

Pink Bloodwood

Corymbia intermedia

Pink Bloodwood is a medium to large statement tree with a solid trunk and a spreading sparse canopy, which produces dappled shade.

May be found in a range of habitats including wet sclerophyll forests, dry sclerophyll forest, riparian areas and dune systems. Spectacular clusters of creamy-white flowers shower the tree from mid-summer to autumn (December-March). Provides habitat for wildlife including koalas, flying foxes and butterflies.
