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# A NOTE FROM FR. CHRIS

Good morning! Our pastor Father Walter invited me to write a little something to introduce myself, so... here I am!

I was born on February 14, 1971 in Toledo, Ohio, but spent most of my life just north in Michigan (Archdiocese of Detroit). I have two older brothers and a younger sister. On June 27, 1998, I had the honor and privilege to be ordained a missionary priest with the PIME Missionaries.

It is so hard to believe that 25 years have already passed since my ordination! From the Italian youth that I ministered to in Treviso during the first three years of my priesthood I learned about the joy, energy and happiness present in our faith when we put it into action. From the Mixtec Indians that I had the honor of serving in the mission of Cuanacaxtitlan, Guerrero, Mexico I learned how Jesus is present in the simplest of actions, words, surroundings, and people. From the troubled teens that I served at Boys' Village in Wooster, Ohio I learned about God's compassion, forgiveness and endless "second chances" to all of those who seek him with a sincere heart. From the Anglo and Hispanic Communities that I served in Detroit, Michigan for seven years as pastor of All Saints Parish I learned what it means to live Church truly as **family**, where we all share in each other's joys, strengths, weaknesses, challenges... striving to lift each other up as we witness to the presence of the Holy Spirit in all people! From my year of sabbatical studying at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome I learned about true liturgy and true pastoral care. From my 7 years in the Brazilian Amazon - and especially my six years as pastor of St. Benedict Parish in Manaus (with 12 city churches and 30,000 parishioners!) – I learned what it means to work together as one Body of Christ, trusting each other, empowering everybody, and evangelizing through our striving for unity! And from my year serving the Brazilian and American communities in Peabody, I learned patience and friendship... and to be open to whatever God may have in store for these next years! Through it all, I've been blessed so much! I can honestly and truly say that I am so much happier to be a priest now than I was at the beginning!

From our Holy Church I have received so much! From Pope John Paul II I developed a love for our Blessed Mother and for the beauty of Family. From Pope Benedict XVI I developed a greater understanding of the divinity of God and of his Incarnation in Jesus. And from Pope Francis I learned even more about the humanity of Jesus in his forgiveness, compassion, charity and outreach.


To be sure, I still have a ways to go in my own faith formation, but I thank God for the possibility he has given me to know Him and serve Him in these 25 years... encountering Him in all of those places, people, moments and situations when I least expected it. One way or another God has always "got me where I needed to be when I needed to be there"! And now he has brought me here to be a part of this Wilmington family of Transfiguration Parish!

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Late in spring, my young nieces would stay with me for a few hours while their parents worked. I had them plant an assortment of small flowering plants. During the summer, they often would help me water the garden and marvel at the size and beauty of the flowers that grew so quickly. By summer's end, the mature plants added beauty and grace to an otherwise barren spot.

When Jesus is transformed before the Apostles, he is not just a bright light in a dark moment. He reveals something new and as yet unseen: the glory of the Father, proclaimed in the Law and the Prophets, and now fully seen in the person of Jesus. This is God's love and mercy, promising new hope and new life to the whole world. Encouraged by their vision, the Apostles would be the first to witness to Jesus and to the Gospel.

Every so often, we may get a small insight into faith. An understanding of the Gospel, or a new appreciation for the sacraments or a sense of awe during a special holy day can reinvigorate our faith. It gives us an added incentive to seek the truth or to delve more deeply into our beliefs. It may also be the little spark that renews a faltering faith. Look for those little moments when we are transformed. When we seek the Lord, He is always to be found.

#### WHAT IS THIS FEAST ALL ABOUT?

ow are we to understand the Transfiguration? The story of the Transfiguration is also proclaimed on the second Sunday of Lent-a key part of Jesus' journey towards the Cross. The Catechism of the Catholic Church draws parallels between Jesus' Baptism and the Transfiguration. Jesus is baptized at the start of his public ministry. His baptism proclaims the mystery of our first regeneration-we die and rise again with Christ. The "Transfiguration 'is the sacrament of the second regeneration': our own Resurrection (St. Thomas Aquinas, STh III, 45, 4, ad 2). From now on we share in the Lord's Resurrection through the Spirit who acts in the sacraments of the Body of Christ. The Transfiguration gives us a foretaste of Christ's glorious coming, when he 'will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body (Phil 3:21)" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 556). During the Prayer after Communion, we pray that God might "transform us into the likeness of your [his] Son, / whose radiant splendor you willed to make manifest / in his glorious Transfiguration." The Collect, or opening prayer, tells us that the mystery of the Transfiguration "prefigures our full adoption to sonship." The Transfiguration, initially revealed to Peter, James, and John, reveals to all of us a taste of what is yet to come.



The Transfiguration is the fourth of the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary. Spend time praying the luminous mysteries at home today:






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
