Euphorbia cussonioides

**About me:** I am only found in the upland forests of Kenya. I am one of the tallest and most impressive trees of the spurge family (Euphorbiaceae) found in East tropical Africa. I have fleshy branches and very small leaves. My timber is soft, white and evenly grained but be careful when cut, I produce a poisonous milky latex-like sap!

Why I'm rare: My forest home is being cleared for farmland and I now only survive in a few small pockets of remaining forest near Embu, Thika and in the Ngong Hills. As a result I am now listed as **Vulnerable** on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species and require conservation action to guarantee my future survival.

**Taking action:** The Global Trees Campaign is working with African botanic gardens, such as Brackenhurst Botanic Garden, to replant me in my natural habitat.
