

Native Jasmine

Jasminum didymum JAZ-min-um DID-ee-mum



A vigorous climber that produces masses of small, strongly-perfumed flowers. Needs regular pruning.

It is a favourite feeding plant for many insects, including various species of native bees, due to the large number of highly-fragrant flowers produced. The dense foliage offers good nesting sites for small birds, which are also attracted by the insect smorgasbord, and the fruits, which ripen to black.
