Acer rubrum

This Red Maple offers a dense, rounded form, made thicker by green, trident shaped leaves that provide shade and cover. Deep red flowers appear in early to mid-April offering one of the earliest nectar sources for native bees and butterflies while Autumn's fiery crimson foliage is amazing. Plant in full sun to part shade. Prefers moist, acidic soils with good drainage but grows well in average to wet, well-drained soil. This is a big tree so give it plenty of room to reach full size.



It is recommended to wear gloves when harvesting as contact dermatitis has been known to occur. The leaves turn yellow in the fall and provide interest. It is a flowering tree that attracts butterflies, pollinators, small mammals, and songbirds, which makes pawpaw a good addition to a butterfly, pollinator, or rain garden. Flies and beetles are attracted to the flower of the tree and are beneficial pollinators that contribute to the odd odor of the flower.

Cercis canadensis

The Redbud is a beautiful native flowering tree with pink pea-like flowers which bloom profusely on bare branches in early spring before the foliage emerges. The foliage consists of alternate heart shaped leaves. The Redbud has a short trunk and lateral branches. The bark is reddish-brown with fissures. Seeds are born in brown flattened bean-like dry seedpods 2 to 4 inches long that mature in late summer to autumn. In its natural habitat the Redbud grows as an understory tree in open woodlands and thickets. Its compact size and flowering make it a desirable ornamental landscape tree for gardens, and it attracts bees and birds.

Chionanthus virginicus

A carefree native, this small tree puts on a heck of a show in late spring with thousands of pendulous, delicately fragrant white flowers covering the tree before the leaves emerge. At the end of bloom season, the green leaf tips accent the snowy blooms for an impressive finale. It's no wonder the Fringetree has been a garden favorite and heritage plant for generations. It is dioecious, meaning that there are male and female trees. The males are typically showier in bloom due to their longer petals; however, it is the female plants that are adorned with dark blue fruit in late summer. Birds relish the fleshy fruit and will find it easily, even though the foliage sometimes hides it from view. The best way to enjoy the fringetree is to have at least one of each, and to be certain you get a male and female, purchase them in late summer or early fall when fruit will be present on the female plants.

Fringetree is easily grown in average to medium wet, well-drained soil in full sun to part shade. It prefers moist, fertile soils, but tolerates a wide variety, including the red clay of the south. Chionanthus virginicus seldom needs pruning but benefits from some branch thinning if an open habit is desired. Tolerant of air pollution, it adapts well to urban settings.



Clematis virginiana

This easy to grow vine is a rapid grower, climbs by twisting petioles, and has bright green foliage. It prefers rich, moist, well-drained soil in the full sun to partial to heavy shade. Though it will grow in the dry shade. It is one of the few vines that will flower with large amounts of shade. It works well in a woodland or native garden where it has room to twine up supports or fences, otherwise, it will scramble along the ground, and it can grow over and overwhelm landscape shrubs. It can be pruned any time during the growing season to maintain shape and encourage bushiness. If it gets too large, prune it back to 8-12" above the ground - back to strong leaf buds - any time from the late fall to early spring to promote new growth in the spring. It does self-seed and can become weedy through suckering as well. This plant has medium severity poison characteristics.

Cornus florida

Flowering dogwood has spreading horizontal branches and distinctive white flowers in spring. The 3" diameter flower clusters bloom mid-April to mid-May, attracting a number of butterflies and other pollinators. Clusters of glossy red fruit mature in fall and persist into winter when they are eaten by birds. The leaves turn scarlet red in fall.

Grow in full sun to part shade. Plant in well-drained soil with adequate soil moisture. Does not tolerate dry soil. Prefers organically rich, acidic soil.

Diospyros virginiana Common Persimmon

Deciduous tree in the ebony family, with a 1-to-2-foot diameter erect trunk with alligator bark. Native to central and eastern US. It is slow-growing and thicket forming and can be a nuisance in fields. It can take 10 to 15 years before the tree bears fruit. The trees are usually dioecious (separate male and female and both are needed for fruiting to occur). Flowering is in spring to early summer with fruit ripening in the fall. The 1-to-2-inch fruits are orange and very sweet when ripe. They are a source of food for many types of birds and mammals. It is astringent when green, but sweet when soft and ripe and may be eaten raw, or used in syrups, jellies, ice cream and pies.



Eupatorium maculatum 'Gateway'

Joe Pye Weed is common in native to damp meadows, thickets and coastal areas in eastern North America. Plants typically grow 4-7' tall on branched, purple-speckled stems clad with serrate, lance-shaped, medium green leaves (to 8" long) that typically appear in coils of 3-6. Tiny, light to deep purple flowers bloom from mid-summer to early fall.





Heliopsis helianthoides var. scabra 'Burning Hearts'

This native is a natural show off in the garden with large, daisy-like yellow-orange flowers that fade to bronze. This plant offers a continuous stream of buds that open from July through September. 'Burning Hearts' is cold hardy, deer resistant and provides nectar for many native pollinators. Prefers moist, well-drained soil in full sun, but may tolerate drought. Propagate by seed, cuttings or division every 2-3 years. Deadhead to extend the blooming season. Low maintenance. Best utilized in the back of a border garden to accent lower growing, brightly colored perennials, as well as wildflower and cutting gardens.

Heuchera longiflora

A beautiful display when used in a group, the long flowering stems of this alumroot sway high above deep green foliage mottled in silver highlights. Flowers in May and June attract butterflies and hummingbirds.

Grows best in organically rich, moist, well-drained soils. Grows well in full sun in the northern part of its range but needs afternoon shade in southern areas. Remove stems of faded flower to encourage continued bloom. In cold winter climates, winter mulch applied after the ground freezes helps prevent root heaving. Divide clumps in spring every 3-4 years to keep plants vigorous.



Black walnuts are very tall, statuesque, shade trees best planted in informal settings. Their wood is prized for furniture building and over harvesting has caused a serious decline in native populations. They are host plants for over 100 species of butterflies and moths! Plant this tree in full sun where it will have room to grow and falling nuts will not be a problem. They prefer full sun and moist, well-drained soil.


Black walnuts produce chemicals called juglones which are very toxic to certain other plants such as azaleas, rhododendrons, blueberries, peonies and solanaceous crops like tomatoes, peppers, potatoes. Most of the toxicity is limited to within the drip line of the tree.





Quercus alba

White Oak is one of the preeminent hardwoods of Eastern North America and is long-lived. Although called a White Oak, it is unusual to find an individual specimen with white bark, the usual color is gray. In the forest it can reach a magnificent height and in the open it develops into a massive broad topped tree with large branches striking out at wide angles. In spring, the young leaves are a delicate silver pink and covered with a soft blanket like down, the petioles are short and the leaves which cluster close to the ends of the shoots are pale green and downy with result that the entire tree has a misty frosty look. Many forms of wildlife feed on the acorns during the fall and winter.



Swamp White Oak, a relatively large deciduous tree with a long lifespan. The open rounded crown makes it a good shade tree for large areas. It produces a good acorn crop every 3 to 5 years that wildlife love to eat. The acorns are distinguishable by they're long stalks. It is found growing wild in low-lying and swampy areas — often moist bottomlands or riverbanks. Plant in an area along a pond, a stream or other wet sites.

Quercus coccinea

Scarlet Oak is a native deciduous tree in the beech family that grows 50 to 80 feet tall and spreads between 45 to 60 feet. It is long-lived, durable and easy to grow. The tree prefers acidic sandy soils on the dry side but will tolerate other soils if they are well-drained. The tree is narrow with an open irregular crown and often retains numerous small dead branches. It is often grown for its beautiful fall color and drought tolerance. It is an important source of food for many wildlife species. This tree has seven-lobed leaves 3 to 6 inches long, each lobe having several sharp points where the veins continue out in the form of bristles.



Sorghastrum nutans Golden Sunset™ - Grass

One of four dominant native grasses to the tallgrass prairie of the Central United States, Sorghastrum nutans, grows on a wide variety of sites and soils. Native plants in natural or restored prairies will be taller in southern states and shorter with earlier flowers in northern locations. This variety has proven winter hardy as far north as USDA Hardiness Zone 3. Its flowers first emerge in mid-August and remain attractive through the winter. Unlike most Sorghastrum nutans, it remains upright and does not lodge or fall over. This new patented grass from the University of Minnesota will be a good addition to landscapes throughout the U.S. but especially in northern climates. Plants grow to 4-6 feet tall at maturity but are closer to 4 or 5 feet the first year or two. Large mature plants can be 36 inches wide, with hundreds of flowering stems. It has olive-green foliage that is just over ½ inch wide. Flowers average 9 inches in length and are a showy yellow and golden-bronze color. It has no known pests or diseases.

Tianshan® **Heptacodium Miconioides** 'MINHEP'

While bred in France, this new cultivar is named after the mountain range in China where the species is native. Clusters of fragrant, creamy-white flowers appear in late summer, with each whorl containing 7 flowers. The blooms are followed in autumn by unusual purplish-red fruits. What makes this variety unique is its compact habit, growing only 8-12', spreading only 5-7'. This small plant is well branched and forms a rounded, upright shrub or small tree with dark green shiny foliage that turns yellow in late fall. Exfoliating bark is very attractive in the winter. Use as a feature plant or as an informal hedge.
