase student agency which is one of the strongly correlated indicators for retention and success. This lab will also provide an opportunity for collaboration with the BC RISE Institute for students to research the most important physics and engineering challenges of the 21st century.

Administered two grants through the Lockwood Faculty Excellence & Innovation Awards, given to projects that exemplify academic innovation.

One recipient, Subramanya Betageri of Radiation Therapy, received funds to upgrade BC's Virtual Environment Radiotherapy Training (VERT), which allows students to acquire clinical skill sets in the classroom in addition to what they learn in clinical practice.

The Computer Science Scholarship is now another amazing gift the college has afforded me in my time here. It will make such a large difference in my ability to dedicate myself wholly to my studies. He spent this summer in an engineering internship at the Snohomish Public Utilities Department where he applied skills gained at BC and learned skills on the job to better prepare him for his future. Zack will soon be continuing his educational journey at the University of Washington where he is already looking at ways to be involved in the campus community like he was at BC.
