### DIRECTORS MESSAGE

#### COURSE MATERIALS

Welcome to the Spring, 1996 semester which heralds **A MAJOR CHANGE** which is being implemented, as I write this message. You are all well-acquainted with the Division of Nursing's course materials fees which provide support for the delivery of our distance learning curriculum. The implementation procedures required to continue the automatic course materials fee structure can no longer support this charge. Also, the complex programming needed to smooth out the billing cycle cannot be handled at this time. Consequently, as of the Spring semester, 1996, **STUDENTS WILL NOT BE AUTOMATICALLY CHARGED A COURSE MATERIALS FEE AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION.** The student will only be charged the student registration fees required by the University. When you touchtone register, a voice will communicate the correct fees owed by you.

Some major implications arise for the Division, as a result of not collecting automatic course materials fees. We must rely on you, our students, to order your module texts AND textbooks directly from the Statewide Technical Bookstore two weeks prior to attending class. As you are aware, required readings and assignments are essential for students to prepare prior to the first and subsequent classes. Lack of preparation impacts the teaching-learning environment for both the instructor and other students. Another implication, of course, is the need to generate resources to support the ongoing revision and production of our module/texts. The modules must incorporate the rapid shifts in healthcare and the impact on nursing which, in this time of escalating change, are ongoing. **WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT TO KEEP OUR CURRICULUM CURRENT AND TO CREATE AN OPTIMAL TEACHING-LEARNING ENVIRONMENT FOR ALL STUDENTS.** We are confident that you will order the module/texts in a timely manner.

#### **National League for Nursing (NLN) Re-Accreditation Site Visit November 14-17, 1995**

Welcome to the Spring, 1996 semester. As the Division of Nursing meets the demands of health care reform changes, we face a future overhaul of our curriculum, including didactic and clinical foundations. Our faculty is beginning to dialog about these changes and will formulate specific plans once the National League for Nursing (NLN) accreditation visit, which will occur November 14-17, is complete. As part of our NLN visit, students, part-time faculty and Associate Coordinators throughout the state may be contacted to discuss with visitors how our mission, philosophy, conceptual framework and objectives are reflected in your coursework.

In preparation, we ask that students and part-time faculty send exemplary papers to Assistant Chairs/Coordinators showing evidence of instructor feedback and about how well the student met the course objective(s).

In the near future, arrangements will be made for conference call and visits to classroom sites, hub offices, student meetings, etc.

#### NON PAYMENT OF FEES

- Students who do not pay their bills on time will be disenrolled. Disenrollment consequences may include:
  - a financial hold placed on student record;
  - administrative drop from all courses in the semester involved;
  - deletion of all coursework and grades received that semester;
  - student unable to conduct any university transactions such as adding, dropping, requesting transcripts, registering for a subsequent semester; and
  - state income tax refund check may be garnished for the amount owed.

#### UNDERGRADUATE

- **Reduction in units:** Effective Fall 1995, the number of units required for graduation has been reduced from 132 to 126 for new students. If you were admitted before Fall 1995 and wish to utilize the reduced unit policy, you may petition to do so. Contact your advisor for assistance. Please note that all GE requirements are still in effect!

#### OTHER CHANGES IN THIS CLASS SCHEDULE

- If you are planning on using the New York State Regents assessment option, they will not be issuing pass/fail reports to the Division of Nursing testing office until February, 1996. If you fail the test, drop the class and register the following semester.

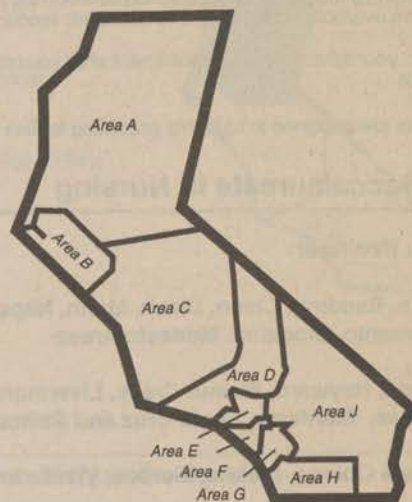

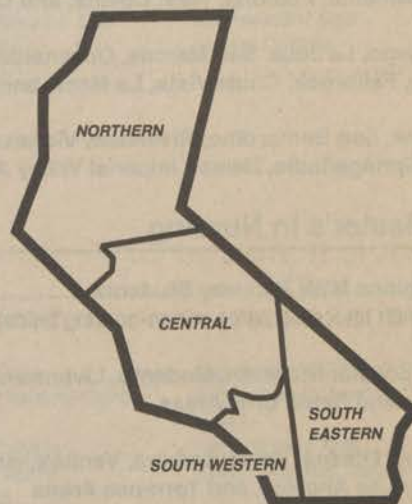

# TO LOCATE YOUR ADVISOR

## Advisement Policy

Academic advisement is an essential component of student services. The advisor will assist the student in completing a Program of Study following a discussion of her/his educational goals and previous experiences. The initial planning meeting will form the basis for an ongoing relationship through graduation.

The advisor, your assistant chair or associate coordinator, is able to serve students in a number of ways: answer curriculum questions, explain procedures/policies; put students in touch with other students in their area; assist with problems, concerns and issues the student may face; advise students regarding BSN/PHN testing options (nursing and General Education classes) MSN role options; help the student petition certain courses as appropriate; offer advisement regarding CSU testing requirements (GWAR, ELM, EPT); provide information concerning leaves of absence; and add/drop of classes as necessary.

The guiding principle for the interaction between the student and advisor is the creation of a plan for degree completion that is compatible with the student's available time, fiscal, and academic resources.

Contact your advisor for an appointment after you receive your formal transcript evaluation and a letter of acceptance from SNP Admissions and Records.

Advisors are assigned to students according to nine BSN geographic areas and four MSN geographic regions.

Advisement sessions are scheduled for **CONTINUING STUDENTS** to seek advisement upon receiving an evaluation of their transcripts from the Admissions and Records Office or when there is a possible change in the planned Program of Study. The primary role of the advisor is to assist and support the student's efforts in planning courses and in achieving their BSN. In addition, the advisor is able to serve the students in a number of ways: answer curriculum questions, explain procedures/policies; put students in touch with other students in their areas; field problems, concerns and issues the students may face; advise students regarding testing options (nursing and General Education classes); help the student petition certain courses as appropriate; offer advisement regarding CSU testing requirements (GWAR, ELM, EPT); provide information concerning leaves of absence; approve "late drop" of classes if needed; advise on taking "Incomplete" in a course; assist in improving use of the APA format, writing and oral presentation skills. # OVERVIEW OF DEGREE PROGRAMS

## OVERVIEW OF DEGREE PROGRAMS

The Statewide Nursing Program (SNP) began in Spring of 1991 with two major commitments: to make quality higher education in nursing more accessible to employed registered nurses and to ultimately improve health care in California. Movement toward these goals is occurring through our BSN and MSN programs. Both of these programs were funded by the W. K. Kellogg Foundation and by contributions from individuals and health care organizations. The Division of Nursing includes the Department of Undergraduate Nursing Science and the Department of Graduate Nursing Science. The curricula are responsive to the needs of adult learners whose time, lifestyles, or work schedules make it impossible to complete a traditional course of study in residence at a campus. The program provides nursing professionals with varying interests and backgrounds with unique advantages such as:

- Classes designed to meet the needs of the adult learner.
- Opportunities to meet students with similar goals.
- Opportunities to study with CSU and other highly qualified adjunct faculty.
- Courses offered at geographically convenient locations.
- Credit and course work transferable statewide.

## INFORMATION SESSIONS

All prospective students are expected to attend an information session prior to enrolling. The faculty is strongly committed to the position that registered nurses should have access to complete Division of Nursing program information as well as information about other traditional and non-traditional routes to bachelor's and master's degrees in nursing, so that an informed decision can be made regarding further professional education. The most effective means of sharing this information is through a group session. Please plan to attend one of the information sessions listed in this schedule or contact the Coordinator in your area for further assistance.

## PROGRAM FEATURES

### *Modules*

All courses are divided into one and two unit "mini courses" called modules. A one unit module has two to three seminar meetings with assignments due before and after each seminar, and takes 6-8 weeks to complete. Many students take two or more modules concurrently. Students must pre-register for each unit and obtain required course materials in order to prepare for the first class seminar. See details under the BSN and MSN sections of this schedule for materials needed and the course registration procedure. The BSN section also outlines an assessment option whereby credit for selected undergraduate courses may be earned by passing standardized challenge examinations.

### *Learning Resources*

In addition to the 20 libraries of the California State University system and the general and specialized libraries of the University of California system, students also utilize DON Learning Resource Centers located in community college libraries or medical center hospital libraries. These centers are a joint endeavor of the DON

and a collaborating health care or educational institution. The centers house audio-visual hardware, audio tapes, videotapes, and computer programs which complement DON coursework.

### *Individual Counseling*

An Advisor is assigned to each degree student upon admission. The advisor provides individualized student advisement throughout matriculation.

### *Preceptorships*

Students are able to participate in performance courses (clinical laboratory/field experience) with the assistance of a preceptor as well as an instructor.

### *Self-Directed Learning Materials*

Module Texts as well as videotapes, audiotapes, and/or computer programs are an integral part of every SNP course. Audiovisual materials are available for use at Learning Resource Centers.

Required module texts are available from Statewide Technical Books. (See Book Order form included in this publication.)

## OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

In any educational program, student participation in the non-classroom aspects of the program is essential. In fact, accrediting bodies such as the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and the National League for Nursing specifically look for such involvement.

There are several standing committees of the Division of Nursing faculty whose membership includes student representatives from the BSN and MSN programs as well as faculty. These committees meet once a month at CSU Dominguez Hills. Since our budget cannot support student travel, transportation and lodging expenses must be borne by the student. The committees are Curriculum, Faculty Affairs, Student Affairs, Research and Evaluation and Ad Hoc Committees, as established. If traveling to CSU Dominguez Hills is not possible, you may also consider serving as a student representative in your area. Each of the Coordinators will seek a student representative for the area council.

Students are also needed in each area to gather information for the program's newsletter which will be published two times per year. You do not need to be an expert news writer. Just be enthusiastic. Other opportunities to participate will arise from time to time. Graduation ceremonies, alumni gatherings, and honors and awards convocations, are ongoing activities that need student involvement. Please let your Coordinator know you are interested in service to the Division of Nursing, or the University as a whole. Your commitment to your educational program beyond the classroom is most important to the vitality of university life. Your ideas are most welcome.

Students are encouraged to apply for membership in the Xi Theta Chapter of Sigma Theta Tau National Nursing Honor Society. See this schedule of classes for additional information regarding membership.



## CONTINUING EDUCATION (C.E.) CREDIT

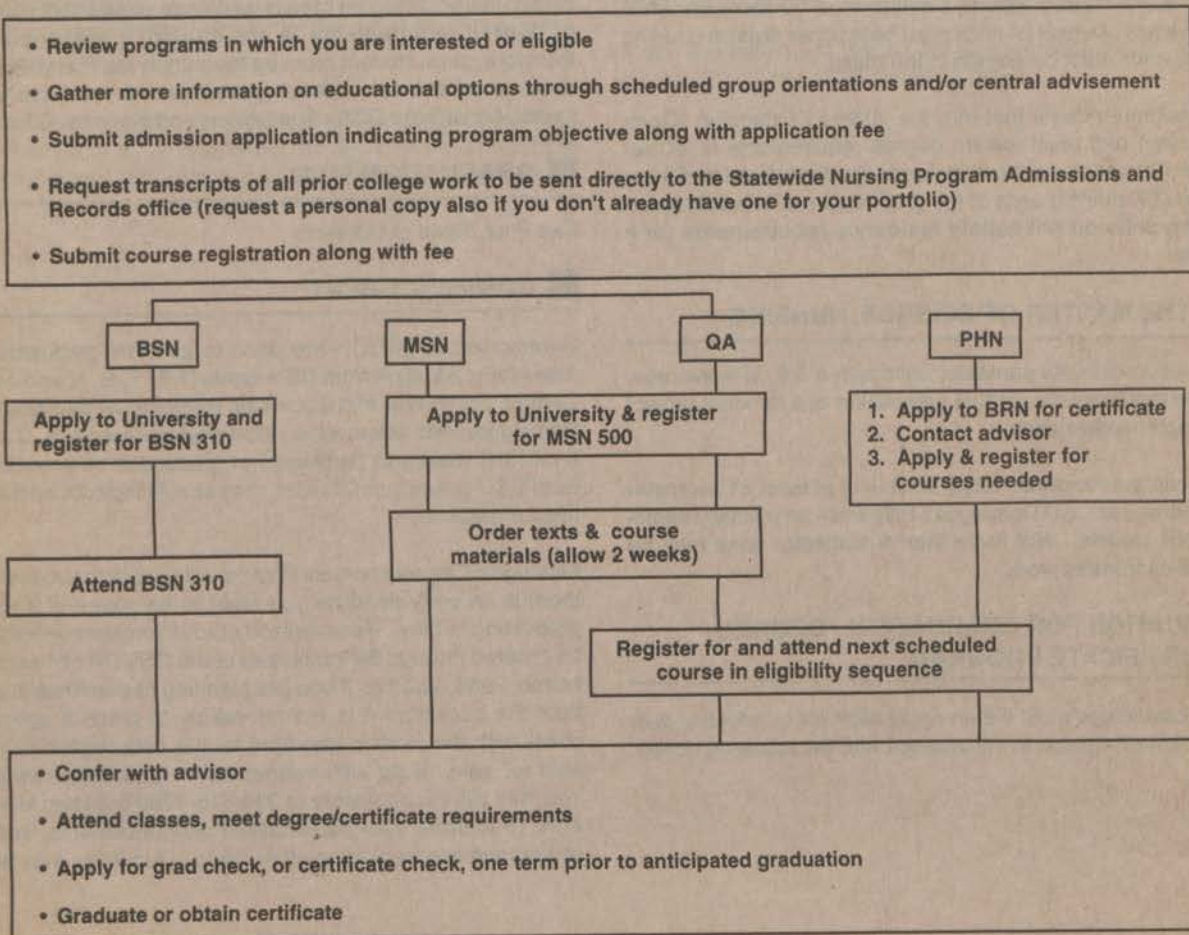
All BSN (not G.E.) and MSN courses are approved for C.E. credit by the Board of Registered Nursing at the rate of 15 contact hours per unit of theory (BRN Provider Number 03594). General Education courses do not qualify. Although the Board of Registered Nursing does not approve individual continuing education courses, providers are required by law to be approved by the Board. Complaints regarding continuing education providers or continuing education courses should be addressed to the Board. Your transcript is your certificate of completion.

## GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- All students admitted to the major must be actively licensed as registered nurses. It is the student's responsibility to immediately report in writing any change in licensure to the Director.
- All students must maintain proof of personal professional liability insurance coverage. Coverage is verified at the beginning of each performance course.

- Students are responsible for obtaining any necessary health exams, immunizations, etc., required by the University or an affiliating clinical agency.
- Client confidentiality and other professional ethics must be respected.
- Students must purchase their own copy of the BSN Module Text or MSN syllabus required for a particular course/module.
- The nursing curriculum must be completed in the order prescribed and all students must earn C or better for each module in that course. Failure to meet course/module prerequisites will adversely affect student progress.
- Students must adhere to the highest standards of academic integrity.

# DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

## BSN/MSN Degree Requirements

### MINIMUM DEGREE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE, NURSING

1. Completion of 126 semester units with a 2.0 GPA.
2. Completion of the General Education program (48 semester units).
3. Satisfaction of the American Institutions requirement in U.S. History, U.S. Constitution and California State and Local Government.
4. Satisfaction of Graduation Writing Competency requirement (by exam or course).
5. Satisfaction of the Entry Level Mathematics (ELM) requirement or exemption and English Placement test or exemption.
6. Complete the residence requirement of 30 semester units earned through CSU Dominguez Hills while an officially admitted DON student. The term, residence units, applies to those units earned at CSU Dominguez Hills while an officially admitted student in a degree program. Fees must be paid through the regular registration process. Residence requirements for a bachelor's degree include a minimum of 30 semester units in residence of which 24 units must be in upper division courses and 18 units must be earned in the major.
7. The maximum credit that may be taken in Extension (Open University) and used toward degree requirements is 24 semester (36 quarter) units at the undergraduate level and 9 semester (13 quarter) units at the graduate level. **Resident extension units do not satisfy residence requirements for a degree.**

### FOR THE MASTER OF SCIENCE, NURSING

1. Completion of 36-49 semester units with a 3.0 GPA average. Degree requirements include completion of a directed project or comprehensive exam.
2. Complete the residence requirements of at least 21 semester units earned at CSU Dominguez Hills while an officially admitted SNP student. Not more than 9 semester units may be earned as transfer work.

### APPLICATION FOR GRADUATION - DEGREE OR CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

All degree candidates must file an Application for Graduation with the Office of the Registrar in accordance with the following schedule:

A final Program of Study must accompany the Application for Graduation signed by the Assistant Chair (BSN) or Graduate Coordinator (MSN or QA) or Role Performance Coordinator (PHN) if not filed previously. Students will receive a "grad check" from the DON Admissions and Records Office which indicates any remaining academic work, outstanding fees or obligations which must be resolved before approval of graduation is granted.

All coursework must be completed by the end of the term (Spring 1996 term: June 19). If you are attending a community college and their Spring term ends at a later date than SNP, you must apply for graduation for the **following** semester.

**If you do not qualify for graduation at the end of the semester for which you applied, you must submit a Change of Graduation Date card and fee of \$10 to the Graduation Unit.** Failing to do so will place a hold on your undergraduate registration packet for the next semester. You must reapply for the Graduation application until your degree requirements are completed. **Completion of degree requirements is the student's responsibility** and, therefore, each student must be thoroughly familiar with the procedures and information about graduation. If you have questions, please consult the DON Admissions and Records Office.

### COMMENCEMENT

Ceremonies at CSUDH are open to all DON graduates. Candidates for graduation from BSN Areas D, E, F, G, H and J and MSN Central, Southwest and Southeast Regions will participate in CSU Dominguez Hills ceremonies. If the student (Area A, B, C and Northern MSN) wishes to participate in graduation ceremonies at their local CSU campus or CSUDH, they should indicate on the application for graduation.

Although a Commencement Booklet will be sent to you in the Spring, there is an early deadline you need to be aware of if you will be graduating in May. Personalized graduation announcements may be ordered through the bookstore at the CSUDH campus between March 1 and April 16. If you are planning to purchase your regalia from the bookstore it is not necessary to place a special order; check with the store in mid-April for the date regalia will be available for sale, along with various other graduation-related items. You may call the bookstore at 310/516-3789 between March 1 and April 16 to order your personalized announcements, and up until commencement regarding other items. Quantities may be limited.



### GRADUATION WITH HONORS POLICY

Effective with the 1978-79 CSUDH academic year, to graduate with honors, an undergraduate student must complete 36 units in residence and receive a minimum of 3.40 on all units taken at CSU Dominguez Hills, with the overall grade point average determined on transferable undergraduate work. The honor categories are as follows based on cumulative grade point average:

Cum Laude	3.40-3.59
Magna Cum Laude	3.60-3.79
Summa Cum Laude	3.80-4.00

Candidates for graduation with honors will be listed in the commencement program based on grades earned through the previous fall semester. Official placement in one of the honors categories will be based on all grades earned including the final term. Therefore, it is possible to be listed as a candidate in the commencement program, but not graduate with honors after all grades have been calculated. Students who graduate with honors will have the appropriate designation inscribed on their diplomas.

### GRADUATION WRITING COMPETENCY REQUIREMENT

#### UNDERGRADUATES

All new and returning undergraduate students admitted for Fall, 1983 or subsequent terms must meet the upper division Graduate Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR). Those students who

have rights to a catalog prior to 1983 will be held to the graduation requirements stated therein. Every CSU campus offers the means for meeting this requirement, either through a test or coursework, or a combination of both. Check the appropriate CSU catalog for details. The writing test is available, a testing fee will be charged. Students are encouraged to meet this requirement by some appropriate means **prior to their senior year.**

#### GRADUATES

All graduate students entering in the Fall of 1983 and thereafter are required to meet the above requirement at the graduate level (which may mean a higher grade on a certifying test, or a higher grade in a certifying course than is required of undergraduates). Consult the appropriate CSU catalog for particulars. This requirement must be met **PRIOR TO OR DURING THE FIRST SEMESTER OF COURSEWORK.**

**IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO SEE THAT VERIFICATION OF PASSING EITHER THE TEST OR AN APPROVED COURSE FROM A CSU IS FORWARDED TO THE OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR IN DON ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS BY THE END OF THE FIRST SEMESTER OF CONTINUOUS ATTENDANCE.**

### PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program, graduates will be prepared to:

1. Deliver professional nursing care that emphasizes health promotion and disease prevention as well as adaptation to acute and long-term care problems, in a range of settings with a community-based focus.
2. Provide professional nursing care to clients of diverse cultural backgrounds, throughout their life span.
3. Develop collaborative relationships, and provide leadership when appropriate, with other professionals, disciplines and community organizations, to promote health of clients.
4. Assist in the design of healthcare delivery systems that provide accessible services to clients.
5. Synthesize and apply knowledge from nursing theory and research findings to professional nursing practice.
6. Contribute to the expansion of nursing knowledge participation in and utilization of nursing research.
7. Incorporate knowledge about current ethical, legal, and social issues into professional nursing practice.
8. Integrate knowledge from the physical and behavioral sciences and the humanities into professional nursing practice.

*Graduates are eligible for certification by the State of California as Public Health Nurses (PHN).*

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. Minimum of 56 semester units of transferable college credit with a grade point average of at least 2.0 (C) or better in all transferable course work (non-residents, 2.4), and have satisfied any high school subject deficiency in English and mathematics by equivalent course work (the maximum transferable credit accepted from a two-year college is 70 semester units.)
2. Current RN licensure in the United States or an RN interim permit. (Demonstrated clinical competence, validated through work history or by a clinical examination, RN licensure, and personal professional liability insurance are required prior to enrolling in a nursing performance course.)

**Diploma Nurse Applicants.** Diploma R.N.s who have not met the 56 unit entrance requirement may be considered for admission through the Undergraduate Preparatory Program. See Table of Contents reference for details and speak with local coordinator.

**Program Structure.** The baccalaureate program comprises classes and/or examinations that include content essential for professional nursing practice. Three options are open to the student:

1. A series of classes. Classes are offered in one- and two-unit modules. The student will take course work and be graded after each course module.
2. A series of written and performance assessments which may be taken in lieu of selected courses. The student receives a study packet and takes the examination. Students who successfully pass the examination **MUST** enroll in and challenge the corresponding DON course. See procedures under "Assessment Option" in this class schedule.
3. A combination of classes and assessments.

### HOW TO BEGIN

1. Attend group information session and review program materials.
2. Submit Admission Application, fee and a photostat of your R.N. license. (Request a CSU Application packet from the SNP Central Office at (310) 516-3596.)
3. **Request transcripts as indicated in the Admission Application. Have transcripts sent directly to the DON Admissions and Records office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you.** All documents must be in by the end of the third month of the term.
4. Complete a registration form for the BSN 310 plus any other beginning classes and send simultaneously with the application. Applications and registration should be submitted in the same envelope but two separate checks **must** be submitted. Allow two weeks for paperwork processing. Order textbooks and course materials from bookstore.
5. All applications submitted during the final two months of a semester for that semester **must** be accompanied by a registration form for BSN 310 class that semester. Students who do not register and take one unit in the semester they apply are required to reapply.
6. Obtain textbook and course materials for BSN 310 and other classes (See BSN book order form in this schedule.) and begin preparing for class.
7. Review module text; complete pre-assignment before first class.
8. Attend first class meetings.
9. While the Admissions and Records Office performs an evaluation of your prior college work you may continue to take classes during the term in which you apply for admission

Performance courses occur in a clinical field setting and involve a clinical preceptor as well as the course instructor. All performance courses have TBA dates and hours in addition to those listed in the class schedule. Refer to the course module text for more specific information on preceptorship and materials needed for the cognizant performance module.

### ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

A cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better in all courses taken to satisfy the requirements for the degree is required. A student will be placed on probation if, in any term, he or she has failed to earn a grade point average of 2.0 or higher for the work taken that term. During the subsequent probationary term the student must achieve a grade point average of 2.0 or better. Failure to do so will result in dismissal from the program.

All nursing major and nursing support courses/modules must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. A course/module may be repeated only once according to University policy.

### ELECTIVE COURSES FOR MATRICULATION STUDENTS

Undergraduate and graduate students may earn elective credit for the following courses. Undergraduate students taking a graduate level course may specify in writing to DON Admissions and Records Office at the time of registration if the credit earned is to be applied toward the BSN degree or reserved for a future graduate degree.

Courses and modules must be successfully completed in the specified order. Certain modules within a course may be sequenced. Any deviation from meeting the course prerequisites or sequence is subject to prior written approval of the Coordinator. Courses below must be completed before proceeding further in curriculum. All transcripts must be received by the admissions deadline or disenrollment from classes will result.

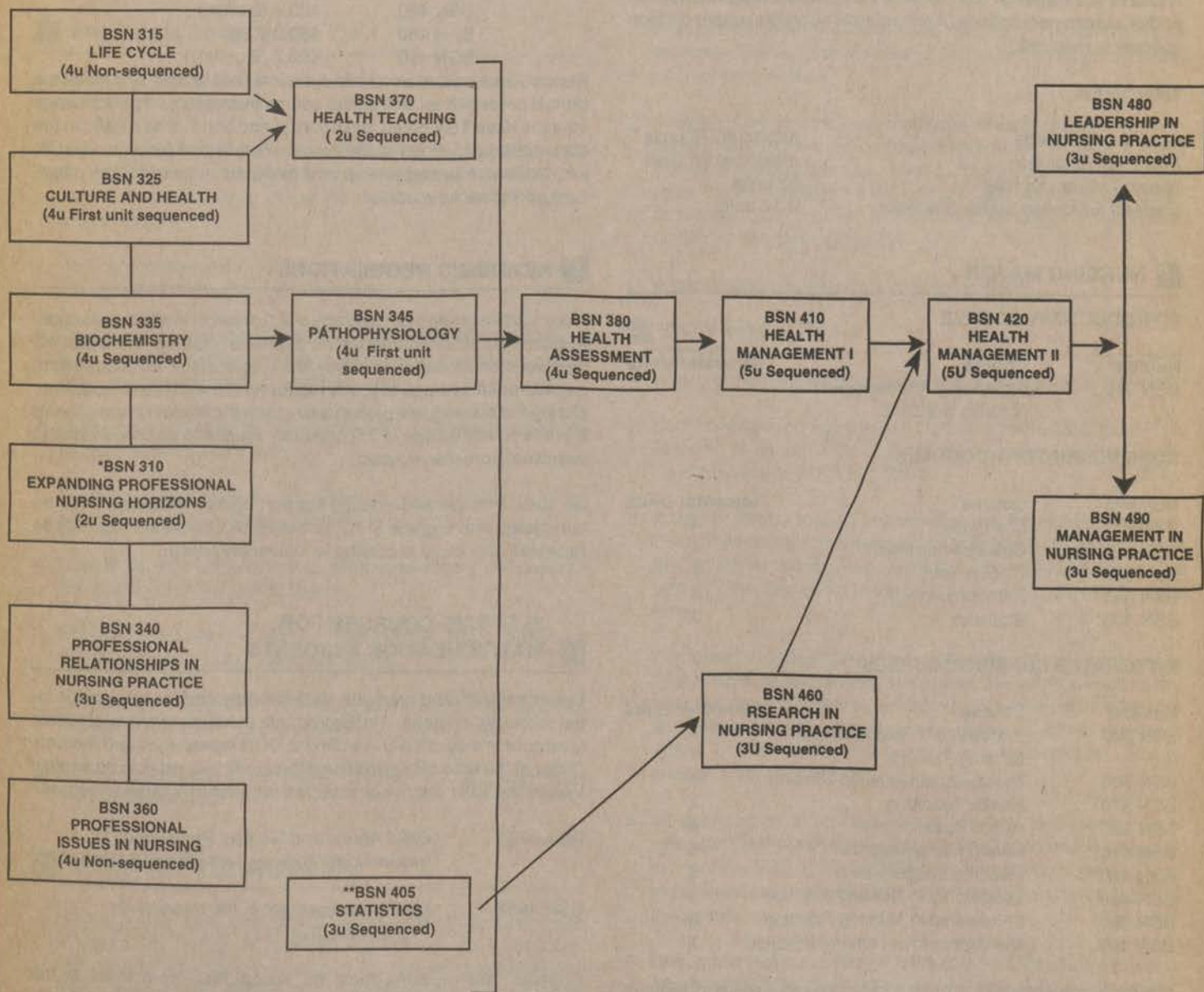


# BSN COURSE INFORMATION

## Curricular Progression

All courses must be taken in the sequences diagramed below. Certain modules within a course may be sequenced. Any exceptions to the sequencing must be approved by the area coordinator/assistant chair in writing. It is not expected that students will take classes out of sequence unless for reasons that are *serious* and *compelling*.

The BSN curriculum has been carefully designed so that advancement through the courses follows a logical progression and each course builds upon prerequisite content.



\*Start with BSN 310 which is prerequisite to or concurrent with BSN 315, 325, 335, 340, 360

\*\*Successful completion of the ELM is prerequisite

Exception: when courses are challenged by written or performance exams



### **BSN 310 EXPANDING PROFESSIONAL NURSING HORIZONS (2).**

*Prerequisites:* Admission to undergraduate program. The increasing complexity and changes in professional nursing demand constant evaluation and planning for formal and informal education. This course presents a systematic problem-solving approach which will help nurses assess their own roles and options, establish career goals, and identify resources which can guide them on a path toward fulfilling their own personal and professional aspirations.

### **BSN 315 LIFE CYCLE (4).**

*Pre- or Corequisite:* BSN 310. The course explores the biological, psychological, cognitive, and social aspects of human development throughout each state of the life cycle. While the first three modules are organized around the growth of the individual within the context of the family, the fourth examines the developmental aspects of adults who are temporarily or permanently living an alternative lifestyle.

### **BSN 325 CULTURE AND HEALTH (4).**

*Pre- or Corequisite:* BSN 310. First units must be taken first. This course explores the relationship between the various components of culture and the dynamics of health and illness. Basic anthropological concepts are used to interpret varying conceptions of health and illness and significant dimensions of cultural variations are analyzed in relationship to health attitudes. Basic tools for cross-cultural health studies are applied to specific problems in health. Human institutions and their connection to health and illness are examined from a cross-cultural perspective. Alternative health care delivery systems are compared and a transcultural approach to health care is presented.

### **BSN 335 BIOCHEMISTRY (4).**

*Pre- or Corequisite:* BSN 310. This course explores the principles underlying the chemistry of living systems, including the molecular basis by which the human organism meets the vital needs of materials, energy and information. It provides an introduction to the chemistry of bioenergetics, metabolism, biosynthesis, and molecular physiology. By translating the unique language of biochemistry into understandable terms, this course will enable the health professional to apply the vocabulary and concepts of biochemistry to everyday practice.

### **BSN 340 PROFESSIONAL RELATIONSHIPS IN NURSING PRACTICE (3).**

*Prerequisite:* BSN 310. This course explores professional interaction including the significance of personal awareness, beliefs, and values. Communication theory and styles are defined and the essential elements of a therapeutic relationship are analyzed. Attention is given to crisis intervention techniques. The course includes an integrated performance component where students in a field experience setting apply theoretical knowledge in communicating effectively with health team members, clients and families.

### **BSN 345 PATHOPHYSIOLOGY (4).**

*Pre- or Corequisite:* BSN 335 or consent of faculty coordinator. This course explores the response of the human body to illness and injury with respect to common disorders of the major systems. Clinical correlations are provided to assist the health professional in applying this knowledge toward more effective patient care.

### **BSN 360 PROFESSIONAL ISSUES IN NURSING (4).**

*Pre- or Corequisite:* BSN 310. This course explores the foundations of professional nursing from historical, philosophical, ethical, political and legal perspectives. Significant issues are analyzed and strategies presented to foster excellence in nursing practice. The relationship between theory, research, and nursing process is discussed in-depth and related to problem solving in the profession. The health care delivery system is examined, as are the diverse roles and settings for nursing practice.

### **BSN 370 HEALTH TEACHING (2).**

*Prerequisite:* BSN 315 and BSN 325 or consent of Faculty Coordinator. This course is designed to assist the professional nurse in addressing the learning needs of clients. In addition to enhancing his or her skills as a health teacher, the student will develop an understanding of the philosophical and scientific foundations of patient education as well as professional and social issues which confront those individuals who provide such services.

### **BSN 380 HEALTH ASSESSMENT (4).**

*Prerequisite:* all other BSN 300 level courses. This course provides an opportunity to gain the knowledge and skills required to perform a complete health assessment. In addition to history-taking and physical examination techniques, emphasis is also given to the analysis and synthesis of the data collected in order to identify health care problems and develop a management plan within the context of the nursing process. An integrated performance module provides the opportunity for application of knowledge and skills in the practice setting.

### **BSN 405 STATISTICS (3).**

*Prerequisite:* Fulfillment of the ELM requirement for BSN students and BSN 310. Satisfies the Quantitative Reasoning requirement. Includes development and application of the following topics: Descriptive and Inferential Statistics, Mathematics of Finance, Linear Programming and Graph Theory.

### **BSN 410 HEALTH MANAGEMENT (5).**

*Prerequisite:* BSN 380. This course investigates how the community health nurse promotes the health of individuals and families in the community. The theoretical foundations and methodology of community health nursing practice are explored as well as the health barriers which the community health nurse seeks to overcome. Family theory and the family nursing process are analyzed. The course also examines how a community health nurse working in a home health care agency addresses the nursing care problems of specific client populations. The course also includes a performance component where students in a field-experience setting apply the theoretical constructs of community health nursing to health care situations encountered in a community health agency. The performance component may be completed concurrently with the BSN 420 performance component directly following completion of all BSN 410 and 420 theory modules.



# BSN COURSE DESCRIPTION

## Degree Programs

### **BSN 420 HEALTH MANAGEMENT II (5).**

*Prerequisite: BSN 410 and BSN 460 or consent of faculty coordinator.* This course explores the field of community health nursing from an epidemiological perspective and focuses on the personal and environmental health of the total population. Attention is given to group process and change agency. Methods of epidemiology are examined and related to appropriate nursing interventions at each level of prevention. Epidemiological principles are applied to situations that community health nurses commonly encounter in their work with official health departments. The course also includes a performance component where students in a field experience setting apply the theoretical constructs of community health nursing to health care situations encountered in the official department.

### **BSN 460 RESEARCH IN NURSING PRACTICE (3).**

*Prerequisite: BSN 405.* This course examines the evolution of contemporary nursing research and its relationship to nursing science, theory, and practice. From the perspective of the investigative role of the professional nurse, knowledge of the research process will be developed and applied to skillful and systematic analysis of research studies and findings. The process of developing a research proposal, derived from a practice issue or question will be examined.

### **BSN 480 LEADERSHIP IN NURSING PRACTICE (3).**

*Prerequisite: BSN 420 and BSN 460.* This course explores effective and ineffective leadership styles and the role of leader is emphasized. Change agency processes are discussed and factors affecting assignment-making and evaluation of personnel are identified. The course includes an integrated performance component where students in a field experience setting practice professional nursing leadership for a nursing team, including team conferences, patient assignments, problem-solving, written communications within an institution, and performance appraisals of nursing personnel.

### **BSN 490 MANAGEMENT IN NURSING PRACTICE (3).**

*Prerequisites: BSN 420 and BSN 460.* This course explores contemporary management theories, issues of power sharing, labor relations management, patient care evaluation, standards development and the emergence of computers as a management tool for nursing. The course includes an integrated performance component where students in a field experience setting practice systems analysis, flow charting, performance evaluation, nursing policy development, nursing quality evaluation and financial evaluation of a segment of a nursing system.

### **BSN 494 INDEPENDENT STUDY (1-3).**

A course of study designed cooperatively by student and instructor, and approved by the Program Director, to accomplish individualized learning objectives that are appropriate to the role of the professional nurse. (Students should contact advisor prior to enrolling to determine the appropriateness of this course for degree completion.)

### **BSN 495 SPECIAL TOPICS/COLLOQUIA (1-3).**

These courses offer student groups an opportunity to explore a topic of current interest to the nursing profession with colleagues, faculty and special guest speakers.

### PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE CERTIFICATE ELIGIBILITY PROGRAM

The Statewide Nursing Program offers nurses with baccalaureate degrees from foreign nursing schools, non-NLN accredited nursing schools, or those with non-nursing baccalaureate degrees the opportunity to complete the requirements for the Public Health Nurse Certificate. The Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) issues the Public Health Nurse Certificate in California when specific course content has been completed. The process for obtaining the certificate differs depending on where the nurse received her/his bachelor's degree. Find the category below that best describes your educational preparation and follow the instructions given.

### DIVISION OF NURSING, STATEWIDE NURSING PROGRAM BSN GRADUATES

All BSN graduates of the Statewide Nursing Program are automatically eligible for the Certificate. Upon graduation, the names of BSN graduates are forwarded to the BRN by the Division of Nursing.

- You must contact the BRN at the number below and request a PHN Certificate application.
- Return the completed application to the BRN with the \$75 fee. The certificate will be issued in approximately six weeks.

### DIVISION OF NURSING, MSN PATHWAY STUDENT

After completing the Pathway requirements:

- Contact Admissions and Records and obtain a change of objective form.
- Complete and return this form to A & R with a check for \$20.
- A copy of your transcripts and Pathway evaluation will be forwarded to the PHN Coordinator for review and evaluation based on PHN content requirements.
- If all requirements have been met, your name will be forwarded to the BRN.  
File a second change of objective form with A & R to return to the MSN program
- Contact the BRN at the following number and request a PHN Certificate application.
- Complete the application and return it to the BRN with a check for \$75.

### NURSES WHO GRADUATED FROM A FOREIGN NURSING SCHOOL WITH A BSN OR FROM A SCHOOL THAT WAS NOT ACCREDITED BY THE NLN: DO NOT ATTEND WORKSHOP.

If you are currently licensed as a registered nurse in California and have earned a BSN from a school outside the United States or from a U.S. school that was not accredited by the National League for Nursing at the time that you graduated:

- Contact the BRN at the (916) 322-1988 and request a PHN Certificate application.
- Complete and return the application to the BRN with the \$75 fee.

- Request transcripts be sent to the BRN from all schools you have attended.
- The BRN will evaluate your transcripts for completion of PHN Certificate content and will either issue the certificate or a letter of deficiency.
- If you receive a letter of deficiency contact Barbara Thorpe (805) 646-2092, for a letter of process, enroll in the required courses using Open University registration form (See table of contents).
- After completing required coursework, request that your transcripts be sent by CSUDH Admissions and Records to the BRN & your certificate will be issued by them in 6-8 weeks.

### NURSES WITH NON-NURSING BACCALAUREATE DEGREES:

If your bachelors degree is **NOT** in nursing:

- Enroll in one of the workshops listed on the following page.
- You will then receive confirmation and requirements
- Send copies of all transcripts and course description to the PHN Coordinator one month prior to the workshop.
- Following the workshop and transcript evaluation, you will be eligible to apply for admission to the PHN program, and to enroll in the courses you need.
- When all requirements are met, you will be eligible to apply to the BRN for the PHN Certificate.

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### THE PROGRAM

The graduate program prepares professional nurses for advanced and specialized practice. The curriculum is organized around the role of the nurse in societal institutions with emphasis on the application of theory through excellence in professional practice, and the advancement of the profession through research, leadership, and scholarship for the ultimate benefit of the health care needs of society.

### PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the program graduates will be able to:

1. Practice at an advanced level in a selected area of expertise;
2. Substantiate nursing practice, policy, and standards through research utilization and/or conduct;
3. Generate practice models that are theory driven;
4. Design health care delivery systems that accommodate access and provide services to individuals, aggregates, and populations in a variety of settings;
5. Take a leadership role in the restructuring of the health care system and its delivery;
6. Create an environment conducive to collaboration and empowerment among health providers; and
7. Inspire professionalism.

### ROLE EMPHASIS OPTIONS

The curriculum allows the student to request role emphasis as nurse educator, nurse administrator, clinical specialist in parent-child nursing or gerontology nursing, or family nurse practitioner. Through a personalized Program of Study the curriculum is individualized and reflective of the student's learning needs and professional goals.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Please refer to the section on Admissions. In addition, please note the following special requirements for admission to the MSN program:

1. Completion of a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution with an upper division major in nursing (BSN) and NLN accredited nursing program or the equivalent as determined by the Graduate Student Affairs Committee.
2. Overall grade point average of 3.0 (on a four-point scale) or higher in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted, or demonstrated academic ability as required by the faculty, following the appeal process.
3. Current licensure in the United States. Personal professional liability insurance is required prior to enrolling in nursing performance course.
4. As indicated in the Admission Application, have transcript sent directly to the SNP Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you.
5. The Graduate Writing Competency requirement must be met prior to OR during the first semester of coursework.

### NURSES WITH NON-NURSING

#### BACHELOR'S DEGREES

Registered nurses who have earned a bachelor's degree in another field may be eligible for the BA/BS Pathway to the MSN degree. (See this schedule for information on the MSN Pathway.) All potential Pathway students must attend a special MSN Pathway Program Workshop.

#### FEDERAL TRAINEESHIPS

A Professional Nurse Traineeship grant may be awarded to the DON by the **Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health Service**. The grant monies when awarded are designated for registration fees and other expenses for selected students who are pursuing graduate level coursework in nursing as Nurse Educators, CNSs, or FNPs, and meet the eligibility criteria established by the USDHHS, PHS and CSUDH/DON.

#### PROGRAM STRUCTURE

All Students complete 16 units of core courses before beginning role emphasis courses.

Students may request role emphasis preparation as:

- Nurse educator with advanced clinical focus
- Nurse administrator
- Parent-child clinical nurse specialist
- Gerontology clinical nursespecialist
- Family nurse practitioner

Within the role emphasis option subspecialization may occur. The student focuses on a specific nursing practice area. For example, quality improvement, the depressed elderly, parenting, or client education/teaching.

#### HOW TO BEGIN

1. Attend a group Information Session and review program materials.
2. Submit admission application and fee. Request a CSU admission application packet by calling (310) 516-3596.
3. Request transcripts (As indicated in the Admission Application, have official transcripts sent directly to the SNP Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy sent directly to you if you do not already possess a copy.) All documents must be in by end of third month of term.
4. Register for MSN 500. Order texts and course materials from Statewide Technical Books **Note:** you must enroll in MSN 500 prior to other coursework.
5. With your first registration, add \$5.00 to your total fee. The \$5.00 is a ONE TIME fee to cover costs and handling of your ID/library card.
6. Attend MSN 500. Bring all information specified in syllabus with you to MSN 500. Your Program of Study and advisement will begin at that time.
7. While the SNP Admissions and Records Office performs an evaluation of your prior college work, you may continue to take classes during the term.

### COMPLETION OF DEGREE/CULMINATING

#### EXPERIENCE

Prior to the completion of MSN 590 Advanced Nursing Research the graduate student must request one of the following culminating experiences:

#### Alternative I: Coursework and Thesis or Directed Project (36 units)

- Complete approved program with a minimum of 33 units of coursework with at least a 3.70 GPA for Thesis and 3.50 GPA for directed Project.
- Complete approved thesis or directed project (3 units). See advisor for guidelines and selection criteria for Thesis or Directed Project.

#### Alternative II: Coursework and Examination (36 units)

- Complete an approved program of 36 units of coursework with at least a "B" (3.0) average (including core courses).
- Pass a comprehensive written examination. After completion of all coursework the student may apply to take the comprehensive examination. There is only one retake opportunity.

### COURSE PREREQUISITES

Certain MSN courses require the successful completion of prerequisites not offered as part of the graduate program, but available as undergraduate nursing courses. These prerequisite courses are as follows:

An upper division statistics course (inferential and descriptive) or equivalent and an introductory research course or equivalent are prerequisite to MSN 530.

A physical assessment course or equivalent is prerequisite to MSN 550.

The clinical specialist and family nurse practitioner role options require the following additional prerequisite courses:

- BSN 325. Culture and Health or equivalent
- BSN 315. Life Cycle or equivalent
- BSN 345. Pathophysiology or equivalent

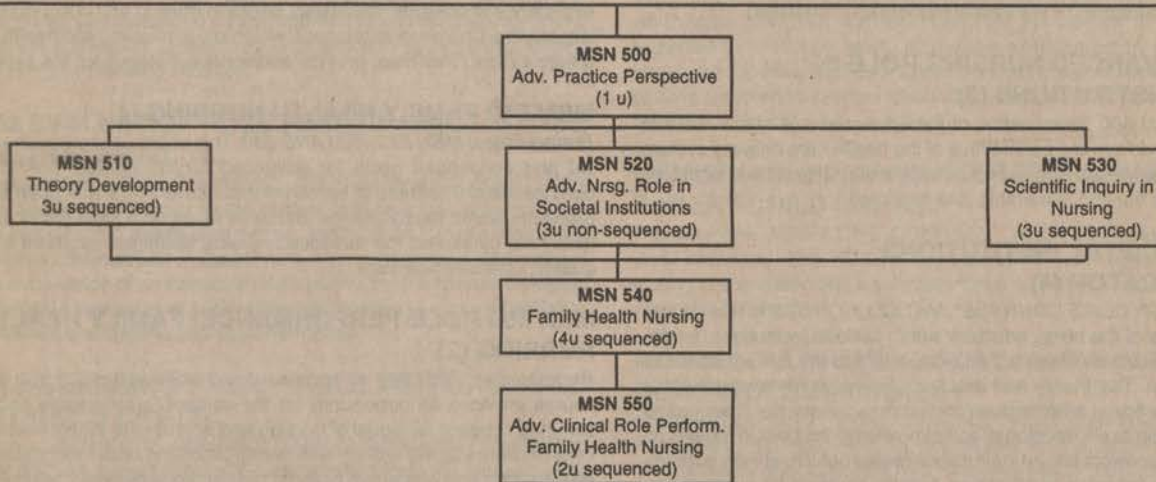

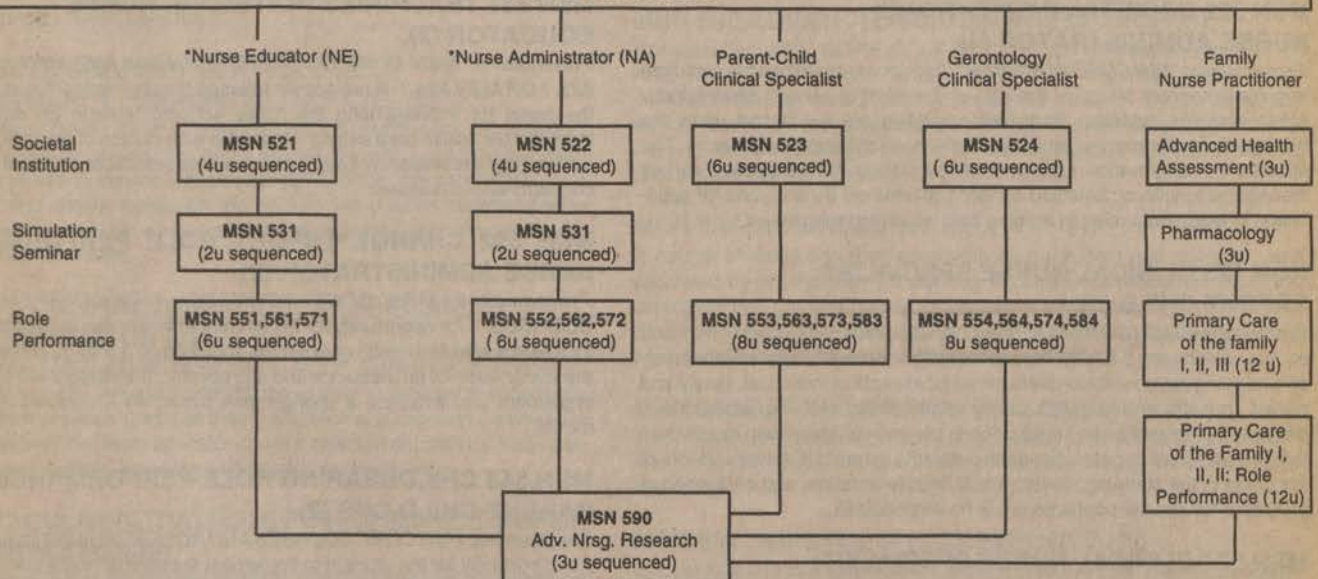
## Degree and Certificate Programs

- All prerequisites, MSN coursework, and Directed Project, or Thesis, or Comprehensive Examination can be completed within the 5 year time period designated by CSUDH depending on personal preferences for class sites and dates.
- Grade averages are calculated each semester by University Admissions and Records. To maintain acceptable standing in the MSN program a "B" average is required.
- MSN 520 is the only course with non-sequenced set of modules. Modules in all other courses must be successfully completed in sequence.
- Any deviation in course/module sequence requires prior written approval by the Graduate Coordinator and Department Chair.
- All coursework, including electives, are to be completed prior to MSN 599, Directed Project, Thesis or Comprehensive Exam.

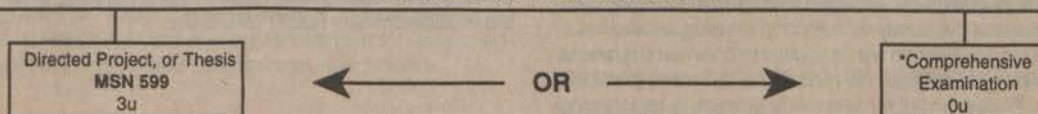

# MSN COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

## Degree and Certificate Programs

### MSN 500 ADVANCED PRACTICE PERSPECTIVES (1).

*Prerequisite:* Application to the graduate program in nursing or the Quality Assurance Certificate Program. An exploration of issues related to preparation for advanced nursing practice including role options in various practice settings. Strategies for success in non-traditional graduate nursing education are explored including adult learning theory, literature search skills, scholarly writing and the use of computers.

### MSN 510 THEORY DEVELOPMENT (3).

*Prerequisite:* MSN 500. This course examines the evolution of contemporary nursing models, theories and the process of theory development. The process of critical analysis of existing nursing and related theories, as well as the actual construction of theoretical models is emphasized.

### MSN 520 ADVANCED NURSING ROLE IN SOCIETAL INSTITUTIONS (3).

*Prerequisite:* MSN 500. Examination of the advanced role of the nurse in societal institutions from the perspective of the health care delivery system and of selected advanced and expert nursing roles. Organizational theory and strategies for nursing leadership are analyzed.

### MSN 521 SOCIETAL INSTITUTIONS: NURSE EDUCATOR (4).

*Prerequisites:* MSN CORE COURSES\* AND 523.1 OR 524.1. This course examines the role of the nurse educator within societal institutions, beginning with an historical overview as an antecedent to the current status of nursing education. The theory and process of curriculum development is analyzed, with particular emphasis on contemporary issues and accreditation realities. Students will develop specific knowledge and skill in transforming a curricular framework into an instructional design which reflects contemporary theories of teaching and learning. Finally, students have the opportunity to focus on strategies for teaching client care to students of nursing.

### MSN 522 SOCIETAL INSTITUTIONS: NURSE ADMINISTRATOR (4).

*Prerequisites:* MSN CORE COURSES\*. This course examines the evolution and contemporary status of the role of the nursing service administrator within complex systems. Particular emphasis will be placed upon the management of primary organizational, financial and human resources. The utilization of information science and technology will be applied to key managerial functions. Selected conceptual tools will be analyzed for application to leadership roles in nursing care system management.

### MSN 523 CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST: PARENT CHILD (6).

*Prerequisites:* MSN CORE COURSES\* AND BSN 315, 325, 345. Focuses on the childbearing family from conception through early childbearing, emphasizing psycho-socio-developmental aspects of individual, family and parent growth, and complex family relationships. Nursing assessment, diagnosis, intervention and evaluation in common alterations in health, and to high-risk actual or potential health problems examined. Advanced role of the nurse in the planning, development, implementation, and evaluation of programs for special populations will be emphasized.

### MSN 524 CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST: GERONTOLOGY (6).

*Prerequisites:* MSN CORE COURSES\* AND BSN 315, 325, 345 OR equivalent. Theoretical perspectives on aging and normative aging processes within the context of the family and society. Nursing assessment, diagnosis, intervention and evaluation will be applied to common alterations in health as well as to high-risk human responses to health problems associated with aging. The advanced nursing role in promoting, maintaining and advocating health for senior adults is emphasized as well as programs which foster self-care in the senior population.

### MSN 530 SCIENTIFIC INQUIRY IN NURSING (3).

*Prerequisites:* BSN 405 or equivalent. Examination of the emergence of nursing science and the investigative role of nursing. Presentation of qualitative and quantitative research methods in advanced nursing role and the principles and processes of critical thinking.

### MSN 531 SIMULATION SEMINAR (2).

*Prerequisites:* CORE COURSES\* and MSN 521, 522 OR CONCURRENT. The simulation seminar provides an opportunity for the application of role emphasis theory through participation in a prescribed scenario which requires a synthesis and creative application of knowledge. In addition, the simulations provide the student with interactional opportunities to develop experience in collegial leadership, decision making and collaborative problem solving. Contemporary issues, which impact nursing and health care and create ethical dilemmas, provide additional substance for the simulations.

### MSN 540 FAMILY HEALTH NURSING (4).

*Prerequisites:* MSN 510, 520 AND 530. This course examines the theoretical and conceptual basis for advanced clinical nursing practice in the diagnosis and treatment of human responses to actual and potential health problems within family groups. Students focus on a selected phase of the family life cycle and the advanced nursing strategies required to provide quality, cost effective care.

### MSN 550 ROLE PERFORMANCE: FAMILY HEALTH NURSING (2).

*Prerequisites:* BSN 380 or equivalent and MSN 510, 520, 530, 540. This course provides an opportunity for the student to synthesize and apply a selected conceptual model of nursing and appropriate family theories in the care of clients/family groups with health problems under the supervision of an instructor and preceptor. Nursing interventions derived from theoretically grounded nursing diagnosis are implemented and evaluated.

### MSN 551 TEACHING STRATEGIES: NURSE EDUCATOR (2).

*Prerequisites:* MSN CORE COURSES\*, MSN 521 AND MSN 531, MSN 523.1 OR MSN 524.1. A previously selected nursing clinical focus provides the basis for implementing the nurse educator role in an educational institution or health care setting. Under the supervision of an instructor and a preceptor, the student will apply and evaluate didactic and clinical teaching concepts and strategies.

### MSN 552 CHANGE THEORY ROLE PERFORMANCE: NURSE ADMINISTRATOR (2).

*Prerequisites:* MSN CORE COURSES\* AND ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\*. An opportunity for the student to initiate the nurse administrator role in a selected health care setting, focusing on a change project. Under the supervision of an instructor and a preceptor, the student will formulate, implement and evaluate a change plan based on a conceptual nursing model.

### MSN 553 CHILDBEARING ROLE PERFORMANCE: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2).

*Prerequisites:* MSN CORE COURSES AND ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\*. An opportunity for the student to implement the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting which focuses on the childbearing family. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor, the student will provide comprehensive advanced clinical nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team.



# MSN COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

## Degree and Certificate Programs

### MSN 554 GERONTOLOGY CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST ROLE PERFORMANCE (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , AND ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\*.* An opportunity for the student to implement the gerontological nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor, concepts influencing legislative regulatory and economic policy will be applied to clinical nursing practice.

### MSN 561 ADVANCED CLINICAL ROLE PERFORMANCE: NURSE EDUCATOR (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND MSN 551.* Under the supervision of an instructor and preceptor, the student demonstrates advanced clinical knowledge and competency with a selected client population. Opportunity is provided to apply clinical knowledge and skill to a teaching situation.

### MSN 562 EVALUATION ROLE PERFORMANCE: NURSE ADMINISTRATOR (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND MSN 552.* An opportunity for the student to initiate the nurse administrator role in a selected health care setting, focusing on forces shaping the role of a nurse administrator in departmental and institutional governance. Under the supervision of an instructor and a preceptor, the student will apply valid and reliable measures of performance evaluation to nurse administrator performance and organizational performance.

### MSN 563 EMERGING FAMILY ROLE PERFORMANCE: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND MSN 553.* An opportunity for the student to initiate the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting which focuses on the emerging family. Under the supervision of an instructor and preceptor the student provides advanced clinical nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team.

### MSN 564 COMMUNITY SERVICES ROLE PERFORMANCE: GERONTOLOGY CNS (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND MSN 554.* An opportunity for the student to explore community-based programs providing service to the senior adult. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor the student will provide comprehensive nursing care to clients in a selected care setting with emphasis on alternatives for long-term care.

### MSN 571 CULMINATING ROLE PERFORMANCE: NURSE EDUCATOR (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND MSN 551, 561.* An opportunity for the student to synthesize knowledge and skill from previous graduate theory and clinical course/work toward the full realization of the nurse educator role in a selected educational institution or health care setting, including participation in governance.

### MSN 572 CULMINATING ROLE PERFORMANCE: NURSE ADMINISTRATOR (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND MSN 552, 562.* An opportunity for the student to initiate the nurse administrator role in a selected health care setting, focusing on professional and regulatory requirements. Under the supervision of an instructor and a preceptor, the student will formulate a nursing service plan for integrating quality measures with cost control and case management practice.

### MSN 573 EARLY CHILDREARING ROLE PERFORMANCE: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND MSN 553, 563.* An opportunity for the student to initiate the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting which focuses on the early childrearing family. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor, the student will provide comprehensive advanced clinical nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team.

### MSN 574 THERAPEUTIC STRATEGIES ROLE PERFORMANCE GERONTOLOGY CNS (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND MSN 554, 564.* An opportunity for the student to develop clinical expertise for common health alterations experienced by the senior adult. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor, the student will provide comprehensive nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team.

### MSN 583 CULMINATING ROLE PERFORMANCE: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND MSN 553, 563, 573.* An opportunity for the student to select a field setting and operationalize a comprehensive CNS role in a narrowly focused clinical specialty.

### MSN 584 CULMINATING ROLE PERFORMANCE: GERONTOLOGY CNS (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND MSN 554, 564, 574.* An opportunity for the student to perform the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor, the student applies case management skills in providing care to senior adult clients and their families.

### MSN 590 ADVANCED NURSING RESEARCH (3).

*Prerequisites: MSN CORE COURSES\* , ROLE EMPHASIS COURSES\*\* AND ROLE PERFORMANCE COURSES\*\*\*.* This course focuses on research processes, methods and comparative research design. Emphasis will be placed on critical analysis of nursing studies and interpretation of nursing research findings. Models for clinical practice innovation through utilization of nursing research will be examined.

### MSN 594 INDEPENDENT STUDY (1-3).

A course of study designed cooperatively by student and instructor, and approved by the Program Director, to accomplish individualized learning objectives that are appropriate to the role of the professional nurse. (Students should contact their advisor prior to enrolling to determine the appropriateness of this course for degree completion.)

### MSN 595 SPECIAL TOPICS/COLLOQUIA (1-3).

This course offers student groups an opportunity to explore a topic of current interest to the nursing profession with colleagues, faculty and special guest speakers.

### MSN 595 NURSING ETHICS ELECTIVE (3),

Course examines theoretical and conceptual bases for evolution of contemporary nursing ethics as part of all advanced nursing roles. Focus is on identification, analysis, synthesis and resolution of ethical issues important to the profession of nursing. Relationships among nursing and related theories, research, and practice in a diverse society are explored.

### MSN 595B: ACUTE CARE CLINICAL CASE MANAGEMENT (3)

Provides opportunity for student to examine in-depth approach to clinical case management in acute care setting. Models of nursing care delivery are compared/contrasted with clinical case management. Under supervision, student articulates current economic influences on case management, and develops business plan strategy.



# MSN COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

## Degree and Certificate Programs

### MSN 595: FAMILY NURSE PRACTITIONER PHARMACOLOGY (3)

This course examines the theoretical basis for pharmacological treatment of common health problems seen by the Family Nurse Practitioner within a primary care setting. Selected classifications of drugs will be discussed with special emphasis of pharmacokinetic principles, pathophysiological basis for therapeutic use, adverse effects, drug interactions, contraindications for use, patient education, and issues of compliance. Ethical and legal issues of drug administration and the role of the Family Nurse Practitioner will be explored. Students will be asked to apply these principles by the utilization of selected case studies.

### ADVANCED HEALTH ASSESSMENT (3)

This course examines the theory and practice of advanced health assessment, and its application to the role of the Family Nursing Practitioner. The course emphasizes the analysis and synthesis of subjective and objective data collected to identify health problems, and to develop management plans within the context of the role of the Family Nurse Practitioner. The health assessment process is explored in the context of health promotion, risk factor identification, and recognition of common abnormalities seen in a family practice setting.

### PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY I (4)

This course examines the theoretical and conceptual basis for advanced practice as a Family Nurse Practitioner in primary care. Emphasis will be placed on comprehensive assessment and management of common health problems seen in the care of clients across the life span. Specific emphasis will be placed on the primary care of the family unit within a culturally diverse environment.

### PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY I: ROLE PERFORMANCE (4)

This course provides a preceptored supervised clinical experience with an emphasis on comprehensive assessment and management of common health problems seen in the primary care of clients across the life span. Emphasis will be placed on the primary care of the individual and family within a culturally diverse environment.

### PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY II (4)

This course examines the theoretical and conceptual basis for advanced practice as a Family Nurse Practitioner in primary care. Emphasis will be placed on comprehensive assessment and management of common acute and chronic health problems seen in the care of clients across the life span. Specific emphasis will also be placed on the primary care of the family unit within a culturally diverse environment.

### PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY II: ROLE PERFORMANCE (4)

This his course provides a preceptored supervised clinical experience with an emphasis on comprehensive assessment and management of common acute and chronic health problems seen in the primary care of clients across the life span. Emphasis will be placed on the primary care of the individual and family within a culturally diverse environment.

### PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY III (4)

This course examines the theoretical and conceptual basis for advanced practice as a Family Nurse Practitioner in primary care. Emphasis will be placed on comprehensive assessment and management of increasingly complex acute and chronic health problems seen in the care of clients across the life span. Specific emphasis will be placed on the primary care of the family unit within a culturally diverse environment.

### PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY III: ROLE PERFORMANCE (4)

This course provides a preceptored supervised clinical experience with an emphasis on comprehensive assessment and management of complex health problems seen in the primary care of clients across the life span. Emphasis will be placed on the primary care of the individual and family within a culturally diverse environment.

### MSN 599 DIRECTED PROJECT OR THESIS (3).

*Prerequisites: Advancement to Candidacy, MSN 590 and permission of the MSN Chair.* The goal of all students enrolled in this course is to complete a scholarly project or thesis under the guidance of an assigned instructor. It is the culminating learning experience of a performance-based curriculum which emphasizes the role and function of advanced nursing practice in health care organizations. To meet the standards established by the faculty the project or thesis must demonstrate a rigorous scientific approach, use a clearly documented theoretical framework, and have practical application to the student's selected role emphasis.

### MSN 600 PROJECT CONTINUATION COURSE (0).

Students who have not completed their MSN 599 Directed Project or thesis module by the end of the term may enroll in the following term in the Project Continuation Course.

The Division of Nursing Program offers a pathway to facilitate a master's degree in nursing for those nurses who presently hold a bachelor's degree in another discipline.

Graduate study in nursing builds on a foundation of undergraduate professional nursing knowledge. Following an analysis of your previous coursework, a Program of Study will be recommended which includes undergraduate nursing and related coursework or assessments to prepare you for MSN coursework. If you meet the usual University requirements for graduate study and concur with the recommended Program of Study, you will be admitted to the graduate program on a conditional basis. Once the undergraduate course content requirements are successfully met, the conditional course content requirements are successfully met, the conditional status is removed and you may proceed with completing the graduate curriculum. See MSN degree section for more details on graduate curriculum enrollment and completion requirements.

Registered nurses who have met the eligibility requirements and who are interested in the MSN Pathway program **must** attend a pathway workshop prior to beginning the program. The cost of the workshop is \$50.

**HOW TO BEGIN**

1. Attend an MSN Pathway workshop session.
2. Request transcripts. (As indicated in the Admission Application, have official transcripts sent directly to the DON Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you if you do not already have a copy).
3. Submit Admission Application and fee. Request a CSU Admission Application packet by calling (800) 344-5484 or (310) 516-3596.
4. Following telephone approval by Kay Davis, register for MSN 500. Order texts and course materials from Statewide Technical Books. Note: you must first enroll in MSN 500 prior to other coursework.
5. With your first registration, add \$5 to your total fee. The \$5 is a **ONE TIME** fee to cover costs and handling of your ID/Library card.
6. Attend MSN 500. Complete specified assignments prior to class attendance.
7. Confer with pathway advisor regarding Program of Study and other units to be taken within your first semester.
8. You must take at least one unit in the term for which you applied.

The Division of Nursing (DON) offers a certificate program in quality assurance for BSN prepared nurses who want to develop graduate level knowledge and skill in implementing an institutional quality assurance program. Included in this course of study is utilization review, assessment and measurement of the level of care provided to clients and the utilization of resources. The certificate program is administered by the Chair, Department of Graduate Nursing Science. To be eligible for this certificate program, applicants must: (a) hold a current R.N. license (b) hold a BSN degree from an accredited US Institution, (Graduate of foreign institutions will need to have their transcripts evaluated by an international evaluation service. More information will be sent regarding this process upon receipt of the application.); (c) have an overall grade point average of 3.0 (on a four-point scale) or higher in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted, or demonstrated academic ability as required by the Nursing faculty, following the appeal process; and (d) as indicated in the DON Admission Application, have official transcripts sent directly to the Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you.

Persons interested in applying to this certificate program must complete the following steps to initiate entry into the program: (a) Submit a complete Admissions Application and check the box labeled CERTIFICATE under Program Objective; (b) Attach a photocopy of your current California R.N. License; and (c) Arrange for your previous college(s) to send your transcript(s) directly to the DON Admissions and Records Office. (Ask for a second set to be sent to your home if you do not already have your own copy).

Students who are admitted in the MSN degree program and want to add the Quality Assurance (QA) certificate program must file a revised Program of Study form with the DON Admissions and Records Office. Applicant must take MSN 500 as the first required course. Certain

courses for the Quality Assurance (QA) Certificate require the successful completion of prerequisites not offered as part of the graduate program. These are:

- upper division statistics course (inferential and descriptive) or equivalent
- Introductory research course or equivalent

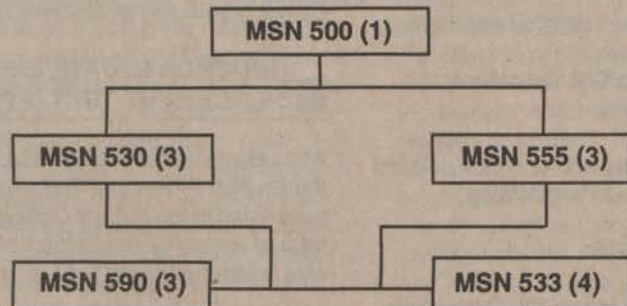
Courses required by the certificate program may be met by DON coursework or by substitution approved by Department Chair, or by Graduate Coordinator, with timely graduate level transferable course from other collegiate programs. Please note: if you eventually want to earn a MSN degree, any courses taken to meet certificate requirements may apply to the degree, but may not be more than 5 years old at the time of degree completion. The certificate program can be completed in 15 months or less, depending on your personal preference and availability of courses. Courses and modules must be completed in the approved sequence with a grade of C or better and an overall B average for the certificate program.

A certificate completion check must be done by the DON Admissions and Records Office one term prior to the term you plan to complete the QA certificate program. The certificate application form may be requested from DON Admissions and Records.

### MSN 555 Quality Assurance in Health Care

Prerequisites: Application to the Quality Assurance Certificate Program or graduate status and MSN 500. This three unit course examines the historical evaluation of quality improvement programs in healthcare, including the political and fiscal aspects. Methodologies for implementing an institutional quality improvement program and strategies for identifying and making needed improvements are explored along with mechanisms for evaluating the total program. (See MSN course descriptions for MSN 500, 530, 590, and 522)

# ACADEMIC POLICIES & PROCEDURES

## ACADEMIC ADVISEMENT AND REGULATIONS

Academic advisement is an essential component of student services. A personal relationship between students and their advisor begins upon admission to their degree program and continues through graduation. The guiding principle for the interaction between the student and advisor is the creation of a plan for degree completion that is compatible with the student's available time, fiscal, and academic resources. Students are encouraged to contact the Assistant Chair/Coordinator for assistance in obtaining the name of their advisor.

Advisors are assigned to students according to geographic areas (by zip code). Please reference BSN Faculty/Program/Advisement Areas in this class schedule to find the name, address and telephone number of the Coordinator who will be your advisor. MSN Pathway and PHN Certificate students should see the Table of Contents for appropriate information. PHN students are advised by the Role Performance Coordinator or designee.

## UNDERGRADUATE ACADEMIC SKILLS ASSESSMENT PLAN

The California State University (CSU) and CSU Dominguez Hills recognize each student's need for adequate preparation in mathematics, English, reading and critical thinking for successful continuation and completion of his or her college education.

The CSU now requires all freshman and those transfer students who have not completed appropriate college courses to demonstrate entry level skills in two areas: English and mathematics. To better ensure that students who are poorly prepared in one or more of the basic skills receive this preparation early in their college careers, CSU Dominguez Hills began implementation of an Academic Skills Assessment Plan (ASAP) in Fall, 1984, starting with new freshman. Beginning Fall, 1988 all Division of Nursing new and readmitted undergraduate students are expected to meet the requirements of the plan. The Academic Skills Assessment Plan has four stages which may effect you:

- Stage 1: Assessment of Entry Level Skills - detailed as follows.
- Stage 2: Completion of Entry Level Skills.
- Stage 3: Certification of Basic Skills - see CSUDH catalog.
- Stage 4: Certification of Writing Proficiency.

Stages 1 and 2 are detailed below. Stages 3 and 4, in their detailed form, may be found in the CSU Dominguez Hills Catalog.

### Stage 1. Assessment of Entry Level Skills

Assessment of entry level competencies in reading, composition and mathematics.

1. Unless exempt, SNP students must take the English Placement Test (EPT) and Entry Level Mathematics Test (ELM) no later than the end of their second semester of attendance at CSU Dominguez Hills. (See description of EPT and ELM in the Admissions session of the University Catalog.) If exempt, the student will be notified when admitted.

2. Entry level English Skills - if students score T150 or below on the EPT, they must enroll in ENG 099 Basic Writing Workshop or IDS 006 Intensive Writing Skills Workshop at CSU Dominguez Hills or **similar course work at a CSU institution or community college**. If their score is T141 or lower on the EPT, they also must enroll in ENG 088 Developmental Reading or a **similar course at a CSU institution or community college**.

Both ENG 088 and 099 or SMC 006 are prerequisites to ENG 110 Freshman Composition 1, and may be taken concurrently prior to ENG 110. (CSUDH course.)

3. Entry Level Mathematics Skills - If students do not pass the ELM, they should register for MAT 003 and/or MAT 005 at CSU Dominguez Hills or **similar course work at a CSU institution or community college**. If students are not exempt, they must pass the ELM (score of 550) or equivalent coursework before taking any higher level math course (BSN 405 Statistics). Only CSU General Education transfer math courses fulfill the ELM requirement.

### Stage 2. Completion of Entry Level Skills

Students will not be allowed to register for a third full term if they have not taken the ELM and/or EPT. If you do not pass the ELM, you may still register for courses other than G.E. math. You must pass the ELM prior to registering for an approved G.E. math course at any CSU or community college.

### Stage 3. Certification of Basic Skills

Within five semesters of enrollment, all students must complete their Entry Level requirements in English composition and mathematics. Students who have not completed the Entry Level requirements will be ASAP disqualified (ref: Executive Order No. 393, V, Administrative Academic Disqualification).

### Stage 4. Certification of Writing Proficiency

Before graduation all students must pass the GEAR exam.

## UNDERGRADUATE ENGLISH PLACEMENT TEST (EPT)

All students wishing to enroll in Freshman Composition must take the English Placement Test unless they meet one of the exemptions listed in the current catalog. Verification of exemptions in the form of letters of notification or scores reported by testing agencies is required at the time of registration of the course.

Additionally, students who are bound by the EPT requirements must take the test no later than the end of their second semester whether they plan to take Freshman Composition that semester or not.

## UNDERGRADUATE ENTRY LEVEL MATHEMATICS (ELM) TEST

All students who entered CSU Dominguez Hills in Fall 1982 or later must demonstrate basic competence in mathematics. New students must demonstrate competence by successful completion of the CSU Entry Level Mathematics (ELM) Examination (pass with score of 550) or equivalent coursework. Transfer students are subject to requirements in the 1983-84 CSU Dominguez Hills Catalog must take the ELM, unless they have successfully completed (grade C or better) a mathematics course certified for General Education - Quantitative Reasoning (advanced algebra or above) at the time of transfer. Satisfactory performance on any of several alternative examinations may exempt students from taking this examination. For more information, contact your advisor. Students required to take this examination should do so as soon as possible after admission. **Failure to take the examination before the end of the second term may lead to probation and disqualification**

## ELM TEST

The California State University and CSU Dominguez Hills recognize each student's need for adequate preparation in mathematics for successful continuation and completion of his or her college education. The CSU requires all freshmen and those transfer students who have not completed appropriate college courses to demonstrate entry level mathematics skills through passing of the ELM (Entry level mathematics) test. This test is prerequisite to enrolling in courses designated as meeting the General Education mathematics requirement. All new and readmitted undergraduate nursing students will be expected to meet the requirements unless exempted (See your official transcript evaluation). **The ELM must be taken soon after receiving the evaluation of your transcript or upon application to the program if you have never taken a college level math course which satisfied the General Education requirement in mathematics or quantitative reasoning.** This timeframe accommodates students who are unsure of their basic mathematics skills, or poorly prepared, allowing time to review and take advantage of various learning materials and workshops. If you do not pass the ELM, you may still register for courses other than G.E. math (BSN 405). Students will not be allowed to register for a third term if they have not taken the ELM unless Advisor's approval is obtained. The ELM requirement must be met.

If you do not pass the ELM, you have several options:

- Take the Coastline College televised course.
- Use other self-study tutorial materials available in the bookstore
- Take an approved college course(s) to exempt you from ELM (call coordinator for a list of proper courses).

## HEALTH EXAMINATIONS BSN AND MSN PROGRAMS

A medical history form, sent to students upon admission should be filed with the student health center before registration.

**Measles and Rubella Immunizations Health Screening Provisions.** All new and readmitted students born since January, 1957 will be notified of the requirement to present proof of measles and rubella immunizations. **This is not an admissions requirement, but shall be required of students by the beginning of the next term.** Proof of measles and rubella immunizations also shall be required for certain groups of enrolled students who have increased exposure to these diseases.

**Persons Subject to these Health Screening Provisions include:**

- New students enrolling Fall 1986 or later.
- Readmitted student re-enrolling Fall 1986 or later.
- Students who reside in campus residence halls.
- Students who obtained their primary and secondary schooling outside the United States.
- Students enrolled in clinical science and practicum, student teaching or field work involving pre-school age children, school age children, field work taking place in a hospital or health care setting.

## DESCRIPTION OF ENROLLMENT OPPORTUNITIES

**REGULAR ADMISSION** - A new student applying for admission to a degree or certificate program should complete the regular CSU application and return to DON Admissions and Records Office along with the \$55 application fee.

**CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT** - Admitted students who are taking Division of Nursing/CSUDH courses this term may also take courses at another CSU campus through concurrent enrollment. Concurrent enrollment forms are available at any CSU campus or by calling 310/516-4065. Be sure to pay attention to the registration deadlines and registration procedures at the particular CSU institution you have selected. Your registration fee is paid to CSUDH and is based on your unit load.

**INTRASYSTEM VISITOR ENROLLMENT** - A means by which students who are not taking a Division of Nursing/CSUDH course may enroll in designated courses at another CSU. Fees are paid to the host campus. Visitor enrollment forms are available at any CSU campus or by calling 310/516-4065.



# ACADEMIC POLICIES & PROCEDURES

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT/INSTRASYSTEM VISITOR

**Undergraduate - student has completed at least one term at the home campus as a matriculated student and earned at least 12 units there.** Student has attained a GPA of 2.0 in all work completed at the home campus and is in good standing at the campus. Student is eligible to register under continuing status at the home campus.

**Graduate - student completed at least one term at the home campus as a matriculated student.** Student has been admitted or is enrolled in an authorized graduate program at the home campus. Student was in good standing at the last institution attended.

## CHANGE OF NAME OR ADDRESS

If you have made a change of name, address or phone which has not been reported to the University, please send the change of name/address to the DON Admissions and Records Office in writing. Change of name must be documented by legal verification. It is important that the University be informed of any changes so that you will receive all mailings.

## CREDIT FOR OPEN UNIVERSITY, EXTENSION AND CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

The University allows transfer credit for appropriate college level courses completed in Extension, including Open University, or by correspondence from accredited colleges or universities and the United States Armed Forces Institute. A maximum of 24 semester (36 quarter) units earned through Extension, completed at CSU Dominguez Hills or elsewhere or through correspondence, and USAF may be accepted toward a bachelor's degree. For graduate level students, a maximum of 9 (13 quarter) units of extension work may be applied to a degree. Please note that these credits do not satisfy CSUDH residence requirements for the degree. For more detailed information, please refer to the current University catalog.

## FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974

All student records of the CSU, including the Division of Nursing at CSU Dominguez Hills, are kept in accordance with the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974.

Students may request access to those campus records that personally identify the student. The student may challenge the accuracy of the appropriateness of its retention in the campus records. Student consent is needed for the release of records covered by the Act to outside parties (e.g. prospective employers) except for those agencies entitled to access under the provisions of the Act (e.g. campus officials, other schools, federal officers, and requests in connection with the application or receipt of financial aid).

A student may request a copy of a record that he/she requested for release. Students must pay a charge for copies of records for which

such a charge has been established. Copies of the full text of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 are available at the Office of the Vice President for Students Affairs (ERC C532) or the campus library. Particular questions with respect to a student's prerogatives under the Act should be directed to the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs.

If a student wishes to restrict the release of directory information, a request may be made at the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs. The request is valid from the semester requested through the end of the academic year. Requests for restriction or release of information for a subsequent academic year requires a new form.

## FULL TIME STATUS

### Undergraduate

Undergraduates are considered to be full-time students during any semester when they are enrolled in 12 or more units.

### Graduate

Graduate students enrolled in eight or more graduate level (500 level) units are considered to be full-time.

## SCHOLASTIC POLICIES

### Grades and Grade Points

Effective with the Fall, 1990 term, CSU Dominguez Hills is using the following grading system:

## NOTES

**Master's degree candidates** are reminded that a "B" (3.0) average is required in the master's degree program and for all courses (related and unrelated; lower division, upper division and graduate) taken concurrent with master's degree program.

**Undergraduate students** are reminded that, in order to graduate with a baccalaureate degree, a "C" (2.0) average is required for all CSUDH courses, nursing support and nursing major courses.

Courses and modules must be successfully completed (grade of C or better) in the order indicated by the curricular progression flowchart. Certain modules within a course may be sequenced. Any deviation from meeting the course prerequisites or sequence re-



quires prior written approval by the Assistant Chair/Coordinator. Students not adhering to progression policy will be administratively dropped.

## Alternate Grading Policy

In departmentally designated courses in basic skills (composition, quantitative reasoning, logic [critical reasoning]) and departmentally designated upper division composition courses, the A-F grading system is replaced by a Credit/No credit system. Therefore, DON curriculum honors the alternate CR/NC grading system.

## Incomplete Grade

A grade of incomplete may be assigned if a student is unable, for an unforeseen reason, to complete a definable portion of course work. An incomplete indicates that there is still a possibility of credit upon completion of future work. The student must arrange with the instructor for completion of the required work. For each incomplete grade assigned, the instructor will complete an **Incomplete Grade Agreement Form in triplicate on which he/she will indicate:**

1. The reason for granting the incomplete.
2. Amount or nature of the work to be completed.
3. The date by which the student must make up the work - date as early as possible, but in any case within one calendar year at the very latest.

The student may not register for any courses to which the incomplete course is prerequisite.

## Application for Incomplete ("I") Grade

An approval form, signed by the instructor, must be completed by the last scheduled meeting date of the course.

An incomplete grade may not be submitted without an Incomplete Grade Agreement Form. A definitive grade for the term is recorded when the work has been completed. An incomplete grade cannot be removed by repeating the course. **The grade will automatically be recorded as "F" or "NC" if the work has not been completed within the time specified on the Incomplete Grade Agreement Form.**

## Change of Grade Procedures

If a grade change is necessary the instructor completes the form and forwards it to the DON Admissions and Records Office. The student will then be notified of the change of grade.

## Unauthorized Incomplete

The symbol "U" indicates that an enrolled student did not withdraw from the course and failed to complete course requirements. It is used when, in the opinion of the instructor, completed assignments or course activities or both were insufficient to make normal evaluation of academic performance possible. For purposes of grade point average computation, this symbol is equivalent to an "F". To remove a "U" grade, note the following:

1. Undergraduates must use the Repeat and Cancel policy.
2. Graduates must petition for exception.

## Official Withdrawal from the University (W)

Official withdrawal is necessary if a student leaves the University any time after registration and does not intend to complete the semester. A drop may be obtained from the schedule of classes or call DON Admissions and Records Office. A student who does not officially withdraw shall receive an "F", "U" or "NC" for the registered courses.

## CR/NC (CREDIT/NO CREDIT GRADES)

### Undergraduate

An undergraduate student may elect to be graded CR/NC in particular courses, subject to the following conditions:

1. Courses used to satisfy a major (both upper and lower divisions), or which are prerequisite to it, must be taken for a letter grade except when such courses are graded solely on a CR/NC basis. A student is permitted to enroll in up to 50% of the units required by a minor on a CR/NC basis, unless otherwise specified in the catalog under specific requirements for a minor.
2. No more than 24 units graded CR/NC, whether taken at this or another institution, may be offered in satisfaction of the total units required for a bachelor's degree. If 24 units grade CR/NC are accepted in the transfer, no additional courses graded CR/NC may be used to satisfy degree requirements, except when a required course is graded solely on a CR/NC basis. (All credits earned in the CLEP testing program may count even if they make the cumulative total of all CR/NC units at that time over 24.)

### Grade Equivalences and Records

1. Both Credit (CR) and No Credit (NC) grades are recorded on student transcripts.
2. In accordance with current policies of the Board of Trustees, at the undergraduate level, the CR grade is the equivalent of an A, B or C; and the NC grade is the equivalent of a D or F.
3. CR/NC grades are not computed in overall or semester GPA.

### Graduate

1. Graduate courses graded on a CR/NC basis are limited to courses specifically designated in the catalog for non-traditional grading and to certain 400 and 500 level courses in the Division of Nursing.
2. At the graduate level, CR is the equivalent of an A or B; and NC is the equivalent of C, D or F.
3. At least 24 of the units used to fulfill the requirements for a master's degree shall be graded on a traditional basis. The remaining units may be graded CR/NC if the course is offered on that basis.
4. Graduate level students are allowed to elect to receive CR/NC grades in courses numbered below 500 that will not be used to satisfy the requirements of a graduate degree program.



# ACADEMIC POLICIES & PROCEDURES

## Repeat and Cancel Policy

The Repeat and Cancel Policy was amended effective Fall, 1986. The following procedures are applicable to all CSU Dominguez Hills students:

1. The Repeat and Cancel Policy may be used by students working toward a baccalaureate degree.
2. The Repeat and Cancel Policy may not be used by graduate/post-baccalaureate students working on master's degrees, graduate certifications, teaching credentials, or by "undeclared" graduate students.
3. In the case of a repeated course, the subsequent grade is substituted for the earlier grade in the computation of units attempted and GPA. The previous course grade(s) remain(s) on the record, but is annotated as being discounted from GPA calculations.
4. Repeat and Cancel may be used on courses taken and repeated at CSU Dominguez Hills and other CSU campuses during summer sessions or as a CSU visitor/concurrent student.
5. Repeat and Cancel may be used for no more than 18 semester units taken at CSU Dominguez Hills.
6. Repeat and Cancel may be used only on grades of U, D or F.

## RESIDENCE CREDIT REQUIREMENT

### Undergraduate

Students must earn the equivalent of 30 semester units of credit through DON to meet residence requirements for a bachelor's degree. At least 18 semester units must be in the integrated nursing courses and 24 semester units must be upper division level courses.

### Graduate

21 semester units of work must be completed in residence through the DON.

### Extension Credit

The maximum credit that may be taken in extension and used toward degree requirements is 24 semester (36 quarter) units at the undergraduate level and 9 semester (13 quarter) units at the graduate level. Resident extension units do not satisfy residence requirements for a degree.

### Definition of courses that meet the residence credit requirement:

- Any regularly scheduled CSUDH/DON course taken after admission.
- A minimum of 30 semester units must be completed in residence at CSU Dominguez Hills, of which 24 shall be earned in upper division courses and 18 upper division units shall be in the major. When a minor is declared, at least one-half of all upper division units earned for the minor must be completed in residence at CSU Dominguez Hills.
- Extension credit or credit by examination (e.g. CLEP, ACT) may not be used to fulfill the minimum residence requirement.
- Credit received in summer Extended Education session or January Session at CSU Dominguez Hills may be counted as residence credit.
- HUX courses may not be used as residence credit.

## MAINTAINING CONTINUING STUDENT STATUS FOR UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATES

### Procedure

Students may elect to be absent for one semester without losing eligibility for re-registration, subject to the following conditions:

1. A permit to register will not be released to students who were scholastically disqualified following their most recent semester of attendance at CSU Dominguez Hills.
2. Students who attend another college or university during an absence from CSU Dominguez Hills must file a Leave of Absence form if they will be absent for more than one term from DON. The Leave of Absence Form must be on file prior to the beginning of the term (see CSUDH catalog for specific requirements).

## PLANNED EDUCATIONAL LEAVE OF ABSENCE

A Planned Educational Leave of Absence is defined as a planned interruption or temporary cessation of a student's formal education in which the student voluntarily and temporarily ceases enrollment at CSU Dominguez Hills while pursuing other educationally related activities to enrich his/her academic program or to clarify educational goals. The leave may be used for any number of educationally related activities including travel, independent study, work study or attendance at another institution. The intent of the program is to make it possible for a student to suspend academic work, leave the campus and later resume studies with a minimum of procedural difficulty. Petitions are available from the Registrar, SNP Admissions and Records Office. **A petition for Leave of Absence must be on file prior to the beginning date of the leave.** A leave of absence may be requested for up to four semesters.

### Eligibility

Any registered student, undergraduate or graduate or classified student, in good academic standing, is eligible for the Planned Student Leave Program. Unclassified Post-baccalaureate (PHN) students may not apply for Leave of Absence.

### Application Procedure

1. A registered student may request an educational leave. The petition shall include an explanation of the student's reasons for seeking an educational leave and when he/she intends to resume academic work.
2. The request shall be initiated by the student and reviewed by the Office of Registrar. If the request is approved, the registrar shall take steps to insure the student's re-entry and retention of registration priority, and the appropriate entry in the student's academic record.
3. The request shall be approved only after contractual agreements (e.g., financial aide) have been satisfactorily terminated or renegotiated.
4. A registered student may file a petition for a Planned Educational Leave at any time; however, the leave must commence at the beginning of the following semester.



5. Permission for a Planned Educational Leave must be requested and approved in advance of the term the leave is to begin. A leave will not be granted retroactively.
6. Students whose planned leaves will take them out of California are advised to consult the Office of the Registrar regarding residence requirements.

## ACADEMIC PROBATION - Undergraduate

Any undergraduate student whose cumulative or CSU Dominguez Hills GPA falls below 2.0 is subject to academic probation and is so advised following the end of that term. A student shall be removed from academic probation when the cumulative and CSU Dominguez Hills GPA is 2.0 or higher, in the next term.

Students on probation must seek advisement and clear the grade point deficiency within one term after notification of the probation or be subject to academic disqualification. A student who is disqualified after having registered will be disenrolled. A student placed on academic disqualification must seek advisement and may not enroll until the grade point deficiency is removed.

## STUDENT HANDBOOK EXCERPTS

## THE CLASSROOM

The University does not discriminate on the basis of sex, disability, race or color.

### Rights and Responsibilities

1. Students are entitled to instructors who refrain from acts or conditions listed in Section 24306 of the Education Code, e.g., unprofessional or immoral conduct, dishonesty, incompetence, etc. Such acts or conditions may cause the University to take disciplinary action against the instructor.
2. The individual instructor controls the order and direction of a class and the scope and treatment of the subject matter, and the class must be free of distraction or disruption. Each stu-

dent must respect the rights of others in the maintenance of classroom order and in the observance of basic courtesy. A student may be ordered to leave a class for cheating or when his/her behavior obstructs the regular activity of the class. The instructor may not officially disenroll a student for a course or discipline without following the student disciplinary procedures.

## Plagiarism

At the heart of any university are its efforts to encourage critical reading skills, effective communication, and above all, intellectual honesty among its students. Thus, all academic work submitted by a student as his or her own should be his or her own unique style, words, and form. When work is submitted that appears to be original, but actually is not, the student has committed plagiarism.

Plagiarism is considered a gross violation of the University's academic and disciplinary standards. Plagiarism includes the following: copying of one person's work by another and claiming it as his or her own, false presentation of oneself as the author or creator of work, falsely taking credit for another person's unique method of treatment or expression, falsely representing one's self as the source of ideas or expression, or the presentation of someone else's language, ideas or works without giving that person due credit. It is not limited to written works. For example, one can plagiarize music composition, photographs, works of art, choreography, computer programs, or any other unique creative effort.

Plagiarism is cause for formal University discipline and is justification for an instructor to assign a lower grade or failing grade in the course in which the plagiarism is committed. In addition, the University may impose its own disciplinary measures.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

#### FOR BACHELOR'S DEGREE UNDERGRADUATE TRANSFER STUDENTS

You will qualify for admission as a transfer student if you have a grade point average of 2.0 (C) or better in all transferable units attempted, and are in good standing at the last college or university attended. Non-residents must have a 2.4 grade point average or better. Current RN licensure or interim permit is required for enrollment in degree objective. Interim permit allows enrollment in first term only in BSN 310 and support courses only. RN license is required for second term.

1. You will meet the freshman admission requirements in effect for the term in which you are applying:
  - a. High school graduates and/or in continuous attendance in an accredited college.
  - b. Have a qualifiable eligibility index for an American College Test (ACT) score or Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).
  - c. Have a "C" or better in the courses of college preparatory subject requirements.
2. Students with an RN license number and less than 56 transferable semester units who must establish eligibility according to these first-time freshman requirements, may be considered for admission through the Undergraduate Preparatory Program (UPP). (See UPP section.)
3. Students who have completed at least 56 transferable semester (84 quarter) units and have made up any missing college preparatory subject requirements in English, Speech, Critical Thinking, and Math.

For this section, transferable courses are those designated for that purpose by the college or university offering the courses.

#### MAKING UP MISSING COLLEGE PREPARATORY SUBJECT REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate applicants who did not complete the subject requirements while in high school may make up missing subjects by any of the following methods:

1. Complete appropriate courses with a "C" or better in adult school or high school summer sessions.
2. Complete appropriate college courses with a "C" or better.
3. Earn acceptable scores on specified examinations.
4. 1987 or earlier high school graduates with 56 or more semester units may complete with a "C" or better in each course for the CSU general education requirements in communication in English language (at least 9 semester units) and mathematics (usually 3 semester units).

Diploma School Graduates see Undergraduate Preparatory Program.

#### THE MAXIMUM TRANSFERABLE CREDIT FROM A TWO YEAR COLLEGE IS 70 SEMESTER UNITS.

#### FOR THE MASTER'S DEGREE/QA CERTIFICATE

- Completion of bachelor's degree in nursing from an accredited institution.
- A grade point average of 3.0 or higher in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted indicated on official transcripts.
- In good standing at the last institution attended.
- Non-BSN baccalaureate see MSN Pathway.
- Please note that lower division courses and extension courses completed after the bachelor's degree will be excluded for the GPA calculation. Upper division coursework taken through Open University will be included in the GPA calculation.

#### For the Public Health Nursing (PHN) Certificate Program

- See PHN page for information.

### APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

To apply for admission:

- Request an admissions packet from Division of Nursing, Central Office at 310/516-3596 or 800/344-5484.
- At least two weeks before desired classes begin, BSN 310 or MSN 500 & any additional desired courses begin, complete CSU Admission Application and send with registration. Order text books and course materials from bookstore.
- Admission package and process are the same for Master's degree (see above).
- Send all materials to DON Admissions and Records Office with a \$55.00 check or money order (this fee is non-refundable).



- Contact all the college(s) and/or university(s) you have attended in the past and have official transcripts sent to the DON Admissions and Records Office. Two (2) official copies of transcripts are required for Graduate students. For transcripts to be considered official, they must be received directly from the institution in a sealed envelope.

(It is also recommended that you have an additional set of transcripts sent to you for your personal portfolio for use by you and your advisor in developing a Program of Study.)

### APPLICATION FILING

Admission applications must be submitted the same time as registration for the first course. Having submitted the application, the students must register for courses during the term for which they have applied while waiting for notice of formal admission. **Students may not continue to register for classes in subsequent terms unless their admission status has been validated.**

### ADMISSION VALIDATION

In order to validate your admission status, all application materials must be in the DON Admissions and Records Office one month prior to the end of the term for which you are applying. Failure to file complete, accurate and authentic application documents may result in denial of admission, cancellation of academic credit, suspension or expulsion (Section 41301, Article 1.1, Title 5, California Administrative Code). Students will receive notification of admission status from the DON Admission and Records Office.

Admissions applications are processed as they are received by the Admissions and Records Office. Apply as soon as possible to facilitate transcript evaluation procedure.

\*All applications filed in November and April must be accompanied with a completed course registration form for the current term. Please note that an application for admission is valid for only one term. If all materials are not received by the prescribed deadlines, the application will be inactivated and students will need to re-apply for admission. Late application fee of \$10 will be assessed for applications received after the deadline date. Also a missed deadline fee of \$10 will be assessed for materials received after deadline date.

### DETERMINATION OF RESIDENCY STATUS

The general rule is that a student must have been a California resident for at least one year immediately preceding the residence determination date in order to qualify as a "resident student" for tuition purposes. For students who have a green card, the date of resi-

dence begins with the date on the green card. A residence determination date is set for each academic term and is the date from which residence is determined for that term.

If you were admitted to CSU Dominguez Hills as a non-resident student you should be aware of the following:

Chapter 102 of the 1981 Statutes of California requires that the financial independence of a student must be considered when a non-resident student is requesting reclassification as a resident of California. If you are seeking reclassification as a resident, you are required to complete and file new residency forms with the Admissions Office. The completed forms will be reviewed and a determination made. If you are eligible for residency status, you will be informed and your registration will be changed to reflect your new status. The appropriate forms are available by calling the DON Admissions and Records Office at 310/516-4060. The residence questionnaire by which your status may be changed must be submitted to the Admissions Office at least two weeks prior to registration.

### UNDERGRADUATE PREPARATORY PROGRAM (UPP)

The UPP: Something special for diploma school graduates.

Since the Division of Nursing's BSN curriculum is at the upper division level, junior standing is required for admission to the major. The Undergraduate Preparatory Program is a pathway for students who have earned less than the required 56 college units:

1. At least 25 years of age.
2. High school diploma or transcript must be on file.
3. Not enrolled as a full-time student (12 units) or more than one academic term within the last 5 years. Must have 2.0 GPA.
4. Recommendation by the Assistant Chair/Coordinator indicating the basis for determining probability of equivalent academic success.
5. Make up missing college prep subject requirements.
6. Verification of taking and/or passing the EPT and ELM tests.
7. R.N. license number or interim permit number.

This program permits students to take in combination general education courses and/or prerequisites for the major through a community college, a CSU campus or other higher education institution. Students may also enroll for Division of Nursing support and introductory courses and assessment options, with the **exception of courses/tests offered at the upper division level in the major.** Upon completion of 56 units, the student will be admitted to the major, assuming other requirements for admission are met.

Coordinators are available to assist you with this option. Each Coordinator's telephone number is listed at the beginning of this class schedule.



# STUDENT SERVICES

## Admissions Information

### STUDENTS WITH FOREIGN DOCUMENTS

The initial evaluation of foreign transcripts may need to be evaluated by an international agency. Applications and all materials must be submitted prior to deadlines.

Deadline dates for applicants with foreign documents:

Spring, 1996 Term.....October 1, 1995  
Fall, 1996 Term.....April 2, 1996

If you have already applied for admission and have sent in your transcripts, we can make arrangements to forward your foreign transcripts to the recommended agency.

If you have sent your transcripts directly to a recommended agency, you need to also order original transcripts sent from your school to CSUDH, DON Admissions and Records.

Recommended agencies will provide:

1. Evaluation of high school level, post-secondary through graduation level, employment and skill re-certification.
2. Reconstruction of education studies.
3. Certified translation of documents.
4. Career development and counseling.
5. Authenticity verification.

There is a fee of \$50-\$150 depending upon the complexity of the evaluation. The evaluation fee covers subject breakdown, equivalence statements, detailed analysis and a narrative evaluation if needed. This includes one original evaluation sent to the designated agency or institution and one copy to the applicant.

The DON Admissions and Records Office will evaluate the transfer units allowed as well as the general education breadth require-

ments from the original analysis of the international evaluation service. The DON Office of Admissions and Records has final authority of approving the transferability of credit. Please refer to:

### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International students are required to have a 2.4 GPA on all units attempted in college.

### TOEFL

All students, regardless of citizenship, who have not attended school at the secondary level for at least 3 years full-time or beyond where English is the principle language of instruction, are required to earn a minimum score of 550 on the Test Of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). This is considered an admissions requirement and must be completed within the first semester.

### SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

Applicants are required to include their Social Security account number in designated places on applications for admission and registration form pursuant to the authority contained in Title 5, California Administrative Code, Section 41201. The Social Security account number is used as a means of identifying records pertaining to the student as well as identifying the student for purposes of financial aid eligibility and disbursement and the repayment of financial aid and other debts payable to the institution.



### FINANCIAL AID

The purpose of financial aid is to assist eligible students in meeting educational costs while attending the university. Because of limited federal, state, and institutional funding, financial aid is awarded to those students who show an exceptional need based on a nationally accepted methodology.

All financial aid at Dominguez Hills is administered in accordance with policies and a philosophy which has been established nationally, that the student and his/her family have the primary responsibility to meet college attendance costs. Financial aid is provided only to fill the gap between the student/family contribution and total educational expenses.

### TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID

There are many types of financial aid available at Dominguez Hills. The Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or renewal serves as an application for the following programs:

- Federal Pell Grant
- Cal Grant A and Cal Grant B
- Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)
- State University Grant (SUG)
- Federal Perkins Loan Program (Perkins Loan, formerly NDSL)
- State Graduate Fellowship
- Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)
- Federal Direct Loan Program (Formerly the Federal Stafford Loan)
- University Administered Scholarships (Requires additional application available from the Financial Aid Office)

To receive federal financial aid, a student must be a U.S. citizen or be in the United States for other than a temporary purpose (i.e. permanent resident).

### FEDERAL DIRECT LOAN PROGRAM (formerly the Federal Stafford Loan)

1. Students who are interested in applying for a Federal Direct Loan (Subsidized and/or Unsubsidized) must complete and submit the FAFSA. Students are required to attend a Loan Counseling Interview session each school year. Contact the Financial Aid Office for the dates, times and location of these sessions.

Both subsidized and unsubsidized loans have the same terms and conditions, except unsubsidized borrowers are responsible for interest that accrues during all in-school, grace and

deferment periods. The interest rate is a variable rate based on the 91-day T-bill plus 3.1% capped at 8.25%.

2. The FAFSA serves as a students' initial application and must be submitted to a Processor (ACT, CSS, or the Federal Processor). Students will be contacted by mail if additional documents are required and will be given 15 days to respond to any requests made by the Financial Aid Office. If applying for Cal Grant A, B and the State Graduate Fellowship for the first time, the application deadline is March 2. In addition to the FAFSA, new applicants are required to submit a GPA Verification Form to the California Student Aid Commission.
3. The Financial Aid Office will review application and send an Award Letter to the student. Detailed information will be provided in this letter about the types and amounts of financial aid a student has been awarded. Students are required to accept or decline the offer and return the Award letter within 15 days to the Financial Aid Office.
4. File a FAFSA. This may take up to six weeks so plan accordingly. The loan application cannot be certified until the FAFSA and additional supporting documentation as required by the Financial Aid Office are received (i.e. Federal tax returns, Financial Aid transcripts). You will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). Please keep it for your records.
5. Attend a Loan Counseling Entrance Interview

Before your loan application is processed, you are required to attend an entrance interview session. Contact the financial aid office for the dates, times and location of these sessions. All fees are expected to be paid at the time due, regardless of your loan application status.

### DEADLINES

#### MARCH 2

Date for the FAFSA to be received by the Processor (ACT, CSS, or the Federal Processor). This is a yearly deadline for receiving aid in September of the same year.

New Cal Grant A and B and Graduate Fellowship application deadline. The FAFSA must be sent by this date. New applicants must include verification of Grade Point Average.

### RESPONSIBILITIES OF STUDENTS RECEIVING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

1. All Financial Aid recipients agree to carry and complete the number of units specified each term showing at least half-time status, report graduation or withdrawal, and notify the Financial Aid Office of any changes in this financial status, marital status, or unit load.

2. Students must use the funds only to meet education costs. Any other use of the funds is prohibited by law.
3. Satisfactory academic progress must be maintained. A student is considered to be in good standing and maintain satisfactory progress when enrolled in and successfully completing at least a half-time credit hour load.

### VETERANS CERTIFICATION

New students who are veterans should be approved by the Veterans Administration to receive benefits and should obtain from 1995 (Change of Institution Form) or from 1990 (Veteran's Application for VA Benefits Form) from the VA, the Campus Veterans Office, VA Hospital, or other appropriate agency.

The student should request a Certification of Enrollment Form (Form 1999) from the DON Admissions and Records Office. Forms should be completed and submitted to the Admissions and Records Of-

ice. Admissions and Records Office will then submit all forms to the appropriate office. (Processing Fee \$4.00)

The student must notify the Admissions and Records Office at once upon withdrawal from a course or upon adding the course.

**Concurrent Enrollment:** If a student attends another school at the same time, a VA form must be sent from the other school to the Admissions and Records Office verifying the enrollment.

Prior to each term, new and continuing students should contact the DON Admission and Records Office indicating the courses to be taken that term. In addition, students applying for VA benefits for the Fall and Spring terms should estimate the number of units to be taken in Spring. Summer benefits must be applied for separately. Any other questions regarding the VA benefits should be directed to DON Admissions and Records Office.

### DON ADVANCED TOUCHTONE REGISTRATION: OCTOBER 23 THROUGH NOVEMBER 17, 1995

This period of touchtone registration is restricted to continuing students and new students who apply for admission to the campus program at least 21 days prior to their touchtone registration date. Allow three weeks for application processing before touchtone registration.

CONTINUING STUDENTS: OCTOBER 23 THROUGH NOVEMBER 17 AND NEW STUDENTS WHO APPLY PRIOR TO OCTOBER 10: NOVEMBER 6 THROUGH NOVEMBER 17.

Be sure to check your registration access mailer for your priority registration time according to your student level. If you have missed your time slot, you may call any day up to November 17. Consult your access mailer for registration times and dates. For best course selection, you should register on the priority access date printed on your registration access mailer.

Registration access, appointment dates and times are determined by class level and units earned. Units taken at another institution since admissions to CSUDH may not be included. A PIN# is required and is noted on the mailer or letter.

BE SURE THAT YOU HAVE CLEARED ANY HOLDS PRIOR TO TOUCHTONE REGISTRATION SUCH AS FINANCIAL HOLDS, ASAP, ELM/EPT, ADMISSIONS DOCUMENT, AND ACADEMIC PROBATION.

### REGULAR REGISTRATION

### LATE REGISTRATION

ADD/DROP PERIOD: JANUARY 2 THROUGH MAY 15, 1996.

Complete the form(s) in this class schedule and mail appropriate form(s) to DON Admissions and Records Office.

Select the appropriate form in the class schedule. Assistant Chairs/Coordinators approval must be obtained prior to late registration. FOR LATE REGISTRATION there will be a fee of \$25. There will be a fee of \$10 for LATE ADD/DROPS.

### ADD/DROP OR WITHDRAW FROM SCHOOL:

- Students must file an add/drop form 20 days prior to the start day of the class.
- A drop will be considered late if filed after 15 days prior to first class and a \$10 late fee will be charged.
- Students who need to drop all classes and totally withdraw from the University must file a drop form and indicate the withdrawal. THE REFUND WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY PROCESSED according to the number of units officially dropped.
- A refund will not be granted if the student attended even one class session.

### OTHER INFORMATION

#### Concurrent Visitor Enrollment Students:

Students from other CSU campuses wishing to enroll concurrently or as a visitor at CSUDH should consult the home campus class schedule and contact the Registrar's Office for procedures and deadlines. Mail in process only: November 18 - December 22, 1995.

#### Enrollment Limit:

A student may enroll in a maximum of 18 units during touchtone registration. Students wishing to register in additional units must wait until the Late Registration-Add/Drop period and must obtain the approval of the Dean, School of Health.

#### Open University:

Students should consult the class schedule, complete the form and mail with payment to the Undergraduate Chair at the address noted on the form.

#### Registration Access Mailer:

New students/returning who apply after October 10 may not get an access mailer and must register manually.

### Touchtone:

You may register from any touchtone phone, however, some telephone functions may prevent access to the Touchtone system. Touchtone phones make a tone sound every time a button is pressed. If the touchtone system is not available, you will get a busy signal, please try again. Made a mistake? Wait for the voice response system to guide you.

- A recorded voice will guide you through the process and will state your courses.
- Your registration is not complete until you confirm the courses.
- You will receive a billing statement. **However, even if you do not receive a bill, it is your responsibility to make payment by the due date (see Fee Requirements).** Late payments will be assessed a \$10 late fee and may result in disenrollment from classes.
- You will receive a schedule confirmation form within a couple of weeks after the Touchtone registration period is over. This information will include all course registration information. Check your confirmation carefully and make adjustments if necessary.

### Authorization from Faculty/Department

- Authorization allows you to compete for an available seat. If the class is full, you will need to seek approval from the Assistant Chair/Coordinator in your area by using an add/drop form.
- Authorization may release a hold on your record allowing you to register via Touchtone telephone system. Note any holds indicated on your access mailer.

### REGULAR AND LATE (MANUAL) REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS NOVEMBER 18-DECEMBER 1, 1996

Under state support, decisions to offer or cancel classes are based on the numbers of students enrolled in a particular location. All continuing students are required to pay the semester fee and submit a course request form for all courses they plan to take that term, prior to the beginning of the term. **New students Spring 1996** may register and pay the semester fees as soon as an application for admission is received in the Admissions and Records Office.

#### Registration Process - Spring 1996 Continuing/New Students.

1. Complete the registration form. Be sure to include the correct schedule number, course number and title, time and location for each course/module you plan to take either by coursework or by challenge/assessment. Attach check or payment by charge card to Registration Form. Mail at least 2 weeks days before the start date of a class.
2. Classes not paid for will not be recorded on your transcript. You may not register for a subsequent semester if there are any outstanding University fees.
3. Make your check payable to CSU Dominguez Hills. Include your charge card number and expiration date if you use VISA or MasterCard. Fees are not considered paid until you check has cleared the bank. **If fees are not attached to registration form, the registration will be returned unprocessed and you will not be enrolled.**
4. If your fees are being paid by a sponsoring agency or company which prefers to pay the CSU fees directly, you must secure a purchase order from the sponsor. The purchase order must be complete and accurate and addressed to the Division of nursing, CSU Dominguez Hills. Submit the purchase order at the same time that you register for classes.
5. All Spring 1996 late registrations for continuing students must be postmarked by May 15, 1996.
6. You may not attend a class without submitting the Registration Form and Fees ahead of time. You may not late register for a unit or begin a class after the first class meeting has occurred.
7. Class size is limited. Seats go to eligible students as registrations are received.
8. Late registration for continuing students must be approved in writing by an Assistant Chair. Include \$25.00 late registration fee.
9. New students may register until May 15, 1996. There is no \$25 late registration fee. Attach the check or payment by charge card to the registration form.

### ADD-DROP PROCESS SPRING 1996 JANUARY 2-MAY 15, 1996

If it is necessary to deviate from your original registration plan, **you may add or drop a course. The add or drop must be on file in the DON Admissions and Records Office at least 15 working days prior to the first class session to reserve a seat in class.** There will be a late fee of \$10 for each add/drop form if the deadline of 15 working days prior to the first class session is not met. (The late fee will not apply to administrative adds or drops).

Mail in the add/drop form to the DON Admissions and Records Office **15 working days prior to the first session.** Postmark dates will be honored.

**If DON cancels a class, the student will be dropped automatically.**

**YOUR REGISTRATION FEES FOR THE SPRING 1996 TERM MUST ACCOMPANY YOUR REQUEST TO ADD A CLASSE(S).**

#### LATE ADDS/DROPS

1. Students who do not meet the deadline for 15 working days: May add or drop the class only with the Assistant Chair's permission. **NOTE: THERE MAY NOT BE SEATING AVAILABILITY.**
2. You may **NOT ADD A CLASS AFTER THE FIRST CLASS SESSION HAS STARTED.**
3. **You must submit the Add/Drop form immediately after the first class session in order to have your name listed or officially dropped on the final grade roster. Assistant Chair's signature required.**
4. Your registration fees for the Spring 1996 term must be paid in order to add a class.

**Penalty - If you do not send in the Add/Drop form, you will receive an unauthorized withdrawal - "U" - on your transcript. This form must be received 15 days prior to the first class session.**

#### Refund Policy

- All refunds are made in accordance with Title V of the California administrative code.
- Not all fees are refundable.
- Refunds are automatically processed provided a completed drop form is received within fourteen (14) days after the first class session and the student did not attend even one class session.
- Last day to drop a class and request a refund of fees paid is fourteen (14) days after the first class session.
- A \$10.00 fee is retained by the University to cover processing and non-refundable portion of the State University Fee.

**If a student completes even a portion of one unit, a refund or portion of refund of CSU fees is not possible.**

## Regular and Late Registration and Fees

### FEE REQUIREMENTS

All students pay registration fees. Students auditing classes pay the same fees as students registered for credit. Nonresident tuition and/or duplicate degree tuition may also be assessed. All fees are subject to change based upon further action by the Board of Trustees of the California State University and the California Legislature.

### PAYMENT DUE DATES

Touchtone (Advance) Registration (10/23/95 - 11/17/95) - Fees will be billed and are due December 21, 1995. Even if students do not receive a bill, it is their responsibility to make payment by the due date. See Methods of Payment for a detail of approved payment plans.

Regular (Manual) Registration (11/18/95-12/22/95) - Payment of fees must be submitted with your registration. See Methods of Payment for a detail of approved payment plans. Registrations that do not include payment by an approved payment plan will be returned unprocessed, and you will not be enrolled. Payment Deadline is February 9, 1996.

Late (Manual) Registration (01/02/96- 05/15/96) - Payment of fees must be submitted with your registration. See Methods of Payment for a detail of approved payment plans. Registrations that do not include payment by an approved payment plan will be returned unprocessed, and you will not be enrolled.

### METHODS OF PAYMENT

Fees can be paid by cash, check, money order, Visa, or MasterCard. An Installment Payment Plan is available for the State University Fee. A description of the plan is presented in the State University Fee Installment Payment Plan section of this schedule.

Forms for credit card payments and for the Installment Payment Plan are included in this schedule. These forms are also available at the Cashier's Office (SCC B-135) and are included with your billing statement (For Touchtone registration only).

### DUPLICATE DEGREE TUITION

Effective with the Fall 1993 semester, Chapter 705, Statutes of 1992 requires the campus to charge duplicate degree tuition to any student who has earned a degree equivalent to or higher than the degree awarded by the program in which the student is enrolled. This includes Public Health Nurse Certification.

# GENERAL EDUCATION (G.E.) REQUIREMENTS

## G.E. Pattern of Statutory Courses

### CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY GENERAL EDUCATION (G.E.) REQUIREMENTS

Each candidate for a baccalaureate degree must complete general education coursework as prescribed by the Board of Trustees in Title 5 of the Administrative Code, Section 40405 through 40405.4. **The program consists of 48 semester units of course approved for this purpose, including nine semester units taken during the junior and senior years and approved as upper division G.E. courses. At least nine of the required 48 units must be completed in residence.**

Since the Division of Nursing offers primarily upper division and graduate courses, most general education work will be completed prior to enrollment in the program or by referral to another institution after matriculation. A student may satisfy the General Education requirements in any one or a combination of the following ways:

#### Prior to matriculation:

- Completion of courses or examinations that are approved as meeting particular requirements by CSU campuses, California community colleges, or other participating campuses.
- Completion of courses at other institutions determined to meet particular requirements.

#### After matriculation:

- Completion of approved courses taken at a regionally accredited college or university (students should consult with their advisor for information on the course substitution process prior to enrolling in any course which is intended to satisfy a General Education requirement.)
- Completion of designated courses or examinations approved for General Education purposes (contact local advisor for courses.)

### REQUIRED PATTERN OF STATUTORY COURSES

#### A. Communication in English (9 semester units)

1. Oral communication - an introductory course in speech.
2. Written communication - a standard course in freshman composition.
3. Critical thinking - a course in logic, argumentation, or critical thinking.

#### B. Science and Mathematics (12 semester units)

1. A general introductory course in astronomy, chemistry, geology, physical science, or physics.\*
2. A general introductory course in biology, botany, or zoology.\* At least one course in either category 1 or 2 must include a laboratory; however, it is recommended that two laboratory courses be taken.
3. A mathematics, or other quantitative course equivalent to advanced algebra (higher level than intermediate algebra). This course should have a prerequisite of at least two years of college preparatory mathematics. The ELM requirement must be met or exemption attained.

#### C. Humanities (12 semester units)

Choose courses from two or more of the following areas: art, drama, language, literature, music, and philosophy. No more than six semester units may be activity or performance courses.

#### D. Social and Behavioral Sciences (12 semester units)

Choose courses from two or more of the following areas: anthropology, economics, geography, history, political science, psychology, and sociology. Certain courses which meet these requirements may also be applied to the requirements described in statutory requirements.

#### E. Whole Person (3 units) (Lifelong Understanding).

#### F. Upper division

May be satisfied with BSN prerequisites.

#### G. Cultural Pluralism (Course covers non Western civilization)

A course dealing with ethnic or other minorities in America is highly recommended.

#### Statutory Requirements

Requirement in U.S. History, U. S. Constitution and California State and Local Government. Title 5, California Administrative Code, Section 40404, requires that each student demonstrate competency in these areas to qualify for graduation. Students who have not met these requirements at the time of admission may do so by completing appropriate courses or by passing comprehensive examinations prepared and administered by most CSU campuses. Courses used to meet this requirement may also be applied to the requirements in section D.

**Students who began undergraduate study in September, 1981 or thereafter are responsible for meeting these requirements. Students enrolling for an additional bachelor's degree must meet any difference between these and any previous requirements that may have been completed.**

The initial general education evaluation cost will be included in the admission application fee of \$55. For additional transcript evaluation updates, a fee of \$5 will be charged per transcript revision.

# ELM COMPLETION PROCEDURE

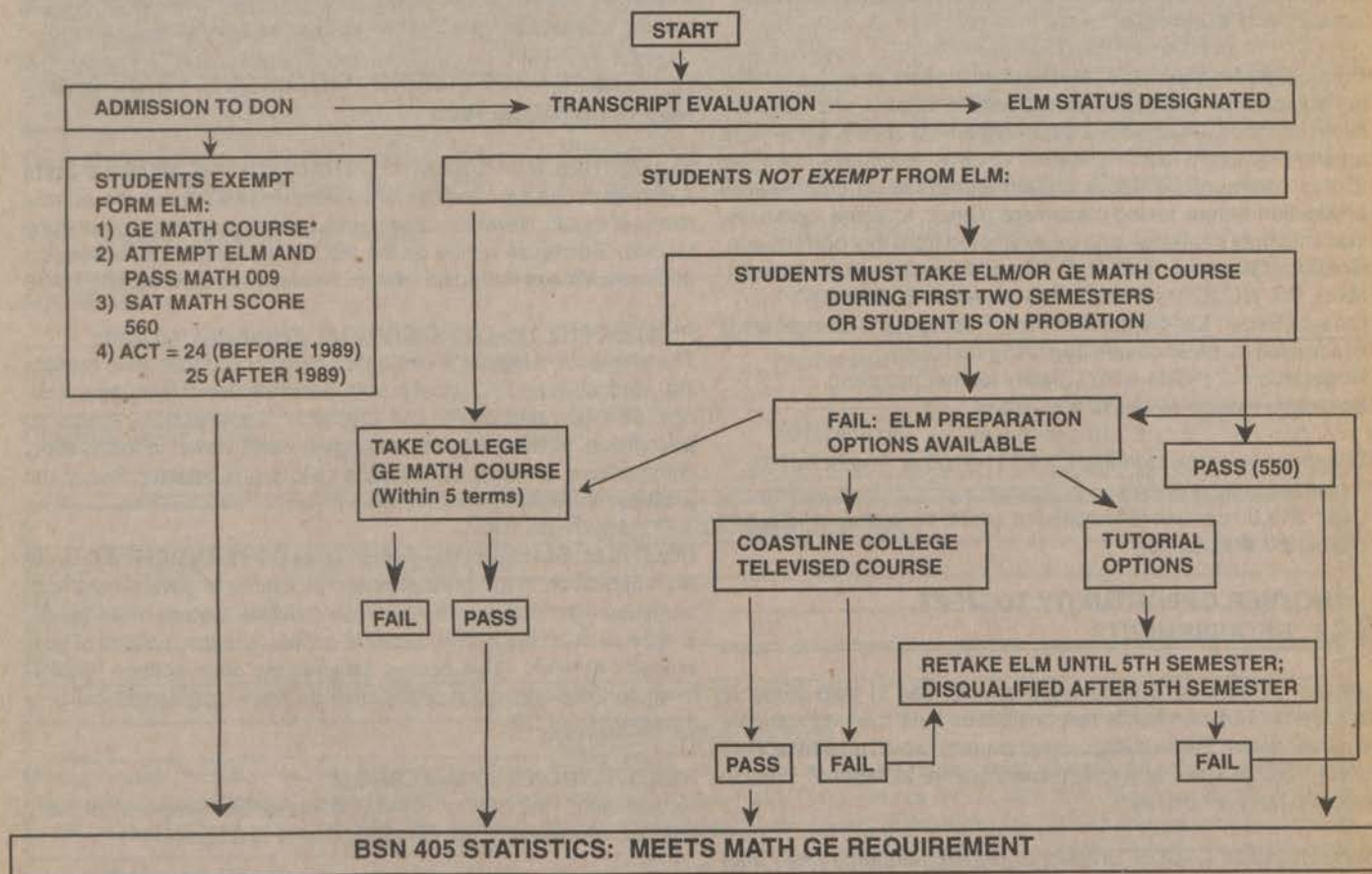
Flow Chart

The California State University and CSU Dominguez Hills recognize each student's need for adequate preparation in mathematics for successful continuation and completion of his/her college education. The CSU requires all freshmen and those transfer students who have not completed appropriate college courses to demonstrate entry level mathematics skills through passing of the ELM (Entry Level Mathematics) test. This test is prerequisite to enrolling in courses designated as meeting the General Education mathematics requirement. All new and readmitted undergraduate nursing students will be expected to meet the requirements unless exempted (See your official transcript evaluation). **The ELM must be taken soon after receiving the evaluation of your transcript, or upon application to the program if you have never taken a college level math course which satisfied the General Education requirement in mathematics of quantitative reasoning.** This time frame accommodates students who are unsure of their basic

mathematics skills, or poorly prepared, allowing time to review and take advantage of various learning materials. If you do not pass the ELM, you may still register for courses other than G.E. math (BSN 405). Students will not be allowed to register for a third term if they have not taken the ELM unless Advisor's approval is obtained. The ELM requirement must be met by the fifth semester or you will be disqualified.

If you do not pass the ELM, you have several options:

- Take the Coastline College televised course.
- Use the ELM video tapes and viewer guide located in all DON Learning Resource Centers.
- Use other self-study tutorial materials available in the bookstore.
- Take an approved college course(s) to exempt you from ELM (call your coordinator for a list of proper courses).

# OFF CAMPUS OPPORTUNITIES—COASTLINE COLLEGE

## Opportunity to Meet ELM and G.E. Requirements

### ANOTHER OPPORTUNITY TO MEET ELM REQUIREMENT

The following course is offered by Coastline College and is recognized by the CSU as a GE Math Course. Upon successful completion, a student has met the ELM requirement.

This course is broadcast locally only and is available three hours per week. If it is not available on TV, tapes must be ordered at a cost of approximately \$60. No refunds.

**MATHEMATICS 100—MATH FUNDAMENTAL CONCEPTS 3.0 units.** An introduction to the nature of modern mathematics for liberal arts students. History of mathematics, introduction to the axiomatic method and the nature of proof, relations and functions; a discussion of the real number system with applications, computers and calculators; metric measurement; geometry; probability; statistics and graphing. The emphasis is not on the development of computational skills but on the nature of mathematics and its structure.

- Prerequisite for Math 100: Intermediate Algebra or earn a qualifying score on the Math Placement Test. Students who have not taken intermediate algebra or passed the ELM are advised to take a math placement test at Coastline or other community colleges. (Some community colleges require individuals to complete an application before taking placement tests.) In some instances, students may challenge and be exempted from this prerequisite.
  - Grading: Graded A, B, C, D, F. (D and F grades are not transferable), CR, NC (CR work equals to grades A, B, C only.)
  - Classes Begin: Mid-September, early February and an eight week condensed summer course beginning mid-June.

### ANOTHER OPPORTUNITY TO MEET G.E. REQUIREMENTS

Coastline Community College offers telecourses to help students with full-time jobs and family responsibilities fulfill their educational and career goals. These college-credit courses, which present course content through video and text, allow students to "attend" class in the comfort of their homes.

Several hundred CSUDH Division of Nursing students have successfully completed Coastline's Math 100 telecourse, thereby satisfying CSU's Entry Level Math Test requirement. Due to tremendous response to this offering, Coastline has expanded the program to "distance learners" to include more telecourses. Nearly thirty other telecourses are available every semester that fulfill general education requirements in critical thinking, U.S. History, the U.S. Constitution and state and local government, humanities, social sciences, mathematical reasoning, physical and biological sciences, and life-long understanding.

### BEFORE YOU BEGIN...

You may wish to check with the local community college in your area to see if it is offering similar telecourses which may be more convenient for you.

Remember that a maximum of 70 units of community college coursework is transferable to the CSU.

Be aware that you will do the same amount of work in the telecourse as you would in a comparable course in the classroom. We suggest taking ONE telecourse per semester.

Telecourses have specific due dates for submitting assignments by mail and taking examinations.

Each telecourse has a qualified instructor. Students can contact their instructor by phone, during weekly office hours, by FAX or by leaving a message on a 24-hour answering machine.

## Assessment Options

### ASSESSMENT OPTION

The Statewide Nursing Program recognizes that many students have knowledge and skills learned by means other than a transferable college credit course. Students may earn academic credit by demonstrating their knowledge through specified written or performance examinations.

### NURSING WRITTEN EXAMINATIONS

You may earn academic credit for the following theory course modules by successfully passing written examinations offered by the American College Testing Service (ACT) through its Proficiency Examination Program (PEP).

As a convenience to DON students, four CSU Dominguez Hills tests meeting CSU graduation requirements will be offered one time during each semester at selected locations in California:

- CSU Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement Exam (GWAR)
- California State and Local Government Exam
- Political Science 101
- United States History Exam

CSU Dominguez Hills Department of History and Political Science has developed a comprehensive exam in **American or U.S. Constitution and/or California State & Local Government**. You may take these exams either to receive certification of having met the State requirements or to receive certification and three units of credit for challenging the courses HIS 101 or POL 101. The exam must be taken in the first week of the term if unit credit is desired. Certification exams (no unit credit) may be scheduled throughout the term. Conscientious preparation is highly recommended. You must

complete the **Petition for Credit by Examination** in this class schedule (see Table of Contents), and attach it to the registration form with fee payment. Texts are listed on DON Book order Form. **LAST DATE TO ADD/DROP REGULAR CAMPUS COURSES FOR CREDIT IS FEBRUARY 2, 1996.**

Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement Exam (GWAR)

To meet the CSU writing requirement, you may take the approved writing test (GWAR) through CSUDH and also through most CSU campus testing centers or you may take coursework specified by the offering CSU campuses as meeting the writing requirement. Undergraduate students should complete this requirement during their junior year. Graduate students must achieve a passing score on the GWAR prior to beginning MSN 500.

CSUDH Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement examination consists of an essay exam with one hour allowed for completion. The test is graded by CSUDH faculty and you will receive notice of your results before the campus course drop date in case of failure.

Early registration is advised. A confirmation and test preparation materials will be sent to you.

Bring 25 cents cash for purchasing bluebook. Also bring a #2 pencil and two pens.

#### Credit/No Credit Policy

An Undergraduate student may elect to be graded CR/NC in particular courses, subject to the following conditions:

#### Course Limitations

1. Courses used to satisfy a major (both upper and lower division), or which are prerequisite to it, must be taken for a letter grade except when such courses are graded solely on a CR/NC basis. A student may enroll in up to 50% of the units required by a minor on a credit/no credit basis, unless otherwise specified elsewhere in the catalog under specific requirements for a minor.
2. No more than 24 units graded CR/NC whether taken at this or another institution, may be offered in satisfaction of the total units required for a bachelor's degree. If 24 units graded CR/NC are accepted in transfer, no additional courses graded CR/NC may be used to satisfy degree requirements, except when a required course is graded solely on a CR/NC basis. (All credits earned in the CLEP testing program may count even if they make cumulative total of all CR/NC units at that time over 24.)

## THE STATEWIDE NURSING PROGRAM IS NATIONAL

Since there are many RNs in the rural and urban United States, as in California, who cannot advance their education and practice due to life-style and geographic constraints, the Division of Nursing has expanded its program nationally. Making higher education accessible to all registered nurses is possible through an affiliation with Mind Extension University (ME/U), an agency which contracts with accredited universities across the nation to offer courses and degree programs through electronic media—satellite delivery, cablevision, computer conferencing/email, voice mail, and video tape. Since the national nursing courses are the SNP courses delivered in California, it will be possible for California resident SNP students to meet all CSUDH nursing, GE and elective requirements through ME/U. The SNP student will be required to register and pay for courses offered through ME/U under another fee structure to receive credit for the televised and computer conferenced courses. Credit is awarded by CSU Dominguez Hills for televised nursing courses and will be granted only to students registered through ME/U. Other General Education and elective courses to meet degree requirements are available through ME/U.

The support courses are now available and eight or nine new BSN units will be scheduled and taped until the entire curriculum is available nationally in approximately two years. It is the Faculty's intention to make the master's degree available in the near future. A new class of baccalaureate students will be admitted starting each September, January and May. The nursing academic year will be year-round, offering courses by satellite and tape to the RN at home. A computer with modem will be necessary for communication with the instructor and with colleagues in the class as well as with advisors and administrators.

## THE MIND EXTENSION UNIVERSITY EDUCATION CENTER

The Mind Extension University Education Center links students, universities and the cable network, offering one-stop registration, advising, bookstore and support services. Registration and academic advisors are available by phone to offer you course and registration information. A toll-free phone call (1800-777-MIND) connects students with everything needed to pursue educational goals.

### ME/U DELIVERY OF CLASSES

Students receive ME/U courses on their cable systems as part of their basic service. If ME/U is unavailable on cable, alternatives include satellite dish on Galaxy V, Transponder 21. A tape rental service is also available to students.

A "missed tape service" is available at a fee to registered students who miss taping a lesson. Orders should be placed within 24 hours of the missed taping to ensure minimum delay in course work. To order, students call the toll-free number, 1-800-777-MIND.

Students in specified programs have the added value of ME/U Access. This is a voice-mail system that links the student with the professor and other students in the same class, either individually or as a group.

Nursing and certain other courses allow communication with other students and professors via a computer with a modem, for sending or receiving electronic mail and documents.

### ACADEMIC YEAR

**Non-Nursing Courses:** The ME/U academic year for courses other than nursing courses consists of three semesters: Fall, Spring and Summer. Some courses are offered every eight weeks in an accelerated format. Registration begins four to six weeks before the beginning of each semester.

**CSUDH Nursing Courses:** Nursing courses are offered throughout the year. Initial course begins early September, mid January and mid-May. Application may be submitted after attending first classes. Registration for classes begins six weeks prior to class, however, to get course materials in a timely manner, register at least two weeks ahead of class.

### PAYMENT AND COSTS

Payment of tuition, and fees for all required nursing and non-nursing course materials can be made by phone (1-800-777-MIND) or mail using Mastercard, VISA, Discover or American Express credit cards, money orders, personal checks or purchase order numbers. (Nursing courses offered nationally are registered only through ME/U). The following charges apply and are subject to change:

### WITHDRAWALS AND REFUNDS

Students may withdraw from a course before a specified deadline without impacting their academic records, and become eligible for a full or partial refund of tuition and fees. Withdrawal, refund dates and deadlines vary by university and are outlined in the course packet sent to each student after enrollment. Refunds are issued according to the date the withdrawal form is postmarked or faxed.

### REGISTRATION

Early registration helps to assure class placement and receipt of materials before the first cablecast class. For non-nursing courses the Fall semester covers September through December, the Spring semester mid-January through April. Registration opens August 1. Classes begin the week of September 3. Registration and payment of fees must be made by calling 1-800-777-MIND.

## NURSING\*

### BSN 310 EXPANDING PROFESSIONAL NURSING HORIZONS

CSU, Dominguez Hills 2 units  
Nursing Program \$199/unit  
Offered in May & Sept. \$ 25 one time registration fee\*\*

The increasing complexity and changes in professional nursing demand constant evaluation and planning for formal and informal education. This course presents a systematic problem-solving approach that will help nurses assess their own roles and options, establish career goals, and identify resources which can guide them on a path toward fulfilling their own personal and professional aspirations.

### BSN 315 LIFE CYCLE

CSU, Dominguez Hills 4 units  
Nursing Program \$199/unit  
\$ 25 one time registration fee\*\*

Concurrent enrollment with BSN 310. The course explores the biological, psychological, cognitive, and social aspects of human development throughout each stage of the life cycle. While the first three modules are organized around the growth of the individual within the context of the family, the fourth examines the developmental aspects of adults who are temporarily or permanently living an alternative lifestyle.

### BSN 325 CULTURE AND HEALTH

CSU, Dominguez Hills 4 units  
Nursing Program \$199/unit  
\$ 25 one time registration fee\*8

Concurrent enrollment with BSN 310. This course explores the relationship between the various components of a culture and the dynamics of health and illness. Basic anthropological concepts are used to interpret varying conceptions of health and illness and significant dimensions of cultural variations are analyzed in relationship to health attitudes. Basic tools for cross-cultural health studies are applied to specific problems in health. Human institutions and their connection to health and illness are examined from a cross-cultural perspective. Alternative health care delivery systems are compared and a transcultural approach to health care is presented.

### BSN 335 BIOCHEMISTRY

CSU, Dominguez Hills 4 units  
Nursing Program \$199/unit  
\$ 25 one time registration fee\*\*

Concurrent enrollment with BSN 310. This course explores the principles underlying the chemistry of living systems, including the molecular basis by which the human organism meets the vital needs of materials, energy and information. It provides an introduction to the chemistry of bioenergetics, metabolism, biosynthesis, and molecular physiology. By translating the unique language of biochemistry into understandable terms, this course will enable the health professional to apply the vocabulary and concepts of biochemistry to everyday practice.

### BSN 340 PROFESSIONAL RELATIONSHIPS IN NURSING PRACTICE

CSU, Dominguez Hills 3 units  
Nursing Program \$ 199/unit  
\$ 25 one time registration fee\*\*

*Prerequisite: BSN 310.* This course explores professional interaction including the significance of personal awareness, beliefs, and values. Communication theory and styles are defined and the essential elements of a therapeutic relationship are analyzed. Attention is given to crisis intervention techniques. The course includes an integrated performance component where students in a field experience setting apply theoretical knowledge in communicating effectively with health team members, clients and families.

### BSN 345 PATHOPHYSIOLOGY

CSU, Dominguez Hills 4 units  
Nursing Program \$199/unit  
\$ 25 one time registration fee\*\*

*Pre- or Corequisite: BSN 335 or consent of faculty coordinator.* This course explores the response of the human body to illness and injury with respect to common disorders of the major systems. Clinical correlations are provided to assist the health professional in applying this knowledge toward more effective patient care.

### BSN 405 STATISTICS

CSU, Dominguez Hills 4 units  
Nursing Program \$199/unit  
\$ 25 one time registration fee\*\*

## LIBRARY SERVICES

The librarians at California State University, Dominguez Hills (CSUDH) are pleased to work closely with the Statewide Nursing Program in facilitating services to SNP students. In addition to your home campus library at CSUDH, you, as an officially enrolled student in the CSU System, have borrowing privileges at all twenty-two CSU campuses. CSUDH librarians and nursing faculty worked together to produce the videotape, "An Introduction to Library Use: Part I", which provides an orientation to library services, resources, and information applicable to any university library.

## Accessing Library Materials

DON students will usually go to their local CSU campus library first. If that library has the materials you need, you may use them there, make copies, or check them out. To borrow materials from any CSU campus library, you will need a validated, current CSUDH library identification card and another piece of identification with your name and photo. (Your validated Library Card, or a validation sticker which you attach to your card, is mailed to you approximately four weeks after receipt of your course registration form and processing of your fee payment.) Be sure to familiarize yourself with your local library policies and procedures. Each campus library has its own loan periods and other unique policies. You must abide by the regulations of the library you are using.

## Literature Searches

Many course assignments require literature searches, and these can be pursued in a variety of ways. The CSUDH library has an extensive collection of indexing and abstracting services, including the Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature (CINAHL), Index Medicus, and ERIC. These and many other databases are available in at least three formats: print, CD-ROM, and through various online computer services. Set up in the CSUDH Library are three public terminals with menu access to CARL/UnCover. The Reference Librarian on duty will be happy to assist anyone wishing to use this database.

Students are urged to carry out their own searches since the learning experiences are more positive and benefits of immediate feedback will be readily available.

CARL is an acronym for Colorado Alliance of Research Libraries which includes many different academic, public and special libraries. Their periodicals are entered into a computer which comprises the CARL/UnCover database.

CARL has three databases of interest to nursing students:

1. CARL/UnCover indexes over 14,000 periodicals. Keyword access to individual articles is available by "word" or "name" "Browse" provides lists of the table of contents information of the 14,000+ titles represented in CARL. Little, if any, information is provided prior to 1990. CINAHL, the "Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health" is available via CARL. This specialized index is searchable using the same commands as CARL/UnCover. Document delivery is available.
2. CINAHL online database provides authoritative coverage of the literature in nursing and allied health. Virtually all English-language nursing journals are indexed along with publications from the American Nurses' Association and the National League for Nursing. Primary journals are indexed in fourteen allied health

disciplines and health sciences. Selected journals in biomedicine and consumer health are also included. In total, more than 580 journals are regularly indexed. CINAHL also provides access to healthcare books, nursing dissertations, selected conference proceedings, standards of practice, educational software in nursing (since 1992), and audiovisual material (since 1993). The CINAHL tutorial booklet, CINAHL Search Guide, listed in the BSN 310 and MSN 500 textbook listing, provides comprehensive documentation and guidelines for search strategy.

3. ERIC, the database that indexes journals in the field of education, is another menu choice from the main menu. It is also searched using CARL/UnCover commands and documents may be ordered directly from CARL.

DON students may search CARL utilizing a home or office computer that is equipped with a modem. Each CSUDH Division of Nursing student may establish an account on the campus VAX computer (A VAX 4000 Account Request Form follows these pages). In order to do this it is necessary to have computer communications software to access online library services. If you need a copy of the software, send the following to CSUDH Computer Services:

- Pre-formatted blank 3 1/2" diskette, high density 1.44 in a "bubble disc envelope".
- Specify if you have an IBM or Mac
- Include another prestamped, pre addressed "bubble disc envelope" for return of diskette.

Instructions on how to establish an account and access the CSUNet and log on to the campus computer from remote locations are outlined below and in the following pages.

Document delivery through fax or mail is also offered through UnCover. Personal credit cards may be used to order copies of some articles. The UnCover database includes the library's periodical holdings via a "browse" search.

## Self Search via CSUNet Online System

After dialing the appropriate CAPS phone number issued by your hub office secretary and using a communication software of your choice, you will be prompted with the following:

- **Please Enter CSUNet Access Code (return for default).** Hit the ENTER key on your key board for default. You will see the following prompt:
- **Enter Resource Name:** You must type DH/VMS and hit the ENTER key. You will be prompted to enter your Username and the Password.

In order to log into VAX 4000, you must have an account on the VAX computer. Your account identification consists of two parts: Your Username and a Password. Your Username is the first character of your first name and your complete last name, entered together without spaces. Your password for the initial log-in is the same as your Username. Once you enter your user name at the password prompt, the system will prompt you to enter a new password. Then you will be prompted to verify your new password. Retype the password you just set up. You must enter a minimum of six characters for the password. Having set up a new password, make a note of it for yourself for future reference. After entering your Username and password, you will be prompted with a Dollar Sign (\$). Once you are logged on to the VAX, Internet access to CARL is obtained by typing the following at the \$ prompt :

## Literature Searches

- TELNET DH.CARL.CALSTATE.EDU. (hit enter)
- After a few seconds, you will be connected to CARL.
- You will be prompted to identify your terminal type. At 'select line #' prompt, type the number 5 (for VT100).
- After a few seconds you will see the customized CSU introductory screen. The top half of the screen lists the CSU campuses who have subscribed to CARL. The bottom half lists references and full-text databases, not all of which you will be able to access.
- To access **CARL/UnCover** journal citations and tables of contents, type the number from the top half of the introductory screen which corresponds to the campus location closest to you and hit enter.
- To access **CINAHL**, type the number 69 and hit enter. Then, follow the instructions on the screen. You may select name search, word search, subject browse or subject word. For more detail on how to use these search functions we suggest that you obtain the CINAHL user manual; Online Database Search Guide, available for purchase at the bookstore (look under BSN 310 or MSN 500 or the order form.) After following the instructions in the step-by-step manual, you will gain access. If questions arise, call June Levy (818) 409-8034 between 8 a.m.-5 p.m., Pacific time.
- To access **ERIC** (Educational Resources Information Center), type the number 74 and hit enter.
- To exit, type //EXIT and hit enter.
- Type LOGOUT to disconnect from VAX

Commercial online services (America Online, Prodigy, Compuserve, etc. also offer access to databases.

## CD-ROM Searching

In the CSUDH campus library, students may conduct their own CD-ROM searches on the computer. Infrequent visitors to the library are advised to call (310) 516-3714 in advance to verify library hours.

In the course of a CD-ROM search students can print out or download citations of interests and immediately look for the journal articles to which the citations refer. If the library has the journals in which the articles appear, students can make photocopies. If the library does **NOT** have the particular journals of interest, students can request the articles by filling out an Inter-Library Loan (ILL) Request Form in order that the CSUDH library can attempt to get the articles from another source, a process taking a minimum of two weeks.

If a student's living or working situation makes it impossible to come to the CSUDH library, he or she can request a mediated CD-ROM search for \$35.00 per search covering the costs incurred for printing or downloading, handling, telephone expenses, and for postage.

## Requesting a Search

The CSUDH library also makes special provisions for students with hardships, i.e., students who reside considerable distances from any CSU campus, or whose working schedules make it impossible to visit a CSU campus. These students may request a mediated search by contacting the CSUDH "Online Search Coordinator" at (310) 516-4085 Monday-Friday. The Online Search Coordinator will discuss and analyze the search topic, explain the procedures to be followed and indicate the paid-in-advance fees for mediated searches. Students having access to IBM-compatible computers should inform the Online Search Coordinator and send a 3.5" diskette(s) for storing and delivering search results. Students will be asked to complete and mail the Computerized Literature Search Request form provided in this Class Schedule. The form must be accompanied by a personal check in the amount of \$35.00 for searches or in the amount specified by the Online Search Coordinator for online searches. **The library cannot process search requests until payment is received.** If time is a factor, students should use Express Mail.

Students should anticipate due dates for their assignments and allow sufficient time for processing requests, conducting searches, and obtaining and analyzing results. Time also must be allowed for obtaining copies of any articles selected. When time is more critical than cost, students may wish to look into the services of vendors such as UMI, described below

Any questions related to the CSUDH Computerized Literature Search form or other library services should be directed to the CSUDH library staff at (310) 516-3718.

### In a Hurry? Use UMI

If you need a copy of an article in a hurry and cannot wait the week to ten days usually required for receipt of an ILL request and special rush service is required, there are commercial vendors who specialize in document delivery described below. For information, contact UMI at 1-800-626-2823.

### Coverage

More than 11,000 titles in the Article Clearinghouse program comprise scholarly and technical journals, popular magazines, conference proceedings and transactions, newspapers, and government documents. The 11,000 + titles represent contracts with 4,000 publishers.

### Inter-Library Loan

You may find that not all of the resource materials you need will be found at any one library. To assist you, libraries cooperate by borrowing items from one another for their users. This system is called "Inter-Library Loan" or ILL. Exact arrangements differ from library to library. If your local library does not own the material requested, you will need to complete the ILL form with the exact bibliographic information or citation for the book or periodical article. This information is then transmitted to other libraries which own the requested material. The lending library then sends the requested material, if it is available, to your local library. This process can take some time so plan ahead and begin your search early. **STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO COMPLETE THE ILL FORM THEMSELVES.**

As a special service to SNP students residing outside of a 25 mile radius of CSUDH, ILL requests for periodical articles can also be mailed to the CSUDH library, using the CSUDH request forms included in this Class Schedule. Forms are available at the LRCs. To get the best turn-around time, students are asked to locate which library owns the journal and note this information on the form. This is fairly simple to do using the following tools which are provided in your LRC:

- The **CSU Union List of Serials** shows the titles of all the journal holdings of all CSU campus libraries. Each title is followed by code numbers which designate the campuses that have the journal as well as volume number and date information.
- The **CSUDH Annual Listing of Periodicals and Serials** presents the list of periodicals and serials housed in the University Library at CSUDH.

Some other CSU campus libraries may also provide ILL services to SNP students. This would be a special service at the discretion of each individual campus. Inquire at the Inter-Library Loan Department to ascertain if that campus can provide you with ILL service.
