
Syntrichia virescens Tortula virescens

- Similar species Tortula muralis (p. 479) has a smooth hair point and margins recurved almost to the tip of the leaf. *S. intermedia* (p. 496) looks like a rather larger version of *S. virescens* and is more common. It may not always be possible to distinguish these two species without microscopical examination. *S. ruralis* (pp. 494–495) is usually larger, but when it is not it can be distinguished by its leaves which are not contracted at the middle.
 - Habitat Usually on trees, but also on stones, walls and concrete paths. This species is rather rare and has a scattered distribution.

in a long, toothed, silvery hair point. The cylindrical capsules are very rare.
