# Why do we participate in high school sports and activities?

Welcome back to a new school year. As I enter my 20th year in education those words still bring excitement, concern and focus to me. The new beginning of a school year brings promise of a fresh start, and a chance to have a positive impact on the lives of young students in the State of Missouri. Teachers, Coaches, Administrators and Legislators are faced with some difficult times ahead this year with the previous budget cuts and the expectation of further cuts required. Even with those issues, seeing children walking through the doors of the schools and onto the practice fields, roads, courts, and gym floors for softball, tennis, cross country, football, volleyball, marching band, and soccer practices has to get the blood pumping with the anticipation of competing. Many times I have discussed the importance of extracurricular activities and when the dollars get tight, everything is on the cutting block. However, the educational process would suffer greatly if extracurricular activities were eliminated. Many schools have cut back on competitions and levels of programs, and some schools are implementing pay for play at the high school level. But education will take place, even with the money issues, and activities and athletics need to be a part of that learning environment.

The beginning of the school year brings, schedule changes, handbook assemblies, and re-enforcing to the students what is expected at the High School or Junior High. The staff of the Missouri State High School Activities Association has been working hard this summer to provide tools for schools to use throughout the year but especially at the beginning of the school year as administrators and coaches meet with students and parents.

The State Legislature discussed the need to pass a law last session that would require MSHSAA to provide information to parents, students, coaches and administrators concerning the dangers of concussions and symptoms of head injuries. Associate Executive Director Harvey Richards and the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee have established criteria for return to play guidelines. The committee adopted the information presented in the National Federation of State High School Associations free online course available at [www.nfhslearn.com](http://www.nfhslearn.com). It is strongly recommended that all coaches,



students, parents and administrators watch the five minute presentation we have on the MSHSAA website at [www.mshsaa.org](http://www.mshsaa.org), and complete the free online course. Schools may want to incorporate this online course into their preseason parent and student meetings.

Along with the concussion course on the MSHSAA website, there will be an online rules presentation that will cover the eligibility pamphlet in more detail presented by Mrs. Stacy Schroeder and Mr. Harvey Richards. I encourage every school to have their counselors watch the online presentation and share with their students and parents that where it is located on the MSHSAA website.

Finally, the member schools of the Missouri State High School Activities Association should expect to receive an instructional DVD and workbook with activities and suggestions to improve Sportsmanship at the member school. The DVD will have three parts with one for parents, one for students, and one for coaches. We encourage you to use the materials to promote positive sportsmanship at your school.

I hope everyone has a great start to the school year and a safe fall season.

## Stahl Named an Assistant Director

The Missouri State High School Activities Association Board of Directors has added a member to the executive staff, as voted upon at its January meeting. Current Athletic Director at Plattsburg High School, Greg Stahl will join the staff as an Assistant Executive Director.

Stahl began his teaching career as a middle school science instructor for the Morgan County R-II School District and Versailles Middle School. In addition to his teaching duties, he served as the head coach for the high school wrestling and baseball teams, as well as the middle school football teams. Stahl also assisted with the high school football team for the Tigers. In 1999, Stahl moved to Marceline High School, where he taught sixth, seventh, eighth and ninth grade science. In addition to his teaching duties, he also coached high school and middle school wrestling programs. Assisting with the middle school football teams, sponsoring the FCA chapter, sponsoring the middle school science club as well as being a co-sponsor for the Students Against Drunk Driving chapter were among Stahl's responsibilities at MHS. In 2000, Stahl was named the Missouri Wrestling Association Head Coach of the Year, after leading the Tigers to a fourth place team finish.

In 2002, Stahl joined the administration of Versailles High School as Assistant Principal. Along with his administrative accomplishments, Stahl implemented and guided a new "Map Gap" instructional period for core subject areas, as well as aided in the development of a GED Option Diploma for decreasing dropout rates. For his efforts at VHS, he received the "Tiger Paw Award" at an annual staff appreciation banquet. In 2004, Stahl was named Assistant Principal and Athletic Director at Plattsburg High School. Since arriving at PHS, Stahl has developed a district coaching evaluation process, implemented a Breakfast of Champions program for high school student-athletes mentoring to elementary students, as well as served as site manager for several MSHSAA activities.

With a bachelors of science degree in Education from Missouri Valley College, Stahl earned a Masters of Education/Secondary Administration from William Woods University. He is currently completing Specialist in Education/Superintendent degree from Northwest Missouri State University.





# QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

The following are questions and answers pertaining to the MSHSAA Constitution and By-Laws and/or MSHSAA Board of Directors policy. These are provided as an aid in interpreting the rules and regulations which MSHSAA member schools have adopted. If you have a specific area and/or question which you would like explained, contact Kerwin Urhahn, MSHSAA executive director. Your attention is called to the fact questions and answers regarding interpretations of the MSHSAA Constitution and By-Laws appear following the Constitution Article or By-Law they relate to in the MSHSAA Official Handbook.

**Question:** We have a family in our district whose children are being taught in their home. They would like their daughter to participate in our high school volleyball program. (a) Is she eligible and (b) could she become eligible after being ineligible for one year?

**Answer:** (a) No. (b) No. The requirements of eligibility are specific in their stipulation that "... Any student who represents his/her school in interscholastic activities shall be a bona fide student and enrolled as an undergraduate student of the school..." (By-Law 210) In addition, all students in order to have the privilege to participate shall be enrolled in classes which allow them to earn 3.0 units of credit or 80 percent of the maximum allowable credit whichever is greater and must have earned 3.0 units of credit or 80 percent of the maximum allowable credit whichever is greater the previous semester (By-Law 213). Credit is recognized by the credits issued on the student's transcript at the member school. A home schooled student is eligible just as any other student providing these same essential eligibility requirements for all students are met.

**Question:** In an effort to comply with provisions of Public Law 94-142 for inclusion we have "mainstreamed" several students who have learning disabilities. In some classes, they are not able to meet the same academic standards as their classmates. How is their eligibility determined?

**Answer:** In order for these students to be eligible to participate in interscholastic athletics, music, speech, cheerleading, academic competition, and pom pons, they must receive passing grades in courses offering a minimum of 3.0 units of credit or 80% of the maximum allowable credit whichever is greater for the semester. Each school is responsible for establishing academic requirements and grading policies to effectively accommodate students who have been identified with having a disability in accordance with provisions of P.L. 94-142. The school

district has two options with respect to grading policies. First, the IEP committee may determine that the student will be required to meet the same academic requirements and grading policies as any other student in the class. When such a determination has been made, no modifications to grading will be made, and the student will be expected to maintain academic eligibility for interscholastic

sports, music, cheerleading, pom pons, academic competition, and speech as any other student. The second option is for the IEP committee to determine that a modification of the academic requirements or grading policies is necessary to reflect the needs of the student and his/her disability. In this situation, the modifications may include alterations in the type of assessments to be given the student, the number of such assessments given a student, the number of items upon assessments given a student, the amount of time the student will be allowed to take the assessment, etc. The IEP committee may also determine that grades will be determined on the basis of the student's progress towards achieving specific goals and objectives from the IEP rather than standard assessments given other students. If this type of modification is made, the IEP committee is responsible to specify the amount of progress which will be necessary to document that standard progress is being made by the student.

If these students are placed in a combination of one or more mainstreamed classes and are in a resource center for one or more classes, then they must be either receiving passing grades in their mainstreamed classes and/or be making standard progress in the self-contained classes taken in a resource room which would be the equivalent of five courses offering a total of 3.0 units of credit or 80% of the maximum allowable credit whichever is greater. Note: Inclusion of activities on the IEP as an educational service is not appropriate. (By-Law 213)

**Question:** We have a student in our school who has been invited to attend a

softball evaluation event in late August. Our school classes will not start until the Monday after the event, however, the event is being conducted one week into our school softball season after starting the required 10 days of conditioning. May the student attend?

**Answer:** No. By-Law 242 clearly states that a student representing his/her school in a specific sport may not attend an evaluation event for the same school sport during the designated school sport season. The season begins with the first day of practice with all or part of the school sport squad. Thus, the student in question would be in season since practice has begun for the school team.

**Question:** We have a French teacher who lives in another district and is going to serve as a host family for a foreign exchange student participating in a CSIET listed program. If the teacher brings this student to our school will she be eligible for varsity competition in all sports?

**Answer:** No. The residence requirement for eligibility applies to the foreign exchange student the same as all other students being that a student is eligible with no restrictions only at the school where the parents residence is located with the school's established geographic attendance area. In this case the host family serves as "parents." Application for hardship could be made providing it can be documented there is an unavoidable hardship making it necessary to transfer. (By-Law 236 and 238)

# Review Rosters Carefully for Age & Academic Requirements

Principals of member schools should have all eligibility rosters carefully checked to be sure that the name of no overaged student or a student not meeting the academic requirements appears on a list.

Any student who becomes 19 years of age on or before July 1 is ineligible. Any junior high school student who becomes sixteen years of age on or before July 1 and any middle school students who becomes 15-years-old on or before July 1 is ineligible for interscholastic athletic competition during the 2010-11 school year.

Students in the junior high/middle school who exceed the age limits may be moved up to participate with the appropriate age group. By-Law 232 has been amended to permit an overaged eighth grader attending a school which goes only to grade eight to participate at the high school he/she will attend the next year. This practice allows the students maximum opportunities for eligibility.

School administrators are reminded that By-Law 232 provides that students who exceed the age limit for participation in a particular grade are permitted to participate up to the next grade level where chronological age would place them. Schools should develop and implement a procedure whereby these youngsters are identified and informed of the By-Law and the option to play with the next grade. The provision, when applied correctly, will permit all youngsters two years of potential participation at the seventh and eighth grade team level and four years of

potential eligibility at the senior high level. Schools not identifying and informing these students are not providing them with an equitable opportunity to participate in accord with MSHSAA By-Laws. School districts not sponsoring junior high sports should make this extra effort so the student has every opportunity through the By-Laws to participate.

Records should be checked and students advised of their academic status and eligibility. It should not be assumed that a student and his/her parents know the eligibility status based on academics.

It is the responsibility of the principal to certify that the information furnished on the master eligibility rosters is absolutely accurate and that the students whose names appear on those lists are eligible in accordance with all the provisions of the MSHSAA By-Laws.

All member school administrators are reminded that a master eligibility roster is to be filed with MSHSAA according to the schedule in By-Law 234. Also, a copy can be viewed on-line by member schools which desire to review the eligibility roster before the date of each game. In accord with MSHSAA By-Law 234, no athlete shall be considered eligible to represent his/her school until the student's name is filed on the master eligibility roster supplied by MSHSAA and exchanged with opposing schools requesting it. Additions to the roster can be made a day before the date of any contest.

## 2010-11 MSHSAA Rules Meetings Move Online

Beginning with the 2010-11 school year all MSHSAA required rules meetings for all coaches and directors of MSHSAA sports and activities will be completed online. Coaches and directors will no longer be required to attend a face-to-face rules meeting. # 2010 Annual Questionnaire Results

Following are the results of the balloting on the amendments to the MSHSAA Constitution and By-Laws in the 2010 Annual MSHSAA Election. Amendments to By-Laws require a simple majority of those voting for passage, while amendments to the Constitution require a 2/3 majority for passage. Proposals which passed will become effective July 1, 2010, with the exception of Proposal Numbers 5, 6, 11, 14, and 18 which shall become EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.

## \*PROPOSAL 1

**(Constitution - Article III, Section 2)**  
**(PASSED) - 506 FOR, 58 AGAINST**

Amends the Classification of Membership section of the MSHSAA Constitution, to clarify the options that schools have in regard to junior high and high school memberships within the MSHSAA structure.

## \*PROPOSAL 2

**(Constitution - Article III, Section 2)**  
**(PASSED) - 445 FOR, 119 AGAINST**

Amends the Classification of Membership section of the MSHSAA Constitution, to indicate that a school that includes grades seven through twelve under the supervision of the high school principal could elect to split their membership for grades 7-8 and grades 9-12 in any combination of membership and Affiliate Registered status.

## \*PROPOSAL 3

**(Constitution - Article III, Sections 6, 7, and 8)**  
**(PASSED)**

**Sr. High Vote - 370 FOR, 113 AGAINST**  
**Jr. High Vote - 253 FOR, 88 AGAINST**

Amends Article III of the MSHSAA Constitution to include sections 6, 7 and 8, regarding the Affiliate Registered School (ARS) category on a permanent basis rather than on a trial basis.

## PROPOSAL 4

**(By-Law 107)**

**(PASSED) - 255 FOR, 86 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 107, to allow Affiliate Registered Schools to cooperatively sponsor a sport or activity with one or more member schools at the junior high level under certain conditions.

## PROPOSAL 5

**(By-Law 108)**

**(PASSED) - 397 FOR, 167 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 108, Summertime Dead Period, to allow schools to set different dead periods for athletic and non-athletic activities.

## PROPOSAL 6

**(By-Law 108)**

**(PASSED) - 441 FOR, 123 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 108, Summertime Dead Period, to indicate that bona fide credit-bearing summer school courses taught by certified teachers in their curricular areas be exempt from the 'use of school facilities' restriction if held during the dead period.

## PROPOSAL 7

**(By-Laws 121, 140, 150, new 130)**

**(PASSED) - 403 FOR, 161 AGAINST**

Amends By-Laws 121 (Athletics), 140 (Music), 150 (Cheer, Dance) and add new By-Law 130 (Speech and Academic Competition), to indicate that all coaches and directors must be approved by MSHSAA prior to instructing students, and that violations of MSHSAA by-laws, rules or regulations may cause the Board of Directors to withhold "approved" status.

## PROPOSAL 8

**(By-Laws 128, 129, 152, 430, 550)**

**(PASSED) - 546 FOR, 18 AGAINST**

Deletes By-Law 128, Part II Exams, and amends the various by-laws regarding Rules Meetings, in order to remove the requirement for Part II exams for coaches and to modify the rules meeting wording to allow for the new MSHSAA Online Rules Reviews.

## PROPOSAL 9

**(By-Law 218)**

**(PASSED) - 524 FOR, 40 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 218, Assumed Name, to indicate the penalty for the violation of this by-law.

## PROPOSAL 10

**(By-Law 213)**

**(PASSED) - 371 FOR, 112 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 213, Academic Standards, to indicate that "extra classes" taken beyond the normal school day that are offered by the school for school credit may be used toward academic eligibility.

## PROPOSAL 11

**(By-Law 231, 235 and 237)**

**(PASSED) - 465 FOR, 99 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 231, Amateur and Award Requirements, and By-Laws 235 and 237, regarding camps and clinics, to allow students to provide lessons or instruction in their sport without jeopardizing amateur standing.

## PROPOSAL 12

**(By-Laws 231, 250, 260, 270, 280, 290)**

**(PASSED) - 445 FOR, 119 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 231, Amateur and Award Requirements, and the applicable non-athletic activity by-laws to indicate that interscholastic participants shall not represent the school (appearing in school uniform, school-named clothing, at school facilities, or with mascot/school colors) to endorse or promote a product/service, commercial venture, political venture, etc. without prior, written consent by a school administrator. If consent is given, any applicable award restrictions must be met.

## PROPOSAL 13

**(By-Law 236)**

**(PASSED) - 504 FOR, 60 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 236.4, All-Star Participation, to clearly indicate that senior students, once eligibility in a certain sport is exhausted, may participate in one all-star contest prior to summertime in that sport, under certain conditions.

## PROPOSAL 14

**(By-Law 237)**

**(PASSED) - 336 FOR, 40 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 237, Sport Participation and Contact During the Summer, to set in place definitions and limits in regard to school-directed football activities, body-to-body contact, and school equipment.

## PROPOSAL 15

**(By-Law 238)**

**(PASSED) - 498 FOR, 66 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 238.3-a-8, Hardship Transfer Exception, to allow certain specified military officers to, upon arrival, have the option to send their children to either the school of residence, or any contiguous school district, without eligibility ramifications.

## PROPOSAL 16

**(By-Law 301)**

**(PASSED) - 510 FOR, 54 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 301.0-a, Definition of Practice, to better express the limitations and allowances.

## PROPOSAL 17

**(By-Law 302)**

**(PASSED) - 461 FOR, 103 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 302, Alumni Games, to include additional terms and conditions for students versus faculty contests.

## PROPOSAL 18

**(By-Law 306 and 237)**

**(PASSED) - 483 FOR, 81 AGAINST**

Amends the All-Star Contest language in By-Law 306, and accompanying language in By-Law 237, Summer Contact, to allow participants to use school equipment in All-Star Contests.

## PROPOSAL 19

**(By-Law 311)**

**(PASSED) - 456 FOR, 108 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 311, Tournament, Meet, and Multiple-Game Event Sanction Regulations, by eliminating wording in regard to coaches awards.

## PROPOSAL 20

**(By-Law 312)**

**(PASSED) - 447 FOR, 36 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 312, District and State Tournaments, to indicate that the 1.35% enrollment multiplier would be applied to any school that has the ability to limit its enrollment through selectivity and/or is exempt from Missouri School Improvement Program (MSIP) guidelines.

## PROPOSAL 21

**(By-Law 353)**

**(PASSED) - 303 FOR, 73 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 353, Football Required Conditioning, to allow for limited hand-to-chest contact during the first three days of practice.

**PROPOSAL 22**

**(By-Law 355)**

**(FAILED) - 117 FOR, 200 AGAINST**

Would have removed By-Law 355, Pre-Season Inter-School Scrimmage (football) due to the current economic crisis for schools.

**PROPOSAL 23**

**(By-Law 355)**

**(PASSED) - 263 FOR, 54 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 355, Pre-Season Inter-School Scrimmage (football), to eliminate the requirements for schools to register the scrimmages with the MSHSAA office and to submit 20% of gross revenues.

**PROPOSAL 24**

**(By-Law 540)**

**(PASSED) - 224 FOR, 22 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 540, Speech Season Limits, to indicate that no senior high school interscholastic debate, dramatics, or speech events shall be held before the second Friday in October or later than April 1, other than the allowances listed.

**PROPOSAL 25**

**(New By-Law 700)**

**(PASSED) - 460 FOR, 104 AGAINST**

Amends the by-laws to add new By-Law 700, Emerging Activities, which would define and outline oversight of "emerging activities" and

"provisionally interscholastic" activities. All by-law references to the sports and activities that currently have less than 50 schools registered will be removed, and these activities will be covered solely in this by-law.

**PROPOSAL 26**

**(By-Law 1022)**

**(PASSED) - 472 FOR, 92 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 1022, Appeals Committee Membership, in regard to size, eligibility, and terms of members.

\* This proposal required a 2/3 majority of those voting to pass.

## ACT and SAT Dates Should be Checked to Avoid Conflicts with MSHSAA Events

High school counselors, principals, coaches and directors are urged to remind all high school students of the dates on which the ACT and SAT tests will be administered, as well as the dates of MSHSAA district and state events. MSHSAA event dates are contained in MSHSAA sport and activity manuals, the MSHSAA wall calendar and inside the back cover of the MSHSAA Handbook.

High school students participating in interscholastic activities often find conflicts between interscholastic events and the ACT and SAT test dates. Students can avoid this problem by arranging for

a test date that does not conflict with an interscholastic event in which they will be participating.

## Handling Contests During Hazardous Weather

The host school principal or designated representative and the head official have mutual authority to delay the start of a game any time weather conditions are considered hazardous to life or limb. Likewise, the head official, once a game has started, has the authority, by rule, to suspend a game any time weather conditions are considered to be hazardous to life or limb. If severe weather develops while a game is in progress where the administration feels safety is questionable and the game officials have not acted, the host principal or his/her designated representative will intervene by informing the head official who shall cause the contest to be suspended.

The first step in the suspension is to remove the participants to a location providing shelter and safety until the weather conditions improve to a point where it is safe to resume play. The spectators will be informed of the procedures to be followed and will be instructed to move to protected areas. Fans should not be permitted to remain in the bleachers.

The length of the delay shall be determined by the weather conditions, and the game may be resumed at any time the principals of both schools or their designated representatives and the head official agree it is safe to do so. However, if after a delay of a maximum of 30 minutes the hazardous weather has not subsided, the decision to postpone shall be made by the principals of both schools or their designated representatives after consultation with the head official. If there are extenuating circumstances such as extreme travel distances, rescheduling problems, etc., which make it desirable to try to complete the game and the principals of both schools or their designated representatives choose to ask for an additional 30 minutes of waiting time, the head official may grant that request. If the principals of both schools or their designated representatives and the head official cannot mutually agree that the weather conditions are safe, the game shall be postponed. The game may either be considered a completed game at that point or rescheduled at a later time ac-

ording to game rules. (All regular season senior high school football contests that are postponed shall be rescheduled on the earliest possible date but no later than four calendar days following the original date, and in compliance with the football playoff scheduling regulations.)

The purpose of this procedure is to first ensure the safety of the players and spectators, but also to relieve the pressure from the officials before declaring a game suspended. The host principal should, when severe weather is pending, keep a constant check with nearby radio stations which would have information concerning the path of the storm. This constant check, available to the administration, is not available to the game officials.

School district emergency plans should include procedures for evacuating players and spectators to protected areas when severe weather occurs.

## Local School Responsible for Conduct at Contests Under By-Law 810 & Board Policy

The MSHSAA Board of Directors policy statement makes it clear that any unsportsmanlike conduct or misconduct of an athlete, coach, student, or fan at the site of an event -- whether it occurs before, during, or after the contest -- is of concern to the Board of Directors and shall be handled in accord with procedures established in the policy.

It also reaffirms the expectation that in cases where an athlete is guilty of deliberately striking an opposing player, using profane or vulgar language, or using abusive language toward officials, etc., that the coach will immediately remove the player from that game and not permit the player to participate in the next succeeding game as a minimum penalty. In addition, it provides that if there are extenuating circumstances making the athlete's conduct more serious, the penalty imposed by the school shall be more severe.

The policy continues to stipulate that a substitute shall not enter the playing floor or field should a fight break out among players in the game. It also specifies "and should any substitute leave the bench area to go onto the floor or field in such situations, he or she shall be suspended from the remainder of that game and from the next contest in which the team plays." Coaches need to make this policy clear to all members of their squads.

The Board of Directors policy statement relating to Unsportsmanlike Conduct is included in the policy section located on pages 110-111 of the MSHSAA Official Handbook and in By-Law 810.

# 2010-11 MSHSAA Statewide Catastrophic Medical and Disability Insurance Plan

The MSHSAA Board of Directors resolved to purchase the Lifetime Catastrophic Medical and Disability Insurance Plan for the 2010-11 school year. This catastrophic insurance plan underwritten by Mutual of Omaha, Omaha, Nebraska will cover all students while practicing for and/or participating in activities under the jurisdiction of the MSHSAA (e.g., athletics, music, speech, sideline cheerleading, dance teams, academic competition, etc.)

This will be the 21st year for this particular program in our state. Attention is called to the fact the plan does not include liability insurance for member schools nor does it include a waiver of lawsuit provision. Therefore, school administrators are urged to check your present school district liability insurance policy to make sure participant liability is not excluded in that policy.

The plan includes a deductible of \$50,000. It will provide excess medical benefits for a student who suffers an accidental injury while practicing for or participating in an interscholastic activity conducted under MSHSAA jurisdiction which results in medical costs exceeding \$50,000 within two years from the date of injury. The premium for this coverage is paid by the member school supplementary service fees. The premium rate for 2010-2011 is \$4.99 per senior high student athlete and \$4.65 per junior high student athlete whose name appeared on the school's master eligibility rosters for all sports during the 2009-2010 school year. This is an unduplicated count in that a student who participated in two or more sports is counted only once. This fee is the same for junior and senior high schools.

**DESCRIPTION OF COVERAGE:**

The Lifetime Catastrophic Injury Insurance Program will pay benefits, after the \$50,000 deductible, for covered losses due to a catastrophic injury in excess of other valid and collectible insurance. Benefit highlights for covered losses are as follows:

Benefit Highlights for Covered Losses are as follows:

- 1) Lifetime Medical, Dental and Rehabilitation Expense Benefit: 100% of reasonable, customary, and necessary covered expenses, with an overall \$3,000,000 lifetime limit.
- 2) \$100,000 Lifetime Special Expense Benefit First 10 Years: Home remodeling or adaptation and special vehicle purchase or adaptation; then \$50,000 each decade thereafter.
- 3) \$50,000 Lifetime Adjustment Expense Benefit: Family counseling, training and travel in connection with care and rehabilitation of catastrophically injured student; loss of earnings of parents due to catastrophically injured student.
- 4) Total Disability/Loss of Earnings Benefit: A catastrophically injured student who is totally disabled at age 18 may receive \$2,000 per month for Life.
- 5) Partial Disability Benefit: A partially disabled student may receive \$750 per month for Life, after recovering from Total Disability.
- 6) \$100,000 Lifetime Benefit for unrelated subsequent accidents and/or illnesses (after a \$5,000 per calendar year deductible).

- 7) \$20,000 Accidental Death and Dismemberment/Cash Benefit.
- 8) \$125,000 Extended Care Facility Benefit per calendar year.
- 9) Education expense of \$50,000 Lifetime for tuition, room/board, and other related education expenses.
- 10) Benefits are paid to a catastrophically injured student regardless of liability. No waiver/ release is required to receive benefits.

**TOURNAMENT COVERAGE:**

A feature of the 2010-2011 statewide insurance plan provided through the MSHSAA is Tournament Play Coverage. This coverage provides benefits on an excess basis for the first \$50,000 of medical and rehabilitation expenses incurred as a result of an injury that is sustained while a student-athlete is participating in an MSHSAA sponsored district and/or state tournament contest after a \$100 deductible has been met.

**REPORTING POTENTIAL CLAIM OCCURRENCES DURING POLICY EFFECTIVE PERIOD:**

If a student suffers an accidental injury under the above described circumstances and might incur \$50,000 or more in medical expenses within two years from the date of the injury or if the student is injured while participating in an MSHSAA sponsored district and/or state tournament game, contact the claim Administrator at the address listed below and instructions for filing the school's claim will be forwarded to the school district:

**OPTIONAL COVERAGE AVAILABLE:**

An individual school or district may, by application and payment of additional premium, purchase optional coverage for school sponsored student activities not under the jurisdiction of the Missouri State High School Activities Association. Each member school may go to the web site at [www.dissingerreed.com](http://www.dissingerreed.com) for information on the optional extended coverage directly from the MSHSAA's plan administrator, Dissinger Reed Insurance Services.

## Nonschool Competition By-Law 235

By-Law 235 provides that a student who is a member of a school sports squad that is in season may practice or compete in organized nonschool competition in a different sport during that school season and may do so on the same day the student practices or plays for the school team provided this dual participation on the same date is approved by the student's school administrator in advance. Nontraditional sports as defined in By-Law 235 are restricted from participation during the respective school season.

It is very important to understand the provision continues the restriction contained in By-Law 235 which stipulates a student shall neither practice nor compete as a member of a nonschool team or as an individual participant in organized nonschool competition in that same sport or sport similar in nature such as three-on-three basketball during the school basketball season.

By-Law 235 permits, during the summer months only, that an individual employed by a school district in any sport may coach a nonschool team which has players from the school team they attend or will attend next year. This provision specifically addresses nonschool competition on a legitimate team designed to compete if the team is not a part of the school program.

By-Law 235 (Nonschool Competition) provides an exception for swimming and diving while in season. Students should discuss participation and the exception with the school coach and athletic administrator.

It is suggested that each student athlete and his or her parents receive a copy of the MSHSAA brochure "How to Maintain and Protect Your Eligibility" which contains information regarding the Nonschool Competition Requirement and other eligibility standards students must meet in order to maintain the privilege to participate in the interscholastic program.





## Physicals Required for Athletics, Cheer and Dance

According to MSHSAA By-Laws 276, 283 and 309, schools shall require every student participating in sideline cheer, dance teams and athletics to present a physician's certificate stating that he or she is physically able to participate. These By-Laws do not allow for any exceptions to this requirement.

A MSHSAA Participation Certificate, or something similar, is to be completed prior to the first practice session and should be readily available during all practices and events. It is suggested that schools make copies of the Participation Certificates for all participants in these activities and have the forms on file in the school's central office in case the original forms are lost during a practice session or an out-of-

town event. This will serve as a back-up for school personnel and prevent having the participants and physicians complete the participation certificates again.

It should be noted that any school physical issued on or after February 1, 2010 is valid for the 2010-11 school year.

By-Laws 276 and 283 include tryouts as a recognized event for sideline cheer and dance teams. School administrator and event sponsors should be certain all students involved in tryouts provide a physician's certificate stating the individual is physically able to participate in sideline cheer or dance activities as required prior to participating in any activities in preparation for tryouts.

## Coaches are Encouraged to Join the Missouri Coaches Association

Membership brochures will be sent to principals, athletic directors, and coaches in the August Packet and sport rules book mailings regarding the newly-formed Missouri Coaches Association (MOCA).

The mission of this organization is to strive for the attainment of all positive objectives and attributes of middle and high school interscholastic athletics. The association focuses on the image and effectiveness of coaches to improve, preserve, and promote the integrity of the Missouri interscholastic athletic programs. The goal of the Missouri Coaches Association is to improve interscholastic coaching as a profession in the state of Missouri, as it relates to all aspects of coaching. "Positive-Active Participants Become Positive-Productive Citizens."

**Section 1: Regular Membership.** Membership is open to anyone employed as, or approved to serve as, a coach at an MSHSAA member school in an MSHSAA-sanctioned sport.

**Section 2: Benefits.** The Missouri Coaches Association shall join and be a constituent member of the NFHS Coaches Association. (All members of the Missouri Coaches Association shall automatically become members of the NFHS Coaches Association.)

**Section 3: Application.** Application for membership, either school or individual, shall be made to the Missouri Coaches Association in care of the Treasurer. The appropriate membership dues shall accompany the application.

**Section 4: Dues.** School Membership (per coach): \$20. (Includes all active coaches from your school, minimum head coaches) Individual Membership: \$25. The MOCA board of directors shall determine the MOCA annual membership dues. The membership year will begin September 1 of the current school year and last until August 31 of the following year. Membership in the MOCA shall be terminated at the end of the membership year. Membership shall commence with the receipt of payment of the annual dues by September 1 of each year.

## Guidance Counselors Play Key Role in Communicating Eligibility Rules

It is important that all counselors be fully knowledgeable of the essential eligibility requirements students must meet to represent the school and participate in interscholastic activities. Counselors are frequently asked by students to advise them on matters dealing with the preparation of, or changes in their class schedules. In doing so, counselors should be sure that they do not advise a course of action which will result in students forfeiting their eligibility to compete in interscholastic athletics or activities through violation of MSHSAA rules of eligibility, e.g. scheduling a course for which the student has already received credit, permitting a student to be scheduled with fewer than five full credit subjects, or the equivalent of work, or permitting a student to drop a course(s) and thereby placing him/her below eligibility requirements. Counselors should discuss eligibility requirements with all students.

Member school principals should emphasize to all guidance counselors the importance of having copies of MSHSAA eligibility requirements on file at all times in the guidance offices. A "Checklist for School Counselors" can be found in the August packet provided to all MSHSAA member schools to assist with transfer students. Also, additional forms for helping counselors can be found on the MSHSAA web site.

It is strongly recommended that counselors view, "How to Protect Student Eligibility" on the MSHSAA Website ([www.mshsaa.org](http://www.mshsaa.org)). This on-line review will provide an electronic cover view of important by-laws students, parents, counselors, coaches and administrators need to know.



## **Schools to Provide Security for Game Officials**

Schools are to provide, if at all possible, private dressing facilities for the game officials employed to officiate their home contests. They should be separate from either of the participating teams with toilet and shower facilities readily available.

No unauthorized personnel are to be admitted to the officials locker room before, during or after the contest. This includes friends of the officiating crew. Only the assigned officials, school personnel assigned by the athletic administrator to assist the officials, and MSHSAA personnel including official observers who may be in attendance, are to be admitted to the official's dressing room. The sign indicating "No Admittance", which is forwarded to all schools by the MSHSAA, is to be placed on the door to the official's locker room and monitored so that only authorized personnel are admitted.

The host school or site manager is directly responsible for the safety and security of all game officials before, during, and after all interscholastic contests (including the parking lot). Officials are encouraged to notify the school and the MSHSAA by the Special Report process when their safety and security is not provided for.

Part of the duties of the game officials are to arrive on time at the site (at least an hour before game time), cooperate with school officials and not admit any of their associates or friends to their locker room. A cooperative effort between school officials and game officials will pave the way for a smooth contest and help avoid undesirable incidents.

## **Schools to Verify Officials' Registration Status**

All athletic administrators and coaches should make certain that all contracted officials are currently registered (2010-11) with the MSHSAA. Contracting game officials is an extremely important responsibility. School administrators and coaches must be certain that each official is duly registered for the current year in that particular sport. Officials are required to renew or register with the MSHSAA annually. The registration year is from July 1 to June 30.

The final responsibility of making certain that game officials are registered rests with the host school. This responsibility cannot be delegated to an officials association or to an assignor. A contract shall be with the individual official, not between the school and the officials association.

The MSHSAA staff realizes that game officials may be contracted a year in advance and may certainly be registered for that year; however, the problem arises when the official then fails to renew for the current year and honors the contract, but is not registered. Administrators and coaches are urged to check the Officials Roster on the MSHSAA Web Site. Athletic Administrators should contact Pam Martin in the MSHSAA office if there is a question regarding the registration status of any contest official.

Be certain that officials you use are legally registered. If an official has overlooked the fact that he or she has not renewed or registered for this year, he or she should contact the MSHSAA immediately.

## **Both Officials and Schools Need To Honor Contracts**

From time to time, the MSHSAA receives complaints from either a game official or a member school that someone has violated a contract. Just one or two of these complaints are too many. Good organization and careful bookkeeping by both parties should eliminate any confusion for either group.

The MSHSAA would like to offer the following guidelines for schools and officials to follow concerning contracting procedures.

- School officials are to make certain that all officials contracted are duly and currently registered with the MSHSAA.
- Officials shall be agreed upon by both schools at least 30 days before each contest.
- All contracts are to be properly signed by a school administrator and the official.
- Some type of guarantee shall be indicated on each contract and shall be paid by the offending party to the offended party.
- A contract may be broken only by the mutual consent of both parties, or for reasons beyond the control of either party.
- The final responsibility for making certain officials are registered with the MSHSAA rests with the host school.
- Officials are not to send a replacement to work a contest unless that official is agreed upon by both schools prior to the contest.
- Contracts shall be with the individual official and not between the school and an official's organization.
- Both parties should review contract dates frequently and communicate with each other immediately if any change needs to take place.

## **MSHSAA By-Law 810 for Fall Sports**

A player who is ejected from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall at a minimum be prohibited from playing in the next interscholastic contest at that same level. A coach who is ejected during a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall at a minimum be prohibited from coaching and attending the next interscholastic contest for that team. Listed below are rules references for the By-Law 810 ejection procedures:

- Softball: Any player or coach ejected from an interscholastic contest under NFHS Softball Rule 3-6.
- Soccer: Any player or coach ejected from an interscholastic contest under NFHS Soccer Rule 12-8-2, 12-8-3, or 12-8-4.
- Football: Any player or coach disqualified (ejected) from an interscholastic contest under NFHS Football Rule 9-4, 9-5 or 9-8.
- Volleyball: Any player or coach disqualified from an interscholastic volleyball match under NFHS Volleyball Rule 12.
- Girls Golf: Any player or coach disqualified from an interscholastic golf match under the 2009-10 MSHSAA Golf Manual Terms and Conditions.
- Cross Country: Any participant or coach disqualified from an interscholastic cross country meet under NFHS Track and Field and Cross Country Rule 9-6-3 and 4-5-1, 2.
- Girls Tennis: Any player disqualified from an interscholastic tennis match under the 2009-10 MSHSAA Tennis Manual Terms and Conditions.

## **Board Policy for Delinquent On-Line Submission of Coaches, Directors and Sponsors**

The MSHSAA Board of Directors adopted, at its June 15, 2007, meeting, the following policy regarding the delinquent submission on the MSHSAA Website ([www.mshsaa.org](http://www.mshsaa.org)) of faculty, non-faculty, and non-certified athletic and activities coaches, directors, and sponsors (**head and assistant**) by member schools. Besides sports, this policy is applicable to music, academic competition, sideline cheerleading, dance team, and speech, debate, and drama. The policy provides that the school administrator shall enter the required information on all staff members associated with the sport/activity no later than the day prior to the first permissible contest for that sport/activity. Failure of a school to submit information on coaches/directors/sponsors by the established deadline shall result in the school being sent a letter of reprimand. A school shall receive a warning for a second occurrence during the same school year. If a third incidence should occur during the same school year, the school shall be placed on probation for 365 days.

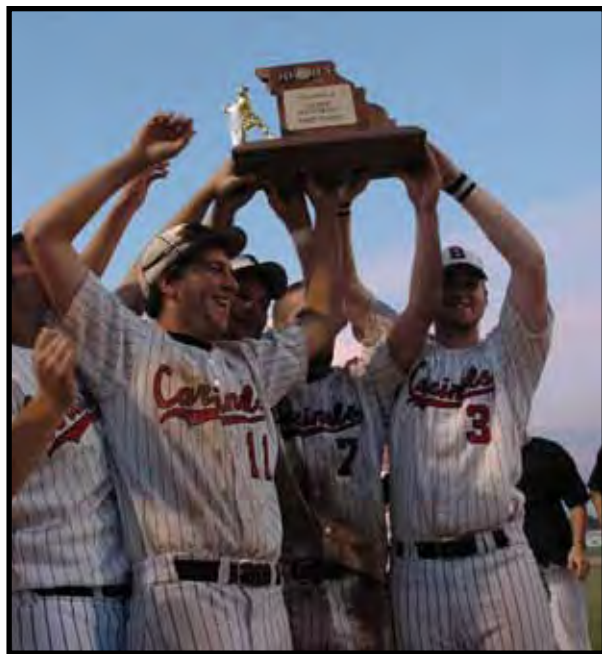

Accepted recommendations 1 through 17 and 19, denied item 18 of the Music Advisory Committee.

Accepted the recommendations of the Officials Advisory Committee.

Accepted recommendations 1 through 8 and 10, denied item 9 of the Speech and Debate Advisory Committee.

Accepted recommendations 1 through 3 and 5, and tabled item 4 (to check on facility availability) of the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee.

Board member Beem had a few concerns to possibly bring to the Softball and Baseball Advisory Committees: 1) metal spikes for softball, 2) base coaches to wear helmets.

Urhahn discussed with the Board, the lawsuit involving the Wisconsin Association and a national media outlet. No action taken.

Thompson informed the Board of three officials who have not responded to a Special Report. No action taken.

Thompson reported to the Board all schools have completed their responses to Special Reports.

Thompson reported to the Board three schools that should be fined for failing to submit spring officials' ratings.

Instructed MSHSAA staff to induce fine to the three schools who failed to submit spring officials' ratings.

Approved participation in the School Administrators Coalition for the 2010-11 school year.

Schroeder reported to the Board on the 2009-10 MSHSAA Leadership Schools which had a record number this year of 61 schools. There are four schools that have been Leadership Schools all 10 years.

Keel suggested correspondence from the Board to the four schools who have been Leadership Schools for the past 10 years.

Denied request by Louisiana High School to allow the local booster club to pay camp fees for certain students.

Approved concussion guidelines of the NFHS.

Richards raised concerns the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee had over football conditioning requirements which were implemented a few years ago.

Accepted the request from North Mercer and Princeton school districts to dissolve a girls softball cooperative agreement.

Accepted the bid from Professional Contractors & Engineers, Inc. for maintenance to the MSHSAA building.

Determined that non-MSHSAA awards not be allowed to be presented at the MSHSAA championships, and that other venues and times be determined by outside groups to present these awards.

Urhahn presented to the Board recommendations on dealing with non-traditional students. Beem suggested a few additions, such as citizenship, drug testing, adherence to local school requirements, etc. Sulser added the topic of transportation to and from events.

# Cross Country Reminders

The schools participating in boys and girls cross country are equally divided into four classes based on enrollment of the gender with the larger number of schools participating in the cross country district and state series.

**There are required online rules reviews offered during the 2010-11 school year.** Student eligibility and coaches' rosters must be submitted online at [www.mshsaa.org](http://www.mshsaa.org).

The district, sectional, and state entry process and deadlines shall be listed in the 2010-11 MSHSAA Cross Country Manual, which can be found on the



MSHSAA website ([www.mshsaa.org](http://www.mshsaa.org)).

Coaches should note that they must work to instruct their runners, managers, and fans to keep off the greens and out of the any roped off areas at Oak Hills Golf Center, Jefferson City, site of the state meets. Schools are required to locate their tents on the west half of No. 1 fairway and all of No. 10 fairway as a permanent location at Oak Hills (schools are liable at all times for their tents). The golf course, used through the courtesy of the Jefferson City Parks and Recreation Commission, is an outstanding location and facility for the state meet and coaches must be especially helpful in controlling abuses so that the Championships can remain there for years to come. No dogs or bicycles are permitted on the Oak Hills property!

As a final reminder, coaches and runners may tour the state meet course after 3:30 p.m. (weather permitting) on Friday prior to the meet. There will be no one allowed on the course prior to 3:30 p.m. on Friday, unless all course preparations have been completed prior to that time (announcements will be made at the course).

A computer chip method/process shall be used to determine places, team scores, and individual times at the 2010 State Championships. Each runner shall wear two computer chips, one securely attached to each shoe. All runners must run across the finish pad in order to receive a place and time. **No chips -- no place/time.**

# Show-Me Bowl Set for St. Louis

The Show-Me Bowl concept began in St. Louis in 1979. The bringing of all championship games to one site has continued with only slight modifications since then.

In 1982, a fifth class was added, and the site was moved to Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City. In 1982 and 1983, five games were played in one day. In 1984, a two-day format was used. That format was followed until the Board of Directors voted to move the games to the University of Missouri-Columbia and Missouri State University in Springfield in 1988. In 1996, the site of the 11-Man Championship was moved to the Edward Jones Dome in St. Louis, and in 2002, a sixth class was added with three games played on Friday and three on Saturday at the Dome.

In 1988 an 8-man championship was added and played at Northwest Missouri State University in Maryville. In 1997, the 8-Man Championship was moved to Tarkio Academy due to the NCAA Division II Playoffs. In 2008, the 8-Man Championship was moved to the Edward Jones Dome.

This will be the 15th year for the Show-Me Bowl to be held in the Edward Jones Dome.

# 2009 Golf Advisory Committee Summary

Held May 27, 2009

1. Recommend the Golf Rules Test and Answers be placed on the MSHSAA Website.
- \*2. Recommend the fees for all state golf courses be set at \$70 per individual.
- \*3. Recommend golf shirts designed to be tucked in, shall be tucked in and hats shall be worn facing forward with the brim down. First-time offense is a warning, second-time offense a 2 stroke penalty, and third-time offense disqualification.

4. Recommend the following formula for advancement from the district tournament to the sectional tournament beginning in 2010-11:

Each sectional tournament will be comprised of the following place finishers from two predetermined districts: The top two teams from each district advance to sectionals. The top 15 individuals (plus ties) advance to sectionals. Schools that qualify 4 or more individuals may compete in the team portion of the sectional tournament.

5. Recommend the following formula for advancement from the sectional round to the State Championships:

From each of the 4 sectional sites: The top two teams and 12 individual qualifiers (plus ties).

- If a team qualifies 4 or more individuals they may compete in the team portion of the state tournament.
  - If a school represented by four individual qualifiers (from districts) places first or second in the sectional, those four individuals must represent the school in the state tournament in the team competition. They may not add a fifth player.
6. Recommend that the odd numbered

districts select the sectional host and site during odd numbered years and even number districts select the sectional host and site for even numbered years.

7. Recommend that no team may compete on the same golf course more than once during the **MSHSAA POST SEASON**. (Example: A team cannot play Districts and Sectionals or Districts and State or Sectionals and State on the Same Course.)

## DIVING: State Qualifying Standards for 1M Diving

- **DD:** The total degree of difficulty for six (6) dives must be twelve (12.0) or higher.
- **POINTS:** The qualifying points necessary for both the boys meet and the girls meet are 210.
- **DIVE SELECTION – Six-Dive Meet:** As per the NFHS diving rules, in a six dive meet a diver must perform a voluntary dive (assigned DD through 1.8) and five optional dives. In order to qualify for state competition only: 1) dives 101, 201, 301, 401 and 5111 may not be selected as an optional dive, and 2) the five optional dives must represent all five groups. The voluntary dive shall be selected from the voluntary group of the week according to NFHS Rule 9-4-6.
- **DIVE SELECTION – Eleven-Dive Meet:** To qualify during a championship meet requiring eleven (11) dives, the competitor can pick six (6) of the eleven (11) dives by circling the dives to be used on the diving score sheet. In order to qualify for state competition only: 1) dives 101, 201, 301, 401 and 5111 may not be selected as an optional dive, and 2) the five optional dives selected for state qualification must represent all five groups. The MSHSAA and NFHS requirements for qualifying in a six (6) dive meet, including a dive from the voluntary group of the week, must be met. The competitor must complete all eleven (11) dives.

# MSHSAA Policy on Stacking Lineups in Tennis

The Tennis Advisory Committee and the MSHSAA Board of Directors is fundamentally opposed to "stacking." Stacking is the practice of placing tennis players in the line-up in a manner not consistent with rank ability, but rather for the purpose of gaining an advantage due to the match-ups created. This is a practice that is unacceptable due to the detrimental way that certain players (usually the lower level players) are placed and forced to compete. Coaches must be able to justify line-ups to competing coaches. The following is the procedure that all tennis coaches should use to insure that stacking does not occur.

1. Line-ups and Comprehensive Results shall be exchanged prior to the start of the match. Varsity line-ups and scorebooks/score sheets shall show all team/tournament results throughout the year up to that day. If a coach does not have his/her scorebook, the opposing coach shall submit a special report to the MSHSAA office.

2. Players must play in the order of ability. The line-up shall always be based on the order of ability. "Matching up" is prohibited. In singles, players must compete in order of rank ability with the best player on the team based on challenges and match results. In case of injury or sickness, all players must move up. This rule shall also apply to doubles play with the strongest doubles team at No. 1, etc.

a. A player shall not be moved down in the line-up because of:

- i. an injury that has forced a player out of the line-up; or
- ii. disciplinary measures.

b. Rank order shall be set by the Saturday of Week #12, Sept. 25, 2010, (girls season) and Week #43, April 30, 2010, (boys season). Rank order is

based on a player's ability, match results, and challenges. All members of the eligibility roster shall be included in the rank order.

- i. Rank order shall be submitted online to the district manager prior to the start of the district tournament. The district manager shall submit the rank orders to the coaches whose team qualify for state play.
- ii. Rank Order shall be submitted with the State Tennis Individual Entry Form (14B/32B) to the MSHSAA office.
- iii. Rank order shall be submitted to all coaches at the regional meet.
- iv. Rank order shall be submitted to all coaches at the sectional meet.
- v. Rank order shall be submitted to all coaches prior to state competition.

c. Doubles line-ups may be played in any order provided:

- i. Doubles rank orders will be determined by the sum total of the singles rank order value. Example: if the #1 and #2 singles play together their sum total is 3 points. If the #3 and #4 singles play together their sum total is 7 points. Therefore, #1 and #2 must play at the #1 doubles spot; #3 and #4 must play at the #2 doubles spot; etc.
- ii. When the sum total of the teams are the same (example: #3 and #4 play together and #2 and #5 play together—both teams point value is 7), the team with the highest ranked player must play at the higher doubles position. Therefore, #2 and #5 would play at the #1 doubles spot;

#3 and #4 would play at the #2 doubles spot; etc.

Exception: When sum totals of teams are of equal value and a team line-up can be justified based on doubles abilities it is legal to use that line-up in post-season only if the line-up has been used three times during the regular season in a 6 and 3 format or in doubles tournament(s) where 3 or more doubles teams were entered.

3. Line-up changes in back-to-back dual matches. In back-to-back dual meet matches (two consecutive dual meet matches played regardless of time between matches), the team line-up (as played) may be changed. A player may move up or down only one position in this situation. The line-up must still stay in order of ability. Prior to the start of the match and during the line-up exchange, it is the responsibility of the opposing coach to appeal any player being moved two or more positions in the line-up.

4. Appeals concerning unfair line-ups. If a coach feels that the opponent's line-up as presented is unfair, he should notify the opposing coach of the protest. Any coach who wishes to submit a match protest (after the completion of the match) must first inform the opposing coach in writing (by fax or e-mail), with a copy sent at the same time to the MSHSAA office. This is necessary even when the opposing coach was informed of the protest at the time of the match. This written protest must be made within 48 hours of the start of the match.

5. Cases in which stacking is determined, the offending school shall be disqualified from the match or the tournament.

## Tennis Playoffs To Have New Look for the 2010-11 Seasons

Starting with the 2010-11 school year the tennis playoffs will have a different look. Each class will expand to 16 districts with the number of schools in a district cut in half. This should alleviate some excessive travel for some schools.

All tennis teams that are registered for post season will qualify to participate in the team district tournament this year. The teams assigned to a district will be seeded and placed on a bracket. Using a 6 singles and 3 doubles dual format the bracket will be played out with the winner of the district tournament advancing to the team sectionals. Scoring for

the team tennis district shall be 2 out of 3 sets with "No-Ad" scoring. Team districts will occur between October 4-8, 2010 for the girls and May 9-13, 2011 for the boys.

The individual singles and doubles district tournament will be played on Saturday, October 9, 2010, for the girls and May 6, 2011 for the boys. Each school may enter up to two singles players and two doubles teams in the individual district tournament. The top two singles and doubles teams in the tournament will advance to the individual sectional round. Medals will be awarded as in the past. Points will no

longer be assigned to each round as the individual district has no bearing on the team competition.

The first place finisher will play a match against the second place finisher in another district. The winners of these matches will advance to the state tournament in Springfield. Each sectional will have two singles and two doubles teams advance to the state tournament. The winners will be placed on opposite sides of the state bracket.



## 2010 Golf Advisory Committee Summary

*Held May 26, 2010*

1. Recommended that the Golf Manual include the following information for District and Sectional Golf Managers: "The golf course shall be properly marked prior to the tournament. Hazards, Out of Bounds, abnormal ground conditions, and obstructions shall be properly marked and included on the Notice to Competitors and local rules shall be clearly stated."

2. Recommended that "Markers" be used at the Sectional Tournaments.

3. Recommended the following method of pairing golfers be used for Sectionals:

- A) The four teams that qualified by placing first or second in their respective districts shall be paired together at the Sectional tournament.
- B) The individual qualifiers shall be paired

according to their district score in relation to par from lowest to highest with no two players from the same team paired together.

4. Recommended the following items be included as survey items when MSHSAA surveys golf coaches.

A) Should the 10 stroke rule be used at the District Tournament?

B) Should "Markers" be used at Districts? Sectionals? State?

C) Should Teams be paired together both days of the State Tournament?

5. Recommended medals be awarded to the top 15 individuals plus ties at the District contest.

## Soccer Survey Required

The MSHSAA Board of Directors, at its June 2006 Board Meeting, approved the recommendation by the Soccer Advisory Committee that all schools participating in soccer submit a summary of all yellow and red cards received. The information obtained through the summaries will help in the evaluation of the current yellow and red card rules. All survey summaries should be completed and submitted in conjunction with the official's rating forms. The survey can be found on the MSHSAA website.

## Soccer Overtime Procedure

The overtime procedure for varsity regular season contests will include two ten-minute sudden victory periods with the National Federation Penalty Kick Procedure to follow if necessary. Overtime for the State Tournament beginning with District play will be two 15-minute sudden victory periods with the National Federation Penalty Kick procedure to follow if necessary.

## Ball Girls Needed at State Tourney

The 2010 MSHSAA Volleyball Championships will be played at the Municipal Auditorium in Kansas City, November 5-6. MSHSAA is looking for interested volleyball teams to serve as ball retrievers for the state tournament, and a total of six teams are needed. Sessions will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. At least six players would be needed to cover one court during a session. Up to 10 players will receive a championship t-shirt and free admission for the entire tournament. If your team is interested, please complete the form available on the MSHSAA web site, under Volleyball.

## Tennis Regular Season Rank Orders & Schedules Submitted Online

All coaches are required to submit their regular season rank orders online throughout the school year. Prior to the first regular season contest each coach must submit their rank order for singles and doubles. Submission of the rank orders can be done on the school's tennis schedule or eligibility roster pages. Each time a school changes the rank order for their team, coaches must use the online system to update their rank order. The update to the website must be done prior to using that rank order against an opposing school. Opposing coaches may view other teams rank order by viewing the opposing school's tennis schedule or eligibility roster. Rank orders will become locked on Saturday of week #12 for girls and on Saturday of week #43 for boys.

## Yellow & Red Card Summary Forms Required

In an effort to help facilitate the lines of communication between officials, coaches, and administrators as well as to provide a paper trail for the issuing of yellow and red cards a soccer game summary form has been developed. The hosting school will be required to provide a Yellow and Red Card Summary Form to the head official prior to the start of each game. A special report should be filed by officials to the MSHSAA Office on schools who do not provide the Yellow and Red Card Summary Form and schools should file a special report on officials who refuse to use or complete the Yellow and Red Card Summary Form during the game. The summary forms will provide administrators, coaches, and officials a written documentation of accumulated cards throughout the season, and designate whether the cards issued are "off-the-ball unsportsmanlike" or "other" violations. This should assist administrators and coaches in tracking the accumulation of yellow and red cards for players as well as the team 10-card rule for coaches and their respective penalties related to card accumulation.

- The yellow and red card summary form will be in triplicate.
- Hosting school will provide form before each game.
- The head official will track all cards assessed during the game.
- The official will provide both the visiting and home team coach a copy.
- The official will keep a copy for his or her own records.
- Violations of NFHS soccer rule 12-8-1: c, d, f2, 12-8-2: a, b, 12-8-3: a, b, d, e, or f will count towards the team 10-card count.
- Cards received marked "other" will not count towards the team 10-card count.
- "Other" cards will go toward an individual players card count.
- The cost of the Soccer Yellow and Red Card Summary Form is \$4 per 50 forms plus shipping and handling.
- Ordering information is located on the MSHSAA website.

## Soccer Advisory Committee Summary Held December 9, 2009

\*\*\* 1. Recommend maintaining standard enrollment breaks, but effective 2010-11 increase the number of districts to 16 when there are at least 64 schools per class. This increase in districts will add a sectional and quarterfinal round.

Amended: Recommend maintaining standard enrollment breaks, but effective 2010-11 increase the number of districts to 16 per class. This increase in districts will add a sectional and quarterfinal round.

2. Recommend to reiterate to district managers and officials, during the district and state tournament, that the official time should be kept on the scoreboard (when available).

\* 3. Recommend that as a part of the pre-game conference, the coaches and officials determine if overtime procedures will be used. If both coaches do not mutually agree during the pre-game conference to end regulation with a tie then the current procedure of ending a game using two 10-minute overtime periods and penalty kicks will be used to determine a winner.

\*\* 4. Recommend that a soccer jamboree consist of the following terms:

Three 25-minute periods when 4 teams participate.

Two 35-minute periods when 3 teams participate.

A jamboree cannot occur before the 9th day of conditioning or on or after the first legal contest day.

5. Recommend that the soccer field width for sectionals and quarterfinals be a minimum of 60 yards, but strongly recommend a width of 70 yards.

6. Recommend the following rotation schedule for sectionals and quarterfinals be implemented as outlined below:

Rotation for Sectional Host:

The host for sectionals will be the top team on bracket in odd years.

The host for sectionals will be the bottom team on bracket in even years.

Rotation for Quarterfinal Host:

The host for quarterfinals will be the top team on bracket in odd years.

The host for quarterfinals will be the bottom team on bracket in even years.

If both teams hosted sectionals, the top team on bracket will host quarterfinals.

If neither team hosted sectionals, the top team on bracket will host quarterfinals.

If one team hosted sectionals and one team didn't, the one that did not host sectionals will host quarterfinals.

# MSHSAA Board Policy On Volleyball Player Limitations

**3-out-of-5 Format Optional:**

Missouri schools may utilize the 3-out-of-5 format or the 2-out-of-3 format for varsity level dual matches only (not in triangulars, quads or tournaments). In the 3-out-of-5 format, the first school to win three sets wins the match and the fifth set, if needed, is played to 15 points rather than 25 points (win by two). Schools and/or conferences may utilize the 3-out-of-5 format for one or more of their varsity dual matches, as agreed upon by both schools and officials in advance. The format for the match must be clearly specified on the game contract and the officials' contracts prior to the contest. Lower level contests (junior high, freshmen, junior varsity) will continue to be played in the 2-out-of-3 format only. The 2-out-of-3 format will continue to be used in the district and state series until a majority of volleyball playing schools support moving the district and state series to the 3-out-

of-5 format.

**2-out-of-3 Format:**

When a team is participating in dual competition on one calendar date against the same school during regular season, and the varsity squad is playing *the 2-out-of-3* format, the following player limitations will be in effect *on that date*:

1. A player may participate in a maximum of three sets, or one full match at a lower level plus one set in a second match at a higher level.

**3-out-of-5 Format:**

When a team is participating in dual competition on one calendar date against the same school during regular season, and the varsity squad (only) is playing the **3-out-of-5** format, the following player limitations will be in effect on that date:

1. A player that will be playing exclusively on the varsity squad may participate in up to 5 sets on that date.

2. A player that is splitting time between the junior varsity match and the varsity match may participate in 4 or 5 sets on that date only in a combination that would prevent the student from participating in two complete matches (see table below for specific legal combinations).

3. A player that is participating on three different levels may participate in a maximum of three sets.

4. A player that is playing exclusively on the junior varsity squad, or splitting between the junior varsity match and a freshman match may participate in any legal combination that is outlined for the 2-out-of-3 format.

All legal softball bats shall meet the 2004 ASA Bat Performance Standard, bear the 2000 or 2004 ASA certification mark, and not be on the ASA non-approval list as found on the ASA web site at [www.asasoftball.com](http://www.asasoftball.com). Softball bats that do not meet this standard are not legal and cannot be used in interscholastic competition. ## Basketball Advisory Committee Summary

*Held April 16, 2010*

\*\*\*1. Recommend that MSHSAA survey all athletic directors and varsity basketball head coaches regarding the implementation of the shot clock.

Amended: Recommend that MSHSAA survey all athletic directors, administrators (principals/superintendents), and varsity basketball head coaches regarding the implementation of a shot clock.

\*\*2. Recommend that an additional item regarding officials' calls in relation to physical play be placed on the officials rating system. A 1-5 rating, as we currently have, with 1 being "allows physical play" etc.

\*3. Recommend allowing an individual athlete to play in a maximum of six quarters per night but an individual athlete may not exceed season quarter limitations of five times the number of regular season contests.

\*\*\*4. Recommend when a team has only completed one game of a tournament and the tournament is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, a team may count this game as a regular season contest and schedule one additional regular season contest.

Amended: Recommend that an item be placed on the Annual Ballot to amend MSHSAA By-Laws 326 and 332. The change would allow a team who has completed one game in a tournament and the remainder of the tournament is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances to count the completed game as a regular season game and the ability to schedule one additional regular season game.

## MSHSAA By-Law 910 for Fall Sports

A player who is ejected from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall at a minimum be prohibited from playing in the next interscholastic contest at that same level. A coach who is ejected during a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall at a minimum be prohibited from coaching and attending the next interscholastic contest for that team. Listed below are rules references for the By-Law 910 ejection procedures:

- Softball: Any player or coach ejected from an interscholastic contest under NFHS Softball Rule 3-6.
- Soccer: Any player or coach ejected from an interscholastic contest under NFHS Soccer Rule 12-8-2, 12-8-3, or 12-8-4.
- Football: Any player or coach disqualified (ejected) from an interscholastic contest under NFHS Football Rule 9-4, 9-5 or 9-8.
- Volleyball: Any player or coach disqualified from an interscholastic volleyball match under NFHS Volleyball Rule 12.
- Girls Golf: Any player or coach disqualified from an interscholastic golf match under the 2010-11 MSHSAA Golf Manual Terms and Conditions.
- Cross Country: Any participant or coach disqualified from an interscholastic cross country meet under NFHS Track and Field and Cross Country Rule 9-6-3 and 4-5-1, 2.
- Girls Tennis: Any player disqualified from an interscholastic tennis match under the 2010-11 MSHSAA Tennis Manual Terms and Conditions.

# Speech, Debate & Theater Advisory Committee Meeting Summary

Held May 4, 2010

1. Recommend that late fees for additional district speech, debate, and theatre entries submitted by a school that entered by the published deadline shall not be assessed if such additional entries are received seven or more days prior to the start of the district tournament.

2. Recommend that a school be fined \$100 for a drop or withdraw from the State Speech, Debate, and Theatre tournament.

3. Recommend that non-internet connected computers be allowed in Cross-Examination Debate for a one-year trial basis, as per NFL rules, during the 2010-11 school year, including at the District and State Tournaments. Invitational tournament hosts may choose to prohibit the use of such computers.

4. Recommend that the final speeches in Public Forum Debate be extended from 1 minute to 2 minutes beginning with the 2010-11 school year.

5. Recommend that quality points be added to the Public Forum Debate ballot, similar to the Lincoln Douglas ballot.

6. Recommend that the statement "Attire which identifies characters or differentiates performers is not allowed and will be considered costuming." be added to 6-E-10 in the Speech, Debate, and Theatre Manual.

7. Recommend that the sentence "Programs shall not be permitted to be distrib-

uted in One-Act Play or Readers Theatre at the district or State Tournaments," be moved from 6-D-6 to 6-D-7 in the Speech, Debate, and Theatre Manual.

8. Recommend that the sentence "; title(s) and author(s) of all selections must be identified." be added to 6-F-1(b), 6-G-1(e), 6-H-1(b), 6-I-1(b), 6-J-1(b), and 6-K-1(d) in the Speech, Debate, and Theatre Manual.

\*9. Recommend that the number of tournaments that a seventh or eighth grade student can attend be increased from five to seven.

10. Recommend that the sentence "A student may not participate in both the Readers Theatre and One-Act Play events." be changed to "A student may not perform in both the Readers Theatre and One Act Play." in 6-D-2 and 6-E-2 of the Speech, Debate, and Theatre Manual.

### Speech and Debate Reminders

Students enrolled in grades 9-12 may participate in no more than 11 interscholastic events during the school year, inclusive of the Missouri NFL Tournament but exclusive of the MSHSAA district and state tournaments. A junior high school may participate in a maximum of five interscholastic speech and/or debate meets, festivals, and/or tournaments in a school year. These events may be held any time during the school year.

No senior high school interscholastic debate, dramatics, or speech events, other than the allowances listed below, shall be held before the second Friday in October (October 8, 2010) nor later than the date of the MSHSAA district tournament. A school may participate in one interscholastic event following districts and prior to the Friday of Memorial Day weekend. Such an event shall count as one of the school's allowable regular season events as per By-Law 262.0 (Limits on Participation) and must meet the travel regulations per By-Law 530-d. Teams or individuals representing a school may participate in

interstate, interscholastic events which may begin no earlier than the Friday of Memorial Day weekend, only if the school has advanced from a qualifying event that takes place during the aforementioned season or if the event's selection procedure has been approved by the MSHSAA Board of Directors.

**There are required online rules reviews offered during the 2010-11 school year.**

Eligibility rosters are required for Speech, Debate, and Drama students. These are done by logging onto our website ([www.mshsaa.org](http://www.mshsaa.org)) going to your school's page, and then "Student Eligibility."

# Guidelines for Bands Performing at Football Contests

The participation of bands at a school football contest is an exciting aspect of the event. The band contributes to the event by increasing the level of excitement and adding a “touch of class” to the festivities. In order to maintain a proper perspective and to insure equity in competition for the participating teams, a few guidelines must be followed.

- During the contest, bands are to play only during pregame, halftime, postgame, the time between quarters, timeouts (except injury time-outs) and between plays (stopping prior to the referee’s whistle for “ready for play”).
- Bands that are seated near the end zone should not play if the line of scrimmage is inside the 10-yard line on the end close to the band. After a touchdown, field goal, extra point, or safety, the band may play the school fight song, etc., however, the director must be sure to stop playing when the official blows the “ready for play” whistle to start the next play.
- When bands want to warm-up prior to halftime, directors should arrange this so that it is done in an area that is not a distraction to the contest. Note: No whistles may be used while the game is in progress.
- Because the band acts as a spirit group, members should always act in a positive manner and must not do anything to distract or negatively affect the opposing team. It is the director’s responsibility to prevent his/her band from playing at inappropriate times, playing inappropriate music, or taunting the opposing team.

The band must display courtesy and respect toward the players, cheerleaders, and fans. To do anything else is not only a distraction from the contest but also reflects negatively on the band, the director, and the school. Support your school and team in a positive manner!

# Sideline Cheer Questions & Answers

The following are some of the most commonly asked questions regarding competition for cheerleaders.

**Question 1:** *Our school would like to sponsor a competitive cheer team to participate in various competitive events throughout the school year. There are members of our sideline cheer team who would like to participate on the competitive cheer team as well. Is this allowed?*

**Answers 1:** MSHSAA has no jurisdiction over competitive cheer. Therefore it would be considered a “club activity” (much like ice hockey, or bowling) with oversight of this activity administered through the local school administration. However, please be advised that participants are covered under the MSHSAA catastrophic insurance for sideline cheer only. Any injuries sustained while involved with competitive cheer are not covered under the MSHSAA insurance policy. **(By-Law 270)**

**Question 2:** *One of our varsity football cheerleaders would like to compete during the high school football season with an independent cheering team. May she do so?*

**Answer 2:** MSHSAA has no jurisdiction over competitive cheer. Whether a school sideline cheerleader may participate in competitive cheer with an independent cheer team during the season she is cheering for the school is a local school administration decision. **(By-Law 270)**

**Question 3:** *Our school has recently added competitive cheer as a club activity. Is it allowable for the competitive cheer team to wear the school cheer uniform when participating in competitive cheer events?*

**Answer 3:** MSHSAA has no jurisdiction over competitive cheer. If a school sponsors a club competitive cheer team, the use of the school cheer uniforms and equipment is a local school administrative decision. **(By-Law 270)**

**Question 4:** *Does sideline cheer conditioning practice count toward the 14 days of*

*required practice for any other athletic sport (i.e. volleyball, soccer, basketball, etc.)?*

**Answer 4:** No. Sideline cheer conditioning practices will not count toward the athletic conditioning requirement. **(By-Law 270)**

**Question 5:** *Is a student who is participating on an athletic squad required to meet the conditioning standard again if the student will be participating in sideline cheer the next sports season?*

**Answer 5:** No. Sports conditioning practices will count toward the sideline cheer conditioning requirement, as long as no more than seven days has elapsed between the last game or sports practice and the first sideline cheer practice. **(By-Law 270)**

## Schools to Approve Non-faculty Music Directors

By-Law 143 specifies that non-faculty music directors must meet the same qualifications as non-faculty coaches.

To qualify as a head music director, an individual must hold a valid teacher’s certificate. To qualify as an assistant non-faculty music director (any non-faculty director that provides music instruction) an individual must hold a valid substitute teacher’s certificate. In addition, each non-faculty music director must be approved by the Board of Directors. The school must annually submit to MSHSAA an application form for each music director that needs approval.

A music director is defined as someone who provides music instruction only. An auxiliary director/flag sponsor, etc. is not considered a music director, and approval is not required for these positions. A drum line instructor would need approval and must meet the above criteria.



# Music Advisory Committee Summary

Held May 26, 2010

1. Recommend that Section 12-A-9 for large and small ensembles now read as: Failure to supply the adjudicator with an appropriate score (i.e. arranger, edition, voicing, etc) showing all the parts of the work or an incomplete score be changed from disqualification to an overall lowered rating for the event. The exception for string duets will still remain.

2. Recommend the penalty for large vocal ensembles performing 2-part literature shall result in disqualification of the event.

3. Recommend language be included in the music manual under Sections 7-B-2, 7-C-2-c and 7-C-3-c stating the penalty for duplication of personnel in large ensembles shall result in disqualification of the event.

4. Recommend to increase the maximum number of performers in chamber choir from 30 to 32.

5. Recommend that at the time of the performance failure to supply the adjudicator with the individual soloist part (not the piano accompaniment) be changed from disqualification to an overall lowered rating.

6. Recommend the following statement be included in Section 7-B and 9-A of the MSHSAA Music Manual. Class 1, 2 and 3 Mixed Choirs that perform only SATB literature during performance must sing SATB literature during the sight reading performance.

7. Recommend a group be disqualified when it has been verified by the festival manager that the same personnel that participated during the performance portion of the festival did not participate in sight reading.

8. Recommend once a selection has been removed from the sight reading rotation it returns to the composer to sell, publish or return to MSHSAA to make available in PDF format to schools for educational purposes.

9. Recommend clarifying the wording in the music manual by changing the word 'verbal' to 'audible' in section 9.

10. Recommend moving section 8-A-6 to 8-A-2 and change the phrase 'Internet or CD copied music' to 'electronically generated music'.

11. Recommend language be included in the MSHSAA Music Manual under Section 8-A and 8-G allowing the use of unpublished, commissioned works for large group festivals only. Commissioned pieces for large ensembles may be used at evaluative festivals under the following conditions:

a. An electronically engraved full score (i.e. not handwritten) is provided.

b. Proper documentation is provided to the district festival manager, adjudicators and the MSHSAA office verifying permission of the piece to be performed by the composer.

12. Recommend creating a mens trio, mens sextet, mixed trio and mixed sextet events to the vocal small ensemble events list.

13. Recommend including the following statements to the MSHSAA Music Manual under Section 8.

Section 8-A-5-b

Definition of Multi-movement Works: For a selection to be considered a multi-movement work, it must have three or more movements.

It should be in sonata or suite form and each section must be separate, titled and performable alone. Theme and variations form is not considered a multi-movement work.

Section 8-A-5-c

Instrumental soloists and small instrumental ensembles will be required to perform selections listed on the

MSHSAA Prescribed Graded Music List.

All selections must be performed as written or indicated by ( ) on the graded music list. If no information appears in ( ) beside the title of the work the performer(s) will be expected to perform the entire work as written (including repeats). Refer to Section 8-A-5-b regarding multi-movement works.

In instances where a second selection is needed the work must be performed as indicated on the MSHSAA Prescribed Graded Music List.

14. Recommend adding the word 'any' to Section 8-A-2-b-1 of the MSHSAA Music Manual.

Section 8-A-2-b-1

An ensemble (large or small) shall not sing or play a selection that was used as an evaluative festival selection from the same school in the any previous year if an individual student, or students, performed in that ensemble.

15. Recommend allowing large group events to submit late entries after the second penalty deadline for a fee of \$300 per group.

16. Recommend the following be placed on

the Annual Ballot to amend MSHSAA By-Law 440-a, to now state: a) District music festivals evaluate the events from each participating school. b) The state music festival evaluates events that have been awarded a superior rating at the district festival and provides the opportunity for an even higher level of performance expectation and adjudicator evaluation.

17. Recommend a sub-committee representing advisory committee members, district festival managers and adjudicator trainers be formed to review the number of events allowed to enter the district festival by school for each classification level, adjudicator training and philosophical and procedural items associated with the festivals.

\*18. Recommend that drum-set solos be allowed as a multiple percussion event on a two year trial basis based upon the criteria presented, with the music advisory committee to review at the end of the second year.

19. Recommend to include the word 'district' in the Purpose and Philosophy section of the music manual as well as the following statement defining the festivals.

The evaluative district and state music festival events reflect the standard instrumentation and/or voicing found in the traditional choral setting, concert band or orchestra.

## Scholar Bowl Advisory Committee Summary

3. Recommended an editorial change in the title of this event from "Academic Competition" to "Scholar Bowl" in all documents and references in order to more adequately represent the nature of the activity to the general public and MSHSAA member schools.

1st Proposal was from Emily Pike, NAQT, Bloomington, Minnesota with a total of 19 pages including a sample game.

2nd Proposal was from M ke Hurley, Questions Galore, Wheaton, Illinois with a total of 26 pages including a sample game.

Both of these proposals will be sent via email attachment to the Scholar Bowl Advisory Committee for review. The Scholar Bowl Advisory Committee will meet to discuss proposals and make a recommendation to the Board of Directors on July 14, 2010 at 9:00 a.m. by conference call.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.



# MSHSAA Official's Rating Procedure

1. Officials working senior high school regular season varsity games must be rated by the schools. Officials are not rated for postseason contests. Rate each official every time he or she officiates for you.

2. The MSHSAA Board of Directors requires the high school athletic director to verify that his or her school's sports officials rating forms have been completed accurately by the respective head coaches. The ratings shall be entered on the MSHSAA web site.

3. If a 5 rating has been given to an official, the head coach shall provide an explanation on line as to why that rating was necessary.

4. Coaches should wait 48 hours after a contest prior to rating an official. However, coaches are encouraged to submit their official's ratings on line through out the season and not wait until the end of the season. Coaches are asked to submit ratings on line every two weeks or at a minimum after each month of the season. This should make it easier for the coach to provide accurate ratings rather than trying to remember individual performances at the end of the season. Plus it will aid the MSHSAA in making postseason officials assignments as the executives will have current information on an official's ability rather than using ratings from the previous year.

5. Schools shall submit the required official's ratings on the MSHSAA web site by the established deadline. **These rating forms shall include regular season contests only.**

6. Schools that fail to submit the required official's ratings by the established deadline shall be issued a \$25 late penalty fee and sent a reminder letter to the principal, giving the school additional days to submit the required official's ratings.

7. Schools that fail to submit the required official's ratings within these additional days shall be placed on probation in the sport concerned by the MSHSAA Board of Directors and assessed a penalty fee of \$100.

8. A certified letter shall be sent to the superintendent indicating the consequence if the ratings are not submitted for a second consecutive year and that probation is automatically extended for one year.

9. If a school does not submit the required ratings in the same sport for a second consecutive year by the established deadline, the MSH-

SAA shall send a reminder letter to the principal indicating that the school has been assessed a \$25 late penalty fee and that the school has additional days to submit the required ratings. A letter shall also be sent to the district school board president notifying the board of the situation.

10. If the MSHSAA does not receive the required official's ratings within these additional days the school will have probation extended and be assessed a penalty fee of \$200 by the MSHSAA Board of Directors and the school administrator and person responsible for not submitting the required official's ratings shall appear before the MSHSAA Board of Directors to show cause why the school should not be considered to be suspended from the district and state tournament series in the sport concerned for the ensuing school year.



# Responsibilities for Game Officials

It is the responsibility of game officials to see that contests are played in accordance with the rules. Officials must promptly and consistently penalize infractions of the rules. This is true regardless of the score, whom it may hurt, or how it may affect an official's future relationship with a coach. Officials must have courage to call fouls as they occur without showing emotion. The same is true with the other responsibilities an official assumes when he puts on the striped shirt and walks out on the field or court.

- The responsibilities of rules makers involve defining legal and/or illegal actions in a sport and then prescribing penalties for illegal acts.

- The responsibilities of game officials involve interpreting the spirit and intent of the published rules and applying them to game situations.

- The prescribed penalties automatically occur when calls are made by the officials.

- Therefore, the judgments of the officials should focus on the actions of the participants and not on whether they consider the prescribed fouls and penalties to be appropriate.

The MSHSAA has received several reports from schools indicating that officials have failed to file special reports for incidents of unsportsmanlike conduct or player ejections or have filed them so late that they are not received until after the next contest. You are reminded to file a special report with the MSHSAA and the school concerned for all acts of unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of players, coaches, and fans. The act should be penalized promptly and consistently and the report is to be filed within 48 hours following the game. It is also impera-

tive that officials verbally communicate complete information to the coaches and the official scorer (if applicable) regarding the specifics of the unsportsmanlike conduct.

It is important that administrators and coaches be in a position to take corrective action in these situations. Thus, these reports are required in an effort to help put these individuals in a better situation to take the necessary action and prevent future problems. Officials who fail to file reports are doing a disservice to the schools and to their fellow officials who might have to work under similar conditions in future games. Further, they are jeopardizing their future registration status with the MSHSAA. Officials are reminded to file special reports for all levels of play (varsity, junior varsity, sophomore,

freshman and junior high).

The MSHSAA and its Board of Directors, if necessary, will deal with the misconduct problem of every unsportsmanlike act or ejection. Regardless of the severity of the situation, it must be reported to the MSHSAA and the offending school.

A report is always necessary, even if the official assumes or has been told that the school will "handle the situation" by itself. This requirement applies to all sports and to all levels of competition.

Officials are also reminded that if they are working a game which is protested, they as officials are to file a detailed report with the MSHSAA within 24 hours.





## Part II Exam Deadline for Officials

All registered officials are required to complete a National Federation examination in the sports of football, basketball, baseball, wrestling, soccer, softball and volleyball. Each official will go to the MSHSAA website at [www.mshsaa.org](http://www.mshsaa.org) and log into their personal account. The Part II test will be located under "Miscellaneous". Officials are required to score at least 75% on the test.

Approximately two weeks before the championships, Mark Mills, a championship announcer for the Missouri State High School Association, contacted the NASPAA to say that some things had come up and that the MSHSAA needed a couple of announcers.

The NASPAA gladly accepted the responsibility and went to work. Announcing a state championship is something that many announcers never have the opportunity to experience. Being able to participate in the process that would provide announcers with the opportunity to announce a state championship meant a lot to the NASPAA.

Missouri and Kansas members were invited to submit their resumes to Mr. Mills, who coordinated the selections with Jason West, MSHSAA Communications Director. The two individuals who were selected were David Ceule, P.A. Announcer for Blue Springs South High School in Blue Springs, Missouri and Ken Corum, P.A. Announcer for Oak Park High School in Kansas City, Missouri.

"I had no doubt that the NASPAA would be able to accommodate our request," commented Mark Mills, NASPAA Board Member. "The NASPAA has a wealth of talented members. I would not be at all surprised if more state associations use the NASPAA to help find qualified announcers for their championships. I know that we will not hesitate to turn to the NASPAA whenever we need announcers." Below is what Mr. Ceule and Mr. Corum had to say about their opportunity.

**David Ceule, CPAA**

After surviving a long school day and the first day of track and field practice on March 1, I sat down at my desk to check my email and prepare for the next day before heading home. I was surprised to see an email from Brad Rumble stating that the MSHSAA was seeking some NASPAA members to assist with announcing duties at the state basketball tournaments in Columbia, Missouri. While I have announced many district softball and basketball tournaments, sectional volleyball matches, and semi-final football games, I had never been given the opportunity to announce at the state championship level. When I arrived home that evening, I immediately powered up my laptop and sent my resume to Mark Mills.

A couple of weeks passed before I received a phone call from Jason West, communications director of the MSHSAA. He invited me to Columbia to announce some of the Class 1, 2, and 3 boys and girls basketball games in Columbia. After working out the details at home, I was headed to Columbia to announce at the Mizzou Arena, one of the finest basketball facilities in the country and home of the Missouri Tigers!

The atmosphere at the state tournament was great, and it was a privilege to work with the MSHSAA at such a class event. Everyone at the scorers' table and throughout the arena was very welcoming and helpful. While I was nervous before the first semi-final game I announced, it did not take long at all for me to become comfortable behind the microphone at such a large venue. This was in part thanks to Keith Sampson, a long time announcer for the MSHSAA at the state level. I had the opportunity to observe Keith announcing one game before I was up, and I was also able to speak with him between games and get his perspective on announcing at the state level. The best advice he gave me was simply "just stay out of the way of the game" – certainly not a new concept to me, but it was a good re-iteration of what a professional announcer does, especially at the high school level – even at the state tournament.

I realized I didn't have to feel like I was "the show," which made me feel right at home, just like I was announcing a game back in the gym at Blue Springs South. In fact, the pressure of announcing at state was less than back home in some regards. For example, I am accustomed to trying to keep individual and team fouls on my own or taking a quick peek at the scoreboard (hoping it's right), but the official scorers at the Mizzou table are so efficient, they signal the number of individual and team fouls before the announcer even has a chance to think about it – a luxury any announcer would appreciate!

Overall, announcing at the state tournament was an incredible event that I hope I have the opportunity to experience again. Thanks again to Keith Sampson, Mark Mills with the NASPAA for his advice and leadership, and Jason West with the MSHSAA for inviting me to be a part of the tournament.

**Ken Corum, CPAA**

The NASPAA was instrumental in providing me with an opportunity to announce at the Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA) state basketball tournament at Mizzou Arena in Columbia,

All of these individuals announced during the week, and I got to experience different styles, ask questions and get constructive critique. So, it turned out to be a tremendous week from a number of different standpoints. I hope to have the opportunity to serve the student-athletes of Missouri next year and beyond.
